## INTRODUCTION.

---

The following genealogies have been prepared more particularly for the gratification and convenience of those directly concerned. As a whole, they may serve the purpose of a general family register for reference, to the increasing posterity of those two venerable ancestors who have long since passed away. Samuel Packard and his numerous family were conversant with some of the Pilgrim Fathers of the Mayflower, and were a part of the Puritan stock by which the New England colonies were early settled. His posterity more or less have intermarried with the descendants of the immortal *forty-one* who signed the famous compact in the cabin of the Mayflower, in 1620. It is obvious from their record, that his posterity have, to a wide extent, been loyal and patriotic subjects of civil government, and stable supporters of Gospel Institutions. Large numbers of them have belonged to the membership of Congregational churches.

In the compilation of this work, the author would gratefully acknowledge the kind aid afforded him by numerous correspondents, and also his indebtedness to the History of Bridgewater, by Nahum Mitchell, in 1840, and the History of North Bridgewater, by Bradford Kingman, in 1867.

So far as it can be ascertained, the Packards in the United States descended from Samuel Packard, who came from England to the Plymouth Colony eighteen years after the landing of the Pilgrims on Plymouth Rock. He came with his wife and one child, in the ship called the "Diligent, of Ipswich, 133 passengers, John Martin, master," in 1638, and settled in Hingham, Mass. Settlements had been commenced in this place five years previously. He came from a small hamlet called Windham, near Hingham, which is about fourteen miles from Norwich, the capital of Norfolk County, in the eastern part of England: and it is some thirty-seven miles from Yarmouth, the seaport of the County, and about forty miles from Ipswich, the port from which he sailed, and one hundred miles north-east from London.

Not far from 1660 Samuel Packard and his family removed from Hingham to that part of the original town of Bridgewater, Mass., which is now West Bridgewater. The original town of old Bridgewater was taken from Duxbury, and was deeded to Miles Standish, Constant Southworth, and Samuel Nash, on the 23d of March, 1649, by the Indian Chief, Ousamequin, who was the veritable Massasoit, and the grandfather of the famous Indian King Philip. The mark *MS* of Massasoit was affixed, and the deed is still extant. The articles paid for the land amounted to less than thirty dollars in value. The place had been called Nuckatset. Holmes' American Annals say, "The settlement of Bridgewater was begun in the year 1651 by a very religious people." Rev. James Keith, of Scotland, who was edu-



cated at Aberdeen, was ordained as the first minister of Bridgewater; Feb. 18, 1664. The town was incorporated in 1656, and is said to have been named from an English Duke. The three towns, North Bridgewater, East Bridgewater, and West Bridgewater, have been taken from it.

Samuel Packard was appointed to office in Bridgewater, in 1664, was licensed to keep an Ordinary in 1670, and his will was dated in 1684, and it is supposed that he died not long afterwards; probably between 70 and 80 years of age. Some of his sons, and probably he himself, were engaged as soldiers in the Indian war of King Philip, in 1675-6. They were among the twenty-one men who went out from Bridgewater and captured seventeen Indians and considerable plunder, on their way to meet Capt. Benjamin Church, under whose command, with an additional force of nine English soldiers and twenty friendly Indians, on the 2d of August, 1676, they killed or captured 173 Indians; and probably the same force, substantially, on the 12th of August, 1676, killed that famous Indian warrior at Mount Hope, slaughtered and scattered his soldiers and ended the war—a war in which about six hundred of the inhabitants of New England were killed, twelve or thirteen towns entirely destroyed, and about six hundred buildings burned.

Six of the grandsons of Samuel Packard, and sons of Zaccheus Paekard, viz.: David, Solomon, James, Zaccheus Jr., John, and Abiel Packard, removed to North Bridgewater not many years subsequent to 1700, and are the progenitors, probably, of the largest number of Packards in the country.

The plan adopted in this work is to give a brief statistical account of each descendant in the regular order of generations, and of families. The genealogy of *Samuel Packard*, of Bridgewater, includes only the first four generations, and only those who have lived in Bridgewater, and the three towns that have been taken from it, viz.: East, West, and North Bridgewater. This brief and imperfect account of 250 persons in four generations may, perhaps, aid in the future preparation of a more complete work brought down to the present time.

The six generations of *Abel Packard*, of Cummington, who was the great-grandson of Samuel Packard, include all his posterity, living or deceased—352. Both genealogies include the *descendants* of these two ancestors, though they have by marriage merged the name of Packard in other names.

The numerical arrangement indicates the order of the families in each generation, and of the children of each family.

The star against names signifies *deceased*. The husbands and wives of the descendants are not enumerated among the posterity.

FIRST GENERATION.

1. \*SAMUEL PACKARD and his wife and one child came from Windham, near Hingham, Norfolk County, England, to Hingham, in Plymouth colony, in 1638. He removed thence to Bridgewater about 1660. His sons, and probably he himself, were soldiers under Capt. Benjamin Church, in the Indian war with the famous King Philip, in 1675 and 1676. He had six sons and six daughters, viz.: Elizabeth, Samuel Jr., Zaccheus, Thomas, John, Nathaniel, Mary, Hamah, Israel, Jael, Deborah, and Deliverance. All his children had families. He was appointed to office in Bridgewater in 1664, was licensed to keep an Ordinary in 1670, his will was dated in 1684, and it is supposed he died not long afterwards. His age was probably between seventy and eighty years.

SECOND GENERATION.

