



THE WOODROW FAMILY

(Contributed to Genealogy)

The first of the name was Patrick Wodrow, born 1530. Robert Wodrow, born 1600, was called by Alexander, Earl of Eglinton, to be his Chamberlain; he married Agnes Dunlop, and had six sons and one daughter. A son, James Wodrow, born 1637, was a Professor of Divinity in the Glasgow University. He married Margaret, daughter of William Hair, Esq., in 1679; their son, Robert, was the first historian of the church, author of "The Sufferings of the · Church of Scotland." He was an eminent divine and had a prominent place in ecclesiastical courts. He married. 17:38, Margaret, daughter of Rev. Patrick Warner, of Ayrshire, granddaughter of William Guthrie, of Fenwick. Soon after his collegiate course, William Guthrie, was installed as tutor to Lord Mauchlin, son of John Campbell, Earl and Baron, of London, one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland. Here he met and married Agnes, daughter of David Campbell, of Ayrshire, a descendant of Archibald Campbell, Duke of Argyle (who crowned Charles II at Scone), and his wife, Margaret, second daughter of William II, Earl of Moreton, of the great and noble house of Douglas (Chambers).

From the marriage of William Guthrie and Agnes Campbell, came Margaret, daughter of Patrick Warner, granddaughter of William Guthrie, who married Robert Wodrow, and was the maternal ancestor of the American Woodrows. After the death of Robert Wodrow, 1734, his four sons left Scotland. Alexander came to America and settled in Virginia, another son settled in Pennsylvania,

another in Nova Scotia. Other Wodrows, sons of James, also emigrated about the same time; John Wodrow, either a son of Robert, or his nephew, went to England and there joined the Quakers. His son, Isaac, married Mary Chivers, came to America and settled in Culpeper Co., Va. Their son, Joshua, married Elizabeth Watson, of Philadelphia, and moved from Virginia to Ohio, where their daughter, Rachel Wodrow, met and married General Allen Trimble, Governor of Ohio.

Another branch of the Woodrow family in America is represented by Rev. James Woodrow, of Columbia, S. Car., a lineal descendant of Patrick, James and Robert, born in Carlyle, Eng., May, 1828, and married 4 August, 1857, Felie S. Baker. They had four children, Jeanie, James, Marion and Mary Charlotte. He was a son of Thomas Woodrow, D. D., born in Paisley, Scot., 15 March, 1793, graduate and A. M., of the University of Glasgow; minister in the Orkney Islands, London, Brockville, (Canada,) Chillicothe and other points in Ohio and Kentucky. He married Marion Williamson, born in Glasgow, Scot., 2 May, 1791, died 16 February, 1836, New York; daughter of Robert Williamson, Deacon in Ralph Wardlow Chapel in Glasgow. Her mother, Marion Wright, was born 1749.

John Wodrow, father of Thomas Wodrow, born in Paisley, Scot., 7 June, 1765, died 1837. He was an elder in St. George's Church, at Paisley. He married 27 September, 1787, Janet Moreton. He must have been a grandson of Robert Wodrow.

Jessie Woodrow, sister of Rev. James Woodrow, of Columbia, S. Car., married Joseph R. Wilson, and her son, Woodrow Wilson, now president of the United States, was born 26 December, 1856, at Staunton, Va.

Hayden, in his "Virginia Genealogies" states that Harriet Gove Scott, born Alexandria, Va., 1811; died Columbus, Ohio, 1865; married 1st, 1835, Asahel Renich, who died 1840; married 2nd, 1844, Rev. Thomas Woodrow,

D. D., Chillicothe, O., son of Rev. James Woodrow, of Columbia, S. Car.

SETH WARNER

(Contributed to Genealegy)

Seth Warner, the American soldier, was born in Connecticut 17 May, 1743, and died 26 December, 1784. Having removed in 1763 to Bennington, he was prominent in the dispute between New York and the "New Hampshire Grants," and was outlawed with Ethan Allen and others. He took part in the capture of Ticonderoga, and 12 May, 1775, effected the surrender of Crown Point, with its garrison and 113 cannon. On 16 September, 1775, he was made by Montgomery, in whose Canadian expedition he participated, colonel of a regiment of Green Mountain Rangers, though the provincial congress of New York withheld his commission. On 5 July, 1776, he was commissioned by Congress colonel of a regiment formed in pursuance of a resolution passed that day, and on 7 July, 1777, was defeat-

ed by Fraser at the battle of Hubbardton. At the battle of Bennington, August 16th, he arrived with his regiment in time to meet the enemy's reinforcement and secure a victory. In 1782 he withdrew from the service.

A RELIC OF 1777

Simon F. Monroe, of New Orleans, La., who recently returned from a visit to Scotland, brought home a curious and interesting relic which was unearthed, by the merest accident, in an ancient churchyard in Linlithgow, Scot. It is a copper plate, twelve by fifteen inches, taken from an oaken coffin, bearing in very legible letters, the following inscription.

