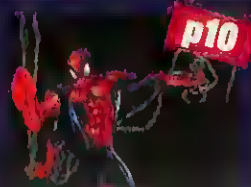

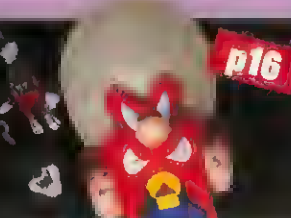

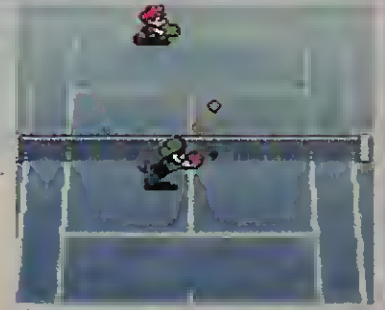

At the start you'll have the choice of either Alex or Nina and it's your mission to become the finest player in the academy.

As you win matches, you'll be rewarded with experience points which can be used to improve your player's skills and give you the added edge to be the best.

Let's get down to the show court and have a taste of what you can expect from this mind blowing sports sim...



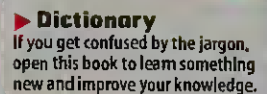
▲ **Exhibition**

Grab your Link Cable and bombard your opponent from the baseline or take 'em from the net.

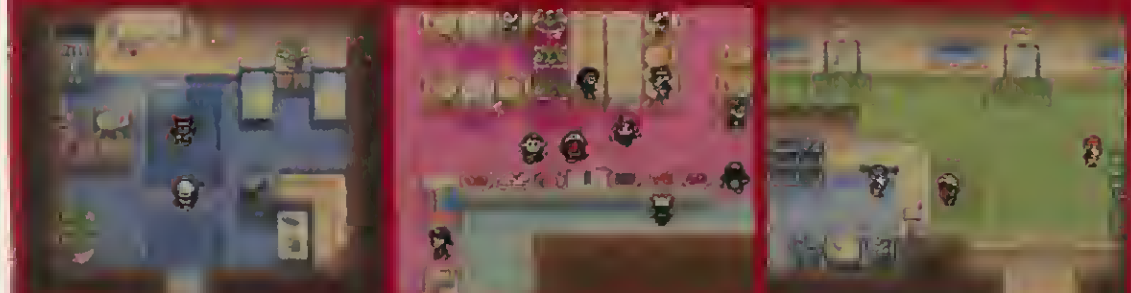


▲ **Dictionary**

Go on tour

Travelling around the colourful world of the tennis academy will take ages, as there are plenty of areas to explore. Each day begins in your dormitory where you room with another tennis player who also acts as your doubles partner. On your travels, you can pop in the café to grab a bite to eat. There's a repair shop where you can improve your racquet and there's even a gym, too.



▲ Each day begins in your room which you share with your doubles partner. If you fancy a spot of two on two, he'll follow you around the academy.

▲ Better eat healthily if you want to be a top sports star. Make sure you have a chat with the other diners and you might learn a thing or two.

▲ As you progress, you can pop into the repair shop and get your racquet improved. Excellent! Now you can really slam home those winners.

Winning shots

If you've already been playing the N64 version of Mario Tennis, you'll be right at home with the controls on your GB Color. Hitting **A** lets rip with a booming serve or top spin, while **B** hits a

net scraping slice shot or slower serve. Hit the ball at the top of your service throw and you can even crash home an ace, if you time it correctly that is!



▲ Hit the ball at the top of the serve and DK will have no chance with that ace.

▲ To keep your opponent at the back of the court, hit 'em with a series of top spin drives across court.

▲ That was close! Keep the ball low over the net and you can rush in and volley the return shot away.

▲ For that extra bit of power, double tap the shot button as you hit the ball to send it zipping back.



SOUNDS This makes a change for the Game Boy Color. Cute, bouncy and tunes that'll have you whistling all day long.

Build it up

You'll begin life as a tennis player in the Junior Class. It's here that you must prove your skills and work your way up.

