The market keeps tolerably high. The fresh Wheat proves in general to be fine and heavy, and so does Rye; Pease are also fine, and Barley and Oats of good quality; but the two latter are very deficient, and Pease, Beans and Rye, not at all abundant.

By advices from Poland there has been very heavy rains, which have injured the crops considerably, by causing a great deal of Corn to sprout.

With regard to Stock in Granary, the Consul regrets he is under the necessity of saying, that it is not in his power to furnish any information which could be depended upon; but humbly begs to refer to his dispatch of the 14th January 1826, in which he states "the medium production of the kingdom of Denmark (Proper) to be, (as compared with the actual exports from the country during the last several years) as follows:—"

The opening of the Ports in Great Britain for the admission of Rye and Oats, and the scantiness of these crops in this and the adjacent countries, caused a considerable rise in the prices of them in this market. The crop of Pease and Beans has entirely failed. The freights paid for Oats to London have been from 2 s 6 d. to 3 s. per quarter.

The King has established a new mode of bonding Corn (Wheat and Rye) in this city, in order to facilitate the trade in these articles, in consequence of which, the importer will be allowed to have the Corn under his sole control, and in his private warehouse, and be debited for the amount of the consumption duty, for which he will again be credited on producing proof of the re-exportation of the same, and will only be charged with it on entering the Corn for home use.

Copy of a LETTER from Sir Daniel Bayley, dated St. Petersburg, 19/31st October 1826 :—With Six Enclosures.

SIR,

St. Petersburg, 19/31st October 1826.

I HAVE paid all possible attention to your Circular Despatch, of the 29th June last, directing me to furnish all the information in my power respecting the growth and exportation of Corn in this country.

The manner in which the agriculture in Russia is carried on, from the nature of the connection between the owner of the land and the cultivator, renders it impossible to give any fair or useful elucidation on the first head.

I had occasion to enter at some length upon this subject in the year 1822, and I cannot, perhaps, do better than by enclosing a copy of the despatch I wrote to Mr. Planta on the 3/15th July of that year, which will explain some part of the query. In regard to the expense incurred on the passage of Corn through the ports, whether as levied as transit duty in the interior, or by charges at the ports of exportation, I would observe, that very considerable expenses attend the bringing it to market, being grown at a great distance from hence, the adjacent country not producing sufficient for the consumption of this capital, and the province in which it is situated is supplied by flour (chiefly of rye, which forms seven-eighths of what is used here,) grown and brought from the interior, at a distance of from 500 to 1,500 miles. Of course the expense will be proportionate to the distance, and its vicinity to water conveyance. To a small transit duty it is certainly liable, but the *legal* duty is probably trebled by gratuities to those appointed to receive it. The duty on export is,—

On wheat 6 cop. silver per chetvert, ($3 \frac{1}{2} d.$ per quarter).

On rye - 3 - - ditto - - ditto - $1 \frac{3}{4} d.$ - ditto.

and the other charges on shipping are not heavy, but vary in a manner that renders it impossible to fix them; depending on the season of the year, weather, and other causes which cannot be defined: perhaps 2 s. per quarter would be a fair average of the lighterage and other expenses of putting the grain on board a ship.

In regard to the average prices of wheat in Russia, nothing approaching to it can be formed. It is not a grain generally attended to, and no prices are ever published by authority, as is done of rye and oats; but even of these an average cannot be formed, as a proof of which I enclose a translation of the last return of the prices thus published, (to which I have added the distances from this capital), showing of rye, the great staple of Russia, the difference between 16 R° and $1 \frac{1}{2} R°$, and a variation of prices almost beyond example in the same empire.

Copy of a LETTER from Sir Daniel Bayley to Joseph Planta, jun. Esq., dated St. Petersburg, 3/15th July 1822, relative to Corn Returns.

SIR,

St. Petersburg, July 3/15, 1822.

I HAVE the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Circular Despatch of the 17th April, directing me to consider the instructions to send home Returns of the Prices of the several sorts of Grain, &c. within the district of my consulate, as annulled; and that in lieu thereof I am to send home once in every quarter an account of the prices of agricultural produce, made up according to the forms transmitted in your Circular. In reply to these instructions, I beg leave to assure you that no delay on my part should intervene in making the desired Returns, but at the same time it is my duty to acquaint you, that it is beyond my powers to make them according to the prescribed forms, or of what I conceive to be the main purpose required; "The prices free of all charges as paid to the farmers." This difficulty, or rather impossibility, arises out of the constitution of this empire, or perhaps more strictly speaking, from the tenure of landed property, and the nature of the connection between the proprietors and cultivators. Farmers, according to our ideas at home, or of tenants, in common acceptance of these terms, *there are none*. The land is parcelled out by the lord of the soil to his peasants or serfs, all living in villages, and not in single farm houses as with us, in certain proportions according to the number of males in each family, which allotments are changed every three or five years. For the use of this land the lord receives head-money, and a certain number of days labour from the peasant per week or per year. On the produce the peasant lives, and he usually grows a little rye, oats, hemp and flax, or other things, for the consumption of his own immediate family. If there be any surplus beyond his own wants, it is either bartered away at the nearest town for necessaries and luxuries, or with itinerant dealers. There are most undoubtedly exceptions to this state of the case, and also a very great number of peasants who cultivate large tracts of land, and many proprietors of estates who manage them in a manner approaching near to our own system; and these furnish the great mass of supply for the towns and cities as well as for the exportation, chiefly from the Ukraine and Poland.

The general custom is, however, as I have before stated, and I trust you will be satisfied that thus circumstanced, it is impossible to ascertain the facts aimed at; viz. "The prices of agricultural produce, free of all charges as paid to the farmer;" and I am convinced, any return of the kind I could make would only lead to error and false conclusions.

SIR,

Archangel, 18/30 September 1826.

SINCE my last Despatch, N° 3, of 10/22d July, I have had the pleasure to receive your Circular of 29th June, accompanied by copy of a Report from the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, relative to the application of Messrs. C. Stewart & Co. of Memel; also copies of Mr. Lack's Letters to Joseph Planta, esq. of 9th and 26th June; my reply to all which has been delayed, till I had made every possible exertion to procure the desired information as to the prices of Grain within my consulate.

The archives of the Custom-House here affording no correct statements, I had recourse to one of the oldest inhabitants who had been in the habit of keeping accounts of the exports during part of the last century, but from a fire that broke out on his premises two years ago, which made him remove his papers in haste, he has been unable to find the documents in question. I therefore resolved to delay no longer acknowledging receipt of the above Letters; and in doing so, to transmit to you, as directed by the Right honourable George Canning, all the information as to Grain that it has been possible for me to procure, as set forth in the enclosed table of the quantities of wheat, rye and oats exported from hence, from the years 1802 to 1825, inclusive, which I have calculated in English quarters and sterling money, from the measure used in this country, and the average annual course of exchange.

In the above Table it is worthy of remark, that the actual prices in roubles, the current money of the country, from the year 1802 to 1810, were considerably less than from 1810 to 1820, but in these years the rouble was worth from 31 and 36 *d.*, down to 15 *d.*, its value in 1810, while from that period to 1820 it was only worth 14, 13, 11 and 10 *d.*; and for the last four years to 1825, 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ *d.* to 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ *d.* sterling.

SIR,

Riga, 3/15th September 1826.

