No. 221.—Whereas there is reason to believe that the action of the title of Dykes which resides in the villages of Chokkikul and Chandel in the Pudukkottai taluk of the Keralam district is entitled to the systematic commission of new punishable offences, the Governor in Council in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 3 of the Criminal Tribes Act, 1917 (LII of 1917), hereby declares that the said action of Dykes is a criminal tribe for the purpose of the said Act.

Under section 10 of the said Act the Governor in Council further directs that every registered member of the said criminal tribe shall in the prescribed manner report himself at such intervals and shall also notify in plain of residence and any change or intended change of residence and any absence or intended absence from his residence.

If a member wishes to reside in a district other than that in which the settlement is located, the District Superintendent of Police of the former district may grant the pass, but before doing so he shall consult the manager of the settlement and the Superintendent of the district in which the second settlement is located. All passes issued by any District Superintendent of Police will be subject to revision by the District Magistrate concerned. The District Magistrate may, without assigning reasons, revoke a pass so far issued and require the member of the criminal tribe to re-enter the settlement. These passes shall be in Form K and shall be subject to the conditions specified therein."

**FORMS OF SUBSCRIPTION:** War Bonds will be issued in the form of (a) Inscribed Stock Certificates, or (b) Promissory Notes. These will subsequently, if desired, be exchanged, free of cost, for Bearer Bonds when the latter are available. If no preference is stated by the purchaser, War Bonds will be issued in the form of Inscribed Stock Certificates.

Promissory Notes will, in order to avoid delay, be issued in the first instance in as few separate pieces as possible, but these will later on be exchanged free of charge for pieces of such denominations as may be applied for. A single Stock Certificate will be issued for the amount required.

### 1. War Bonds in the form of promissory notes in denominations of Rs. 100,

or multiples thereof, can be purchased from the 3rd June 1918 to the 14th September 1918 on payment of the amount due

Applications may be in the form attached hereto (Form A), or may be in any other form which states clearly the amount and description of Bonds required, the full name and address of the purchaser, and the treasury at which he desires that interest shall be paid.

### 2. War Bonds in the form of inscribed stock can be obtained in denomina-

tions of Rs. 100 or multiples thereof, from the 3rd June 1918 to the 14th September 1918 on payment of the amount due and on application, from the Public Debt Office, Calcutta, direct or through any of the following offices:—

(a) Office of the Controller of Currency, Calcutta, or any Accountant-General or Comptroller;

(b) The Head office, or any Indian branch of the Bank of Bengal, Bombay, or Madras;

(c) Any Government treasury or sub-treasury.

Applications may be in the form attached hereto (Form A), or may be in any other form which states clearly the amount and description of Bonds required, the full name and address of the applicant, and the treasury at which he desires that interest shall be paid.

### 3. War Bonds in the form of inscribed stock or promissory notes can be

purchased in denominations of Rs. 25, or multiples thereof, subject to a maximum of Rs. 10,000, from the 3rd June 1918 to the 31st December 1918 on payment of the amount due and on application at any post office conducting savings bank business. Applications may be in the form attached (Form B), or may be in any other form which states clearly the amount and description of Bonds required, the full name and address of the applicant and the treasury at which he desires that interest shall be paid.

Bonds purchased through the post office may, if so desired, be left in the custody of the Accountant-General, Posts and Telegraphs.

No. 211 of Chinnayakanur; thence crossing again the Tirupattur road and proceeding west along the northern boundary of S.P. No. 25 of Anappappalayam; thence along the northern, western, southern and eastern boundaries of S.P. No. 79 of Anappappalayam up to the junction of S.P. Nos. 39, 59, 69 and 74 of Anappappalayam, thence continuing the full western limit.

Again crossing the Tirupattur road and starting the outside wall of the jail along the north-east, north-west, north-east and north-west corners, i.e., proceeding along the eastern boundary of the Tirupattur road, viz., of S.P. Nos. 59, 74, 29 and 198 of Anappappalayam village; then proceeding east and turning north along the western boundaries of S.P. Nos. 103 and 101 of Anappappalayam village; then turning east and proceeding along the northern boundaries of S.P. Nos. 103, 104, 105 and 109 of Anappappalayam village; thence northwards along the western boundary of the Jail road, S.P. Nos. 110 of Anappappalayam and 204 of Krishnastra, as far as the junction between S.P. Nos. 104 and 284; thence westwards along the western and western boundaries of S.P. No. 158 as far as the junction between S.P. Nos. 158 of Krishnastra and 211 and 212 of Chinnayakanur; thence along the northern boundary of S.P. No. 211 of Chinnayakanur, i.e., as far as the quadrifurcation between S.P. Nos. 211, 212, 213 and 214 of Chinnayakanur, thence enclosing the Central Jail.