By defeating certain players and challenges you'll get points to build up your experience in either spin, control, power or speed.

Graduate and you'll move to Senior Class where harder players are waiting to defeat you. Only the best of the best can then move onto the hardest challenge in Mario Tennis, the Varsity Court.



◀ Talk to the people who are standing around the courts and they will take up your challenge for a game of singles. To start with they're easy to beat, but just wait for the later challengers!

▶ Hard courts are the easiest. The high bounce makes for top rallies.

Moves to master

To become the best in the academy you'll need to mix the play to keep your opponents on their toes.

Just hitting basic shots won't get you very far, but build up your trick shots and you'll paste them every time.

By holding down **A** or **B** as the ball flies over the net you can charge up and smack back a really impressive shot.

You can even send a lob or a sneaky drop shot over the net to fox your rival and win the match in style.



▲ DK's hit a deep volley, but has left the court exposed. Hold down **A** and your player will flash as they charge up a beauty.



▲ As the ball bounces up, let go of **A** and you'll unleash an all powerful shot that will leave them standing. Poor Donkey Kong's got no chance.



▲ Now just sit back and watch the ball cruise away for a winner. DK might be tough, but he's looking a right chump as that sails past.



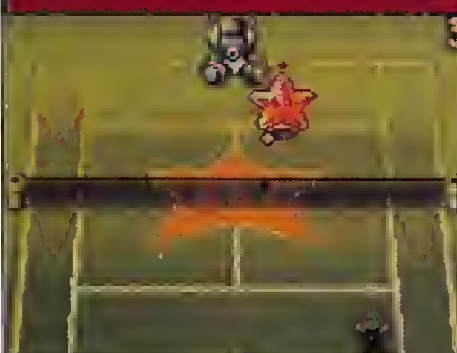
Groovy games

For a bit of added fun, Mario Tennis is bursting with extra challenges for all you gamers to enjoy. There are nine mini events to play in, but only three are available from the start of the game. Beat them and you'll open up some cool secrets, so here's the lowdown on some of the best...



Target Shot

Player Baby Mario
Your aim To hit the ball back into the highlighted area. Don't miss or you'll have to start again.

Player Luigi
Your aim Return the ball through the stars to pick up points. The balls come thick and fast, so be quick!



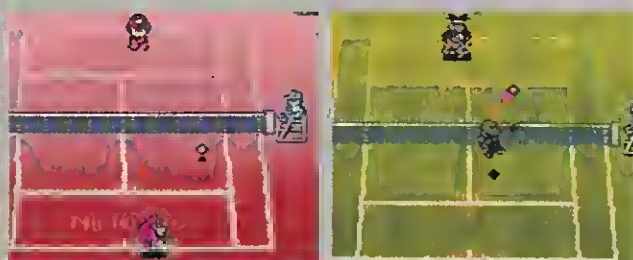
Banana Target

Your aim Hit the ball against the moving squares. Some walls have arrows on them which lob the ball over you.

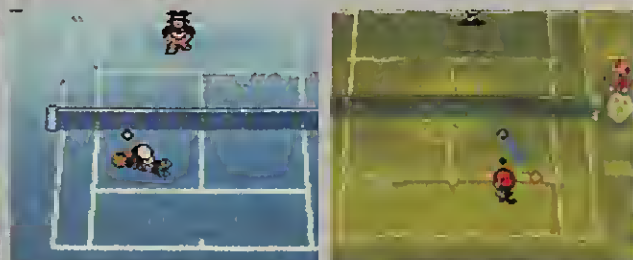
ONE PLAYER → Becoming a star takes ages and later challenges are tough. Using the Transfer Pak certainly adds to the lastability.

Keep an eye on the ball

The speed of the ball in Mario Tennis is absolutely incredible and you'll need to be a pretty nippy mover to reach the ball in time. But what causes you the most problems are the different courts you'll play on. There are four to get to grips with, hard, clay, grass and carpet. Hard courts have the highest bounce and are great for rookies, while grass is extremely fast as the ball bounces long and low. Hidden away in the game are some cool cartoon courts, but you'll need to be good to unlock the little crackers.