I HAVE the honour to transmit herewith, for the information of His Majesty's principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the two Returns required by Circular under date of the 29th of June last.

I beg to state, that as no records calculated to facilitate the object exist in this city, or throughout the province of Livonia, it is altogether impracticable to obtain a statement of the average prices of grain from the early period mentioned; but, by a reference to the books of an old commercial establishment, I have succeeded in forming a correct Report from the year 1800 to this day (N° 1).

In the statement under the head of Exports I have been more fortunate; and N° 2 is a return to that effect, since the year 1783 to the end of 1825.

The expenses attending the passage and transmission of grain from the place of growth to the shipping port are rendered so various by distance, as well as by the different modes of conveyance, that any attempt at calculating the carriage must prove erroneous. Grain is brought to this market partly over land from Courland, Lithuania and Poland, and partly from the interior, down the Duna in barks, usually the property of the grower or inland dealer, and navigated by his own dependents; hence all purchases are made by the shipper receivable at Riga, where a small duty on exportation is levied, which, with other charges, and commission to the merchant, together on wheat, silver *R.* 11.55 per last, makes the present price on board as under:

SIR,

British Consulate, Dantzig, October 5th, 1826.

I DO myself the honour to transmit eight weekly returns of grain, from the 10th of August to the 28th past, which complete the Returns for the third quarter ; and I also enclose the duplicate of that of the 3d of August. In future I shall transmit them quarterly.

These Eight Returns are to be found in the Consul's Returns of the Prices of Corn and Grain, (separate). E. I. L. (marked N^o 1. and numbered 26.)

Though prices of wheat have rather declined since the late considerable advance, the supplies brought to market, which become pretty plentiful, are briskly bought up. The present stock may consist in about 200,000 quarters, and about 20,000 quarters more may be expected before winter sets in. Very little of any grain is brought to town except wheat ; and I do not believe there will be much else for exportation in spring ; probably only some little rye.

I am preparing the lists wanted of grain, prices, &c. from the beginning of last century, and have succeeded in getting them more complete than given to Mr. Jacob.

These accounts, extracted from official records, may be generally relied upon; it must however, be observed, that the prices of grain fluctuated very much in the course of several of the years cited, and in most instances the average of the month of October is taken as the annual one.

During most of the years in which exportation of corn took place, the exchange on England has been below par, so that grain was considerably dearer in English money than appears here. Of the exact state of the exchange during the different periods, no accounts can be obtained; the average rate is supposed to be about 18 florins for a pound sterling. The French war occasionally brought it down to 14 florins.

dated September 12th, 1826.

SIR,

Memel, September 12th, 1826.

IN obedience to the directions contained in your Circular Dispatch, I have endeavoured to procure the most extensive and accurate particulars respecting the average prices of corn and grain within the district of this consulate, and also an account of the quantities thereof exported annually from this port during a series of years. I regret that my endeavours have met with very imperfect success, in consequence of there being no records showing the price so far back as the year 1700, nor any documents which furnish authentic information from a later period. Memel is not a port from whence corn and grain are, or ever have been, exported in considerable quantities. There was formerly an insignificant trade in rye carried on with parts of Sweden and Holland, but even that is now in a great measure discontinued.

The cultivation of arable land fast decreases throughout East Russia, the farmers preferring to cultivate pasture lands for grazing sheep, in the purchase of which they are greatly encouraged by the Russian government, which has appointed agents to sell to the Lithuanian peasants or farmers sheep at low prices, obliging them, in return for this accommodation, to pay for a determinate period an annual interest on the value of the stock so purchased.

I am informed that the exports of corn and grain from this port have seldom exceeded in one year from 5 to 10,000 quarters.

SIR, British Consulate, Christiania, 22d August 1826.

I HAVE had the honour of receiving your Circular of the 29th June last, directing me to furnish some information concerning the prices of wheat and other grain in this country, and enclosing two Letters from the Board of Trade on the subject.

Having on the 7th July last handed you my quarterly Report of the prices of grain at this port, I beg now leave to observe, in reply to that part of your Circular which directs me to state every expense affecting the passage of corn through the several ports within my consulate, that no corn of any description is at any time exported from this country; but considerable quantities are yearly brought hither from Denmark.

The import duty on corn, brought hither in privileged ships, is as follows, viz.

There are no public records of the prices of wheat in this country, neither are there any mercantile establishments here of very old standing, whose books could furnish the required information, for any thing near the time fixed in your Circular; hence, although I have used my utmost endeavours to comply with the directions given me in your Letter, I have not been able to ascertain the prices of wheat further back than the year 1786, and a statement of the wheat prices for that period, or the last 40 years, I have herewith the honour to enclose.

SIR,

Hamburgh, 14th November 1826.

CONFORMABLY to your desire, communicated in Mr. John Bidwell's Circular Letter, dated 29th of June last, I have used my utmost endeavours to procure, and have now the honour to transmit to you the following Returns relating to grain, namely,

“ An Account of the Prices of several sorts of Grain in this District, during a series of Years, from 1792 to 1825.

“ An Account of the Quantities of the several sorts of Grain exported annually from this District, during a series of years, from 1792 to 1825.

“ An Account of the Average Prices of Wheat in Germany, as far as the same can be ascertained, from the Year 1700 to the Year 1825 inclusive.”

I regret, Sir, that from the very imperfect state, and in some cases the total want of any public record of the prices and export of grain in these countries, I have found it impossible to obtain the information called for, and I am therefore obliged to transmit the Returns to you with many blanks in them. At many places within this district, shipments of grain can be made without being entered at any custom-house, and without any account of the quantity exported being required or recorded.

That there has been so much delay in complying with your desire, I am extremely sorry, but although I did not omit to take immediate steps to obtain the required information, by duly writing for it to the proper public authorities within this district, yet to some of the letters, although dated in July last, official answers have been received only this day.

SIR,

Amsterdam, 31st July 1826.

IN obedience to the orders conveyed to me by a Circular Letter from John Bidwell, esq. dated Foreign Office, the 29th ultimo, I have the honour to state, in reply to the queries therein made, that the circulation of corn and grain within the district of this consulate, and throughout the kingdom of the Netherlands, is quite free, and subject to no duty in the interior; but that on export of the same to a foreign country, one is levied, as follows;—

to all which duties a certain per centage is added, varying according to the exigence of the state, and which is for the present established at 13 per cent.

No public document being obtainable showing the export of corn, or any other description of merchandise from this country, and the officers of the customs being extremely unwilling to grant any information on these points, which, indeed, could only be obtained in a complete form at the seat of government, to which all the books of the different offices are periodically sent, and where, probably, a general return is made out, I have only been able to discover it, as well as the importation from the year 1813 to the year 1822, from the report of a committee appointed some years ago by government to investigate into the state of the corn trade, from which I have also extracted the average prices of wheat from the year 1709 to the year 1785, and have the honour to transmit both these documents inclosed; as also the return of prices of wheat, rye, barley and oats from the year 1786 to this date, distinguishing the inferior wheat from the Polish or best, and stating them for each quarter, which I have copied from various brokers price currents; no average returns of these articles being officially made or published in an authentic form in this country.

Copy of a DESPATCH from Consul Ferrier, dated Rotterdam,
5th September 1826 :—With Four Enclosures.

SIR, British Consulate, Rotterdam, 5th September 1826.