*Children of Samuel Packard. (1.)*

2. \*ELIZABETH, born probably in England, married Thomas Alger, of West Bridgewater, in 1665, and had one son and one daughter, viz.: Israel Alger and Deliverance Alger. He lived a while in Easton, and probably had other children.

3. \*SAMUEL Jr., born in Hingham, married Elizabeth, <sup>Latrop</sup>



daughter of Mark Lathrop, of West Bridgewater, was appointed Ensign, and was in King Philips' war. He had three sons and three daughters, viz.: Samuel 3d, Daniel, Joseph, Elizabeth, Mary, and Susanna. All of them except Elizabeth had families. His estate was settled in 1698, and he probably died just previously.

4. \*ZACCHEUS, born in Hingham, <sup>Apr. 20, 1657</sup> married Sarah, daughter of John Howard, of West Bridgewater, had eight sons and one daughter, viz.: Israel, Sarah, Jonathan, David, Solomon, James, Zaccheus Jr., John, and Abiel. All of his children had families. His six youngest sons removed to North Bridgewater some years subsequent to 1700, and their descendants now constitute a large portion of the population of that place. The father died in Bridgewater, Aug. 3, 1723, aged probably about eighty years.

5. \*THOMAS, born in Hingham, was living in Bridgewater in 1673, and had one son, Joseph.

6. \*JOHN, born in Hingham, lived in South Bridgewater, near the bridge, "which was called after him, Packard's bridge," in 1688. His estate was settled in 1741, and he probably died just previously. He had one son, Joseph.

7. \*NATHANIEL, born in Hingham, married a daughter of John Kingman, of Bridgewater, and he died probably about 1720. He had three sons and ten daughters, viz.: Samuel 4th, Zechariah, George, Fearnot, Margaret, Sarah, Lydia, Faithful, Hannah, Deliverance, Elizabeth, Mary, and Deborah. All of them except Fearnot, Hannah, and Deliverance, are known to have had families.

8. \*MARY, born in Hingham, and married Richard Phillips, of Weymouth.

9. \*HANNAH, born in Hingham, and married Thomas Randall.

10. \*ISRAEL, born in Hingham, "was appointed Trooper in 1671."

11. \*JAEEL, born in Hingham, and married John Smith.

12. \*DEBORAH, born probably in Hingham, and married Samuel Washburn, of Bridgewater, who was a sergeant and a soldier in King Philips' war, and died in 1720, in Bridgewater, aged sixty-nine. The parents had five sons and one daughter,



viz.: Samuel Washburn Jr., Noah Washburn, Israel Washburn, Nehemiah Washburn, Benjamin Washburn, and Hannah Washburn, all of whom had families.

13. \*DELIVERANCE, born probably in Hingham, and married Thomas Washburn, a brother of the preceding Samuel Washburn, and lived in Bridgewater. She was his second wife. He was in King Philip's war, and died probably about 1729. They had three sons and four daughters, viz.: Nathaniel Washburn, Thomas Washburn Jr., Timothy Washburn, Hepzibah Washburn, Patience Washburn, Deliverance Washburn, and Elizabeth Washburn. All of them except Nathaniel Washburn had families.

All of the twelve persons of the second generation had families, and eight of them had *forty-five* children, and it is not known but that the remaining four had equally numerous families. Three of the families having children probably had a greater number than has been reckoned. There is reason to believe that the children of the twelve families amounted to *seventy-five*. Some of them having removed from Bridgewater, nothing more is known respecting them.

### THIRD GENERATION.

#### *Children of Elizabeth (Packard) Alger. (2.)*

14. \*ISRAEL ALGER, born in Easton or West Bridgewater, married Patience, daughter of Nathaniel Hayward, of Bridgewater, and had five sons, viz.: Israel Alger Jr., Joseph Alger, Thomas Alger, Nathaniel Alger, and John Alger. All of them except Nathaniel and John are known to have had families.

15. \*DELIVERANCE ALGER, born in Easton or West Bridgewater, probably about 1669.

#### *Children of Samuel Packard Jr. (3.)*

16. \*SAMUEL PACKARD 3d, born in Bridgewater, married Elizabeth, daughter of Dea. Samuel Edson, of Bridgewater, in



1705. The parents died in 1716. They had three sons and one daughter, viz.: Samuel 4th, Bethiah, Paul, and Job, all of whom had families.

17. \*DANIEL, born in Bridgewater, married Mary, daughter of Isaac Harris, of Bridgewater, in 1713, and he died probably about 1732. They had three sons and four daughters, viz.: Sarah, Mary, Susanna, Martha, Daniel, Isaac, and Nehemiah. All of them, except Isaac, had families.

18. \*JOSEPH, born in Bridgewater, and married Mary, daughter of John Willis, of Bridgewater, in 1723. They had two sons and one daughter, viz.: Joseph Jr., Mary, and John, all of whom had families.

19. \*ELIZABETH, born in Bridgewater.

20. \*MARY, born in Bridgewater, married Amos Snell, of South Bridgewater, in 1700. He died in 1769, aged 91. They had three sons and six daughters, viz.: Mary Snell, Jemima Snell, Susanna Snell, Amos Snell Jr., Daniel Snell, Moses Snell, Martha Snell, Charity Snell, and Keziah Snell, all of whom had families.

21. \*SUSANNA, born in Bridgewater, and married John Snell, of West Bridgewater, brother of the preceding Amos Snell, in 1715. They had five sons and two daughters, viz.: John Snell Jr., Nathan Snell, Samuel Snell, Zebulun Snell, Samuel Snell 2d, Susanna Snell, and Silence Snell. Only the two last are known to have had families. The father died in 1767, aged 87.