"James Glen
Esqr.
I of Longeroft
Late Governor of
South Carolina
Obit. 18th July
1777
Ae 76"

The oaken coffin held a lead coffin in which it is supposed the remains of James Glen were deposited, from the fact that another copper plate, having an inscription, a facsimile of the above, was found securely attached. The plate in the possession of Mr. Monroe was unearthed by Adam Dawson, Esq., provost of Linlithgow, who stated that a few years ago, on the occasion of the burial of an American lady, the spade of the sexton struck and brought to the surface this memento of the past. Linlithgow churchyard in which the remains of James Glen were found is a very ancient place of sepulture and adjoins the ruins of the famous Linlithgow Palace in which Mary Queen of Scots was born.

THE SCOTCH-IRISH IN NORTHAMPTON CO., PENN.

In the year 1728, ante-dating many years the settlement of Easton, Bethlehem, Nazareth and Allentown, a colony of Scotch Presbyterians, founded what was known as the Craig settlement, in the Monoquasy Valley, eleven miles northwest from Easton. The territory was named Allen Township in honor of Chief Justice, William Allen, who became proprietor about 1740. The settlement later bore the name of the "Irish settlement" and is now known as the town of Bath.

The Scotch-Irish families of Craig, Ralston, Lattimore, McCord, McCook, McConnell, Brown, Sterling, Horner and Wilson, composed the pioneer band of Ulster Scots, who first settled in Bath and the immediate territory. Daniel Craig, the Scotch-Irish ancestor of Ex-President, Theodore Roosevelt was among the early white settlers of the Borough of Bath.

A PIONEER WOMAN OF THE WEST

Mrs. Eliza Castle, one of the early pioneer women of the West, died a few weeks ago at Colton, Cal. Mrs. Castle was born in Newton, Eng., 23 January, 1840, her maiden name being Eliza Arnell. Mr. James Swinnerton, a well known artist, who married a daughter of Mrs. Castle, has written an unique tribute to this pioneer woman of the West, as follows:

"As Mrs. Eliza Castle lay, her soul fast joining the myriads beyond, she rallied a moment, a smile serene, beautiful, came to her strong old face, and she hummed twice the notes of an Indian song, a long forgotten melody of Indian legendry. What memories of a past, of hardships and stress, must have been echoing in the fast dissembling brain—that brain which had been trained to know no fear, no turning back, no lagging in duty, and yet withal as just and as kind as the brain of mortal may attain.

"The pioneer woman has only too few to appreciate the character that could stand under the stress of desert travels, the menace of hostile tribes, of the birth of children under circumstances that would seemingly bend a body of steel. True the man provided and defended, but the woman was by his side in the defense; and beside, the drudgery fell on her quite as much as it did on her hostile sister. Day in and out it was the strain of work plus danger and hardships.

"Fast passing now, the pioneer women of this section should be given an everlasting monument in our deepest regard. Their chronicled efforts are few and meagre. Our children are almost totally ignorant of the wonderful qualities they had. What a strengthening inspiration their memory should be to the present more or less colorless growing generation. The faint old Indian songs

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crooned pathetically by the dying lips of a wonder woman of the old stern days should take our thoughts back in tribute to their sacrifices that we might now have come fort in a land of roses and a wreath of sunshine. Appreciation intertwined with love to you, Pioneer Woman, who calmly and with brave eye walks on and out, erect, unfearing."

GIBSONS IN THE REVOLUTION

Abraham Gibson, born 1752, in Lunenburg, Mass., died 1829, in Leiscester, Vt., served as a minute man in the Worcester County, Mass., Militia under different commands.

Abraham Gibson, born 1735, in Stow, Mass., died 1813, in Lunenburg, Mass., served in the early colonial wars and was a minute man in the Revolution.

Isaac Gibson, born 1721, in Sudbury, Mass., died 1797, in Grafton, Vt. He was a minute man at the Lexington alarm and gave valuable civil service during the Revolution.

John Gibson, born 1738, died 1778, was a member of Anthony Wayne's regiment and was killed at Valley Forge.

Robert Gibson, born 1758, died 1801, in Chester County, Penn., served as a sergeant in Capt. Samuel Watson's Company, Pennsylvania Militia.

William Gibson, born 1759, in Hopkinton, Mass., died 1839, in Woodstock, Vt., was placed on the pension roll in Vermont in 1832, for service as a private and sergeant in the Massachusetts Militia.

Thomas Gibson, born 1750, Prince Edward County, Va., died 1800, in Farmville, Va., served as a licutenant in Capt. James O'Hara's Independent Company.

Barnabas Gibson went from Pelham at the Bennington alarm and served in Capt. Amos Gage's Company of Volunteers in the Burgoyne Campaign.

THE HAWKINS FAMILY IN AMERICA

The Hawkins family little known in colonial New England, is a name famous in Virginia, North Carolina, Kentucky, and all the way to Texas, for the gallantry of all its members.

John Hawkins, a lenial descendant of Sir John Hawkins, of England, was in America about 1718. And as soon as he reached his majority he, following in the footsteps of his ancestor, Sir John Hawkins, engaged in the African slave trade, Sir John Hawkins having brought to America the first importation of slaves.

It is doubtless true that he was a protege of Queen Elizabeth, and was operating in this expedition under her guidance and assistance; indeed, she was equally interested in the profits arising from the expedition.

John Hawkins, with his sisters, Jane, Mildred, Agnes and Elizabeth Hawkins, and Colonel Thomas Langford and family, came to Virginia to make their future home. Colonel Thomas Langford had been in the naval service. His daughter, Mary Langford, married John Hawkins in Virginia.