IN compliance with the directions of Mr. Secretary Canning, communicated to me in your Letter of the 29th June last, I have been engaged in collecting the further information desired in respect to corn and grain, and am now enabled to transmit enclosed,—

“ An Account of every Expense affecting the Passage of Corn through the Port of Rotterdam, whether levied in the shape of Transit Duty in the Interior, or of Charge at the Outport.

“ A Statement of the Quantities of the several Sorts of Grain exported from, and imported into the Ports of the Netherlands, from 1814 to 1825.

“ A Statement of the Average Price of Wheat at Rotterdam, from 1769 to 1825.

“ A Statement of the Average Price of Wheat at Dordt, within the District of this Consulate, from 1700 to 1825.”

Returns from the custom-houses in the southern part of this kingdom are readily obtainable ; but the same facility not existing here, I have been unable to get a separate statement of the quantities of grain exported from the ports of this consulate, and the Return given is therefore of the exports of the whole kingdom, taken from official reports made to the council of state at the Hague. No returns exist of the export of grain from this part of the kingdom earlier than 1814, up to which period from 1725 the export was free of all duty.

In adding the Return of imports to that of exports, I have exceeded the strict letter of Mr. Canning's directions, but I trust the information may be considered of interest ; and with that view I venture further to state, that the consumption of corn in this kingdom has been officially estimated at no more than 4,650,000 quarters per annum ; and in the year 1817, a year of scarcity, it was calculated that the stock fell 770,000 quarters short of that quantity. What surplus stock there may be now in the country, beyond the quantity required by the inhabitants, is matter of very loose speculation ; but the trade consider the excess, if any, to be very trifling.

Copy of a DISPATCH from Consul Larpent, dated Antwerp, 16th August 1826 :—With Seven Inclosures.

SIR,

Antwerp, 16th August 1826.

IN compliance with the directions of Mr. Secretary Canning, contained in your Circular of the 29th June last, I have the honour to transmit the accompanying documents.

N° 1.

“ No. 1.—The Average Price of Wheat, Oats, Barley and Rye from the Year 1668 to the Year 1826, collected from the archives in the town hall at Louvain. Some of the registers were irregularly kept at intervals since the year 1795, but I have obtained from the merchants books at Louvain, information sufficient to complete the Account.

N° 2.

“ No. 2.—The same Average Account put into British Sterling Money per quarter Winchester Measure.

N° 3.

“ No. 3.—An Account of the Price of different sorts of Grain on the 1st January in each Year, from 1814 to 1825.

N° 4.

“ No. 4.—An Account of the Price of different sorts of Grain at different periods, Monthly, from the 25th April 1815 to July 1826.

N° 5.

“ No. 5.—Pro forma Invoieces, being an Account of the Expense attending the Exportation of different sorts of Grain from the Port of Antwerp.

N° 6.

“ No. 6.—An Account of the Exports of Grain, for the Year 1825.”

N° 7.

I regret to state that it is impossible for me to procure any account of the exportation of grain for any series of years from this port, as the accounts are regularly sent to the director general of the customs at the Hague, and no copy is kept at the custom-house here. I transmit likewise a letter marked N° 7, from one of the principal merchants here, and a member of the Chamber of Commerce, by which it appears that all information respecting the exports and imports, has been constantly refused, even to the Chamber of Commerce.

In addition to the foregoing documents, I hope shortly to procure further information from the office of the burgomaster of this city, but some time must elapse before I shall be in possession of these statements, which must be collected and arranged from a mass of papers.

The documents I have obtained from Louvain may be said to be the most important, as that city is the principal market for corn and grain from the Walloon country, and the rich provinces of Hainault and Brabant.

I have to observe, however, that since the year 1819, the outward trade in corn may be said almost to have ceased, especially from Louvain, and even the inland trade has been in a state of stagnation; rye is, however, pretty constantly shipped from

from Louvain for the distilleries in Holland, and wheat from time to time for Brussels and Ghent. The bakers at Antwerp almost always procure their supplies from the market at Louvain, but this interior trade is trifling.

Into France, corn cannot get, except by smuggling, which is said now to be carried on in a little way, in the neighbourhood of Charleroi. Many of the Walloon farmers who used to frequent the market of Louvain, have for some months taken their corn there; the distance is greater, but they get better prices.

There is no transit or other duty paid on corn from the interior to Antwerp, Flushing, or other ports, in case of exportation; but an octroi or toll is levied on grain entering the different cities of the kingdom, when for *consumption*.

The quantity of wheat, and of other grains in store before the present harvest, was much reduced within the last six months. There were no parcels of any consequence left. Money was scarce, and trade dull; speculators fear to do any thing. The Maats Chappy, or Merchant Company, in which the King, as an individual, has the greatest number of shares, can at any time come into the market, make a sacrifice, and sell lower, or by offering a large parcel, depress the prices. Private persons cannot risk such a competitor. But on the other hand, farmers have now, usually, much more grain in hand than formerly, and do not come to market whilst prices are low. Many of them, and particularly those who are landowners, hold over their corn; and among them large parcels may be collected.

The present wheat harvest is generally good, and in seven-eighths of this country, a fair crop is considered to have been obtained.

The district about Louvain is remarked for good wheats; the farmers prefer that market, and come in freely, because there is no regulation observed as to hours.

I shall continue to transmit such further information and documents as I may be able to obtain.

SIR, British Consulate General, Paris, 6th October 1826.

IN obedience to your directions conveyed to me in a Circular, dated June 29th, from Mr. John Bidwell, I have used my best endeavours to obtain the information respecting some particulars therein detailed, connected with the corn trade of this kingdom, as required by the House of Commons; and having for that purpose addressed myself to the Minister of the Interior, his Excellency gave immediate orders, that every information existing in the archives of his department should be furnished by that branch of it which is specially charged with making out the official monthly Returns I am in the habit of transmitting to the Foreign Office.

The documents herein enclosed, which I have delayed transmitting till now, in the expectation of being able to add further details, contain, as I have been assured by the head of that particular bureau, all the information it is in their power to give on the points stated in the Circular.

They consist of,

(A).—A memorandum of general observations from the Minister de l'Interieure, in answer to the queries put by me; from which it will be perceived, that the required statement of expenses affecting the passage of Corn from the interior to the ports, cannot be furnished, except at the out ports themselves; such statement will, no doubt, have been transmitted by His Majesty's Consuls respectively for the ports of their districts.

(B).—A Table marked N° 1, giving the Quantity of Wheat and Flour exported from France, from the Year 1793 to 1824, both years inclusive.

(C).—Table of the Average Prices of Grain throughout France, from the Year 1756 to 1825.

1°.—Quelle est la quotité des Frais à l'exportation des grains à l'étranger, depuis l'époque del 'achat sur les Marchés ou dans les greniers de l'intérieur, jusqu'au moment de leur sortie par les frontières de mer ou de terre?—

La quotité des divers frais dont il s'agit est extrêmement variable. Un grand nombre de circonstances peuvent influer sur le taux de ces frais ; les négocians en grains sont seuls en état d'avoir des données exactes sur le cours moyen de pareilles dépenses ; C'est auprès de ceux qui se livrent à ce commerce, dans les places maritimes ou de terre, qu'on pourrait obtenir les informations demandées.