*Children of Zaccheus Packard. (4.)*

22. \*ISRAEL, born in Bridgewater, April 27, 1680, married Hannah —, in 1703. They had four sons and four daughters, viz.: Seth, Mehitabel, Sarah, Eliphalet, Hannah, Zerviah, Israel Jr., and Robert. All of them, except Eliphalet and Sarah, had families. The wife died, and he married Susanna, daughter of Daniel Field, of West Bridgewater, Nov. 20, 1735.

23. \*SARAH, born in Bridgewater, Aug. 19, 1682, married Capt. Josiah Edson, of South Bridgewater, July 27, 1704. He was born in 1682, was a Deacon in the church, and often a Representative of the town. He died in 1763, aged about 81. She





died in 1754, aged 72. They had three sons and four daughters, viz.: Sarah Edson, Abiah Edson, Josiah Edson Jr., Huldah Edson, Abiezer Edson, Freelove Edson, and Elijah Edson, all of whom had families.

24. \*JONATHAN, born in Bridgewater, Dec. 7, 1684, and married Susanna, daughter of Dea. Joseph Hayward, of Bridgewater, Dec. 24, 1719. She was born in 1695, and died in 1722. He then married a second wife, Abigail —, and they had three sons and two daughters, viz.: Jonathan Jr., Susanna, Jacob, Jonathan 2d, and Abigail, all of whom had families, except the first named Jonathan, who died while young.

25. \*DAVID, born in Bridgewater, Feb. 11, 1687, removed to North Bridgewater subsequent to 1700, and married Hannah, daughter of John Ames, of West Bridgewater, Dec. 17, 1712. She was born near 1690, and died Jan. 10, 1767, aged about 77. He died Nov. 3, 1755, aged 68. They had five sons and four daughters, viz.: David Jr., William, Hannah, Isaac, Mary, Ebenezer, Abiah, Mehitabel, and Jane, all of whom had families.

26. \*SOLOMON, born in Bridgewater, March 20, 1689, removed to North Bridgewater subsequent to 1700, and married Sarah, daughter of Samuel Lathrop, of West Bridgewater, Nov. 16, 1715. She was born in 1693, and died while young. He then married Susanna, daughter of Samuel Kingman, of Bridgewater, who was born in 1693. They had seven sons and four daughters, viz.: Sarah, Jacob, Nathan 1st, Susanna, Joanna, Martha, Solomon Jr., Nathan 2d, Benjamin, Zebulon, and Micah, all of whom had families, except Nathan 1st, who died while young. After the death of his second wife, he married Dorothy, widow of Mark Perkins, of North Bridgewater, Oct. 5, 1760, who died May 1, 1782.

27. \*JAMES, born in Bridgewater, June 2, 1691, and married Jemima, daughter of Joseph Keith, and granddaughter of Rev. James Keith, the first minister of Bridgewater, June 7, 1722. He removed to North Bridgewater subsequent to 1700. "He was one of the first Deacons in the North Parish." He died Nov. 24, 1765, aged 74. His wife died Dec. 8, 1763, aged 62. They had two sons and three daughters, viz.: James Jr., Keziah, Jemima, Rebecca, and Reuben, all of whom had families.

28. \*ZACCHEUS Jr., born in Bridgewater, Sept. 4, 1693, and married, Oct. 21, 1725, Mercy, daughter of Isaac Alden, of East Bridgewater. She was a great-granddaughter of Hon. John Alden and his wife, Priscilla Mullins, both of whom came over in the Mayflower in 1620. Mercy Alden was born in 1696. Her husband, Zaccheus Packard Jr., died in 1775, aged 82. They had five sons and one daughter, viz.: Eleazer, Benjamin, Jesse, Seth, Simeon, and Mercy. All of them, except Benjamin, Jesse, and Seth, had families, and they died while young.

29. \*JOHN, born in Bridgewater, Oct. 8, 1695, removed to North Bridgewater subsequent to 1700, and married Lydia Thomson, of Halifax, in 1726. He died June 3, 1738, aged about 43, in North Bridgewater; and he lived on the place now occupied by Micah Faxon. He built the first grist mill in the town. After his death his widow and his oldest son, Abel, removed to Cummington, in 1774. His widow, who was born April 22, 1703, died in Cummington, March 10, 1789, aged about 86. They had three sons and two daughters, viz.: Lydia, Abel, Abigail, John Jr., and Barnabas, all of whom had families.

30. \*ABIEL, born in Bridgewater, April 29, 1699, removed to North Bridgewater subsequent to 1700, and Jan. 11, 1723, married Sarah, daughter of John Ames, of West Bridgewater. He died in 1776, aged 77. "He was a Captain in the militia. He was the largest landholder in the North Parish; owned one thousand acres of land in one body, upon which he settled seven of his sons." His wife was born in 1702, and died in Bridgewater in 1790, aged 88. They had eight sons and two daughters, viz.: Josiah, Abiel Jr., Joshua, Thomas, Timothy, Sarah, Betty, Daniel, Eliab, and Benjamin. All of them, except Abiel Jr., had families.

*Children of Thomas Packard. (5.)*

31. \*JOSEPH 1st is the only child of whom there is any record, and there is no further record of him.

