

Geoffrey de Mandeville is said to have succeeded Asgar in such lands as belonged officially to him, “non in totum quidem possessionem quam possederat pater, sed in eam tamen quæ pertinebat ad stallariam, quam nunc habet comes Willielmus.” This is corroborated by the entries in Domesday, and explains them. Of the manor of Clapham in Surrey we read, “Dicunt homines quod Goisfridus hoc manerium injuste habet, *quia ad terram Asgari non pertinet;*” tom. i. fol. 36. Again, in the same folio, under Weneberge, “*non est de terra Asgar.*” In Berkshire, Middlesex, Hertfordshire, Oxfordshire, Northamptonshire, Warwickshire, and Essex, Geoffrey de Mandeville’s lands are marked uniformly as having been, in former time, the property of Asgar or his homagers. Of Geoffrey’s lands in Suffolk, in contradistinction to the rest, it is more than once said, that he did not hold them as of the honor or fee which had been Ansgar’s: as in tom. ii. fol. 411, under Cratinga, “*Gosfridus habet pro manorio ex dono Regis, et sub eo Willielmus de Botevilla, sed non pertinuit AD FEUDUM Ans-gari, antecessoris Gosfridi.*”

In the town of Hertford, Geoffrey de Mandeville possessed the tenement or mansion which had been Asgar’s: “*Goisfridus de Magnavile habet occupatum quoddam qui fuit Esgari stalri.*” *Hertf.* 132.

THILDIS REGINA." Mathilda's manors in Gloucestershire, fol. 163 b., had also been Brictric's.

The anonymous continuator of Wace, who wrote in the reign of Henry the Third, and who says he translated his Poem at Amesbury in Wiltshire, is perhaps the oldest authority for the story of Matilda's disappointment. He states Brictric to have died in prison at Winchester, without heir, and that his property in consequence escheated, and was disposed of by the Conqueror, in part to *his Queen* and in part to Robert Fitz Haimon. But the honor of Gloucester, which had been Brictric's, was really bestowed upon Robert Fitz Haimon by King William Rufus: so that Wace's continuator is guilty of at least one anachronism.

Turner, in his History of England, vol. i. p. 64, quoting the circumstances which attended the search for Harold's body on the field of Hastings, which was recognized only by his favourite Editha, surnamed Swanneshals or Swans-neck,^a says, "this Editha is the Editha Pulchra so often mentioned in Domesday." But this opinion seems to have been taken up by Mr. Turner, merely because in a manuscript note in the margin of the Narrative he quoted, he found written, "Ista Editha nominatur EDITHA PULCHRA in Libro Domesday." The Narrative here alluded to, of the two monks who watched the battle, obtained William's permission to bring away the body of Harold, and afterwards carried the mistress to aid their search, will be found, MS. Cotton. Jul. D. vi. on vellum, of the fourteenth century; whilst the marginal note, from which the additional information was obtained, is in a hand of a date near three centuries later; and, unsupported by the manuscript itself, or by collateral evidence, is no more than a surmise of some possessor of the manuscript who is not known.

The present writer has another opinion to offer, as to Eddeva pulchra. He believes her to have been Editha, the sister of Edwin and Morcar, widow of Griffin Prince of the Welsh, and the Queen of Harold.

William of Jumièges, in his account of Harold's victory obtained in Wales in 1065, says, "Grithfridi quoque Regis Wallorum, postquam hostilis illum gladius peremit *pulchram conjugem ALDITH*, præclari Comitis Algari filiam, sibi uxorem junxit." Duchesne, Script. p. 285.

It is to be observed, that throughout the Domesday Survey, Harold is never mentioned as KING; his wife, therefore, would not be likely to be designated as a Queen: yet

that he had two wives there can be no question: his children were by the first wife; the second was Aldith, Editha, Algiva, or Eddeva, names which were all synonimes. That Aldith or Algytha was beautiful we have Norman authority: there is no known record of her death: and the time was, comparatively, so short, between the battle of Hastings and the Conqueror's distribution of forfeited lands, that we cannot but wonder to find every mention of a wife of Harold omitted in the Domesday returns.