Quant à l'administration, elle n'a, dans ses cartons, que des documens et des renseignemens informes ; c'est seulement pendant les années de pénurie, où il arrive de faire quelques achats de grains, qu'elle cherche à se procurer et à recueillir des données qui puissent la diriger dans ses opérations, ou lui fournir les moyens de contrôler celles qui ont eu lieu d'après ses ordres ; ainsi la commission des subsistances de 1816 et 1817, avait réuni plusieurs notions sur les frais dont il s'agit, mais de tels renseignemens, pris dans des années de cherté ne peuvent servir de règles pour les tems ordinaires.

Il n'existe point de droits de transit ni d'octroi. La circulation des grains à l'intérieur est libre, et les règles générales de la législation ne permettent pas de soumettre les grains à des droits d'octroi ; seulement, dans certaines localités, il existe des droits de halle, pour l'exposition des grains sur les Marchés.

A l'égard des droits des douanes, à l'exportation des grains à l'étranger, la loi du 28^e Avril 1816, les a fixés à 25^e les 100 kil. brut.

dated October 1826 :—One Inclosure.

SIR,

British Consulate, Caen, October 1826.

I HAVE the honour herewith to transmit to you, for the information of Mr. Secretary Canning, an Account of the Average Price of Wheat, Rye, Barley and Oats, that have been sold in the different markets throughout this department, since the commencement of the year 1812 to the 30th of June in the present year.

I was in hopes I should have been able to have obtained a return of the price of wheat from a much earlier period, and this is the reason of my having deferred replying to the Circular which I had the honour to receive from you, dated Foreign Office, June 29th. 1826, but the authorities here are so cautious and fearful of committing themselves in any way, that I could not possibly prevail on them to allow me to examine the records which have been preserved in their offices, of the prices of wheat and other kinds of grain; and it was not without a good deal of difficulty that I could even obtain the enclosed Return.

The exportation of grain from the ports within the district of my consulate, has heretofore been very limited; for owing to the great quantity of land that is employed in the cultivation of rape seed, (that crop yielding a greater profit to the farmer than any other) the supply of wheat, barley and oats raised in this district has never very far exceeded that required for its consumption; and unless a very great improvement takes place in husbandry, or some substitute is found for rape oil, I do not think that the exportation of grain from this part of France is likely to become at all considerable.

Copy of a LETTER from Sir Richard Clayton, dated Nantes,
17th September 1826 :—One Inclosure.

SIR, British Consulate, Nantes, 17th September 1826.

IN conformity to your Letter of the 29th June, I forward the Corn Returns as far back as there is in this department a possibility of getting them. In a former Dispatch I suggested for Mr. Canning's information, the difficulty there would be in the acquisition of any reports during the turbulent time of the French revolution. This part of the kingdom was, indeed, more exposed to it than any other and in the Vendeean war, where Nantes was so continually implicated, what I suspected had been the case, was literally so. Every public proceeding during that period was destroyed and burnt, as either party prevailed; and with every assistance from the prefet of the department and the mayor of Nantes, they could only furnish me with part of the enclosed Statements.

There is no duty whatsoever on corn in this country, except the trifling "droit de balance," as it is termed, which amounts to 25 centimes, or 100 kilogrammes, (about 200 lbs.) and is intended merely to defray the expense of weighing it, and to ascertain the quantity.

For the last five years I have been able to procure an account of the quantities sold in the various markets of the department.

Within the last four or five years there has been little exported from this department, there having been no foreign demand for it whatsoever, and small quantities only having been wanted for Marseilles and Brest. There is, therefore, nearly the produce of a whole harvest on hand, at present.

This department would of itself furnish annually, without inconvenience or effect on its own consumption, 150,000 hectolitres (about 50,000 quarters) of wheat; 500,000 hectolitres (166,666 $\frac{2}{3}$ quarters) of rye; and 80,000 hectolitres (26,666 $\frac{2}{3}$ quarters) of oats. Barley is only cultivated upon a small scale.

Exportation is prohibited when the price of wheat rises to 22 francs the hectolitre (or about 3 bushels).

The freight from Nantes to London or Liverpool varies from £. 1. to £. 1. 10s. per ton, according to the scarcity or number of vessels to take on board the cargo, with the addition of a bonus of 10 per cent to the captain.

I flatter myself I have been able to furnish as comprehensive a detail as Mr. Secretary Canning will receive from the other consulates. If the contrary should be the case, he will have the goodness to consider it to have arisen, not from any want of exertion, but the destruction in this department of every public record during the Vendeean war.

The amount of the expenses of the transport of corn from the interior to the port of Nantes, I have added in French, as there would be some difficulty in reducing the *technical* terms into English.

SIR, British Consulate, Charente, 23d August 1826.

I HAVE the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Circular of 29th June, enclosing copies of two Letters from the Board of Trade, respecting the prices of foreign corn and grain on the continent.

In answer thereto:—

The exportation of wheat in this department is only allowed when the price is under 20 francs per hectolitre. There are no transit duties thereon in the interior. The only charge is that of 25 centimes per 100 kilogrammes at the out port, with the addition of the *décime*, or a tenth, over and above.

The importation of said grain is allowed when the price is above 20 francs per hectolitre:—

My letter of 21 ultimo, contained the prices of the several sorts of corn and grain that have any value at present in this district.

As to the quantities annually exported, this department would not ship any corn for foreign ports, and little for the ports of France; there has been none shipped even for the latter since the year 1811, which is the cause of the low price of wheat in this district at present.

The average price of wheat in France cannot be obtained in this department for a series of years, and can only be had correctly of Mr. Petit, Chef de Bureau au Secrétariat de l'Intérieur, at Paris.

No exact account of the price of corn can be found in this department further back than 20 or 25 years, the average price from that time is from 18 to 20 francs per hectolitre (about 41*s.* 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ *d.* sterling per quarter Winchester), and according to the report of the oldest farmers, that is the average price for the last 50 or 60 years.

ACCORDING to the instructions contained in your Circular of the 29th] of June, I beg leave to forward to you herewith, for the information of Mr. Secretary Canning, a Return of the Average Prices of Corn and Grain from the Year 1796, it being quite impossible to procure accounts of an anterior date, all records and public documents, of every description, being either lost or destroyed during the French revolution.

The enclosed Account, as far as it goes, may be relied upon, having extracted it myself, from the records of the mayoralty of this city.

With respect to the quantities of grain exported annually from this port, it will be found by the enclosed Letter from the director of the customs, and the accompanying Enclosures, that this district does not produce a sufficiency for its consumption, and that they are in the habit of importing considerable quantities from Brittany and elsewhere.

There is no duty levied in the shape of transit duty in the interior; the charge at the out port is $5\frac{1}{2}$ sols per 100 kilogrammes, custom duty, as stated in my weekly Returns of Corn and Grain.

I BEG leave to acknowledge the receipt of your three Letters of the 29th June (Circular), and 17th and 18th August, which reached me by ship on the 6th of October; it has therefore been impossible for me to procure the "Account of the Average Prices of Wheat," required by your said Circular, until last week; I now transmit it to you enclosed, made up to the end of September, from the year 1700, with the exception of the years 1731, 1732, 1787 and 1788, which were not found in the records.

In further reply to your said Circular, I have to observe, that this province scarcely produces wheat sufficient for the consumption of its inhabitants, and a great deal is introduced from Castilla, particularly for the use of this town; the quality being in general far superior. Since the scarcity in the southern provinces, a great quantity has been, and continues to be brought down from the interior to be shipped at this port for the said provinces; but there is no permission at present for its exportation to foreign parts.