*Children of John Packard. (6.)*

32. \*JOSEPH 2d, born probably in South Bridgewater, and married Susanna, daughter of Thomas Mitchell, of Bridgewater,



in 1724. She was a granddaughter of Jacob and Susanna Mitchell, who were slain by the Indians in Dartmouth, in 1675; and she was a great-granddaughter of Experience Mitchell, one of the forefathers who came over in the third ship, the Ann, in 1623. She was born in 1703, and died in 1756, aged 53. He died in 1760. They had three sons and four daughters, viz.: John, Joseph Jr., Edward, Susanna, Mary, Parnell, and Judith, all of whom had families.

*Children of Nathaniel Packard. (7.)*

33. \*SAMUEL, married Anne ——. They had three sons and six daughters, viz.: Anne, Mary, Betty, Samuel Jr., Hepzibah, Caleb, Joshua, Chloe, and Desire. All of them, except Caleb and Joshua, had families.

34. \*ZECHARIAH, married Abigail, daughter of Richard Davenport, of South Bridgewater, in 1724, and he died probably about 1771. They had three sons and one daughter, viz.: Elijah, Abigail, Nathaniel, and Nathan, all of whom had families.

35. \*GEORGE, married Mary, daughter of Samuel Edson, of Bridgewater, in 1728. They had three sons and two daughters, viz.: George Jr., Jonathan, Lydia, Rebecca, and Ichabod, all of whom, except Jonathan and Ichabod, had families. After his death, his widow married Jonathan Mehurin, in 1740.

36. \*FEARNOT PACKARD. No farther record of her.

37. \*MARGARET, married John Washburn, of South Bridgewater, in 1710. He died probably about 1746. They had five sons and three daughters, viz.: John Washburn Jr., Nathaniel Washburn, Robert Washburn, Abraham Washburn, Margaret Washburn, Abishai Washburn, Jane Washburn, and Content Washburn, all of whom, except Abraham, had families.

38. \*SARAH, married Thomas Hooper, of Bridgewater, in 1722, and had two sons and two daughters, viz.: Sarah Hooper, Thomas Hooper Jr., John Hooper, and Jerusha Hooper, all of whom had families. All the four children were baptized in East Bridgewater.

39. \*LYDIA, married Jeremy Howell, in 1718.

40. \*FAITHFUL, married George Vaughn, probably of Middleboro', in 1719.



41. \*HANNAH PACKARD. No farther record of her.
42. \*DELIVERANCE, died in South Bridgewater, in 1776.
43. \*ELIZABETH, married John Hooper, of Bridgewater, in 1722. He died about 1741. She died about 1742. They had four sons and one daughter, viz.: John Hooper Jr., Winslow Hooper, Hezekiah Hooper, Joseph Hooper, and Rebecca Hooper. All of them, except Winslow, who was lost at sea while young, and Joseph, had families.
44. \*MARY, married Joseph Leonard, of Bridgewater, in 1721. She died in 1770. They had six sons and one daughter, viz.: Joseph Leonard Jr., David and Jonathan Leonard, twins, Dan Leonard, Simeon Leonard, Seth Leonard, and Sarah Leonard. All of them, except Joseph Jr., and Seth, had families.
45. \*DEBORAH, married Timothy Mitchell, of Bridgewater, and she died in 1744, and he died in 1733. They had four sons and one daughter, viz.: Thomas Mitchell, Nathan Mitchell, Abiel Mitchell, Deborah Mitchell, and Timothy Mitchell Jr. All of them had families, except Timothy Jr., who was lost at sea while young.

- Children of Hannah (Packard) Randall. (9.) No record.*
- Children of Israel Packard. (10.) No record.*
- Children of Jael (Packard) Smith. (11.) No record.*
- Children of Deborah (Packard) Washburn. (12.) ~~No record.~~*
46. \*SAMUEL WASHBURN Jr., married Abigail —, and they had three sons and four daughters, viz.: David Washburn, Deliverance Washburn, Solomon Washburn, Samuel Washburn 3d, Abigail Washburn, Susanna Washburn, and Tabitha Washburn. All of them, except David, Samuel 3d, and Abigail, had families.
47. \*NOAH WASHBURN, married Elizabeth, daughter of Joseph Shaw, of Bridgewater, in 1710, who was a sister of Rev. John Shaw, who was ordained in South Bridgewater, November 17, 1731. They lived in East Bridgewater, and had two sons, viz.: Eleazer Washburn, and Noah Washburn Jr., both of whom had families. He died in 1717, and his widow in 1719 married Isaac Harris, of West Bridgewater.
48. \*ISRAEL WASHBURN, married Waitstill Sumner, and

had two sons and two daughters, viz.: Sarah Washburn, Deborah Washburn, Seth Washburn, and Israel Washburn Jr., all of whom had families, except Seth, who probably died while young. After the death of the father his widow married Ebenezer Pratt, of Weymouth, in 1720.

49. \*CAPT. NEHEMIAH WASHBURN, married Jane, daughter of Ephraim Howard, of West Bridgewater, in 1713. She died in 1715. He was often employed by the town, and was its Representative in 1730. They had two daughters, viz.: Silence Washburn and Jane Washburn, both of whom had families.

50. \*CAPT. BENJAMIN WASHBURN, married Joanna Orcutt in 1715, and had two sons, viz.: Benjamin Washburn Jr., and Jonathan Washburn.

51. \*HANNAH WASHBURN, married John Keith, son of Rev. James Keith, a Scotchman, and the first minister of Bridgewater, settled there in 1664. She was married in 1711, and died in 1766. He died in 1761. They had six sons and four daughters, viz.: John Keith Jr., James Keith, Israel Keith, Hannah Keith, Kezia Keith, Daniel Keith, Susanna Keith, Zephaniah Keith, Joseph Keith, and Mary Keith. All of them, except Susanna, had families.

