

#### INTRODUCTION

The United States is one of the world's largest agricultural exporters, reflecting the ability of U.S. agriculture and its related industries to provide ample supplies of quality products at competitive prices. Bulk commodities make up over half of U.S. overseas sales, but significant growth in U.S. exports of consumer food products is expected to continue during the 1990's. In most countries, rising personal incomes are creating demand for more sophisticated foods than those found in traditional national diets. U.S. food technology and quality are recognized throughout the world, providing a solid base on which to build further growth in exports of U.S. consumer food products to fill this demand.

#### FOREIGN AGRICULTURAL SERVICE

The Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) conducts programs around the globe to develop, maintain, and expand markets for U.S. agricultural commodities. FAS coordinates a global system for gathering and assessing information on world agriculture and trade. This enables American farmers to market abroad advantageously and it helps consumers obtain food products they need from other countries. FAS also coordinates activities related to the development and expansion of export markets.

#### Commodity and Marketing Programs

FAS has a continuing market development program to develop, service, and expand commercial export markets for U.S. agricultural products. Virtually every U.S. agricultural product entering world trade is promoted by one of FAS's market development activities, which cover more than 80 countries.

These marketing activities involve work with nonprofit commodity groups, trade associations, and State departments of agriculture and their regional associations. In addition to these cooperative efforts, FAS performs a variety of other promotion and trade servicing operations.

Commodity analysts provide estimates and forecasts of area, yield, and production for foreign crops as well as estimates for foreign livestock, poultry, and dairy production. These efforts are supported by data gathered through remote sensing techniques as well as weather-related analyses of foreign crop conditions.

Commodity experts and economists analyze attache reports on production and trade, combining them with accumulated background information and expertise. Commodity information compiled and analyzed by FAS is available to the public.

Commodity marketing specialists support the work of cooperators and individuals interested in specific markets and products.

#### **Export Credits**

#### The Public Law 480 (Food for Peace) Program

Title I of Public Law 480 (also called the Food for Peace Program) authorizes USDA to provide financing for sales of U.S. agricultural commodities to friendly developing countries on concessional credit terms. Title I concessional sales provide low-interest, long-term credit to foreign governments. U.S. suppliers are paid by the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) upon delivery of the commodities onboard vessels at U.S. ports. Recipient countries resell the commodities internally and use the proceeds for agricultural and economic development projects. The foreign government repays the loan to the CCC.

In FAS, the Program Development Division oversees the preparation and negotiation of country agreements, while the Public Law 480 Operations Division oversees the purchasing and shipping of commodities. In addition, under Title II of Public Law 480, the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service procures U.S. agricultural commodities for direct donation to foreign countries in cases of natural disasters or other crises and in support of nutritional feeding programs. Over two-thirds of these donations are made through voluntary relief agencies and the multilateral World Food Program. The Program Analysis Division coordinates this program with the Agency for International Development.

#### **CCC Commercial Financing**

Export Credit Guarantee Programs provide U.S. agricultural exporters or financial institutions a guarantee that they will be repaid for short- and intermediate-term commercial export financing provided to foreign buyers. These programs protect against commercial or noncommercial risk if the importer's bank fails to make payment. Under one program, the CCC will guarantee credit terms of up to 3 years. Under another, credit terms from 3 to 10 years are guaranteed.

The programs operate in cases where credit is necessary to increase or maintain U.S. exports to foreign markets and where private financial institutions would be unwilling to provide financing without CCC's guarantees. The CCC Operations Division administers these programs.

#### Other Programs

Section 416 of the Agricultural Act of 1949, as amended, provides for the donation of CCC-owned surplus dairy products and grains to needy people overseas through public and private nonprofit voluntary agencies and foreign governments.

#### Foreign Agricultural Affairs

The Office of Foreign Agricultural Affairs (FAA) manages the overseas arm of FAS, which consists of more than 250 permanent U.S. and foreign national employees around the world. FAA also coordinates visits of foreign dignitaries to the Office of the Secretary in Washington, DC.

Agricultural counselors, attaches, trade officers, and other FAS personnel are assigned to over 80 embassies and consulates around the world and provide coverage of more than 130 countries. These officers gather and interpret global information important to U.S. agricultural trade, including information on production, consumption, trade, agricultural and trade policy, and other factors that affect demand for U.S. products. In addition, these officers represent U.S. agricultural and trade policy interests to host governments and businesses.