Again proceeding along the western and northern boundaries of S.P. No. 211 and the northern boundary of S.P. No. 283 as far as the quadrifurcation between S.P. Nos. 210 and 203 of Chinnayakanur; and 223 and 284 of Krishnastra village; thence along the western and eastern boundaries of S.P. No. 224 and the eastern boundaries of S.P. Nos. 104 and 110 of Krishnastra village; thence west along the northern boundary of S.P. No. 110; thence north along the western boundary of the main Jail as far as the north-west corner of the jail thus including the main starting the jail on the north and the east, viz., S.P. Nos. 211 of Chinnayakanur, 284, 204 and 110 of Krishnastra.

## NOTICE FOR GOVERNMENT OF INDIA (BANKING AND TRADE) SCHOLARS IN EUROPE.

All Government scholars are required to send themselves of the information and advice which the Educational Adviser for Indian Students and the Local Adviser at University studies are in a position to give them and apply to their Local Adviser for information as regards their studies and in any circumstances of difficulty. The Local Advisers in Delhi, Cambridge, Manchester, Edinburgh and Glasgow have charge of Government scholars studying at these Universities. Scholars studying at other British Universities abroad will be under the charge of the Local Adviser in London. The Adviser in the proper place is being below the Educational Adviser for Indian Students any matter regarding the education of the Secretary of State in Council.

1. Every scholar should, on reaching England, at once report himself to the Local Adviser in London at 21, Grosvenor Road, S.W. Accommodation for such arrivals is provided in that house. After seeing the Local Adviser in London and consulting with him as regard to his course of study, he should also call on the Educational Adviser for Indian Students at the India Office.

2. Every scholar must obey all instructions which he may receive, either through the Educational Adviser for Indian Students or through his Local Adviser. He must consult his Local Adviser especially in regard to his work and carry out any course of study which the Adviser may ultimately prescribe. Any course which requires and has received the sanction of the Secretary of State will not be changed without similar sanction.

3. Every scholar must, from time to time, whenever his Local Adviser in London or other Local Adviser requires it, submit a certificate from the proper College or University Authority, showing that his academic and progress in six or more subjects.

4. Subject to such conditions with the above conditions, the scholar's allowance will be paid quarterly in advance by the India Office to the Local Adviser under whose charge he is. It will begin from the date of the scholar's reporting his arrival in England, and the Local Adviser will advance it to the scholar in such instalments or instalments as may be determined. Three months after the date of reporting arrival, the allowance to the meeting of the Quarter Day\* will be paid to the Local Adviser, and subsequent payments will be made in advance on or after each official Quarter Day. The allowance will generally be at the rate of 1000 a year, and Language scholars at Oxford or Cambridge will be supported in between Non-Collegiate students, and permission to join a College will not be granted unless admission to the University is not otherwise possible, or unless the scholar is of undergraduate age and has means offered to him in College. In the event of a Language scholar having to join a College at Oxford or Cambridge, his allowance will be increased to 1200 a year to cover the additional expenses incurred.

5. Every scholar is required to begin work with the Educational Adviser for Indian Students at the India Office, London, before his arrival in England, the sum of 200 for initial expenses. He will have no claim to payment of any instalment of his scholarship until this deposit has been made.

6. The necessary travelling expenses of scholars abroad by second class, or by third class if an amount be available, will be defrayed by the Secretary of State. These expenses should be shown as items obtainable from the Adviser. Travelling expenses in the United Kingdom will be borne by the scholar themselves. Charges for University and College fees, for private tuition, for books, hotel bills and medical attendance, must be borne by the scholar and will not be defrayed by the Secretary of State.

7. No claim can be admitted for the payment of any expenditure unless the scholar has obtained previous sanction from the Secretary of State.

