




PREFACE

Daniel Webster said: "It is wise for us to recur to the history of our Ancestors. Those who do not look upon themselves as a link, connecting the past with the future, do not perform their duty to the world."

One of the many questions asked by almost every one is: "How far back can you go?" Only from the landing in America has been given. However, Mrs. Charles H. Smith of Jenera, Ohio, has furnished the following German data for her Grandparents.

Birth Records, March 20, 1800 and December 25, 1800.

He was son of Johann Georg Pfeisfer and wife Katherina (Wolff) Pfeisfer.

She was daughter of Georg Pfeitser and wife Margaretha Maagsamen. Her sponsor was Katherina, the wife of Johann Adam Bietsch.

The Passport was to Johann Peter Pfeiffer, wife, and children (two boys) from Bremen, Germany, to Baltimore, North America. Dated June 2nd, 1831.

The three children of Johann Georg Pfeiffer and his second wife (Pauline Bell) were Anna Barbara, Margaretha Anna, and George Pfeiffer. Anna B. was married to Bartholomew Bietsch in Germany. Her little daughter, Catherine, was two years old on the voyage to America. Margaretha A. and George were both single. In their party also came John Philip Nicklas, who was married to Margaretha A. Pfeiffer in America.


The Passport of Margaretha A. Pfeiffer and John Philip Nicklas is dated July 14, 1831. Minnie M. Huber of Gridley, Ill., has it.

George Pfeiffer wrote the following account: "Our German home was in Erlanbach, Groshertzuchdon, Hesse-Darmstadt, Germany. From Erlanbach, we started on July 7th, and rode in wagons for seven days to Hanover, Mendon, then another seven days by boat to Bremen. In Bremen, we staid twelve days, then two days more on a schooner to Bremen Harbor. We left there on August 5th, in a sailing vessel, and after 82 days on the ocean, landed in Baltimore, America, on October 25th, 1831." The descendants of Mrs. Bietsch and Mrs. Nicklas also have some old German papers, pictures, and books. It is told that the father of Peter, George, Anna Barbara, and Margaretha, had married for the third time, before they came to America.

With the aid of the genealogy list which follows, any member of this large kinfolks can add to and make for themselves as much of a family record as they may desire.

I am truly grateful to all who helped to gather data for this work.

CHAPTER I


PETER PFEIFFER and family came first, of the four Pfeiffer lines in America.

Peter was son of Johann Georg Pfeiffer by his first marriage. Born March 20, 1800, in Erlenbach, Hesse-Darmstadt, Germany. He died in Ohio in 1883. His marriage to Katherina Pfeiffer (distantly related) took place in Germany, and two sons were born there. It is believed that this family arrived in America about September 18th, 1831, having landed in Baltimore, Maryland, after 90 days of ocean voyage. He and others in the same party, went to Ohio, the then Frontier, where they bought adjoining lands from the Government. The Original Deed and other papers are now in possession of Mrs. Chas. H. Smith who lives on that Pioneer Homestead. It is one-half mile south of Jenera, Ohio.

After establishing this home in America, Mr. and Mrs. Peter Pfeiffer had five more sons born to them. Children were Jacob and Philip born in Germany. Peter, George, Henry, Adam and Simon born in Ohio. Sometime between 1850 and 1863, the English spelling of Pifer, instead of Pfeiffer, was adopted by this father and his sons, and is used entirely by all of them ever since.

When Peter's half-brother, George and two half-sisters followed him from Germany they landed in Baltimore, Maryland, on October 25, 1831, after 82 days of ocean travel. It is known that George went later on to Ohio to see his half-brother Peter and walked from Ohio to Illinois in 1835.


Peter Pfeiffer (Pifer) and all his seven sons are dead.