#### **Agricultural Trade Offices**

The Agricultural Trade Act of 1978 directed the establishment of Agricultural Trade Offices (ATO's) in major centers of commerce throughout the world. This law requires a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 25 such offices to develop, maintain, and expand international markets for U.S. agricultural commodities. These offices serve as centers for export sales promotions and contact points for importers seeking to buy farm products from the United States. ATO's are located in China (Beijing and Guangzhou), Germany, Hong Kong, Japan (Tokyo and Osaka), Korea, Mexico, Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, United Arab Emirates, and Taiwan.

#### International Trade Policy

International Trade Policy coordinates USDA's role in negotiating and maintaining international agreements that expand world trade in U.S. agricultural commodities. Trade policy activities include supporting U.S. policy formulation on trade issues arising with the European Community, Japan, and other important trading partners: handling commodity issues that arise in international organizations; monitoring U.S. import quotas for farm products; meeting USDA responsibilities concerning international trade: and supporting the office of the U.S. Trade Representative in trade negotiations. In addition, market development activities are supported by providing economic data and analysis on tariff rates, nontariff barriers, and trade conditions.

International Trade Policy also collects and publishes weekly outstanding sales and accumulated export data. All exporters of U.S.-produced agricultural commodities are required by law to report their sales and associated exports by commodity and country. (Commodities included are barley, cattle hides and skins, corn, all upland cotton, American pima cotton, flaxseed, linseed oil, oats, rice, rye, soybean cake and meal, soybeans, wheat, and wheat products.)

The Office of Food Safety and Technical Services (FSTS) coordinates activities and responds to issues related to food safety regulations and barriers that affect the international trade of U.S. agricultural products. The office serves as the primary contact for U.S. companies' inquiries related to foreign product labeling and food standards, sanitary/phytosanitary regulations, pesticide residues, commodity quality and quantity complaints, and other technical requirements for U.S. products imported into foreign countries.

#### Trade Leads

FAS offices around the world send inquiries from overseas buyers looking for U.S. products to FAS in Washington, DC. FAS then disseminates from 2,500 to 4,000 Trade Leads domestically each year. Trade Leads may be obtained in five ways:

#### • Trade Leads FAX Service:

Trade Leads are available each week by polling the AgExport FAX machines. Trade Leads are grouped by commodity. To request information on how to access the Trade Leads FAX service, FAX AgExport Connections at (202) 690-4374.

#### • Trade Leads Bulletin:

All Trade Leads are published in a weekly bulletin titled AgExport Trade Leads. The bulletin also highlights upcoming trade shows and foreign trade developments throughout the world. #### **Foreign Buyer Lists**

The AgExport Connections staff maintains a database of approximately 13,000 foreign firms from over 70 countries. These foreign firms have expressed interest in importing specific U.S. food and agricultural products. U.S. firms may obtain lists to match their products with prospective foreign buyers. The Foreign Buyer Lists provide company name, contact, address, telephone, FAX, and/ or Telex numbers (where available). The lists may be ordered for a specific commodity for the entire world, or by country for all commodities. In addition, Foreign Buyer Lists may be processed on Cheshire or gummed labels.

#### International Trade Shows

FAS organizes U.S. pavilions in major international food shows throughout the world. For a fee, participants receive individual booths, access to a trade lounge, advance publicity, product shipment, and customs clearance for the show. For a trade show calendar, call (202) 720-7937.

The food quality certification service (also called "acceptance service"), provided by USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS), is available to foreign buyers to assure that any product shipped overseas meets contract specifications. To apply for the service, which is operated on a user-fee basis, foreign buyers must submit the specification or contract to AMS in advance. The AMS will review the contract and work with the buyers to write a specification that can be certified. The requirements for USDA certification can be made a part of the purchase contract. USDA also has grade standards for a wide variety of food products.

TMD helps exporters to:

- Maintain Product Quality in Transit. TMD has published a series of handbooks and tip sheets for exporters on shipping practices that will assure products are delivered in top condition.
- Obtain Competitive Transportation Rates. TMD provides shippers with rate information and is an active participant in regulatory issues that affect rates. TMD represents the interests of agricultural shippers before the Federal Maritime Commission.

- Monitor International Transportation Issues. TMD monitors developments related to cargo preference, transportation subsidies, technological restrictions resulting from the European Community's single market in 1992, ocean container standards, and cargo insurance.
- Use Transportation Services Efficiently. TMD provides information and assistance to reduce transport costs and increase access to foreign markets. TMD monitors developments in doublestack and intermodal transportation and can help shippers evaluate their intermodal, air, and ocean service and rate options.