*Children of Deliverance (Packard) Washburn. (13.)*

52. \*NATHANIEL WASHBURN. No farther record.

53. \*THOMAS WASHBURN Jr., married Elizabeth ——. They had two daughters, viz.: Mary Washburn and Elizabeth Washburn. Mary had a family.

54. \*TIMOTHY WASHBURN, married Hannah ——. They had one son and two daughters, viz.: Timothy Washburn Jr., Hannah Washburn, and Mary Washburn.

55. \*HEPZIBAH WASHBURN, married; in 1708, John Hutchinson. No farther record.

56. \*PATIENCE WASHBURN, was married and had children. No farther record.

57. \*DELIVERANCE WASHBURN, married Ephraim Jennings, in 1719, of South Bridgewater, and had one son and two daughters, viz.: Mary Jennings, Ephraim Jennings Jr., and Sarah Jennings.



58. \*ELIZABETH WASHBURN, married, in 1701, Josiah Conant, of West Bridgewater, who was a grandson of Roger Conant, one of the forefathers, who came over in 1623 and lived at Plymouth. Josiah Conant died about 1721. They had two sons and two daughters, viz.: Joseph Conant, Josiah Conant Jr., Susanna Conant, and Prudence Conant.

#### F O U R T H   G E N E R A T I O N .

##### *Children of Israel Alger. (14.)*

59. \*ISRAEL ALGER Jr., born in 1689, married Alice, daughter of Dea. Joseph Hayward. She was born in 1683, and died in 1716. They had one daughter, Patience Alger, in 1713. He married, in 1717, Susanna, daughter of William Snow, of West Bridgewater, and had three sons, viz.: Israel Alger 3d, Daniel Alger, in 1727, and James Alger, in 1729. The sons had families, and the daughter also, whose name was changed after her mother's death to Alice; and three of them had twenty-two children.

60. \*JOSEPH ALGER, born in 1694, married Mary, daughter of William Ames, of West Bridgewater, in 1719. She was born in 1699. The four generations of Samuel Packard here given, embracing 252 persons, have long since passed away. His posterity, as will be seen by the following genealogy, has now reached the tenth generation. The fourth generation contains the names of 194 persons, yet this is not the whole number. If the descendants of these 194 persons have become as numerous as those of Abel Packard, who is one of that fourth generation, and whose genealogy follows, and whose descendants are 352, then Samuel Packard's posterity would now exceed 48,000.

FIRST GENERATION.

1. \*ABEL PACKARD was the son of John Packard, the grand-son of Zaccheus Packard, and the great-grandson of Samuel Packard, who came from England to this country in 1638, and is the ancestor of the Packards in the United States. He was born in North Bridgewater, Mass., Sept. 8, 1729. At the age of sixteen he was appointed chorister, and long led the choir in the Congregational church. He became blind at about forty years of age. In June, 1774, he removed with his widowed mother, wife and children, to what was then called No. 5; which was incorporated June 23, 1779, and called Cummington, in honor of Col. John Cummings, of Concord, who had purchased the township of the government, June 2d, 1762. His residence was a little west of the center of the town, and he kept a public house. The old "tavern sign" is still preserved as a relic of the last century. The house which he erected in 1784, and the barn that was on the premises in 1774, are yet standing. The early town-meetings were held in his house. More or less he boarded the minister. He was an Ensign in militia, and tradition says he never knew what fear is. He married Esther Porter, of Abington, Jan. 24, 1751. She was a descendant of the fifth generation, it is supposed, of Nicholas Byram, who, "according to family tradition, was the son of an English gentleman of the county of Kent, England, who removed to Ireland about the time this son was born. His father sent him, at the age of sixteen, to visit his friends in England, in charge of a man who betrayed his trust,



robbed him of his money, and sent him to the West Indies, where he was sold to service to pay his passage; and after his term expired he made his way to New England and settled at Weymouth." Ensign Abel Packard's brother, Barnabas, also removed to Cummington, and had seven children. Another brother, John, settled in Plainfield. His sister, Lydia, married Edward Southworth, and settled in Pelham, and has a numerous posterity. Ensign Packard's cousin, Sarah Packard, married Esq. Ebenezer Snell, and settled in Cummington, and was the mother of Rev. Dr. Thomas Snell, and a grandmother of William Cullen Bryant, the poet, and of Prof. E. S. Snell, of Amherst College. In his immediate neighborhood in Cummington, were raised the following persons known in public life, viz.: Hon. Luther Bradish, Hon. Henry L. Dawes, William Cullen Bryant, Rev. Dr. Thomas Snell, and Rev. Dr. Theophilus Packard. During the last century several descendants of the forefather, Samuel Packard, settled in Chesterfield, Pelham, Petersham, New Salem, Warwick, and Conway. Ensign Packard's mother, Lidia (Thompson) Packard, lived with him in Cummington, and died there March 10, 1789, aged about 86. He had eleven children, all except the youngest of whom were born in North Bridgewater, viz.: Abel Jr., Esther, Adam, Lydia, Abigail, Mary, Olive, Theophilus, Jacob, Noah, and Abigail 2d. The father died in Cummington, March 4, 1804, aged 75. The mother died there, May 30, 1812, aged 79. As descendants of the Puritans, they honored their lineage by their Christian characters and lives. They had long professed the religion of the Gospel of Christ, and died in the membership of the Orthodox Congregational Church of Cummington. Well may their posterity respect and imitate such an ancestry.