8. The scholarship is given for the first instance for two years, unless the Secretary of State in the exercise of his discretion sees reason to terminate it sooner. Every scholar will furnish his school-ship who, not being disabled by illness or prevented by any other cause which the Secretary of State may consider sufficient, fails to comply with the rules here set forth. The school-ship, for sufficient reasons, may be extended beyond two years by the Secretary of State. It may be terminated at any time within the first two years or later, if a scholar fails to break or succeed.

9. On the expiration of the scholarship a scholar is provided by the India Office with a free second class passage to India, and he should apply for it without delay through his Local Adviser. It is recommended to make his own passage arrangements and to claim an allowance in due from the India Office. If a scholarship is forfeited, or if it be assigned before completion of its term, or if the holder of it on non-compliance of its terms declines to return to India when required to do so the scholar will lose the claim to a free passage back to India.

Under rule 35 of the rules for the conduct of business at meetings of the Council, the following Bill, together with the Statement of Objects and Reasons, is published for general information:—

No. 3 of 1918.

*A Bill for the prevention of the spread of Insect Pests, Plant Diseases and Noxious Weeds.*

Whereas it is expedient to take measures to prevent the spread of insect pests, plant diseases and noxious weeds injurious to health or to crops, plants, trees or water-supply or obstructive to waterways within the Presidency of Madras; It is hereby enacted as follows:—

#### PART I.

##### PRELIMINARY.

1. This Act may be called "The Madras Agricultural Pests and Diseases Act, 1918."

2. Unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires the following words and expressions in this Act shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them:—

"Insect pest" means any insect or other invertebrate animal which has been

declared by notification under section 3 of this Act to be an insect pest;

"Plant disease" means any fungoid, bacterial, parasitical or other disease which has been declared by notification under section 3 of this Act to be a plant disease;

"Noxious weed" means any weed which has been declared by notification under section 3 of this Act to be a noxious weed;

"Plant" includes the fruit, leaves, bark, cuttings or any living portion of a plant but does not include the seed unless the seed has been especially included in the definition of plant by the Governor in Council by notification under this Act;

"Occupier" means the person having for the time being the right of occupation of any land, premises or water and shall include his authorized agent or any person in actual occupation of the land, premises or water;

"Notified area" means the area covered by a notification published under section 3.

3. If the Governor in Council considers that any pest, disease or weed in any local area is dangerous to health or is injurious to crops, plants, trees or water-supply or is obstructive to waterways and that it is necessary to take measures to eradicate it or to prevent its introduction or re-appearance, he may by notification in the Port St. George Gazette—

(a) declare that such pest, disease or weed is an insect pest, a plant disease or a noxious weed;

(b) prescribe what preventive or remedial measures shall be taken in respect of such pest, disease, or weed, and

(c) define the local area within which and the period during which such notifications shall be in force.

4. On the issue of a notification under section 3 every occupier within the notified area shall be bound to carry out the remedial and preventive measures prescribed in such notification.

5. Any officer duly empowered under section 17 in this behalf may enter on any land or water within the notified area in order to ascertain—

(a) whether any insect pest, plant disease or noxious weed is there present; and

(b) whether the prescribed remedial or preventive measures or both as the case may require have been taken.

6. If such inspecting officer finds that the prescribed remedial or preventive action or both have not been properly taken he may, subject to such rules as the Governor in Council may prescribe under section 18 (j), either—

(a) call upon the occupier by notice in writing to carry out the prescribed remedial or preventive action within a time to be specified in such notice; or

(b) carry out such measures himself or cause them to be carried out under his supervision.

7. (1) If any occupier upon whom notice is served under section 6 (a) fails to comply therewith within the time specified therein, he shall be deemed to have committed an offence under this Act, and thereupon the prescribed remedial or preventive measures may be carried out by the inspecting officer or under his supervision.

(2) No compensation shall be payable for any action taken under this section.

8. (1) If any prescribed preventive or remedial measures are carried out by the inspecting officer under sections 6 (b) and 7 (1), the cost of such measures shall be recoverable from the occupier as if it were an arrears of land revenue, but such occupier may appeal to the Collector within 30 days from the date of demand on the ground that,

(a) charges for items other than cost of labour, material or use of implements have been wrongly included, or

(b) the rates charged for labour, material or use of implements are unduly high.

(2) The order of the Collector on such appeal shall be final.