Jane, the oldest daughter of John Hawkins and Mary Langford, married General John Todd. He was the son of David Todd and wife, Hannah Owens, of Kentucky. In 1777 he was one of the first two burgesses sent by Kentucky to Virginia General Assembly.

While a burgess at Richmond, he married Jane Hawkins. He was for several years civil governor and colonel of the County of Illinois. In 1782 he fell in battle at "Blue Lick." Their daughter married first, Colonel Russell, and second, Robert Wickliffe, both distinguished men of Kentucky.

The earliest Boston records indicate that James Hawkins and his wife, Mary, were in Massachusetts prior to 1650. Their daughter, Sarah, was born in Boston, in

March, 1656, and in the same year Mehitable Hawkins was born to Thomas Hawkins and his wife, Rebecca, also in Boston. In 1653, Sarah, the daughter of Widow Hawkins, was married to Robert Breck, a Boston merchant, by Deputy Governor Bellingham.

The Hawkins family of Long Island were largely of Smithtown, where Jonas was a leading name. In 1753 Mary Hawkins married Jacob Mills. Jonas Hawkins had married Ruth Mills and Rachel Hawkins married a Jonathan Mills. The Hawkins and Mills tribes evidently formed a very close corporation.

In New Hampshire, Ephriam Hawkins married Miss Alexander, of Winchester, and there was also a Hawkins family in Temple, N. H.

Thomas and Benjamin Hawkins were well known men in Philadelphia before the Revolution, and Peter Hawkins was in Montgomery County, Md., before 1790.

The Connecticut family was a considerable one. Anthony Hawkins was of Farmington and was married there in 1656, to Anne Welles. Thomas and John Hawkins were in New London in 1748, and George was living in Coventry, where he married Hannah Kingsley. There were Rhode Island families in Scituate and Glocester.

There were numerous Johns in the War for Independence. John Hawkins, a native of Charles County, Md., was a captain in the Revolution. John of Virginia was a private from Hampshire Co. John of Baltimore, was a captain of Eastern Shore troops in 1771.

Thomas Hawkins served as a lieutenant in the Pennsylvania line, 1776-1778. He died in Washington Co.

Joseph Hawkins, of Rhode Island, enlisted as a private from Ubridge. He served as a sailor on the frigate Dean, was captured and confined in England until the treaty of peace was signed. He died in Ohio in Summit Co.

Here lies George Lyttleton Smith Parker, son of George and Elizabeth Parker, and grandson of Isaac and Elizabeth Smith; he was born 13th day of December, A. D., 1803, and died on 26th of June, 1806.

SOME LARGE FAMILIES

(Contributed to Genealogy)

John Sherman of Watertown, Mass., born in England in 1613, died 8 August, 1675, was twice married, having six children by his first wife and twenty by his second wife.

Manley Butler, who married Sarah Hamlett, of Pelham, N. H., had thirteen children, seven sons, six daughters. First born 19 July, 1812; thirteenth born 28 December, 1835. His sister, Betsy Butler, married Solomon Barker, of Pelham, N. H., and had twelve children.

William Rawson, born 21 May, 1651, married 11 July, 1673, Ann Glover, daughter of Nathaniel Glover, Dorchester, Mass. They had twenty-children, ten sons and ten daughters; first born 11 April, 1674; twentieth born August, 1698, twenty in twenty-four years. All recorded in family Bible.

NEW JERSEY BISHOP FAMILY

(Contributed to Genealogy)

Concerning the original settler, John Bishop, of Woodbridge, N. J., the town book has the following to say of him: "John Bishop was one of the original associates. He was from Newbury, Mass., where, by his wife Rebecca, daughter of Richard Kent, he had son Noah, born 20 June, 1658. The children of Noah are given in this register.

"Marriages-Mary Bishop to Charles Gilman of

Piscataway, 9 January, 1684."

"Births—Bishop, Sarah (Noah and Lydia), 10 February, 1684; Jonathan (Noah and Lydia), 9 January, 1686; Ruth (Noah and Lydia), 9 February, 1690; Mary (Noah and Lydia), April, 1693; Noah (Noah and Lydia), 8 March, 1694-5; Ann (Noah and Lydia), 8 March, 1697."

No further vital records of this family are evident in the town book.

John Bishop was a carpenter, which was a common vecation of the early settlers of Woodbridge, but he was also a substantial man of affairs in the early history of the town. However, it appears that in Newbury, he was a miller. He had settled there in 1637 and he sold his mill in 1644 and removed to Woodbridge, possibly 1666-7.

Daily, in his "History of Woodbridge," is somewhat contemptuous of military titles and makes the following comment concerning the Bishops: "They had a monopoly of the cheap distinction at one time, young John Bishop glorying for a long time in the captaincy, old John in licutenancy and Jonathan being ensign. No use being made of these officers, of course, we cannot say just how

COPY MADE BY INDIANA STATE LIBRARY valiant they were. In civil life the Bishops were exceedingly useful and did good service in their day and generation."

It is true that in 1675 John Bishop, Sr., was appointed a lieutenant in the local military company; his oldest son was captain for several years of the same company, and is frequently referred to in the records as Captain John Bishop, and 1682-1687 his brother, Jonathan Bishop, was ensign.

