PREFACE

PLACING THIS FOLIO COLLECTION before the public, the compiler takes pleasure in stating that it is the only complete collection ever issued, containing, as it does, all the Missions of Callfornia, together with the "Home of Ramona," the bath house used by the Mission Fathers over one hundred years ago, and the celebrated chair imported from Spain by Father Junipero Serra.

The Missions herein represented are located about forty miles apart, ten having been founded by Father Jumpero Serra and the others by his successors, all of whom have long since passed away.

Many of the Missions themselves are now in ruins nothing but mounds of adobe marking the place where once they stood—thus making this collection a valuable agency for perpetuating their memory, as well as a charming souvenir of California during the most poetic epoch in its history.

SAN TERNANDO REY Founded September 8, 1707 - Tocated at San Fernando Los Angeles Counts





SAN DIEGO DE ALCALA Founded July 16, 1769. Located six miles north from San Diego.





SAN LUIS REY DE FRANCIA
Founded June 13, 1708. Located three miles east of Oceanside, San Diego County.





SAN ANTONIO DE PALA
Founded 1816. Mission station attached to San Luis Rey and located at Pala, fifteen miles southeast from Fallbrook.





SANTA YSABEL

Mission station located twenty-five miles northeast from Foster, San Diego County.





SAN JUAN CAPISTRANO
Founded November 1, 1776. Located at San Juan Capistrano, Orange County

SAN LUIS OBISPO DE TOLOSO Founded September 1, 1772. Located at San Luis Obispo.






SAN MIGUEL Founded July 25, 1707. Located on the Salinas river, six miles north from Paso Robles.

Founded September 25, 1791. Located at Santa Cruz.






SAN CARLOS DE MONTEREY OR CARMEL Founded June 3, 1270. Located on the Carmel Bay, six miles from Monterey.

Fininded Friber G. Fin. Located on the Salinas river, six miles (1 = S) edad






SANTA CLARA

Founded June 11, 1797. Located in Alameda County, forty miles north from San Jose.






SAN FRANCISCO DE SOLANO Founded August 25, 1823. Located at Sonoma, twelve miles west from Napa
