The meeting voted to adopt this flag as the official flag of the Klan, and aske to obtain prices for a five foot version of this flag.
Considerable discussion was held concerning from Miami, Florida. It was stated in the discussion that had been associated with and his organization, the Anti-Communist Klan of Florida. 

It was said that Somersett's Klan was not to be confused with the Anti-Communist Klan of America, Inc., but the location of this latter Klan was not identified. It was decided that Somersett would be dropped temporarily from the National Klan until he is investigated.

They discussed having a national cross burning day all over America, including Washington, D. C., where the United Klans of America are supposed to have a Klavern. This cross burning is to be done illegally and no permission will be obtained to burn the crosses. The date was set for December 23, 1961. Each Klavern in the United States is to participate and should burn at least ten crosses, with all of them to be ignited as close to 10:00 PM, Eastern Standard Time, December 23, 1961, as possible. The plan is to build each cross with an individual stand so it can be dropped off at the side of the highway from a truck without wasting any time. A second car or truck will come along later and pour gasoline or an inflammable liquid on each cross. After the first two groups have left the scene, a third car or truck will pass behind and ignite each cross. Anonymous telephone calls will then be made to police headquarters, Sheriff's offices and State Patrol headquarters, as well as newspapers, to tell them about the crosses so as to get national publicity for the Klans. It was further decided that if any officers of the various Klans or Klaverns are interviewed by authorities or newspapers about the crosses, they are to say that they guess the crosses are being burned because it is Christmas.

After burning the crosses on December 23, 1961, the Exalted Cyclops of each Klan unit is to report to the Grand Dragon of his state the number and approximate location of crosses burned. The Grand Dragon for the state is then to report to the Imperial Office of his Klan organization the number of crosses burned. The Imperial Office will then tabulate the number and send that total to the National Ku Klux Klan.

On December 6, 1961, Confidential Informant who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that captioned organization including the Association of South Carolina Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan are scheduled to have a National cross-burning at 8:00 PM, December 23, 1951, on private property throughout the United States which, according to informant, may be two or three States, or perhaps more.

Recording the Association of South Carolina Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, the following is to be noted:

A source advised on September 24, 1956, that the Association of South Carolina Klans (ASCK) was organized in the fall of 1955 and is patterned after the Association of Carolina Klans (ACK). This source said ASCK is a new organization and not a rebirth of ACK. although all high-ranking officials of ASCK had been members of ACK. The source stated announced purposes of this organization are to promote white supremacy and combat integration of the races; however, the use of violence is disavowed.

Another source advised on September 2, 1950, that ACK was composed of groups formerly members of the Association of Georgia Klans (AGK) and although ACK severed all connections with AGK on November 14, 1949,

the ideals, purposes, and policies of the two organizations remained identical. ACK became defunct after conviction and imprisonment of its highest official and other members in 1952.

AGK has been designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Regarding the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., the following is to be noted:

A source advised that on May 22,1960, the National Grand Council of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan met at Atlanta, Georgia, to discuss consolidation of the Klans, unity of effort and activities, establish a National Fund and a National Secretary and to design a new flag. The meeting was attended by representatives of the Federation of Ku Klux Klans, Alabama; Association of Arkansas Klans, Arkansas; Florida Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Southern Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Association of Georgia Klans, Georgia; Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, North Carolina; Association of South Carolina Klans, South Carolina; Dixie Knights of Ku Klux Klan, Tennessee; and Hyksos Klan, Texas.

This source advised that at a consolidation meeting at Atlanta, Georgia, September 2-5, 1960, at which the North Carolina and Texas Klans were not represented, it was resolved and passed that their name will be changed to National Ku Klux Klan.

This source also advised that at a consolidation meeting at Savannah, Georgia, October 23, 1960, it was resolved and passed that in any future meetings of this group the name "Majority Citizens League" will be used.

Another source advised that at a National Klonkave Meeting at Texarkana, Texas, on February 11-12, 1961, a motion was carried that there should be at least six national meetings a year to be held any time from one week to twelve weeks after the last meetings. The time and meeting

This source also advised that at each meeting a new chariman and acting secretary are elected to serve at the next meeting. A national secretary has not been appointed.