When John Bishop, Sr., settled in Woodbridge he received the 240 acres of upland and forty acres of meadow allowed to each of the associates and in addition acquired another 190 acres. In the early land divisions his son, John acquired seventeen acres and Jonathan acquired forty-one acres. In 1682 Jonathan was admitted a free-holder upon consideration of building a sawmill on Rahway River. In addition two other sons of John Bishop, Sr., settled in Woodbridge, i. e., Noah and David.

When the township court was opened in 1669, John Bishop, Sr., was made assistant, and in 1671 chosen again; in 1676 he was "viewer and scaler of leather;" in 1669 and 1674 was on a committee to secure a clergyman; a ratemaker in 1675 and a tax gatherer in 1670-1; he was on the committee for schools in 1682 and his name appears as witness to several wills and in connection with the administration of estates, so that he enjoyed the confidence of his neighbors and stood well.

While in Newbury, John Bishop, Sr., had married Rebecca, daughter of Richard Kent, when she was the widow of Samuel Scullard, her first husband. Richard Kent, Sr., was a malster, came to Ipswich in 1635, then to Newbury the same year. He died 14 June, 1654, and had a daughter, Rebecca, who must have been born about 1620, which gives a clew to the probable birth of John Bishop, Sr., near to that date.

Rebecca's first husband died in 1647. By him she

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had four children: Mary, born 9 January, 1642; Rebecca, born 4 February, 1644; Sarah, born 18 June, 1645; Martha, who died 6 March, 1645. She must have been married to her second husband in 1647, and several of their children were born and recorded in Newbury. John Bishop, Sr., died in 1684, leaving a will dated 27 September, 1684, which was proved 27 November, 1684, in which he does not mention his wife, but does mention his sons, Jonathan, John, Noah and his daughters Rebecca, Joanna and Ann, grandchild John Bishop, the natural son of John, and refers to land at Rahway and at Newbury.

David, born 26 August, 1660.

One of the above daughters possibly married John Alston, the name frequently being spelled Elston in the Woodbridge records, or perhaps a sister of Rebecca Kent, was the wife of John Alston. Certain it is that there was an intimate relationship, because Captain John Bishop called John Alston "kinsman" in his will.

Of the family of John Bishop, Sr., the four sons, Captain John, Jonathan, Noah and David Bishop, all settled at Woodbridge and took prominent parts in the affairs of the town.

Rev. Nathan Birdseye, of West Haven, Conn., born 19 August, 1714, graduated from Yale in 1736. He died 28 January, 1818, aged 103 years and five months. He had 258 descendants of whom 206 were living at the time of his death. His wife died at the age of 88. They had 12 children, 76 grandchildren, 163 great-grandchildren and 7 of the fifth generation.



THE CHAPMAN FAMILY IN AMERICA (Contributed to Genealogy)

The parent stock of the Chapman family flourished through several generations in Leicestershire, England, from whence emigrated to Ireland two brothers, John and William, under the auspices of their cousin-german, Sir Walter Raleigh. The elder brother died without issue. The family was established there by William, who left an only son, Benjamin, a captain in the army, whose second son, Thomas, came over to America with the first colonists.

There were numerous pioneers who came early to Virginia. Francis Chapman came in the ship "Star," in 1608. Two years later, in 1610, arrived Thomas Chapman in the "Tryall," while in 1617 arrived his wife, Ann, and two children. The "Jonathan," in 1619, brought Nicholas Chapman, aged thirty-one years. In 1621, Philip Chapman, aged twenty-three years, was one of the arrivals, in the "Flying Hart."

Among the immigrants in 1635 was Henry Chapman, aged nineteen, in the "Primrose," and John Chapman, aged twenty-four, in the "Expedition." Half a century later, in 1685, for his participation in the Monmouth Rebellion, Matthew Chapman was transported.

Nathaniel Chapman, born in 1695, son of Jonathan, settled in Charles County, Maryland, where he established an extensive plantation, upon which he resided during the remainder of his life. As his father had done before him, the son engaged in the culture of tobacco, and acquired a considerable fortune for that period. Besides

COPY MADE BY INDIANA STATE LIBRARY his estate in Charles County, he also owned extensive tracts of land in Stafford, Prince William, Fauquier and Fairfax Counties, Virginia.

The Chapmans were early in New England. Ralph was living in Scituate, Mass., in 1657, where in September of that year, his children, Sarah, John and Ralph were baptized by Dr. Witherell.

Richard Chapman and his wife, Mary, were residents of Boston as early as 1635. Their son, Richard, died there at the age of seventeen, in September, 1653. Isaac Chapman of Barnstable, Mass., married Rebecca Leonard in 1678, and they were the parents of a family of nine.


In Connecticut, Robert Chapman was in Saybrook, having married there as early as 1642, and there was a large and growing Saybrook family in the next thirty years, including John, Nathanial and several Roberts. Not far away in Windsor, the widow Chapman married Samuel Cross in 1677.

Andrew Chapman of Connecticut, born in 1754, was a soldier at the battles of Stillwater and Saratoga, and at the siege of Boston. He aided in the building of Fort Trumbull.

James Chapman, born in Connecticut, in 1720, enlisted with his son James, Jr., in the Revolution, having fought in the earlier wars. He commanded a company at Bunker Hill, and was killed at the Battle of Harlem Heights. When dying he handed his sword to his son, James, saying: "Take this and never disgrace it." His brother, Richard, was killed at Groton, and his brothers, John and Joseph also served in the Revolution.