## SECOND GENERATION.

### *Children of Abel and Esther Packard. (1.)*

2. \*DEA. ABEL PACKARD JR., born in North Bridgewater, April 16, 1754, went with his brother Adam to Cummington,





April 20, 1774, two months previous to the removal of his father's family, to make preparation. He married Mary, daughter of Ebenezer Bisbee, Sept. 20, 1783. She was born in East Bridgewater, Nov. 30, 1759, and had removed to Cummington, and died in Cummington, Sept. 1, 1807, aged 48. He married his second wife, Rachel Porter, daughter of Jacob Porter, Oct., 1808, who was born in Abington, Nov. 17, 1765, and had removed to Worthington, and died in Cummington, Aug. 31, 1851, aged 86. She was a sister of the wife of Adam Packard, who was a brother of her husband. His four children were by his first wife, viz.: Eliphalet, Chester, Betsey, and Theophilus 2d. He long officiated as a Deacon in the Congregational church, and died in Cummington, April 30, 1832, aged 78.

3. \*ESTHER PACKARD, born in North Bridgewater, June 21, 1756, removed with her father's family to Cummington in 1774, and married, Nov. 21, 1793, Esq. Ephraim Williams, of Ashfield, whose numerous sons by a previous wife settled in different portions of the town, and whose posterity have greatly multiplied. He was born Dec. 27, 1747, and was among the early settlers in the town. He served as a Justice of the Peace for many years, represented the town in the Legislature, and died in Ashfield, March 9, 1839, aged 92. By his second wife he had one son, Abel Williams. The mother died in Ashfield, May 31, 1826, aged 70.

4. \*ADAM PACKARD Esq., born in North Bridgewater, Feb. 11, 1758, went with his brother Abel in 1774 to Cummington, to prepare for the arrival of his father's family two months afterwards, in June, 1774. In 1790, Nov. 11, he married Abigail Porter, daughter of Jacob Porter. She was born in Abington, April 3d, 1768, and moved to Worthington. They had eight children, who were born in Cummington, viz.: William, Olive, Philo, Philo 2d, Ruby, Abel, Polly Porter, and Abigail. The father died in Cummington, July 20, 1810, aged 52. The mother died there July 13, 1829, aged 61.

5. \*LYDIA PACKARD, born in North Bridgewater, July 4, 1760, removed with her father's family to Cummington in 1774;



was partially blind in her last years; was never married, and died in Cummington, Dec. 23, 1836, aged 76.

6. \*ABIGAIL PACKARD, born Aug. 24, 1763, in North Bridgewater, and died the same day.

7. \*MARY PACKARD, born in North Bridgewater, Sept. 29, 1764, removed with her father's family to Cummington in 1774, and married Col. Lebbeus Bates, of Cummington, March 20, 1788. He was born in Weymouth, Jan. 16, 1760, removed to Cummington about 1784, and to Windsor in 1817, where he died, Sept. 6, 1844, aged 84. He was the youngest of four brothers, all of whom were in the revolutionary war in different parts of the field, and who returned home in safety at the close of the war, not having seen each other during the whole time. He was with our army at the capture of Burgoyne in Oct., 1777, near Saratoga. By Mary Packard he had four children, born in Cummington, viz.: Sibyl, Quincy, Galen, and Polly. His wife died Aug. 27, 1804, aged 40. He married his second wife, Melatiah Robbins, of Cummington, June 14, 1807, by whom he had William Albert and William Henry, both of whom live in Worthington, and Mary Jane, who died in 1830, aged 8. The mother died July 28, 1860, aged 79.

8. \*OLIVE PACKARD, born in North Bridgewater, Feb. 3, 1767, removed with her father's family to Cummington in 1774, and married Capt. Joseph Narramore, of Goshen, in Dec., 1785. They had ten children, born in Goshen, viz.: Deborah, Clarissa, Olive, Samuel, Deborah 2d, Abigail, Electa, Esther, Joseph Jr., and Abel. He was born Aug. 13, 1760, and died in Goshen, Oct. 2, 1834, aged 74; she died on a visit at her daughter's, Mrs. Olive Hawks, in Shelburne, Sept. 7, 1835, aged 68.

9. \*REV. THEOPHILUS PACKARD, D.D., born in North Bridgewater, March 4, 1769, and removed, at five years of age, with his father's family, to Cummington. He graduated at Dartmouth College in 1796, in the class with Rev. Dr. Philander Chase, late Bishop in the Episcopal church; studied theology with Rev. Dr. Asa Burton, of Thetford, Vt., was licensed to preach in six months by the Orange Association of Vermont, and was ordained in Shelburne, Feb. 20, 1799. He was on the Board of Trustees of Williams College from 1810 to 1825, and was on the Board of