On December 26, 1961, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the Anderson Klavern Number 694 of the Association of South Carolina Klans (ASCK) had planned to burn a cross on the night of December 23, 1961, in accordance with instructions received from State Headquarters, Columbia, South Carolina. One of the members of the Klavern had obtained a lease on property on which the cross was to be burned. On the night of December 23, 1961, only two members showed up to carry out the cross burning and since it was a cold,

windy night, they decided they would not burn the cross because it would create a fire hazard. who has furnished reliable On January 2, 1962, information in the past, advised that at a meeting of the Conestee, South Carolina, Klavern Number 777 of the ASCK which was held December 31, 1951, it was reported that five prosses had been burned by members of this Klavern on the night of December 23, 1961. However, it seemed that there had been a leak in secrecy regarding plans for this event as there were three South Carolina Highway Patrol cars and two sheriff's cars on hand before the crosses had been lighted. It was also reported that the patrol cars apparently knew just where to be waiting as one was parked directly across the street from where the cross was finally burned. Most of the members seemed to think some of the men had just talked too much about what they were planning to do on that night. On January 3, 1962,L who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the Lancaster Klavern Number 252 of the ASCK had burned six crosses at various places in Lancaster County, South Carolina, on the night of December 23, 1961, beginning at 10:00 P.M. stated no incidents were noted and that no publicity had been received from the local newspapers to his knowledge. On January 2, 1962, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised the Newberry Klavern of ASCK had scheduled to burn one cross at Newberry, one at Joanna, one at Pomaria, and two at Prosperity, all South Carolina, on the night of December 23, 1961. However, did not know whether these crosses were actually burned or not as no meeting had been held since that time and no mention had been made of it in the papers or on the local radio. On January 2, 1962, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the Whitmire Klavern of ASCK had built two crosses, one to be burned at Whitmire and the other on Routce 1, Whitmire, over in Laurens County, on the night of December 23, 1961. stated he did not know whether the crosses were actually burned as no meeting had been held since then but he had not seen anything in the local papers or heard anything on the local radio regarding cross burnings. On January 3, 1962, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the Ninety-Six, South Carolina, Klavern, affiliated with ASCK, burned a cross as scheduled about four miles out of Ninety-Six on the night of December 23, 1961. Klansmen were present but no spectators and the cross was burned out in the country. Also, another cross was to be burned at Troy, South Carolina, but it was not known by whether this cross was burned or not.

It was the general consensus of the above sources that very little publicity had been received as a result of the cross burning and since the crosses were burned on leased property no publicity had been received on the radio or in the local newspapers.

The meeting was attended by representatives of the Federation of Ku Khuk Khans, Alabama; Association of Arhansas Khans, Arhansas; Florida Knights of the Ku Khuk Khan, Florida; Bouthern Knights of the Ku Khuk Khan, Florida; Association of Georgia Khans, Georgia; Knights of the Ku Khuk Khan, North Carolina; Association of South Carolina Khans, South Carolina; Dixie Knights of the Ku Khuk Khan, Tennessee; and Hyksos Khan, Texas.

This source advised that at a consolidation meeting at Atlanta, Georgia, September 2-5, 1960, at which the North Carolina and Texas Klans were not represented, it was resolved and passed that their name will be changed to National Ku Klux Klan.

This source also advised that at a consolidation meeting at Savannah, Georgia, on October 23, 1950, it was resolved and passed that in any future meetings of this group the name "Majority Citizens League" will be used.

Another source advised that at a National Konkave Meeting at Texarkana, Texas, on February 11-12, 1951, a motion was carried that there should be at least six national meetings a year to be held any time from one week to twelve weeks after the last meetings. The time and meeting place is to be decided by the newly elected chairman. This second source also advised that at each meeting a new chairman and acting secretary are elected to serve at the next meeting. A national secretary has not been appointed.