Another Chapman at the Battle of Harlem Heights was Daniel, also of Connecticut. Later he was appointed commander of the armed boat, "Success."

John Chapman was an ensign in the Revolution. In the Long Island campaign he was taken prisoner. He was on the pension roll from Luzerne County, Penn.



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THE MOFFETT FAMILY

Rev. Anderson Moffett was imprisoned and persecuted during the Revolutionary War because of his belief and strong religious influence. Henry Moffett had one other son named Daniel. He died in Fauquier. Henry Moffett was accompanied to this country by three brothers—Daniel, Jesse and John.

Henry Mossett was twice married—first to Mary Anderso and afterward to her sister, Elizabeth Anderson. One of the descendants of Rev. Anderson Mossett married a Bryan.





THE MOODY FAMILY IN AMERICA (Contributed to Genealogy)

In early colonial New England there were two principal Moody families, those of William Moody, of Newbury, Mass., and John Moody, of Roxbury, Mass. There were also the following: Eleazer Moody, of Boston, a freeman in 1690; Lady Deborah Moody, of Salem, and afterward of Gravesend, Long Island, and Sir Henry Moody, of Gravesend, son of Lady Deborah Moody.

George Moody, of Moulton, county Suffolk, England, was "famous for his housekeeping and just and plain dealing." He married Lydia Smith of Ispwich. His son Samuel, was a woollen draper in Bury, an alderman, a justice of the peace and a member of parliament, who married Mary Boldin, daughter of John Boldin, of Bury St. Edmunds.

John Moody, son of George and Lydia of Moulton, England, came to the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1633 with the first pioneers, who settled in Ipswich. With him came his wife Sarah, but they do not appear to have brought any children. In 1636 he was one of the company which was led by the Reverend Thomas Hooker across the country to the banks of the Connecticut river, where they founded the settlement of Hartford. In his will of 25 July, 1655, he mentions his wife, Sarah, his son Samuel, and Elizabeth Segar, who is believed to have been his daughter.


Samuel Moody, of Hartford, was probably the only son of John and Sarah Moody. About 1660 he moved to Hadley, Mass., where he died in 1689.

COFY LLOE BY INDIANA STATE LIBRARY William Moody, according to tradition and early records, was a native of Wales. He removed to Ipawich, England, in his mature years, and in 1633, joined the migration which followed Governor John Winthrop, who had come three years before. He wintered in Ipawich, Mass., in 1634, and in the following year was one of the company of first settlers of Ould Newbury. By occupation he was a saddler and blacksmith, and is said to have been the first in New England to shoe oxen so as to keep them from slipping on the ice. He died in Newbury, October, 1673.

Joshua Moody was born in Newbury, Mass., about 1632. Graduated from Harvard College in 1653, he began preaching in Portsmouth, N. H., in 1658. In 1684. his sturdy religious independence brought him into conflict with the civil authorities and at the instigation of Lieutenant-Governor Edward Cranfield he was indicted and imprisoned for thirteen weeks for refusing to administer the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, after the manner of the Church of England. He was vigorous in denunciation of the Salem witchcraft delusion of 1692 and openly befriended Philip English and his wife, who were accused, helping them to escape from the Boston iail whither they had been removed from Salem and sending them to New York for safety. He was a prolific writer of sermons and other treatises. In September 1688, his sermons had reached the number of 4.070.

In the Revolutionary war was Nathaniel P. Moody, born in Haverhill, Mass., who was in the battles of Monmouth, Stony Point and Yorktown. Paul Moody, born 1743, was among the wounded at Bunker Hill.

In 1700 there was a large Moody family at Stratford, Conn., and in 1750, there were several of the name living in Scarborough, Maine, including Temperance Moody, whose daughter married into the Fogg family. Richard and John were early residents of New Hamp-



shire. There were two Moody families in Bucks Co., Penn., before 1770.

In York Co., Va., were William and John Moody and Granville Moody of Amelia Co., married Mary Booker of the well known Virginia family. Moses and Boyer Moody were residents of Shenandoah Co., Va.



John Collamore, died in Kensington, N. H., 29 December, 1825, aged 110 years and 4 months. His hair which had been silvery white became before his death nearly black. He was a native of Ireland.

Mary Davie, died in Newton, Mass., in 1752, aged

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116 years. Her portrait drawn by Smibert, is in the Museum of the local historical society.

Michael Dougherty died at his plantation on Horse Creek, Scriven Co., Ga., 29 May, 1808, aged 135 years. He was one of the first settlers of Georgia. Two days before he died he walked a distance of two miles.

Edward Drinker, was born 24 December, 1680 in Philadelphia. He died 17 November, 1782, aged 102 years. He was four times married and had 18 children all by his first wife.

Hon. Timothy Farrar, Judge, grad. Harvard, 1767, died at Hollis, N. H., 1848, aged 101 years.

Henry Francisco, died near Whitehall, N. Y., November, 1820, aged 135. He was a native of England and witnessed the coronation of Queen Anne. He served in the French and Revolutionary Wars.

John Gilley, died in Augusta, Maine, 9 July, 1813, aged 124. He was a native of Ireland. He was singularly active and vigorous to the day of his death.