9. (1) In carrying out any prescribed remedial or preventive measures under section 6 (b) or 7 (1) the inspecting officer may destroy or cause to be destroyed—

(a) any tree which infested with the insect pest or plant disease; or

(b) any plants, not being trees, some or all of which are affected by the insect pest or plant disease but which are growing so closely together that it is not ordinarily practicable to treat such plant individually; or

(c) any plants including trees which though not so infested have in his opinion become liable to such infection.

(2) No compensation shall be payable to any person in respect of action taken under clause (a) of sub-section (1), but subject to the provisions of section 7 (2) two-thirds of the value shall be payable as compensation to the occupier in cases falling under clause (b) and full value in cases falling under clause (c).

Provided that—

(1) the Governor in Council may by notification permit compensation to be granted in special cases falling under clause (a) of sub-section (1); and

(2) when the prescribed remedial or preventive measures require that the plants, not being trees, shall be removed before were spent due subsequent to the ordinary date of harvest of those plants, no compensation shall be payable for the removal thereof although some more produce might have been obtained by leaving the plants standing beyond the date specified.

10. For the purpose of section 9 value shall be taken to mean the market value of that tree or plant at the time of its destruction as determined by a valuing officer appointed by the Governor in Council.

11. (1) Such valuing officer shall award compensation according to the rates prescribed in section 9 (2) and transmit or cause to be transmitted copies of his award in writing to the occupier and to the inspecting officer.

(2) The date within which an appeal may be filed and the officer before whom it may be filed shall be entered in the award.

12. (1) Either the occupier or with the sanction of the Director of Agriculture the inspecting officer may file an appeal against such award within sixty days of the date of receipt of the award.

14. Any one convicted by a magistrate of an offence under section 7 of this Act shall be liable to fine not exceeding Rs. 50, which in case of non-payment thereof may be commuted into simple imprisonment not exceeding ten days.

15. If any person contravenes a rule made under section 18 (c) of this Act, he shall be deemed to have committed an offence under this Act. Any one convicted by a magistrate of such an offence shall, in addition to conviction and destruction of the plant in respect of which the offence was committed, be liable to fine not exceeding Rs. 50, which in case of non-payment thereof may be commuted into simple imprisonment not exceeding ten days.

### PART III.

#### GENERAL.

16. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall lie against any officer for anything done under this Act in good faith or for any damage to property caused by any action taken in good faith in carrying out the provisions of this Act.

17. The Director of Agriculture may from time to time appoint inspecting officers for the purpose of carrying out duties prescribed in sections 5 and 6. The Governor in Council shall by notification in the *Port St. George Gazette* make such rules as may from time to time be necessary describing the general qualifications to be possessed by such officers.

18. The Governor in Council may by notification in the *Port St. George Gazette* make such rules not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as may from time to time be necessary—

(a) including and within the definition of a plant,

(b) prohibiting or restricting the removal of any plant from any one place to another within the Presidency for the purpose of preventing the spread of any insect pest, plant disease or noxious weed,

(c) prescribing the methods of publication of descriptions of insect pests, plant diseases and noxious weeds and of the treatment to be followed,

(d) prescribing compensation in special cases falling under sub-section (a) of section 3, sub-section (1), and prescribing the rates thereof,

(e) prescribing the procedure to be followed in ascertaining value under section 10,

(f) prescribing the procedure, notices, notifications, registers and other processes needed for the effectual working of this Act, and

(g) generally to carry out the purposes of this Act.

#### STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

In Act No. II of 1914, entitled "The Insecticide and Pests Act of 1914" power has been taken to issue orders and frame rules with the object of preventing the introduction into British India of any insect, fungus or other pest which is or is believed to be harmful to crops. This Act, however, relates only to any of, i.e., the bringing into British India by land or sea, and give no power to prevent or control the transport of insect-pests, plant diseases or noxious weeds from one part of British India to another. The prevention of the spread of insects or of insect and vegetable pests within the country is hardly less necessary than the prevention of the importation of such pests from outside British India, and it is accordingly proposed, in the interests of agriculture throughout the country, to undertake legislation with

the object of preventing the spread of insect and vegetable pests within the presidency and, if possible, of exterminating them. In the Bill which has been prepared with this object it is proposed to take power to notify such pests and to define what preventive or remedial measures shall be taken to deal with them. An obligation is laid on owners of land to carry out the prescribed measures and in the event of their neglecting this duty, power is proposed to be taken to carry out the measures and to collect the cost thereof from the defaulter, to whom compensation will be payable in certain specified circumstances. Full provision is made for appeals against orders made under the proposed measures and the usual retrospective clauses are added.

