What are the eligibility requirements?

The UIC requires FSRP students to be registered for minimum number of credit hours (eight in the fall and spring: six in the summer). The UIC requires FSRP students to:

- read relevant materials to supplement lectures;
- successfully pass written, oral, and practical examinations;
- successfully complete the FSRP with a grade of Satisfactory in the academic course; and
- engage in meaningful didactic experiences during each full work week while under direction and/or supervision of a forensic science training coordinator.

Is financial assistance available?

The Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) has developed the Illinois Forensic Science Grant Program for qualified applicants. Students may be eligible for expenses up to \$30,000. Students must agree to a work commitment with the ISP for not less than four years upon graduation from the UIC. If students are offered a position by the ISP, failure to honor the work commitment requires students to repay the amount of the award, prorated, according to the fraction of the obligation not completed.