GENEALOGY IN CONGRESS

(From a Washington Correspondent)

In the recent debate over the Immigration bill in the House of Representatives of the United States, numerous genealogical facts were brought forth in the speeches of the eminent gentlemen who represent the nation in the Congress.

Hon. Clyde H. Tavenner of Illinois said of the Irish

race in early American days:

"Lest we forget, let it be remembered that the first Commodore of the American Navy was John Barry, an Irishman. The convincing and eloquent orators of the Colonies were Matthew Lyons and Patrick Henry. both of Irish descent. John Hancock, the first signer of the Declaration of Independence, was the descendant of an immigrant from Ireland. The secretary of the Continental Congress, Charles Thompson, was born in Maghera, Ireland. John Nixon, who was the first to publicly read the Declaration of Independence from the statehouse in Philadelphia, 8 July, 1776, was the son of Richard Nixon of county Wexford, Ireland. The man who first printed the Declaration of Independence was John Dunlap, who was born in Strabane, county Tyrone, Ireland. Ten signers of the Declaration of Independence were of Irish birth or Irish descent. Prominent among those was Charles Carroll, of Carrollton."

Hon. Joseph G. Cannon of Illinois, said in his speech: "So much for that. I have lived almost 80 years. (Prolonged applause.) I date back fairly well in my recollection to 1846. I was then a lad of 10 years of age, living on the Wabash. My parents were pioneers from North Carolina to the Wabash. They were Quakers and small landholders in North Carolina—my father, a Quaker by adoption, and my mother, from George Fox down, by inheritance. They left North Carolina, bearing testimony against slavery, as hundreds and multi-

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plied thousands, I might say, like them did—and they and Moravians and other small landholders. What for? To get away from servile labor that was performing similar labor which they performed into a country where servile labor did not exist.

"Now, the human family is a peculiar one. Man naturally is a religious animal. I believe the gentleman from Massachusetts is a direct descendant of some one of the people who came over in the Mayflower. A great people they were. Why? Because there was no place on the Continent of Europe or in Great Britain where a man could have freedom of religion and conscience without persecution. Well, they came over and had a pretty hard time. They were the common people, the Puritans; but no sooner did they get over here than they wanted to have a close corporation, and they did not want anybody but Puritans; others were not encouraged.

"It ran along that way for several generations; but early there began to be protests against immigration that was not Puritan. There was old Roger Williams, that old Baptist, you know, who did not agree with the Puritans. In civil affairs he wanted everybody to obey the law, but in religious affairs he wanted every individual in Massachusetts Bay and everywhere to have freedom touching his religious views, without persecution. Well, they banished old Roger. He went down to Providence and Rhode Island Plantations. I said that on my mother's side from George Fox they were Ouakers. Well. there was one branch of them, the Folgers, the Coffins, the Marcys, and others, who were residents in Massachusetts. They went to Nantucket, because they had to choose between going there and being hanged if they stayed in Massachusetts. So there you are."

Hon. Edwin Y. Webb, of North Carolina, paid the

following tribute to the men of his state:

COPY MADE BY INDIANA STATE LIBRARY "Wherever the flag of North Carolina floated on land or sea it was without tarnish, the emblem of honor, of courage, and unchanging fortitude which endured to the end.

"The Shenandoah, commanded by James Iredell Waddell, a North Carolinian, flew the Confederate battle flag at its masthead more than six months after Gen. Lee's surrender.

"The first Confederate soldier killed in battle was Henry L. Wyatt, of the Edgecombe Guards, Company A of that regiment, who fell at Bethel on the 10th of June, 1861."

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THE HOOD FAMILY IN AMERICA

(Contributed to Genealogy)

The Hood family coming from England were early in Massachusetts and Pennsylvania, but it is not known that there was any relationship between those of New England and those of Pennsylvania.

The Pennsylvania pioneers came from the county Leicester, while those of Massachusetts were from the county Norfolk. It is at least slightly significant that the Hoods of Pennsylvania were Quakers, while several of those in Massachusetts in the second generation became members of that sect, showing, as it would appear, an inherited family religious inclination. In both families the names, John, Richard, Elizabeth and Thomas, were common. These traits may indicate a possible common origin.

John Hood was the first of the name in Massachusetts. He was born in Halsted, England, about 1600, was the son of John and Anne Hood. His father was a weaver and died in 1622. John Hood, the immigrant, was also a weaver, and was settled in Cambridge, Mass., as early as 1638. He removed to Lynn, Mass., before 1650. In 1653 he was again in England, but his wife, Elizabeth, was still in Lynn. Whether he returned from the old country is not known, nor is the place or date of his death known. But in February, 1683, one John Hude, who may have been the pioneer, purchased from Roger Shaw of Hampton, N. H., an estate in Lynn, comprising twenty-one acres of land and a house.

Richard Hood, was born in Lynn, 18 November, 1655. He became a Quaker, uniting with that sect before 1690. He died in 1696, administration upon his estate being granted 14 December of that year.

John Hood was born in Lynn, 7 May, 1664. He became a Quaker before 1690 and, in 1696, was sent to

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COPY MADE BY INDIANA STATE LIB the Salem jail for one month for refusing to pay the ministerial tax for the established church of the town. He died in Lynn, 4 December, 1730.

