Forms of Policies.

The Penn probably issues more different varieties of policies than any other company. It provides every safe and commendable form. The most common are as follows:

Ordinary Life, supposed to require payment of premiums during life, with amount payable at death.

Limited Life, which are full paid in ten, fifteen, or twenty years, with amount of policy payable at death.

Endowment, which are full paid in terms of ten, fifteen, or twenty years, with amount of policy payable at end of term or at prior death.

Trust Certificates, which may be written upon any one of the above forms, but providing that the amount of policy shall be paid to the beneficiary in annual instalments instead of one sum, thereby avoiding the necessity of safely and profitably investing a large amount at death.

Endowment Investment Bonds, allowing several options at maturity, one of which guarantees four per cent. interest upon the face of bond and accumulations; this may also be written with the face value of the bond payable in instalments to beneficiary in case of death of the insured prior to maturity.

The Different Plans

Upon which the foregoing forms of policies may be written are as follows:

The Annual Dividend, under which dividends may be used annually after the first year either to reduce the premiums or to purchase additional insurance. This is often the best plan for the insured, but has been practically discarded by several companies, whose dividends have declined with increasing expenses.

The Accumulated Surplus, under which the payment of dividends is deferred for a certain term of years, when several valuable options are given to the survivor, who then not only receives the dividends belonging to his policy, but his proportion of the dividends of those whose policies were discontinued during the term.

The Five Year Option, allowing privileges similar to the above every five years, and also providing that after the fifth year all dividends earned shall be paid with the policy if death occur during any period.