Interest on War Bonds 1921, 1923, 1925 and 1928 will be income-tax-free but will be taken into account in determining the rate at which the tax is levied on other income and will be liable to super-tax.

**Form or Securities:** War Bonds will be issued in the form of (a) Inscribed Stock Certificates, or (b) Promissory Notes. These will subsequently, if desired, be exchanged, free of cost, for Bearer Bonds when the latter are available. If no preference is stated by the purchaser, War Bonds will be issued in the form of Inscribed Stock Certificates.

Promissory Notes will, in order to avoid delay, be issued in the first instance in as few separate pieces as possible, but these will later on be exchanged free of charge for pieces of such denominations as may be applied for. Single Stock Certificates will be issued for the amount required.

1. War Bonds in the form of promissory notes in denominations of Rs. 100, or multiples thereof, can be purchased

Purchase of Bonds in the form of promissory notes at Banks and Government offices. from the 3rd June 1918 to the 14th September 1918 on payment of the amount due

(a) without formal application, at the Head Office, or any Indian branch, of the Banks of Bengal, Bombay and Madras and

(b) on application, at the office of the Controller of Currency, Calcutta, of any Accountant-General or Comptroller or at any Government treasury or sub-treasury.

Applications may be in the form attached hereto (Form A), or may be in any other form which states clearly the amount and description of Bonds required, the full name and address of the purchaser, and the treasury at which he desires that interest shall be paid.

2. War Bonds in the form of inscribed stock can be obtained in denominations of Rs. 100 or multiples thereof, from

Purchase of Bonds in the form of inscribed stock at Government offices and Banks. the 3rd June 1918 to the 14th September 1918 on payment of the amount due and on application, from the Public Debt Office, Calcutta, direct or through any of the following offices:—

(a) Office of the Controller of Currency, Calcutta, or any Accountant-General or Comptroller;

(b) The Head office, or any Indian branch of the Banks of Bengal, Bombay, or Madras;

(c) Any Government treasury or sub-treasury.

Applications may be in the form attached hereto (Form A), or may be in any other form which states clearly the amount and description of Bonds required, the full name and address of the applicant, and the treasury at which he desires that interest shall be paid.

3. War Bonds in the form of inscribed stock or promissory notes can be

Purchase of Bonds at post offices. purchased in denominations of Rs. 25, or multiples thereof, subject to a maximum of Rs. 10,000, from the 3rd June 1918 to the 31st December 1918 on payment of the amount due and on application at any post office conducting savings banks business. Applications may be in the form attached (Form B), or may be in any other form which states clearly the amount and description of Bonds required, the full name and address of the applicant and the treasury at which he desires that interest shall be paid.

Bonds purchased through the post office may, if so desired, be left in the custody of the Accountant-General, Posts and Telegraphs.

4. Payment may be made either in cash, or by cheque. In the case of purchases of Bonds at banks cheques should be drawn in favour of the Secretary and Treasurer or the Agent of the Presidency Bank according as the purchase is made at the Head Office or at a branch of the Presidency Bank. In the case of purchases made at a Government office or a post office the cheques should be drawn in favour of the officer to whom the application is presented.

Payment at post office may also be made by withdrawal of sums at the credit of the applicant at the post office savings bank.

Payment at Head offices of Presidency Banks may also be made in Indian Treasury bills which will be accepted as cash at their face value less a discount calculated at the rate of 4 per cent per annum on the unexpired portion of the currency of the bill.

5. Brokerage of one-eighth per cent will be paid to recognised bankers and brokers by the Presidency Banks on any payment in cash or by cheque made through them for purchase of War Bonds.

Brokerage of one-eighth per cent will be allowed to recognised bankers and brokers on applications for War Bonds, bearing their stamp, presented to the Controller of Currency or to any Accountant-General or Comptroller, or at any Government treasury or sub-treasury.

Brokerage of one-sixteenth per cent will be paid to recognised bankers and brokers by the Presidency Banks on any payment in the form of Indian Treasury bills made through them for purchase of War Bonds.

7. These certificates may be cashed at the post office of issue at any time during the 5-year period at rates not in any case less than the amount originally paid for the Certificates. These and other particulars can be ascertained at any post office.