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Nathaniel Hood was born in Lynn, 9 June, 1699. For a time he lived in his native town and his elder children were born there. About 1712 he moved to Topsfield, Mass., where he purchased a farm. In 1746 he built a house by the pond which later became known as Hood's pond; the house has remained in the possession of his Hood descendants to the present day.

There was a Jasper Hood in New York as early as 1680, and in June, 1696, he married Kathrine Anderson. In Maine was Lemuel Hood, who reared a considerable family.

The Pennsylvania Hoods were early settlers in Philadelphia, Lancaster and Chambersburg. Thomas and his sister Elizabeth were both married the same year 1742, in Philadelphia. Many of the Philadelphia Hoods were Quakers. Jonathan was in New Jersey in 1727.

The Hoods of North Carolina first appeared there in Chowan County about 1730. In Virginia the Hood families were numerous in Amelia, Campbell and Shenandoah Counties, and there was a goodly sized family in Montgomery County, Maryland.

In King Phillip's War, 1675, Jeremiah Hood of Woburn, Mass., was among those impressed for service in Capt. Davenport's Company.

Among the Revolutionary soldiers, Alexander Hood served in the 2d Penn. Artillery.

In the female line, Mary Hood of the Lynn, Mass., family, married Michael Deriche. She was imprisoned as a witch, and was a widow in 1692. Sara Hood, born 2 August, 1657, married 25 October, 1675, William Bassett, Jr., husbandman. She was imprisoned as a witch in 1692.



THE LATE SENATOR WITHERSPOON (Contributed)

The late Senator of the United States, Samuel Andrew Witherspoon, son of Dr. Elias Bourdenot Witherspoon and Mrs. Elizabeth Dowd Witherspoon, was born in Lowndes County, Miss., near the city of Columbus, 4 May, 1855, and died at his home in Meridian on Wednesday, 24 November, 1915. In his early youth he attended the common schools in the neighborhood in which he lived. His father died when he was quite young; after which his mother, who was in rather impecunious circumstances, in order that she might afford her children educational opportunities, with Sam and two younger brothers moved to Oxford, Miss., in 1872. Young Witherspoon entered the University of Mississippi, as a student in the preparatory department in October, 1872, and was graduated with honors from that institution in June, 1876. After his graduation he was for a while assistant professor of Latin in the University of Mississippi, during which time he prosecuted his study of the law. In 1879 he moved to Meridian, Miss., where he resided until his death. By intense intellectual effort he advanced rapidly in his profession and became one of the most accomplished lawyers at the bar of Mississippi. He was elected to the United States Senate in 1910.

OLD TIME PERSONALITY

(Contributed to Genealogy)

Ezra Stiles, president of Yale, who died in May, 1795, aged 67, was of low stature and of a small body.

Major Gen. Charles Lee, who died, 2 October, 1782, in Berkeley Co., Va., was a large man and "his remarkable aquiline nose rendered his face somewhat disagreeable."

Aaron Burr, of New Jersey, 1714-1757, was of slender and delicate frame, yet to encounter fatigue he had a heart of steel.

Rev. John Davenport of Stamford, Conn., who died

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in 1731, was an accomplished linguist. When he read the Bible in his family, he did not make use of the English translation, but read from the Greek and Hebrew original.

Benjamin Lay, "the benevolent Quaker" who died in Abington near Phila., Penn., in 1760, aged 79, was an enemy of idleness. When he was confined to his house and was wearied with reading he used to spend his time in spinning. All his clothes were manufactured by himself.



OLD TIME SENTIMENT (Contributed to Genealogy)

Rev. Samuel Newell, missionary, graduated from Harvard 1807, married Harriet Atwood of Haverhill. Mass. She died at Isle of France, 30 November, 1812. aged 19. In writing to her mother, Newell said: "Oh, Harriet, Harriet, thou was very dear to me. Thy last sigh tore my heart asunder, and dissolved the charms which tied me to the earth."

John Alden, of Plymouth, 1598-1687, was sent by his friend Capt. Miles Standish to make for him a proposal of marriage to Priscilla Mullins. The lady said to him: "Prithee John, why do you not speak for yourself?" This intimation of preference from the lips of one of the Pilgrim beauties was not to be overlooked. and Priscilla became Mrs. Alden.

Died at his seat near Barrington, 17th inst., Matthew Watson, Esq., aged 107 years. He had lived in three centuries and died in a good old age, full of days, riches and honor.—Boston Weekly Mag. 29 January, 1803.

Mr. Stephen Cook died last week in Tiverton, R. I., aged 100 years. In Mentz, Mrs. Elizabeth Adam, aged 105. At Barnstable, widow Elizabeth Chadwick, aged 101 years and three months. At Litchfield, Conn., Mrs. Mary Adam, aged 105.—Boston Weekly Mag. 9 April, 1803.

In Wakefield, Robert Macklin, a native of Scotland, died in 1787, aged 115. He lived several years in Portsmouth and followed the occupation of a baker. He frequently walked from Portsmouth to Boston, 66 miles, in one day, and returned in another. This journey he performed, the last time, at the age of 80.—Dr. Belknap's History of New Hampshire, Vol. 3.

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THE BASSETT FAMILY IN AMERICA

(Contributed to Genealogy)

The Bassetts were originally from Cornwall and Devonshire. The first English colonist to reach America was William Bassett, who arrived in the ship "Fortune," in September, 1621. He settled in Duxbury, Mass. Another early arrival was John Bassett, who located in New Haven, Conn., in 1643.