Synopsis:

Jonesboro, Ga., newlyorganized Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., a splinter group from U. S. Klans, on 2/18/60, sent invitations to all Klans in southeastern U.S., except U.S. Klans, to form national organization of Klans. First organization meeting held 2/27-28/60, Atlanta, Ga. Additional organization meetings held 3/12/60, Chattanooga, Tenn.; and 4/9-10/60, Columbia, S.C. Organization allegedly finalized 5/22/60, at Atlanta, Ga., to include Association of Arkansas Klans; Association of Georgia Klans; Association of South Carolina Klans; North Carolina Knights of the Ku Klux Klan; Dixie Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Tennessee and Georgia; Federation of Alabama Klans; Florida Ku Klux Klan; Southern Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; and Hyksos, a Klan-like organization from Houston, Texas. and his group were expelled and the national group was known as National Grand Council of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. They voted to plan a national Klan flag, establish a national secretary and a national fund, to plan a Klan newspaper and to hold national Klan rally at Stone Mountain, Ga., 9/3/60. A national meeting was held 7/17/60, at Orlando, Fla., where North Carolina KKKK was eliminated from membership. Name of the national group was changed to National Knights of the KKK and it was decided to have annual national Klan Memoral Day fjust before each Labor Day at Stone Mountain, Ga. A national eeting was held at Stone Mountain and Atlanta, Ga., 9/3-4/60, there the name was again changed to National KKK. At the mational meeting, Savannah, Ga., 10/23/60, a motion was carried that future national meetings would be carried under name of Majority Citizens League. Also, Southern KKKK, Florida, would not be represented. At national meeting, Texarkana, Texas, 12/10-11/60, discussion took place regarding front organizations

for the Klan but were not decided upon. Southern KKKK, Florida, allowed to resign. A national meeting at Shreveport, Ia., set for 2/11-12/61, transferred to Texarkana, Texas, at last minute due to cross burning at residence of U. S. Congressman OVERTON BROOKS, Shreveport. They agreed to posters reading, "Be a Man - Join the Klan," in a membership drive and to promote boycotts of Negro musicians. A national meeting was held at Tallahassee, Fla., 4/15-16/61, where security measures were discussed and another attempt made to get a flag design. At a national meeting held Chattanooga, Tenn., 6/4/61, they discussed using violence against Freedom Riders away from bus stations but no definite plan made. They also discussed boycott of Negro recording artists and places playing their records. At a national meeting at Anniston, Ala., 7/8-9/61, they discussed lynching of Negro college students on campuses and that MARTIN LUTHER KING should be killed and that Klans should hold more demonstrations in home states to make people aware of the Klan. There were dissenters to killings and no definite plans made. At national meeting, West Columbia, S. C., 9/9-10/61, they again discussed Klan flag and it was suggested trouble in many places would divide the great force of U. S. Marshals. A national rally was held at Stone Mountain, Ga., 9/30/61, but the public speaking was nearly called off because hard feelings flared up between U. S. Klans and United Klans of Georgia. At national meeting, Savannah, Ga., 11/11-12/61, United Klans of America, Inc., was represented and it was agreed these two major Klan groups would meet together at the national meetings but there was no talk of consolidation. The leaders discussed the differences they had had in the past and voted that they meet and further plan on consolidation of the Klan organizations into one group known as KKKK, Inc., at Columbia, South Carolina, sometime in May, 1960.  advised tha, KKKK, Inc., told those present that he had formerly been associated with U. S. Klans and because of a difference of opinion had obtained a charter through the Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, on December 7, 1959, to operate a Klan organization known as the KKKK, Inc.	
The above information was substantiated by  Confidential Informant on February 29, 1960, and the list of representatives in attendance was supplemented by information furnished by him. was to appoint or have elected two men to represent his particular Klan, and these men would act as Grand Council of all Klans represented at this meeting. It was decided there would be no grand chairman, but at each meeting the chairman for the next meeting would be elected by the council.

A motion was carried that no Klan group which was not represented at the meeting on March 12, 1960, could join the group at a later date unless the Klan group was completely investigated and voted on by the Grand Council.