Besides wheat, maize is the only grain cultivated in Biscay, and is principally consumed in the districts where it is raised; it is now worth 24 s. per quarter.

In the regular Returns forwarded from this consulate, I shall be as particular as possible in giving every information in my power on this subject.

SIR,

Barcelona, 13th September 1826.

I HAVE the honour to enclose you a Statement of the Prices at which Wheat has been sold in this province, since the year 1792 up to the termination of the last year; the produce of the country, and that of foreign importation, is separately marked.

Corn is very scarce at present in Catalonia, a circumstance which, in all probability, would be more severely felt by the labouring classes, was it not for the frequent supplies smuggled into the country, and retailed at a fair and moderate price: the contraband system is now carried on to such an extent, that scarcely a day passes without a vessel landing her prohibited cargo on the coast, in open day, under the eyes of the custom-house officers, and often within a very short distance of Barcelona.

An extensive corn speculation is also carried on here by some of the French authorities, upon the plea of supplying the French troops; but it is the general opinion, thus entered at this port, that the French troops are not the only persons who profit by this free importation.

SIR, British Consulate, Nice, 1st of October 1826.

IN reference to your Circular Letter dated 29th ult. I have the honour to transmit to you, the *Account of the Prices* of the several sorts of Grain, and other *Articles*, the raw produce of agriculture of this country, free of all charges, as paid to the farmer during the preceding *three months*; I beg also to forward, an Account of the Average Prices of Wheat in this district from the present time back to the year 1797, being the latest period to which I have able to procure accurate information.

Adverting to Mr. Canning's request to procure and transmit to him an account of the quantities of the several sorts of grain exported annually from ports of this district, I beg leave to observe, that in consequence of this being a very hilly country, and entirely occupied by olive plantations, the produce of wheat is not equal to the consumption, and there is therefore none exported.

This Account properly belongs to the first set of the Consuls Returns of the Prices of Corn and Grain, &c.; but, from the reasons hereinafter expressed, the same is not considered of sufficient consequence to be taken any notice of.

SIR,

Bastia (Corsica), October 26th, 1826.

IN answer to the questions contained in the Circular dated, "Foreign Office, June 29th, 1826," which I received on the 2nd inst. from Paris, through the deputy of this department, I have the honour to state:—

That there is no example of passage of corn through the ports of this island, neither could such passage easily be permitted, on account of the want of buildings appropriated to hold depôts, and that in consequence there exist no regulations about expenses affecting such passage of corn.

That no corn or sort of grain is ever exported from Corsica to foreign ports, because in the rare cases of an excess of the harvest over the demand, (which has taken place only twice within the ten years that I know this island, and never before) the small superfluity of corn is not allowed to be shipped to others, but to French ports.

That there exist no records, either public or private, showing the prices of wheat as far back as the year 1700, and that a diligent research has hitherto only been able to furnish the information contained in the Enclosure, N° 1.

I have also the honour to transmit on this occasion, the Return of the actual Prices of several sorts of Grain, &c. in the Enclosure N° 2, but beg leave to repeat the observation, that these prices are rather taken from conclusion than from facts; because the generality of the inhabitants of this island, inclusive of those who live in towns, are small proprietors, and that therefore the little corn trade which exists is extremely limited, almost imperceptible, and of an arbitrary nature; which circumstance will also plead for my being precluded from fulfilling regularly my duty to send the usual Returns.

SIR,

British Consulate, Genoa, 26th August 1826.

IN obedience to your Circular Letter of the 29th of June, which I received on the 24th of July, I have the honour to enclose the Returns N° 1 and 2, which will show the exact quantities of grain annually exported from this port between the 1st July 1819 and the 30th of June 1826. I am sorry the director of the custom-house here could furnish no information prior to the year 1819. Under the heads of *Remarks*, I have fully stated the charges on exporting and re-exporting grain.

Genoa is the only trading port within this consulate. When grain is sent from one place to another, it is accompanied with a custom-house paper, called, "Bolla di Circolazione," without paying duty; there is only the charge for transporting grain, which is according to the distance.

It was with great difficulty I could procure the average prices of wheat since the year 1790, as there are no records kept in the custom house of such prices, I have obtained the information in the return N° 2. from an old mercantile house of this city.

REMARKS:—The duty of exportation on all sort of grain, when permitted, is 5 centimes per decimal quintal. The exportation is at present permitted.

The duty of re-exportation, which is called "Ostellagio," is 35 centimes on every decimal quintal of wheat, and 20 centimes on any other sort of grain; which duty is paid on shipping.

The expenses, besides the abovesaid duty on shipping any sort of grain, amount from 10 to 11 sous of Genoa per mina, when the grain so shipped is withdrawn from the storehouses in the town. If transhipped from on board, the expenses, not including the above-specified duty, amount to only 8 sous per mina: if a vessel sails with the same cargo, there are no charges; but if any part of the cargo is discharged here, then the fourth of the before-mentioned duty of "Ostellagio" is charged on the quantity left on board.

The duty on exporting rice is 3 francs and 35 centimes per decimal quintal; but there is a drawback of 3 francs and 30 centimes on each decimal quintal of rice when it is exported by Sardinian vessels, or by vessels of a nation where no difference of duty exists, whether the rice is imported by native or Sardinian vessels.

The duchy of Genoa produces very little wheat. The Genoese make use of wheat, produce of the island of Sardinia, which pay only one franc duty of entry per mina.

One mina is reckoned to be equal to a decimal quintal; 100 minas are equal to 42 and $\frac{2}{3}$ Winchester quarters.

The quantity of grain now in deposit here is about 260,000.

dated 13th October 1826.

SIR,

Leghorn, 13th October 1826.

I ENCLOSE an Account of Grain, and the other agricultural productions of Tuscany, for the three months ending the 30 ult.

The wheat in regard to quantity may be considered a fair average crop; but, in consequence of the excessive rains, the grain is much lighter than usual. Of oats, barley and beans, the crops have been satisfactory, and that of Indian corn most abundant.

This not being a corn country (the produce being insufficient for its consumption,) there is seldom any exportation of the growth of the state; but, when such does take place, neither transit nor other duty is paid.

Foreign grain imported into Leghorn, pays a duty of seven soldi (equal to 2 $\frac{2}{3}$ d. sterling) per sack, and one soldo further per sack, when exported.

Of the small quantity of Tuscan wheat exported, no register is kept; nor is there any record from which the average price can, for any length of time back, be ascertained.

Copy of a LETTER from His Majesty's Consul at Venice,
dated October 6th, 1826.

SIR,

Venice, 6th October 1826.

IN transmitting you the usual weekly Statement of the Prices of Corn and Grain in this market during the quarter now just expired, I beg to state, with reference to that part of your Circular of the 29th June last, requiring a specification of every charge affecting the passage of corn and grain through the ports of this consulate, that every kind, the produce of the Austrian dominions, may pass through these states free of any charge, in the form of transit or other duty, either in the interior or at the out port, excepting a small duty on exportation, the tariff of which was transmitted by Mr. Tatam the 3d January last.

Foreign corn and grain coming to the Venetian ports, for the purpose of exportation, may pass through the Austrian states, under certain regulations, *free of all duty*, whether import, transit or export.

As many difficulties present themselves in obtaining the other points of information required by the above-mentioned Circular, I am necessitated to beg further indulgence before I can reply thereto.

30.—TRIESTE.