Children are Lloyd and Elroy Von Gunten. Address, Bay Village, Ohio. (Suburb of Cleveland). Mary Pifer daughter of Jacob, the son of Peter. She married Adam Zeigenfusz. Children, one daughter, Lydia. Lydia Zeigenfusz married Benjamin Backey. Children are Theodore, and Emanuel. Theodore Backey, married Alice Hopsin. No children. Emanuel Backey is single. Address, Jenera, Ohio. Henry Pifer son of Jacob, the son of Peter. He married Sarah Redick. No children. Address, Jenera, Ohio. Lýdia Fifer daughter of Jacob, the son of Peter. She married William Bosse. Children are Freeman, Rosa, Solomon, William, Marvin Bosse. Freeman Bosse married Ruth Kaiser. Children are Ollan, Earl, Harold, Philip Bosse. Address, Ada, Ohio. Rosa Bosse is single. Solomon Bosse married Pauline Criblez. Two children, Martha and Eldon Bosse. Address, Ada, Ohio. William and Marvin Bosse are single. Address, near Ada, Ohio. Elizabeth Pifer, youngest child of Jacob, the son of Peter, married William Heldman. No children. Address, Arlington, Ohio.

The second son of Peter Pfeitser was *Philip* P. Pfeitser, born in Germany. He married Lavina Thomas. Children were Simon and Solomon. They lived and died near Bangor, Michigan. Simon Pifer married Cora Walmer. Children are Adrian and Norman. Adrian Pifer is single. Norman Pifer married Florence DeGroot. No children. Address, Bangor, Mich. Solomon Pifer married Olive Gregory. One child, Olney. Address, Raton, New Mexico.

The third son of Peter was Peter Pfeiffer, Jr., who was a lawyer. He married Miss Mina Smith. No children. Both are dead.



George Pifer was the fourth son of Peter. He married Eliza Zehrbach. Children were Eliza, Milton, Ami G. Eliza Pifer married Noah Basinger. One child, Adrian. Address, Bluffton, Ohio. Adrian Basinger married Glenna Mumma. Children are Leo and Alice Basinger. Address, Toledo, Ohio. Milton Pifer married Mary Basinger. Children are Edgar, Marion, Marguerite, Evelyn Pifer. Address Rawson, Ohio. Edgar Pifer married Ruth Palmer. One child, Joan Pifer. He is Principal of High School in Mt. Cory, Ohio. Marion Pifer married Mary Jergen of Marion, Indiana. No children. Ami G. son of George, married Verna Pifer. Two children. Frances, and Amanda Pifer. Address, Ada, Ohio.


Henry Pifer was fifth son of Peter. He died very young.

Adam Pifer was the sixth son of Peter. He married Miss Margaret Wahl. Children were Marion Adam, who died at the age of 27 years. Emma and Franklin W. Pifer. Emma Pifer married Charles H. Smith. Children are Theodore, Byron, Woodrow, and Hugo Smith. Little Charles Franklin died at the age of five years. This family live on the original home land of Peter, the Pioneer, one-half mile south of Jenera, Ohio. Mr. and Mrs. Smith made a short but delightful visit to Peoria in 1933, when driving to the Century of Progress Fair held in Chicago, Illinois. Franklin W. Pifer married Hazel Pfeiffer. Children are Genevieve and Robert Pifer. Address, Detroit, Michigan. Hazel Pfeiffer is from Ft. Wayne, Ind., and not related.

Simon Pifer was the youngest son of Peter. He married Sarah Solt. Children were Sanderson H. (Sandy), Mary, Florence, James, William, Ella, Ora Pifer. Sanderson H. Pifer married Tina Shontelmyer. No children. Address, Rawson, Ohio. Many thanks are due him for the help he gave in completing the list of kinfolks. Mary Pifer married Warren Williams. Children are Porter and Percy. Address, Monroe, Washington. Florence Pifer married Henry Mueller. (Both dead). Children are Morris A. and Gilbert J. Mueller. Morris A. Mueller married Margaret E. Robertson, Oct. 8, 1929. CHAPTER II

EORGE PFEIFFER was born in Erlenbach, Hesse Darmstadt, Germany, Jan. 11, 1813, and landed in America, on October 25, 1831. He died in Peoria, Ill. May 12, 1904, at the age of 91 years. His wife was Anna Mary Haller who was born in Germany, Jan. 21, 1821, and who came to America in 1834. She died October 27, 1881. To them came the pioneer family of children, of whom three died in infancy. Those living were Philip, Catherine, John, George Jr., Rose, William and Mary (Mame) Pfeiffer. Only the last named is still living.