There are in this country upwards of 50,000 descendants of William Bassett, the first immigrant, and at the present time over 2000 American families bear the name of Bassett.


The Bassetts and Burwells were among the most prominent of Virginia families in Colonial days. On 9 March, 1713, Governor Spottswood declared: "The greater part of the present Council are related to the family of the Burwells. If Mr. Bassett and Mr. Berkeley should take their places, there will be no less than seven so near related that they will go off the bench whenever a cause of the Burwells comes to be tried."

Colonel William Bassett was son of Captain William Bassett (an officer in the English garrison at Dunkirk until it was evacuated in 1662), and Bridget, daughter of Colonel Miles Cary and Ann Taylor.

Joanna Burwell was daughter of Hon. Lewis Burwell and Abigail Smith (who was niece and heiress of Hon. Nathaniel Bacon, and whose great, grandfather, Sir James Bacon, was first cousin to Lord Francis Bacon.)

Colonel William Bassett and Joanna Burwell were the great-grandparents of President William Henry Harrison, for it was Elizabeth Bassett, who married Benjamin Harrison, the father of President Harrison.

The name "Eltham," the home of Colonel William Bassett, suggests that Colonel Bassett descended from James Bassett, gentleman, of the royal chamber, who died in 1558, and his scholarly wife, Mary, daughter of



William Roper, of Eltham, in Kent, England, Mary's mother was daughter of Sir Thomas Moore, Lord Chancellor of England.

Col. William Bassett's tomb bears the arms of the family: Or, three bars wavy gules. Crest: A unicorn's head coupled argent. Motto: Pro rege et populo.

The coat of arms borne by the falconer, Thurstine de Basset, was: Argent, a chevron between three bugle horns, sable. Crest: A stag's head cabossed, between the attires, a cross fitchee, all argent. Motto: "Death before dishonor."

In New England, there was a Nathaniel Bassett of Chatham, or Harwich, Mass., born 1755. Nothing is known of him unless this is he: "Captain Nathaniel Bassett," "killed by pirates," left sons Nathaniel and Joel and probably "Ellery"?

One of the revolutionary heroes was Abraham Bassett, who was in the battles of Long Island and White Plains. Near one hundred Bassetts from Massachusetts alone were in the Revolution.

Ebenezer Bassett, served in the sea coast defense of Martha's Vineyard in 1776. After the Revolution he removed to Washington Co., New York state. He married Abigail Adams, and had a son Ashahel.

Richard Bassett, senator and governor of Delaware, 1798, was born in Delaware, and lived in his native state during all his life. He was always in active practice, and while the articles of Confederation were in force in the American colonies, was a member of the Continental Congress. He was in active correspondence with many of the leading men of his day.

In November, 1689, in the Province of Maine, Capt. William Bassett took prominent part in a Council of War, held at the Point Garrison, in Scarborough.

Among the females of the family, the place of honor falls to Sarah Bassett, the daughter of William, the first







THE FEMALE LINE (Contributed to Genealogy)

Lord Brougham was one of the first public men in England to recognize the value of female ancestry. His father had been engaged to be married to a Miss Mary Whelpdale, "the last of a purely Saxon race," who died shortly before the day fixed for the wedding. Her affianced bridegroom consoled himself a little later by marrying the niece of Robertson, the historian. Lord Brougham declared his belief that if his mother had been Miss Whelpdale he would have remained in the state of respectable mediocrity in which his forefathers had lived and died. He traced the power of achievement which had raised him from an obscure Scottish advocate to be a great tribune of the English people to the energy hereditary to the Scottish clans, which had come to him from his mother.




DRESS IN OLDEN TIMES (Contributed to Genealogy)

In 1780, when John Andre was captured near New York he wore "an old torn crimson coat, nankeen vest, and small clothes, old boots and flapped hat."

Theophilus Parsons, chief justice of Mass., 1750-1813, was a man of large size, broad and corpulent, with sallow complexion and heavy appearance. He wore a reddish skull-czp, having been bald at the age of 30. A bandanna handkerchief often protected his neck from the chilly winds.

When David Gookin, and several friends were capsized in Boston harbor in April 1676, he lost "a large cloak of drab dewberry lined through with fine serge, cost in London about 8 pounds, a new pair of gloves cost 2s. and a rattan headed with ivory worth 18 pence."

Dr. William B. Leonard, born 1737, was one of the early physicians of Marietta, Ohio. He retained the fashions of the days of Queen Elizabeth, which in the backwoods of Ohio excited the curiosity of a people accustomed to the most simple attire. He was thin and spare in person with very slender legs on the border of old age. His favorite costume was a blue broadcloth coat trimmed with gold lace, and enormous gilt buttons. A waistcoat of crimson velvet with large pocket flaps. On his head flowing periwig and a cocked beaver hat. Over the whole a large scarlet colored cloak.



To wear arms it is not essential that a family be noble, although few Americans are anxious to claim untitled ancestry; for some of the oldest families in England have no title. Coats-of-arms were originally used to distinguish their owners when in armor on the battlefield. The College of Arms may design a new decoration for newly ennobled families if they desire; but, to Americans the antiquity of a crest seems to give it its greatest value.