Confidential Informant ladvised on March 16, 1960, that the delegates to this meeting could not agree on whether the national Grand Council could issue orders to each individual Klan. It was agreed that the Council, to consist of the Grand Dragon and three men from each Klan, and one alternate delegate from each Klan, would establish policy, remove undesirable council members, channel information of interest to all Klans for dissemination to all Klaverns. Local Klans could still exercise their own initiative on action to be taken on local problems and could take prompt action without having to clear it through the Grand Council. Each Klan would furnish funds to the Grand Council for use in employing attorneys to defend Klan members and employ lobbyists to further Klan interests in various state Legislatures. The Grand Council would take the initiative in establishing national policy and seeking national publicity and issuing Klan publications in furtherance of Klan progress.

The Grand Council would be known as the National Grand Council of the KKKK and all Klans would be affiliated with the Council, but would still maintain their separate individual identities and names in the states in which they operate.

There would be no permanent chairman. The chairman-ship would rotate in order among the Grand Dragons with a different one serving at each meeting.

The paper work, correspondence and general administration would be handled by one fulltime permanent secretary to be elected by the Grand Council. He would receive a salary from the funds received from the various Klans.

Confidential Informant advised on April 12, 1960, that on April 9, 1960, leaders of the various Klan groups in the southeastern United States gathered at West Columbia, South Carolina, in preparation for a meeting to finalize the consolidation of all Klans for a joint operation. Throughout the day on Saturday, April 9, 1960, no formal meetings were held.

On Saturday evening, April 9, 1960,

ASCK, remarked that all the Grand
Dragons of the Klans had decided as follows:

- 1) The Grand Dragons would make up a secret Supreme Council to govern all the Klans.
- 2) There would be a public Supreme Council consisting of the Grand Dragons and two delegates from each Klan.
- The public Supreme Council would discuss strategy and decisions of the secret Supreme Council and would carry out the orders of the secret Supreme Council through the various Klan groups.

also said the Grand Dragons had decided to use
shotguns with #4 shot (squirrel shot) to break up Negro demonstra-
tions when and where the police failed. The Klansmen would shoot
the Negroes' legs and it was not desired to kill them but to
halt them. Klan robes or identity of Klansmen would not be
revealed when and if shotguns were used. The secret Supreme
Council would decide when such action was necessary and would
order the Titans and Exalted Cyclopes in the troubled areas to
carry out these shootings.   said that this decision to use
force would not be openly discussed or mentioned at the meeting
of the public Supreme Council to be held April 10, 1960. He said
the reason it was not to be discussed was because thereafter it
would be too easy to show conspiracy to use force in any subse-
quent court action and could involve all of the principal Klan
leaders who had participated in such discussion and would
handicap the Klan in carrying out its program to put down these
demonstrations.



They voted that all Klans should work to assist one another financially and otherwise in any emergency when requested to do so by the Grand Council. They voted that each Klan in each state build up and handle its own finances but the finances would be available for use by the National Grand Council in any emergency in any state. They resolved that in the event the United States was attacked by any foreign government, the Klan would offer its complete services to defend the United States. They resolved that strangers, non-residents, foreigners or anyone else seeking to start racial trouble in the south would be contacted by the Klan in the troubled area and removed one way or another from the troubled area by the Klan.

They agreed to get the list of Communist organizations declared subversive by the Attorney General of the United States and, thereafter, whenever these Communist groups were found active in the south the Klan would break them up by one means or another and identify themselves as Klansmen in so doing.

They also passed a resolution to nominate Governor FAUVUS of Arkansas for the next President of the United States and to pick a Vice-Presidential nominee at a national meeting to be held July 17, 1960.

They agreed that the manner in which local authorities in Biloxi, Mississippi, handled the attempt by Negroes to integrate the beaches at Biloxi was excellent and would serve as a good example for the Klan to use on a local level if a situation should arise where integration of a local beach was attempted.

They agreed that more drastic steps must be taken to stop any further school integration. It was further agreed that the best way to stop integration in schools was to "knock off" the leaders be they white or colored.

It was agreed that conflict with law enforcement officers would not be tolerated and all Klan members were cautioned not to become involved with the law, even though they were in complete disagreement with those people.

Five speakers present advocated violence, if necessary, to maintain segregation in the south and they received the unanimous approval of those present.

