Mindscape's adaptation of the TV graphical adventure uses the Captive adventuring system which made the game of the same name the best adventure product of last year.

Using a highly sophisticated point and click icon system you can explore the vast maze complex quickly and easily. The mouse operates movement and combat and the numeric keypad can control walking, thus making the whole system faster to use.

Every time the character loses energy by not resting and going for long periods without sustenance, the bar will fall. When it reaches zero your stamina will drop until you eventually wither away.

0nce again the overbearing urge to kill loads of allens in an extremely quick and powerful spacecraft is thrust upon us.

You are at the controls of a class fighter, initially armed with a mere spud gun-type weapon. The first few waves are simple enough but after a while along will come the bonus ship.

Killing this will produce a weapon power-up which comes in two types: red and blue. The red powers up the spud gun with increasingly more powerful and vicious shots, while the blue proffers a long, blue laser which comes in more or less one line.

Either guided or non-guided missiles may also be added. The former are really useful and after hunting out the nearest



bad guy on screen, explode on contact. The non-guided missiles fire forwards at a high velocity.

A great many of these shoot'em-ups have large end-of-level beasties and this is no exception. If you thought getting through the level was hard enough, then wait until you try the guardian!

These usually come in the form of immense tanks, spacecraft, boats, or monsters, and every single one takes an Incredible amount of shots to destroy. Elther that or a couple of smart missiles.

Pressing the second button will launch one of these projectiles which will destroy everything that happens to be inside the radius of the explosion.

Graphically this is right up there with the thousands of coin-op shoot'em-ups.


The backgrounds are incredibly detailed and the weaponry and sprites are all excellently drawn and executed.

The scrolling too is very smooth, making the whole appearance one of immense quallty. With excellent sonics, loads of explosions, laser sounds and a very fast backing track, your adrenalin is sure to be kept pumping.