Florence of Worcester, p. 634, says, that after the fate of the battle of Hastings was known, and Harold's death, Edwin and Morcar came to London, and sent off their sister Alitha to Chester. “*Cujus morte audita Comites Eadwinus et Morcarus (qui se cum suis certamini subtraxere) Lundonium venere et sororem suam Alitham reginam sumptam ad civitatem Legionum misere.*”

The lands which are entered in Domesday as possessions of EDDEVA PULCHRA, are of great if not of royal amount. She held in different counties more than two hundred and thirty hides, equal to twenty-seven thousand six hundred acres. Her fee in Cambridgeshire, amounting to more than a hundred and fifty-eight hides, was considered as fit to form a part of the reward of Alan Earl of Bretagne. Among the under-tenants of Eddeva Pulchra, too, we find a person allied to the royal family. Of the manor of Fulbourn in Cambridgeshire, it is said, “*Comes Alanus tenet in Fuleborne viii. hid. Hoc manerium tenuit GODUINUS cilt homo Eddeuæ pulchræ. Non potuit recedere.*” Upon her lands in Hertfordshire, too, which were granted to Earl Alan, her chaplain, occurs, “*Leuing presbyter homo Eddeuæ.*”

Whether it would be likely that a mistress of Harold should hold such tracts of land, or that she should have had a person of such high rank for an under-tenant, unalienable

as he is recorded to have been from his service to Eddeva, or that she should have had an ostensible chaplain, the reader will judge.

EDDEUA DIVES, probably alluding to the amount of property above enumerated, seems to have been only another appellation for Eddeva pulchra.

A concubine of Harold has been already noticed in the former volume, where, in the second folio of the Survey of Kent, Ralph Curbespine, or Crookthorn, is entered as holding four masures in the city of Canterbury, which had belonged to her. Here was a mistress residing at a short distance from the field of Hastings.

Of Eddeva Swanneshals, mentioned in the monkish narrative, the present writer has found no other notice,^a except in the Chronicle of John of Oxneude, MS. Cotton. Nero, D. II. fol. 204, who names her, in four words, as a benefactress to the Abbey of St. Benet Holm. “Edgyue Suanneshals dedit Thurgarton.” Domesday says of Thurgarton, only, “semper tenuit Abbatia.”

He had held the manor of Shippen in Berkshire in the time of Edward the Confessor, which was afterwards given to the Abbey of Abingdon. The Saxon Chronicle calls him Eadnoth stallere. He was Harold's master of the horse, but made his peace with the Conqueror, and apparently entered his service. He was killed in 1068, in opposing the sons of Harold when they came upon their expedition into Somersetshire. This Elsi is a personage relating to whom a very curious Narrative is preserved, in a poetical Work of the fourteenth century, entitled “ Cursor Mundi,” written in the dialect of the North of England : a poem hitherto scarcely noticed by the English antiquaries ; but copies of which are extant, of the period just named, in the Cottonian Collection, in the library of the College of Physicians at Edinburgh, two in the Bodleian, one in the College of Arms, one in the Harleian Collection, and one, the most curious, in the library of the University of Gottingen.

Elsi is represented in one of the fits or cantos of this Poem to have been sent by William the Conqueror to Denmark, to appease Suein, who, upon the news of his nephew’s fate at Hastings, made preparations for a descent upon England, to revenge Harold’s death.

The miraculous conclusion of the story, relating to the origin of celebrating the Feast of the Conception, gives the whole the appearance of a fable. The historical portion, however, must have had some foundation in truth. It is remarkable, that the eighth of Wace's works, enumerated by Mr. George Ellis in the Notes to his Specimens of the early English Poets, vol. i. p. 54, is said to be “ *A History of the Origin of the Feast of the Conception*, which is supposed to have been established by William the Conqueror, and was kept in Normandy with such magnificence that it was usually called in France the Feast of the Normans. It is to be found in the Royal Library at Paris.”

In the Duke de la Valliere's library there was a MS. which seems to have contained the French text, that is, the original of the whole Canto relating to Elsi. See the Cat. La Vall. tom. ii. p. 247: and it contained the author's name,

The editor of the Catalogue supposes this author to have been Gace Brulès, a French poet of the thirteenth century there can be no doubt, however, but that it was Wace.

Elsi, Ailsius, or Elsinus is usually stated to have been made abbat of Ramsey in 1080, and to have died in 1088; but we have the evidence of Charters in the Ramsey Register, Cotton. MS. Vesp. E. 11. fol. 9, that he was abbat in the time of Edward the Confessor, to whose charter of privileges he signs as a witness, "Ego Agelsius abbas hoc meum desiderium ad perfectum adduxi et a Rege hilariter suscepi :" he also witnesses a charter of the Conqueror in 1077, ibid. fol. 10 b. "Ego Ailsinus abbas hoc munificentiae donum a Rege petii et gratanter accepi." These signatures are proofs that he was in communication and confidence with both sovereigns. The Historia Ramesiensis states him to have also aided Harold with his counsels, which might be a reason for the Conqueror selecting him for a mission to Denmark.

Elsi, or Elsinus, is evidently the same Abbat who, in a passage of Domesday quoted in a former page of the present work, vol. i. p. 306, is called Aluuinus, and who rendered some service to King Edward the Confessor, which is not explained, in his exile. There is another passage in the same folio of the Domesday Survey, tom. i. fol. 208, which alludes to *an absence of this Abbat in Denmark*, whether in the reign of Edward or William is not distinctly ascertainable, but probably early in the latter.