Copy of a LETTER from His Majesty's Vice Consul at Trieste,
dated October 12th, 1826.

SIR,

Consular Office, Trieste, 12th October 1826.

IN conformity to the instructions contained in a Circular Letter dated Foreign Office, June 29th, 1826, I have the honour to transmit such information on the subjects therein mentioned as I have been able to procure; and as Trieste (where I reside) is the only port within the district of this consulate at which any considerable quantities of corn are shipped for exportation, what I have to report will be chiefly referable to *it*.

Duties and Charges
on Grain.

The first point to which I am directed to attend to is, "The Expense of every kind affecting the passage of Corn through the ports of this consulate, whether levied in the shape of Transit Duty in the interior, or of Charge at the out port."

Grain shipped at this port is the produce,

1st.—Of Friuli, or other of the nearer provinces of the kingdom of Venice and Lombardy :

2dly.—Of Romagna, Ancona, Urbino, and other parts of the papal states :

3dly.—Of Hungary, and more particularly of the Bannat and the adjacent districts :

4thly.—Of the Russian provinces bordering on the Black Sea, chiefly from Odessa.

Lastly, of Egypt.

Hence it appears, that the corn exported from this place is in part re-shipped, being previously brought hither by sea, and that which comes from Hungary is subject to land-carriage. Notwithstanding this circumstance, considerable quantities of corn have occasionally been sent from this port to Spain, Portugal, the Ionian Islands, and also to Genoa, Leghorn and Marseilles.

Grain, in whatever ships it may be brought, is, at this port, subject to no duties, either of entry or sortie, excepting only *that* of $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent *ad valorem*, payable on all goods and merchandize indiscriminately, and which is not of the nature of customs, but rather to be considered as a port charge; neither grain or other merchandize is, however, liable to this duty, if declared for transit; the charge applying only to articles destined for consumption within the Austrian states, without being re-shipped: and, by a special permission, goods are allowed to be sent to the fair of Sinigaglia, in the papal states, and if there unsold, to be returned to this port free of duty.

Wheat may be brought from Friuli, Venice and Ancona at a trifling charge. The expense of land-carriage from Hungary is greater; but the first cost of corn in the Bannat is generally so low, that it might be shipped in the ports of the Adriatic at an equal, if not a lower price, than the produce of Venice or Romagna. There is an excellent road over the mountain-country between Fiume and Carlstadt, the tolls on which, now rather high, would be reducible in proportion to the increase of traffic upon it. The abundance of horses and other cattle for draught, the cheapness of provisions and fodder, and the low price of labour, would facilitate the transport either to Fiume or Trieste.

Grain from the Black Sea, or from Egypt, re-shipped here, is subject to the charge of freight from the different ports respectively, to insurance, port charges, and commission; but there is no duty, either of transit or other kind, payable thereon at this port.

Prices of Grain.

The price of grain at this port is an aggregate of the first cost at the place of growth, and of the expense of transport; and whether derived from Hungary by land, or by sea from South Russia, Egypt or Italy, its price here is nearly the same, the difference in the first cost being compensated by that in the freight and charges.

For the present current prices of grain, I beg leave to refer to the usual monthly Returns.

Annexed hereto is a Table, showing the Average Price of Wheat at this place for a series of 25 years, from 1801 to 1825 inclusive.

I have not been able to extend it further back, for want of authentic documents; nor have I been successful in my endeavours for procuring exact accounts of the quantity of grain annually exported from hence since the beginning of the last century. It would not in fact be at all interesting, even if it could be ascertained.

Trieste, though a place of great antiquity, was not until lately of any importance in a commercial respect, its trade during the first half of the eighteenth century was extremely limited. It then drew its supplies of grain, as it does at present, from the neighbouring provinces of Italy and Hungary; and it does not appear that any corn was exported from hence to foreign parts in quantity sufficient to merit notice.

The events of the war of the European powers against the French republic, the consequent blockade of the principal ports of the continent, and the fall of Venice and Ragusa, contributed to raise Trieste to its present importance. Its trade and population rapidly increased, and though it suffered much during the French occupation, it is now in a very thriving state.

With respect to grain, it has occasionally carried on a very considerable trade in wheat, imported from Odessa and Alexandria, not only for home consumption but also for exportation to Spain, Portugal and other countries. During the war this trade was very brisk. In the last years of scarcity, 1815 to 1818, the importations were excessive, and the sudden fall of prices had the same effect here as in other parts of Europe: many capitalists and merchants, speculators in corn, were ruined, and since that period little business has been done in this article.

Should the ports of Great Britain be opened to the introduction of foreign grain, there is no doubt but much would be shipt at Trieste. Maize has been lately exported, and can be delivered in England or Ireland at 20 s. per quarter, all charges included. Good wheat might also be supplied (free of duty) at about 30 s., and as the prices in Germany would, in case of a demand, speedily rise, and neither the Black Sea nor the Baltic is navigable the whole year, it is highly probable that corn, the produce of Hungary and Italy, shipped in the ports of the Adriatic, would be able to compete both in quality and price with that of any other country.

Copy of a DESPATCH from His Majesty's Consul at Fiume, dated August 14th, 1826 :—One Inclosure.

SIR,

Fiume, 14th August 1826.

I HAD the honour on the 2d inst. to acknowledge the receipt of your Circular of the 29th June, and also copies of two Letters from the Board of Trade, with the Resolution of the House of Commons for obtaining the most extensive and accurate information respecting the Prices of Foreign Corn and Grain on the continent, &c. &c.

For which object I had solicited, by a note to the governor, that referenee might be had to the registry of this district for obtaining the information required ; and having now received the governor's note in answer, have the honour to transmit a translation of the same from the Italian, as follows :

No. 195.

(Notc.)

“ By your esteemed note of the 1st inst. you request of me to communicate the prices of wheat for a series of years in this government district, as also to indicate the quantity of wheat annually exported from hence.

“ With regard to the first demand, you can best obtain the desired information from the merchants ; and with referenee to the second, I have the honour to assure you, that in the years 1780 and 1782, there was exported from this Littorale, more than one million metzen of Hungarian wheat, and that this quantity, and even more, could be now exported from the Hungarian kingdom (a).

“ And as relative to the existing current prices of wheat from Hungary, I find it a duty to inform you, that it is now in treaty on the part of the kingdom, to obtain the Private Linigia Road (b), and to abolish the present existing toll, which on its taking place, as it is hoped, our wheat with regard to the price can be in competition with that of Odessa, as it is also in point of quality, being much superior.

On which subject I am given to understand, that many of the old records and documents of the government have been lost during the time this district was occupied by the French, from the years 1809 to 1813 ; I have, however, obtained from a merchant, the average prices of wheat (which is the principal grain for exportation) from the year 1788 to the present, as annexed. As the ports of this district are now a part of the Hungarian kingdom, there are no transit duties on the passage of the corn from the interior, nor other than 1 karantan per 100 funti weight (123 $\frac{7}{8}$ pounds English) which is about 1 $\frac{2}{3}$ d. per quarter, as an exportation duty, which is mentioned in my quarterly Return, &c.

(a) One million metzen makes about 236,500 quarters of our new measure.

(b) By the nation purchasing this road, so as to be free of toll, except for repairs, will make a difference of about from two to three shillings per quarter less in the price of wheat when brought to Fiume.