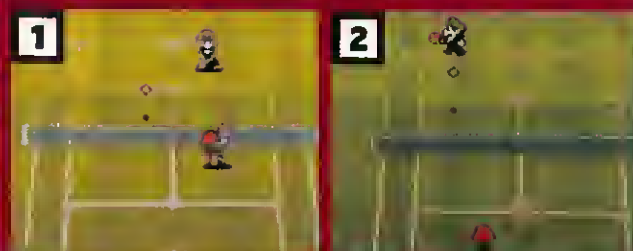
▲ The clay courts are very tricky to master. The ball bounces up slowly, so get ready to react if it drops short.
▲ On grass courts, hit a wide serve and rush in to volley to the opposite corner. This leaves your rival dead and buried.



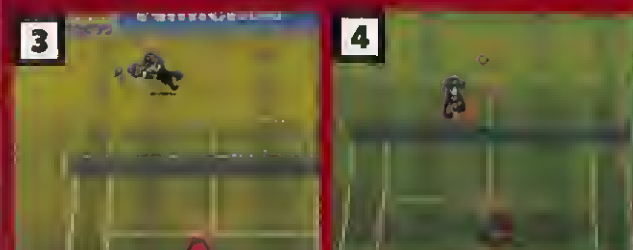
▲ Hard courts have great bounce and are an ideal surface for tennis beginners. Use them to master your winning returns.
▲ The more you play Mario Tennis, the better the courts you'll unlock. Hey! Check out Toad sitting on the giant egg!

Grab your Cable

Some classic Game Boy games have missed out due to the lack of two player support, but Mario Tennis has got it all. If you've got a mate with a copy of the game and a Link Cable, you can join up for a game of singles. With your buddy on the other side of the net you'll be in for a real ball bashing frenzy when the game gets underway. You'll be yelling at your Game Boy Color as you fight it out for every last winner, so make sure you've mastered the skills to beat them hands down or you won't hear the last of it, Nintendooids!



▲ Hello and welcome to Centre Court where Baby Mario and Luigi are battling it out. That volley's got to be a winner!
▲ Luigi is trying his best to take out Baby Mario, but the wee guy's shots are proving too strong. 30-0 to the little man!



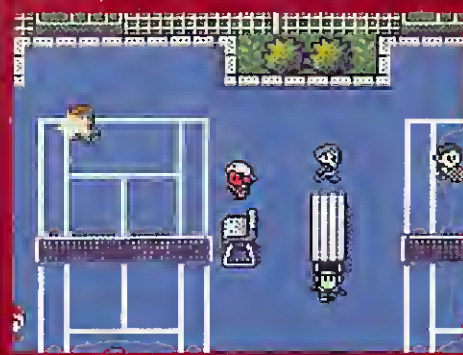
▲ What an ace! Despite Luigi's desperate dive, the serve wide to the left is a corker. One point needed to wrap up the game.

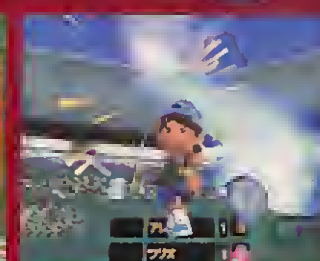
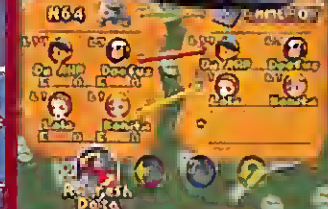
If you managed to bag a copy of Pokémon Stadium and have still got your Transfer Pak tucked away, then it's time to get it out of retirement, Nintendooids!

Your friendly roommate not only bunks up in your dorm, he also acts as your doubles partner. What a pal!

By varying your different skills you can make your team into a fantastic partnership and blast your opponents with wicked tactics from anywhere on court.



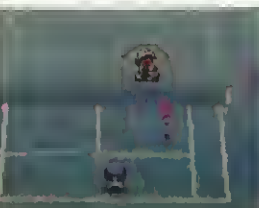
▲ That volley's found space in the corner of the court. They've got no chance returning that one.