# Activities advised the first order of business was to make it impossible for anyone other than the Grand Dragon and his two delegates to enter into any of the Klonkades (meetings). A representative of the Grand Dragon would have to prove his right to represent said Grand Dragon. Also, the group was to have a right to ask any man for proof of just what he did represent, how many Klaverns, etc. This motion was aimed to keep out of Charlotte who was suspected of not actually representing a Klan. A design for a national flag was brought in by Atlanta, and was decided upon as the national flag for the Kian. The flag contained an outline of Stone Mountain, Georgia. Each Klan group would pay their share of the total cost of the printing of 10,000 copies and each group would receive an equal number of copies to put out in their state or locality. This informant advised that the religious question in the coming Presidential election was discussed at an informal meeting and speeches were made by the members, at which time they suggested eliminating the identifying of individual race and religious groups at all future meetings of the Klan. They further decided to place the Klan on record as fighting Communism and supporting constitutional government; and also to place the Klan on record as being in favor of states rights and segregation of the races as God created them.

A resolution was also offered and passed to have four delegates from each Klan attend meetings instead of three delegates. In the future, each state would have four delegates from each Klan in attendance.

The Atlanta Journal and Atlanta Constitution, daily newspapers published in Atlanta, Georgia, in their combined edition for Sunday, September 4, 1960, identified the chief speaker at the Klan rally at Stone Mountain as "PARSON JACK" JOHNSON of Columbus, Georgia, publisher and owner of the Georgia Tribune, a segregationist newspaper, and Pastor of a Baptist Tabernacle.

He attacked the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), Presidential candidates NIXON and KENNEDY, Catholicism and the present state administration.

The newspaper also identified C. H. MADDOX of the AGK, Savannah, Georgia, as one of the speakers. MADDOX said the meeting consisted of 27 "splinter" Klan groups which had consolidated themselves into the NKKK. He also said Klansmen wore masks because they had that right on private property. The newspaper pointed out that a State of Georgia anti-mask law makes the wearing of masks in public places illegal.

The newspaper article further stated that about 300 persons attended the speaking.

With respect to the Freedom Riders said that the bus drivers who drive the Freedom Riders must be stopped and that this could be done by shooting the drivers from ambush or setting a charge of dynamite by the side of the road and setting it off by battery just as the bus goes by. Highway #301 about three miles south of Orangeburg. Klansmen addressed a group estimated at from "about 1,000" by state highway patrolmen to "more than 5,000" by Klan spokesmen.

The only speakers who identified themselves were of Tennessee and of Tennessee and of the AGK. The spokesmen said that it was the first time that all of the Klans had had representatives together at a meeting, adding that other assemblies would be held in the state in the near future.

The newspaper reported that the rally was policed by representatives of the Orangeburg County Sheriff's Office and the South Carolina State Highway Patrol and the officers found no cause to interfere and no incidents were reported.

The flaming cross was the tallest and widest seen in this area since reconstruction days, being more than 20 feet high.

The Charlotte Office advised under date of January 5, 1962, that no crosses were burned in North Carolina the night of December 23, 1961, to his knowledge; that five crosses were reportedly burned in Conestee, South Carolina; six crosses reportedly burned in Lancaster County, South Carolina; one cross burned at Newberry, South Carolina; one at Joanna, South Carolina; one at Pomaria, South Carolina; and two at Prosperity, South Carolina; one at Whitmire; one in Laurens County; and one at Ninety-six, South Carolina.

advised on January 9, 1962, he heard that 13 crosses were burned in Chatham County, Georgia, but there had been no information concerning any crosses received from public sources or other available sources.

Information was received from other sources indicating nine crosses were reportedly burned in Burke County, Georgia; three in Jenkins County, Georgia, and possibly seven in Emanuel County, Georgia. No crosses are known to have been burned in the vicinity of Columbia, South Carolina, home of the ASCK.