It is also to be remarked, that the navigation to and from the ports of this district, and Adriatic Sea, is by no means difficult or dangerous, but easy, with the common necessary precautions of navigation, and therefore much safer, and also nearer to the respective ports in the Mediterranean, as also to the coast of Portugal, France, England, &c. than from the port of Odessa in the Black Sea, in which navigation there is danger and risque; consequently the expenses of freight of insurance will be always less from the ports of this district to any port either within or without the Mediterranean, than from Odessa to any of such ports.

32.—MESSINA.

Extract of a DISPATCH from His Majesty's Consul at Messina,
dated 27th of September 1826.

“ YOUR communications have engaged my attention, which treat of the quantities and prices of the several sorts of grain annually exported from Sicily. I beg leave to annex the translation of a Letter, which I received on that subject from a very intelligent Sicilian gentleman who resides in Catania, a part whence considerable shipments of grain are made, whenever there is a demand in a foreign market. That translation I will thank you to lay before the Right Honourable Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, as by it he will see how difficult it is to procure accurate information, and that in procuring it to the extent required in the third paragraph of your Letter of the 29th June, weighty expenses must be incurred.

“ It may happen that His Majesty's government is not aware that corn and all kinds of grain are brought from the coasts, and interior of the island, into the city and port of Messina for the supply of the population, as this district does not furnish a sufficient quantity for the local consumption, consequently no kind of grain is ever exported directly from this port; farther, in the great earthquake of 1783, the city records were almost totally lost, and those extant, are for a very short period.”

Sir,

Catania, 10th September 1826.

I learn that you are desirous of obtaining, if not a precise, an approximate statement of the quantities of wheat, barley, oats, rye, rice, and other grain produced in the ear, exported from this island, from the “ Carricatori ” of Terranova, Alicanta, Girgenti, Siculiana, Castellamare and Termini (*a*), from the year 1700 to the present time, together with the respective prices in each year; as also the duties payable in the interior, and at the ports of exportation; but if such a report cannot be had for so long a period, to have it from the most remote term for which it can be obtained.

I should have attended with much pleasure to your request, had it been in my power to give you satisfactory information, but neither myself nor any other person in this island can comply with your request, not even in approximation; and if any one has the hardihood to say he can do it, it must be done in the way I am about to describe, or he will give you a fictitious account, instead of a true and effective statement.

(*a*) Carricatori—Depôts and loading-places on the coast, of which there are six; vide above.

To execute the undertaking with any degree of success, it will be necessary to employ some respectable person who has friends in the island, with whom he must confer personally at the "Carricatori," and at those places where the registry of the annual exportation is preserved by the keeper of the archives, using no little application and industry, and perhaps he would require the assistance of one or more intelligent clerks; he must also pay the regular fees to the keeper of the archives, should his certificate be required.

Respecting the prices in each year, I have to remark, that annually in Sicily, in every community where there is a "Carricatore," a council of the municipal officers is convened; this council fixes the prices of the different grains which are sold for the relative population, and different prices for such quantities as are sold to be exported from the "Carricatori" coastwise; these rates regulate the prices of those purchases that have been made, by advancing a sum of money in anticipation, on account thereof; the seller being bound to consign the quantity sold at the prices which have been fixed by the municipalities or councils, on getting in the ensuing harvest; the prices, however, at which the speculators who have purchased grain resell it to the merchant who buys for exporting it to a foreign market, have always varied, generally with an augmentation, sometimes at double the first price, but seldom more; scarcely ever less than the first cost; but of the prices at which exportations from the kingdom have been made, it is almost an impossibility to obtain an approximate estimate.

By the registrar of the archives of this municipality, I am informed, that from the registries thereof the prices may be ascertained even so far back as 1700, if then they will be acceptable you may command me, but to every other part an intelligent person must be sent, or you must have in every place a friend who is willing, and who knows how to execute the business with exactness.

Copy of a LETTER from His Majesty's Consul at Philadelphia ;
dated August 23d, 1826 :—With two Enclosures.

SIR,

Philadelphia, August 23d, 1826.

I HAVE to acknowledge your Circular Letter of 29th June on the 16th instant.

I have the honour to state, for the information of His Majesty's government, that the prices put down in the weekly Returns, sent regularly from this office, include all charges on grain, except the expense of shipping, which is very trifling. No duty exists in the United States on any of its produce exported to any part of the world, and this exemption is secured by the constitution.

The export of grain from the United States for a series of years has been so trifling that it scarcely deserves notice. It is but very lately that accurate accounts have been kept of the exports from this country ; and I have taken an account, from the reports of the secretary of the Treasury; of its extent from the year 1822 to the present date, by which it will be seen that the whole exports are quite unimportant. This Statement is enclosed, and is marked (A).

A report of a Committee on Commerce was presented to Congress the 15th March 1822, annexed to which I find a Statement of the price of Flour from July 1802 to January 1822, at the market of Baltimore, a copy of which I send herewith, marked (B). In looking over this Statement, it will not escape notice how fluctuating the market had been, and still continues to be, according to the demand from foreign countries.

I know of no record kept here of the state of exports except at the custom house, and I have at various periods endeavoured to procure a perusal of both that, and imports, without success.

The Statements now sent are from the documents laid before Congress, and comprehend the exports from the whole country.

I would here beg leave to remark, that the scantiness of exports in grain is not from the capability of the soil to produce extensively, but from the want of foreign demands; and if the ports in England were open for the admission of American wheat and flour, the farmers of this country would turn their attention to the cultivation of grain in preference to raising so much tobacco and cotton as they are now compelled to do, and which has extended to North Carolina, Virginia and Maryland, in the absence of a market for corn, which was ever considered as the natural product of those states.

It is quite clear that too much tobacco and cotton are raised for the demand.

The extent to which the cultivation of wheat, barley, oats and Indian corn could be carried on in North Carolina, Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania and New York is incalculable, if they could find a tolerable market, and they would be very glad to take moderate prices. It is entirely owing to the want of a market that the cultivation in those articles is so limited.

I have read the communication from the Board of Trade with attention, in regard to getting Returns so far back as the year 1700. That must apply to European countries, and not to these states.

There were no regular returns made to any department in this country previous to the adoption of the federal constitution in 1789, and even after that period it was long before a system was digested to regulate the commercial concerns of the nation. It is now, however, very accurately attended to, and the annual report of the Secretary of the Treasury to Congress can be relied upon as authentic.

Copy of a DISPATCH from Consul Gilpin; dated Newport, (R. I.), August 17, 1826.

SIR, British Consulate, Newport, 17th August 1826.

I HAVE the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Circular of the 29th June, in which you inform me that His Majesty's government are still desirous to obtain the most extensive and accurate information respecting the price of foreign corn, &c.

In answer to which I beg leave to assure you that no wheat is raised in the state of Rhode Island, nor is there any imported. The whole consumption in this state of wheat flour is imported from other states in barrels, and but little re-exported, chiefly to the West Indies.

Under these circumstances no record exists of the average price of wheat within this consular district.

Indian corn (maize) is the grain chiefly raised here, which is generally used among the lower classes for bread; but of this little is exported, as the production of it does not much exceed the consumption, especially since the increased population in the manufacturing districts. The average price is about a dollar per bushel.

Rye, barley and oats are also raised within this district, but very little of either is exported.

Rye is used for bread, and for the distilleries, which require considerable importations from other states.

A fly has latterly attacked the barley crops, which has prevented the farmers from sowing so much as they used to do; what barley is raised is bought up by the brewers, who also import a considerable quantity. It has no price at present.