Overseers of the Fund, or of Trustees of Amherst College, from 1821 to 1854. He represented Shelburne in the State Legislature in 1829, 1830, and 1839. He received a Doctorate from Dartmouth College in 1824. During his ministry in Shelburne he attended 150 ecclesiastical councils; about 400 members were added to his church; seventeen persons from the town acquired a collegiate education, and nine from among his people became ministers of the Gospel. On the 20th of Feb., 1849, fifty years from his ordination, he preached a Half-Century sermon, which was published. Of the large congregation present on the occasion, only *twenty* remembered having been present at the ordination. Several of his sermons preached on special occasions were published. On the 20th of Feb., 1842, he publicly expressed his relinquishment of pastoral labor, and received no farther support from his people. From 1846 to 1854 he lived with a daughter of his in South Deerfield, and spent the last year or two of his life in Shelburne. He instructed thirty-one students in theology, who became preachers. Feb. 9, 1800, he married Mary, daughter of Dea. Isaac Tirrill, of Abington. Their mothers were sisters. They had eight children, who were born in Shelburne, viz.: Theophilus Jr., Isaac Tirrill, Louisa, Marian, Esther Porter, Sibyl Tirrill, Laura Emily, and Lucy Jane. The father died in Shelburne, Sept. 17, 1855, aged 86; the mother died in South Deerfield, Dec. 4, 1865, aged 90. She was born in Abington, Nov. 17, 1775. Her remains were interred at Shelburne. For further particulars respecting Rev. Dr. Packard, see sermon preached at his funeral by Rev. Dr. Hitchcock, of Amherst College, and published, and the Congregational Year Book, vol. 3, for 1856, page 109, and accounts of him by Rev. Dr. Sprague, Rev. Dr. Thomas Snell, and Rev. Dr. Thomas Shepard, in Sprague's Annals of the American Pulpit, vol. 2, page 408.

10 \*JACOB PACKARD, born in North Bridgewater, Jan. 22, 1771, and died the same day.

13. \*ELIPHALET PACKARD Esq., born in Cummington, Sept. 2, 1784, married, March 30, 1808, Clarissa, daughter of Capt. Robert Dawes, of Cummington, who was born Oct. 4, 1787, and died March 18, 1823, aged 36. He married Lucy Olds, Oct. 27, 1826, who was born in Chesterfield in 1790, and died in Cummington, Aug. 11, 1840, aged 50. He married, March 2, 1841, Amanda Kent, of Longmeadow, who was born Aug. 20, 1801, and died in Cummington, May 22, 1859, aged 58. By his first wife he had five children, born in Cummington, except the second, Austin, viz: Theron, Austin, Sally, Mary, and Clarissa. By his second wife he had one son, Levi Spencer. He lived in Worthington from 1809 to 1814. In 1860 Esq. E. Packard removed to Crystal Lake, Waupacca Co., Wisconsin, and lived there with his brother Chester. He has lived to be a cotemporary with *seven* generations of his kindred, from a great-grandmother to a great-grandchild. He died June 3d, 1868, at Crystal Lake, Wis., aged 83.

14. CHESTER PACKARD, born in Cummington, June 6, 1788, and married, July 4, 1816, Eunice Sadler, who was born in Williamsburg in 1797, and died in Cummington, July 25, 1830, aged 33. In 1851, Sept. 17, he married Anne Bates, of Cummington, who was born there in 1796. By his first wife he had six children, born in Cummington, viz.: Ira, Edwin Chester, Edwin Chester 2d, Sumner, Silas Sadler, and William Dwight. He removed to McKean, Ohio, in 1833, and then in 1852 to Dayton, Waupacca Co., Wisconsin, where he now lives. Crystal Lake is a post office address in Dayton.

15. BETSEY PACKARD, born in Cummington, March 9, 1791, and married Nehemiah Richards April 3, 1810, who was born in Cummington, July 1, 1785. They removed to Ohio in 1834, and eventually to Kirtland, Lake Co., Ohio, and now live near Washington City, D. C. They had eight children





born in Cummington, viz.: Zalmon, Lawrence, Mary Packard, James, Clarissa, Christiana J., Almarin Cooley, and Alvan Stone.

16. \*THEOPHILUS PACKARD 2d, born in Cummington, Nov. 30, 1793, married, Nov. 26, 1818, Esther Guilford, who was born in Williamsburg, June 22, 1789, and died Feb. 9, 1835, aged 46. Dec. 24, 1840, he married Maria H. Morgan, who was born in Mifflin, Penn., April 17, 1813, and who died in Alexandria, Ohio, March 20, 1854, aged 41. Dec. 25, 1856, he married Hannah Canfield, who was born May 8, 1803, in Dutchess Co., N. Y., and removed to Granville, Ohio, in 1836. He removed to Fredonia, Ohio, in 1833, and has lived in Burlington, O., in Homer, O., and Alexandria, O., and Granville, O., in which last named place he died, March 8, 1867, aged 73. By his first wife he had seven children, born in Cummington, viz.: Melissa Augusta, Abel, Abel Guilford, Ardelia Maria, Isaac Tirrill, Rachel Electa, and Theophilus Simeon. By his second wife he had two sons, Morgan Elmer, born in Homer, O., and Joseph Ernest, born in Alexandria, O. In 1866, one year previous to his death, the "Newark (Ohio) American" published the following, viz.: "Mr. Theophilus Packard, of Granville, called at our office a few days ago. Mr. Packard belongs to a family rather remarkable for health and longevity. He is 72 years old, and the youngest of a family of four, which has never been diminished by death. The family consists of three brothers and a sister. The eldest brother is 82; the second 78; and the sister 75; in the aggregate 307 years, and all enjoying a hale and hearty old age. The habits of these men have always been regular and temperate, and they have always been early risers, scarcely ever being in bed after five in the morning."