NATION OF ISLAM, formerly referred to as the Muslim Cult of Islam, also known as Muhammad's Temples of Islam

In January, 1957, a source advised Elijah Muhammad has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On May 5, 1961, source advised: Elijah Muhammad is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI). Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI. In mid 1960 Muhammad and other NOI officials, when referring to Muhammad's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. Muhammad claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following Muhammad's teaching and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including Muhammad, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, source advised Muhammad had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

## NATION OF ISLAM

On May 17, 1961, source advised: Muhammad had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to Muhammad, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

Alabama, was a restaurant located at a truck stop. The truck stop is located at the junction of State Highways 82 and 5 at Centreville, Alabama. A discussion was held concerning the crosses burned by various Klan groups on December 23, 1961. Although written reports were supposed to have been submitted concerning the number of crosses burned by each Klan group, this was not done. From the discussions, informant learned that several crosses were burned, and that a greater number were burned by the Dixie Klans in Tennessee, North Georgia, and Alabama.

A discussion was held concerning the fight to maintain segregation in the various states represented by those present. Said that it appeared that the segregationists in Savannah, Georgia, are losing their battle. However, there are indications that the various segregationist groups are beginning to work together in Savannah, and that many more people are showing concern and resentment of the Negroes who seek to desegregate various public facilities.

The meeting decided to hold a big segregation meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, in July, 1962, to coincide with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People Convention to be held in Atlanta during the first part of July, 1962. A committee was formed to

A source advised that on May 22, 1960, the National Grand Council of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan met at Atlanta, Georgia, to discuss consolidation of the Klans, unity of effort and activities, establish a National Fund and a National Secretary and to design a new flag. The meeting was attended by representatives of the Federation of Ku Klux Klans, Alabama; Association of Arkansas Klans, Arkansas; Florida Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Southern Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Association of Georgia Klans, Georgia; Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, North Carolina; Association of South Carolina Klans, South Carolina; Dixie Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Tennessee; and Hyksos Klan, Texas.

This source advised that at a consolidation meeting at Atlanta, Georgia, September 2-5, 1960, at which the North Carolina and Texas Klans were not represented, it was resolved and passed that their name will be changed to National Ku Klux Klan.

This source also advised that at a consolidation meeting at Savannah, Georgia, October 23, 1960, it was resolved and passed that in any future meetings of this group the name "Majority Citizens League" will be used.

source advised that at a National Klonkave Meeting at Texarkana, Texas, on February 11-12, 1961, a motion was carried that there should be at least six national meetings a year to be held any time from one week to twelve weeks after the last meetings. The time and meeting place is to be decided by the newly elected chairman. This source also advised that at each meeting a new chairman and acting secretary are elected to serve at the next meeting. A national secretary has not been appointed.

source advised that at a national meeting on November 11-12, 1961, United Klans of America, Inc. (UK) was invited to meet with NKKK and it was agreed they will meet together, but there was no talk of consolidation.







There was a discussion to the effect that on July 4, 1962, klansmen should go to Stone Mountain, Georgia, in their robes and hold a public speaking on the mountain even though the State of Georgia would not permit it.

Tape recordings were played at the meeting concerning the radio program that Wally Butterworth in Atlanta is having under the name of "Defensive Legion." These radio programs are supposed to be in answer to Ralph "Rastus" McGill and his "left wing smear sheet, the Atlanta Constitution - Journal." The program is heard Monday through Friday from 7:15 to 7:30 on WGUN, Atlanta, Georgia.



The identity of the delegates was furnished by Confidential Informant on February 14, 1962, Confidential Informant on February 14, 1962.
advised on February 14, 1962, that delegates arriving in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, were supposed to check in at the Stafford Hotel. When they reached the hotel they were to meet a man wearing a red tie, glasses, mustache, a dark suit and hat. This man was supposed to be there from 1:00 to 5:00 PM Central Standard Time. This man was not at the hotel when some of the delegates arrived and they searched for him and called the Imperial office of the UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA without results. This contact man finally showed up about 4:30 PM and told the delegates at the Stafford Hotel to check in at the Town House Motel.
There was just a short meeting on Saturday night at 7:30 PM held in room 134 of the Town House Motel with about klansmen present. The reason why there was so much difficulty concerning a place to stay was because Tuscaloosa was reportedly full of Federal Marshals and the local policemen were all keeping an eye on the activities of the klansmen.  Of AMERICA, had been subpoenaed to go to Federal Court in Anniston, Alabama on Tuesday, February 13, 1962, with reference to the burning of the bus there.  The reason for the recall of the Federal Grand Jury was because one of the jurors was a klansman. said the FBI and Federal men were really after him and that he had to take every necessary precaution.