It appears to me that the farmers have latterly turned their attention more to sheep than grain, as the wool meets a ready market from the manufacturers.

With these remarks, I trust I have complied, as far as I possibly could, with your Circular, for the information of His Majesty's government.

Copy of a LETTER from Consul Buchanan, dated New York,
October 1st, 1826:—One Inclosure.

Sir, British Consulate, New York, 1st October 1826.

IN obedience to the Circular dated 29th of June, which I have had the honour to receive, requiring in addition to the particulars respecting foreign corn, which I have been in the habit of forwarding, that I should state every expense affecting the passage of corn within my consulate, whether in the shape of transit duty or charge at out ports; also to use my utmost exertions to transmit an account of the prices of the several sorts of grain, and quantities thereof exported annually from this port during a series of years; and to procure the average price of wheat in the state of New York, as far as practicable, from the year 1700.

In reply I have the honour to state, that there is not any charge of transit duty in the interior, or charge at any out port, for the exportation of grain; there are not any regular returns kept in this city of the prices of grain, to which I could resort with the hope of any accurate return; the average price of wheat in this city for the last 30 years, I have alone been able to obtain by examining the oldest file of newspapers in this city. The return of the quantity of grain exported cannot be procured for a greater number of years than set forth in the enclosed Return, by reason of the removal of the custom-house documents, nor where such returns kept with any accuracy until lately; but the officers of the customs connected with that department state, that returns have been made for a number of years to the department of state at Washington.

36.—NORFOLK. (U. S.)

Copy of a DISPATCH from Consul Gray, dated Norfolk,
15th September 1826.

SIR, British Consulate, Norfolk, 15th September 1826.

I HAVE now the honour, in compliance with your instructions, to state to you, as the result of my inquiries, and the best information I have been able to collect upon the several particulars embraced in Mr. Bidwell's Circular of the 29th of June last, relative to the different sorts of grain produced in this district, that, as regards the first point, corn of every description is usually delivered by the farmer in his own waggons (free of any extra expense to the purchaser) at the different mills, or, if to be transported to an out-port, at the nearest "landings" of the rivers, where vessels are in waiting to receive and convey it to some of the other states for a market, the general freight for which is about eight cents per bushel. There is no "transit duty," or other charge upon it "in the interior" whatever.

In regard to the second point, I am to observe, that very little grain of any sort was *raised* in Virginia until after the Revolution, and none *exported* therefrom prior to the year 1785, at which period the price of wheat was about 75 cents per bushel (of 60 lbs.), and Indian corn 30 to 35 cents, which rates continued until a year or two after the war between Great Britain and France took place, when the former rose to about 1 \$50 and fluctuated from that to 2 \$25 (and the latter in the same proportion, until the peace of 1814). For the last ten years wheat has averaged about 90 cents, and Indian corn 40 to 45.

Since the year 1785 the quantity of both these articles, raised in this state, has been gradually increasing; and it is estimated that rather better than three millions of bushels of the first, and about two millions of the second, have been *exported* annually for the last ten years, principally, however, ground into flour, and to the neighbouring states, and but a small proportion direct to foreign markets. There are also about 20,000 bushels of barley, averaging 65 cents per bushel, and probably about the same quantity of black-eyed pease (average price about 75 cents), exported annually, but no other sorts of grain.

I do not find that any records, either of the prices or quantities of corn produced in the state, have been kept; and the present information is derived, therefore, from private sources only, but at the same time from persons, I have every reason to believe, well informed upon the subject.

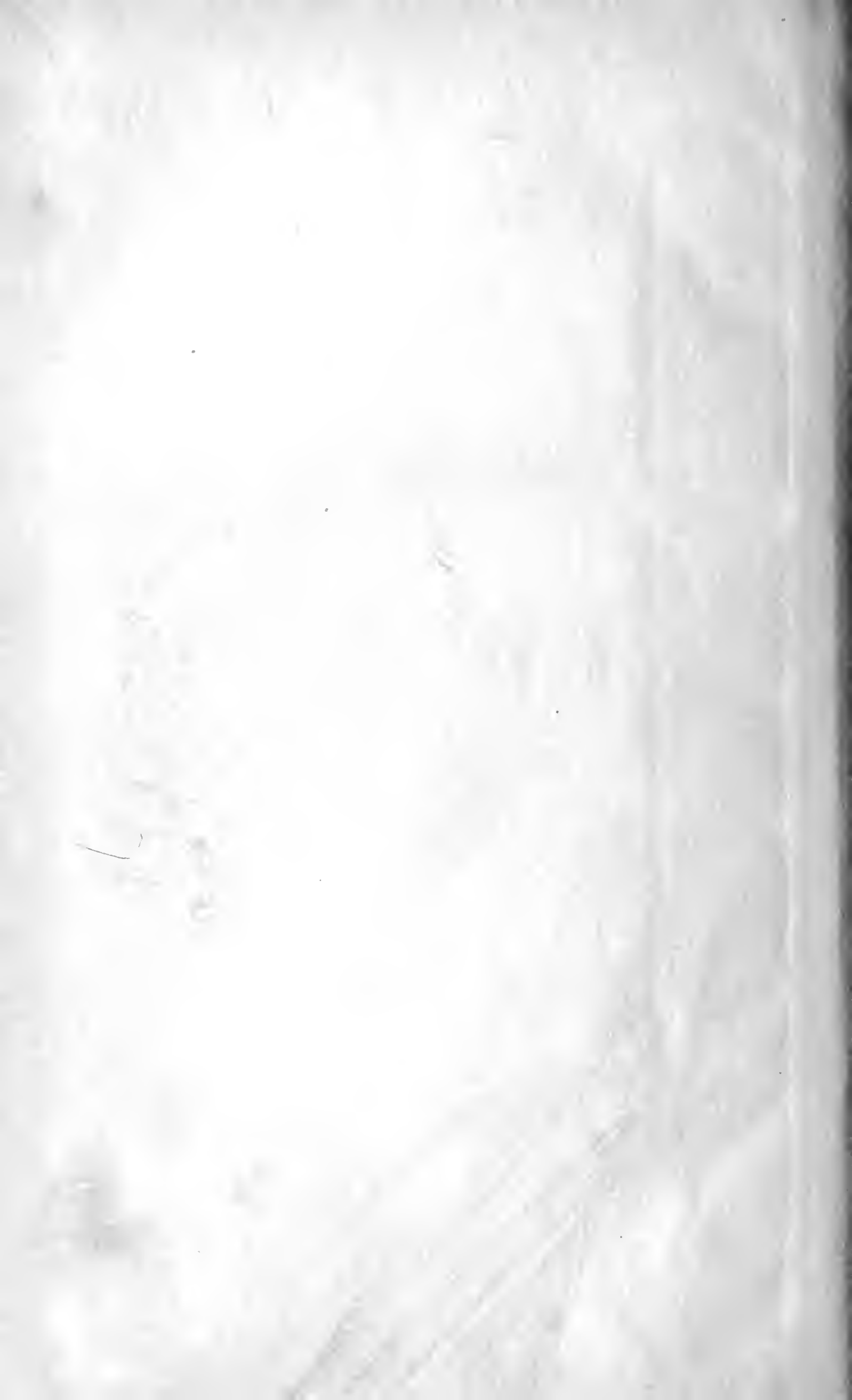