Philip Pfeiffer born in 1838, died in 1906. He married Sarah M. Harker in 1862. She was born Jan. 12, 1843, and died in 1926. Children were Mary Ruth, Margaret Bell, Lincoln Grant, Addie J., Emma Jane, Philip Sheridan, Charlotte Lavina and John Willis Pfeiffer. Ruth, Addie and Grant died young. Margaret B. married Dr. James L. Brown. Their one child was James L. Brown, second. Mrs. Margaret Pfeiffer Brown lives in Peoria. Dr. J. L. Brown died in 1918. James L. Brown, second, married Ruth Louise Drysdale. One child, James L. Brown, third. Address, Peoria, Ill. Mrs. Ruth Drysdale Brown died in Peoria, April 30, 1924. Emma J. Pfeiffer married George H. Oechsle. No children. He died in 1922. Charlotte L. Pfeiffer, single. The two sisters live together in Peoria. Philip S. Pfeiffer, single, died in 1929. John W. Pfeiffer married Marcella Reiley. No children. He died in 1924.

Catherine Pfeiffer died single in 1918.

John Pfeiffer born Aug. 22, 1842. Died May 3, 1932. Almost 90 years of age. He was married in 1868 to Achsah S. Nevius, who died in 1901. Children were Nelson, who died young, Mary Etta and George Wilbert Pfeiffer. They are single, and live in Fairview, Ill.

George Pfeiffer, Jr., born in 1844, and died in 1914. On Nov. 14, 1865, he married Margaret A. Harker, who was born in 1845, and died in 1895. Their children were Anna Mary, who died young, Charles, Sarah Margaret (Sallie) and Caroline (Tatta). Charles Pfeiffer married Minnie Aldenbrand. No children. He died in 1922, in Detroit, Mich. Sarah M. (Sallie) married Edwin Moschel. One child, Margaret M. Margaret M. Moschel married Edward L. Shoemaker. One child, Marshall L. Shoemaker. Address, San Diego, Calif. Caroline Pfeiffer (Tatta) married first, Frederick Dunn. Second, Jack Gardner. Her third marriage was to C. B. Marshall. She had no children, and is a widow living in San Diego, California.

George Pfeiffer, Jr., married for his second wife, Sedonia Beaumont of Chicago, in 1898. One son, George Beaumont was born in Detroit, Mich. in 1900. George Beaumont Pfeiffer married first, Agnus Marcus. One child, Jack Beaumont Pfeiffer. His second marriage was to Mrs. Mary Threw Gale. No children. Address, Peoria, Ill. Rose Pfeiffer, single, died in May 1931. William Pfeiffer, single, died in Feb. 1926. Mary (Mame) Pfeiffer, single, is living in the family home in Peoria, Ill.


CHAPTER III

ISS ANNA BARBARA PFEIFFER born in Germany August 7, 1807. She was married, very young, in Germany, to Bartholomew Bietsch. Lost her first two children there. Came to America, October 25, 1831, and died in Peoria, Illinois, September 4th, 1887. The living children were Catherine (who was 2 years old on the ocean), Margaretha, Barbara, Mary, Adam, Elizabeth, Louisa, George, Caroline. She was left a widow early, through the accidental death of her husband, and reared her large family. For this Pioneer Mother, it was found that she had more than 250 descendants at the close of her one hundred years in America. Also, that eight of her sixth generation are recorded. This is quite remarkable for 100 years. The descendants of Mrs. Anna Barbara (Pfeiffer) Bietsch (Beach).

Catherine Beach born Sept. 9, 1829 in Germany. Died in Peoria, Ill., April 1, 1910. She married John Hirsch, who died Jan. 11, 1906. She married Christopher Friedrich Hefft in Peoria, on Nov. 30, 1857, and died on Easter Sunday in April, 1917, Pekin, Ill. Mr. C. F. Hefft died Oct. 21, 1914. Of their large family of children, all are dead except Mary and Christopher H. Mary Hefft married P. W. Bauman. Two sons are Roy and Richard Bauman. Mrs. Hefft-Bauman is now Mrs. Michael Hurst. No children. Address, Pekin, Ill. Roy Bauman married Henrietta Stone. No children. Richard Bauman married Margaret Colvin. One son, Richard, Jr. Address, Pekin, Ill. Christopher H. 