*Child of Esq. Ephraim and Esther (Packard) Williams. (3.)*

17. \*COL. ABEL WILLIAMS, born in Ashfield, Sept. 26, 1794, and married Lydia Eldridge, March 16, 1814, who was born in Ashfield, July 31, 1793, and died there Feb. 28, 1867, aged 74. They had two children born in Ashfield, viz.: Esther Porter, and Ephraim. Col. Williams removed from Ashfield to Windsor in 1855, and died in Windsor, Aug. 2, 1857, aged 63.

18. \*ESQ. WILLIAM PACKARD, born Oct. 25, 1791, in Cummington, married, Oct. 25, 1824, Sarah Stoddard, of Plainfield, who was born there, March 14, 1799. They had five children born in Cummington, where the parents lived till 1869, viz.: Laura Sarah, William Jr., Vesta Augusta, Melinda Diantha, and William Lucius. During the fifty years past he has held numerous offices in the town and parish and various societies, having been treasurer of the parish more than 30 years, and of the town more than 40 years. As Justice of the Peace he has presided at nearly 40 civil trials, and no appeal was ever taken from his decisions. He lived on the farm to which his grandfather, Ensign Abel Packard, removed in 1774. Since 1869 he lived in Worthington, till his death, Nov. 2, 1870, aged 79.

19. \*OLIVE PACKARD, born in Cummington, Oct. 9, 1793, and married, Dec. 29, 1814, Jacob Whitmarsh, who was born in Cummington, Jan. 1, 1789. They lived in Worthington in 1815 and 1816, and in Plainfield from 1816 to 1867, and then in Cummington, and have had seven children, viz.: Polly P., Florintha, Marian, Jacob Sebert, Fordyce, Rachel, and Nahum. She died in Cummington, July 25, 1870, aged 76.

20. \*PHILO PACKARD, born in Cummington, Oct. 7, 1795, and died there Aug. 8, 1797, aged 2.

21. \*PHILO PACKARD 2d, born in Cummington, Jan. 11, 1798, and, Nov. 21, 1832, married Irena Stoddard, who was born in Plainfield, March 4, 1810, and died in Cummington, May 5, 1838, aged 28. He married, Oct. 10, 1839, Sukeey Stoddard, who was born in Plainfield, March 20, 1795, and died in Cummington, Dec. 18, 1840, aged 45. She was a sister of his first wife, and of Esq. William Packard's wife. He married, April 2, 1856, his third wife, Vesta (Beals) Snell, who was a daughter of Dea. Robert Beals, of Plainfield, and the widow of Ebenezer Snell, and was born Sept. 29, 1808, and died in Cummington, Aug. 25, 1859, aged 51. By his first wife he had Philo Franklin and Theresa Abigail; and by his second wife he had Susan S.; all of them born in Cummington, where the father lived, and occupied, till near his death, the same house in



which Ensign Abel Packard lived and died. He died in Cum-  
mington, East Village, Aug. 5, 1870, aged 72.

22. \*RUBY PACKARD, born in Cummington, Oct. 21, 1799,  
and died there July 25, 1837, aged 38.

23. \*DOCT. ABEL PACKARD, born in Cummington, Sept. 18,  
1802, and, Oct. 30, 1825, married Maria, daughter of Dea. James  
W. Briggs, and granddaughter of Rev. James Briggs, the first  
minister of Cummington, where she was born, May 5, 1804.  
They had two children born in Cummington, viz.: Frances  
Eugene and Calvin Eugene. He graduated at Amherst College  
in 1824; studied medicine in New Haven; practiced in Cum-  
mington; removed to Wolcott, Conn., in 1829; and died in Cum-  
mington, Dec. 12, 1830, aged 28. His widow married, Oct. 30,  
1831, Doct. Junius L. Field, of Waterbury, Conn., who was born  
Feb. 1, 1808, and they have lived in Unadilla, Mich., and have  
four children, viz.: James Edward, Sarah Elizabeth, Eugene  
Briggs, and Calvin Briggs; all but the first of whom died young.  
Doct. J. L. Field died at Unadilla, Mich., Nov. 23, 1867, aged 60.

24. \*POLLY PORTER PACKARD, born in Cummington, May  
9, 1806, and died there Nov. 14, 1815, aged 9.

25. \*ABIGAIL PACKARD, born in Cummington, Jan. 3, 1811,  
and, June 9, 1833, married Asa Huntington Porter, who was  
born Feb. 7, 1802. They lived in Cummington, where they had  
one child, Sarah, and where the mother died Feb. 24, 1835, aged  
24, and where the father now lives, and where the daughter died.

26. \*SIBYL BATES, born in Cummington, July 23, 1789, and,  
April 19, 1826, married Joseph Phillips, of Windsor, who was  
born in East Bridgewater, March 21, 1790, and removed to Wind-  
sor about 1811, where he now lives. They had one son and one  
daughter born in Windsor, viz.: John L. Thomas and Lucy  
Cornelia. The mother died in Windsor, Oct. 4, 1860, aged 71.  
By a previous wife he had one son, with whom he now lives.

27. QUINCY BATES, born in Cummington, March 17, 1791,  
and married Louisa Knapp, March 5, 1812, who was born April  
17, 1790, and died Jan. 3, 1839, aged 49. He married widow  
Margaret Sherman, June 5, 1844, who was born March 14, 1800.



He removed from Cummington to Petersburg, N. Y., about 1817, then to Windham, N. Y., then to Worthington, then to Cummington, and in 1847 removed to Goshen, his present residence. By his first wife he had ten children, viz.: Shepard F., Herman Lee, Emily L., Marcus A., Mary Lorinda, Fordyce and Gordyce, twins, Laura F., Jonathan Lebbeus, and William Austin.