A discussion took place on what moves the klan should make next. They talked about stirring up the Negros and scaring them to death. Several ways were discussed; one way was to catch a buzzard, dress it in a white suit, tie fireballs to its feet and put the buzzard on a long wire that would allow him to fly about 100 feet in the air after the fireballs were ignited. Another way was to take large balloons, about the size of a man, fill them with helium, attach a cross to the balloon with lights that flicker on and off; and enough wire to give the ballons a length of about 100 yards.

They also discussed how to renove all stool pigeons from the klan. It was suggested they appoint a special committee consisting of one man from each klan. Their work would be kept top secret and no one except the members would know about this secret group. It is believed that when this group finds a suspect that they might use a lie detector test or other means to find out whether he is revealing secret information regarding the klan.

The meeting on Sunday, February 11, 1962, was held at the Twix and Tween Restaurant, at the junction of Highway 5 and 82, Centreville, Alabama, with

DIXIE KLANS, INC., stated that the klan flag was not quite completed for this meeting, but would be ready for the next meeting.

There was a discussion on the national cross-burning day held on December 23, 1961. The various klans had not submitted written reports as originally requested, but the various klans orally reported that in the neighborhood of 3,000 crosses were burned in the United States on the night of December 23, 1961. UNITED KLANS reported that they had burned 1,537 in the State of Alabama. Each delegate was urged to have each klansmen in their group write to their Senators and Congressmen expressing their feelings on segregation.

Another discussion was held concerning the Pepsi Cola Bottling Company. This company has appointed a Negro as Vice-President of the company. It was said that the merchants in Alabama; and Florida were setting all Pepsi Cola bottles and boxes in the streets and calling the distributors to pick them up.

All klan groups were urged to contact all Citizen Councils and other segregation groups, ask them all to take part in a national anti-communist and anti-integration meeting in Atlanta, Georgia in July 1962 to coincide with the convention of the NAACP. The exact dates were to be decided on at a later date. In addition to the above, advised on February 15, 1962, that it was voted at the meeting on February 11, 1962, for the National Ku Klux Klan. to elect was elected to this position. A discussion was held concerning the fight to maintain segregation in the various states reported by those present. said that it appeared that the segregationist in Savannah, Georgia, were losing their battle. However, there were indications that various segregation groups are beginning to work together in Savannah, and that many more people were showing concern and resentment of the Negros who seek to desegregate various public functions. The delegates decided to hold a big segregation meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, on July 1962 to coincide with the convention of the NAACP to be held in Atlanta during the first part of July 1962. A committee was formed to plan this meeting and of the UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, Atlanta, Georgia, were selected to serve on this committee. The meeting to be held in Atlanta would not be called a klan meeting but would be considered as a segregation and communist fighting rally. It was also hoped that some well-known speakers could be obtained. 



A confidential source of the Savannah Office of the FBI who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that klansmen representing various Klans in Mississippi, Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, and South Carolina, gathered at Wakulla Springs, Florida, at the Wakulla Hotel for a national meeting August 11-12, 1962.

At a meeting held on Saturday night, August 11, 1962, in room 103, Wakulla Hotel, the following persons were present: all of Savannah, Georgia. The meeting was made a talk on his arrest in 1961 regarding the bombing of a Little Rock college. He said he had been framed and that a man who was working with him making bombs turned against him and reported him to the FBI. Al Sisk gave a talk on electronic devices to pick up and transmit sound. announced that he had to go to court on August 13, 1962, and said that he may not see them for a long time. Various individual talks were given but nothing pertaining to the business at hand. from Biloxi, Mississippi, said that he was one of the original instigators of the leaflet announcing that the Welfare Center in New York, New York would take care of individuals who came to New York.