² The fate of Leuuine and Guerth, the brothers of Harold, at the battle of Hastings, is one of the settled events of history: recorded both in the English and the Danish Chronicles. “Hic ceciderunt Leuuine et Gurd, fratres Haroldi Regis,” is the inscription over the subject of their deaths in the Baieux Tapestry.

There is a tale, however, of the twelfth century, which represents Guerth to have escaped alive. He is said to have been seen in extreme age by Henry the Second himself, to have spoken mysteriously respecting Harold, and to have declared that the body of that Prince was not at Waltham. The whole was, probably, the fabrication of one of the secular canons, who were ejected at the re-foundation of Waltham Abbey in 1177.

The Legend alluded to is preserved in the Harleian Manuscript 3776, fol. 21 b.

Among the forgotten fables of the day, a story was undoubtedly prevalent, that Harold had escaped from Hastings. Giraldus Cambrensis asserts that it was believed he had fled from the battle pierced with wounds, and with the loss of his left eye, and that he ended his days holily and virtuously as an anchorite at Chester. *Itin. edit. Franc.* 1603, p. 874. Brompton and Knighton quote the story.

By the kindness of John Bidwell Esq., of the Foreign Office, F. S. A. and of Mr. Moke of Bruges, the compiler of the present Index is enabled to lay before the reader a copy of an Inscription upon an ancient leaden plate, which was found by some workmen, in 1786, while repairing a wall in the Church of St. Donat at Bruges, where Gunnilda was interred, and which supplies in few words the story of her life. This inscription is at present preserved at Bruges, in the Church of St. Sauveur.

The same letter which brought this Inscription, brought another from the same church, in honour of another Gunnilda, the half-sister of Edward the Confessor, who is mentioned in our Chronicles, and who married the Emperor, Henry the Black.

It must be allowed, however, both for the Saxon and the Norman times, that these usurpations, or forcible entries upon lands or other possessions, were often made by the ministers or bailiffs of the great allodial tenants, in the name, but without the knowledge of their masters. minster Abbey in 1067, charges Hamo his steward with unjustly seizing on the church of St. Clement Danes in the Strand, "violenter et injuste sibi usurpavit," and which he had himself caused to be restored.

There is a very curious document in the Cottonian Collection in the British Museum, Augustus II. n. 90, which has not hitherto been sufficiently noticed. It is an original Narrative in Saxon, upon a strip of vellum, not of the time of Harold the Second, but of Harold Harefoot, written in all probability by Ælfgar, who is mentioned in it, or some fellow-monk, by order of Archbishop Eadsy, concerning Sandwich, as belonging to Christ Church, Canterbury; the toll of the port of which had been forcibly entered upon in the King's name by Ælfstan abbat of St. Augustine. Ælfgar, a monk of Christ Church, after an interval of near a year, was sent by the archbishop to make his complaint to Harold, who lay sick at Oxford, and in imminent danger. Livingus bishop of Crediton, and Thancred the monk, were at that time with the King, and these, with Ælfgar and one Osward, went to his bed-side, and reproached him with the usurpation; when Harold unhesitatingly swore by Almighty God and by his angels, that it was "neither his rede nor his deed" that man should ever deprive Christ Church of Sandwich. It was soon seen, says the writer, that the taking of it was other man's thought, not the King's, and that it had been seized by the direction of Abbat Ælfstan. The King sent Ælfgar back to the Archbishop, with the fullest confirmation in words of the possession of Sandwich as he and his monks had at any time held it. Ælfstan, who had received the third penny in toll at Sandwich, offered ten pounds as a fine to retain it. The acquisition of it for his monastery had been the sole object of the usurpation. He afterwards, as the document informs us, attempted to establish a rival

port at "Hyppesfleote." It finishes, "This is all truth. Believe who will. In no other way did Abbat Ælfstan command the payment of the third penny at Sandwich. God's blessing be with us all, and for ever. Amen."

The date of this Narrative is closely ascertainable. Eadsige, according to the Saxon Chronicle, was made Archbishop in November 1038. Harold Harefoot died at Oxford, on the 16th before the kalends of April 1040. The third penny had been detained for near a year. This will bring the date of the present writing to the year 1039.

No detailed mention of the port of Sandwich occurs in Domesday; but in allusion to it, in the account of the

town, it is said, “ Hoc Burgum tenet Archiepiscopus et est de vestitu Monachorum, et reddit simile servitium Regi sicut DOVERE.”

Various instances may be cited from different parts of Domesday, of the arbitrary disposition of property by bailiffs. Under Etwelle in Surrey, fol. 30, it is said, “ Testantur homines de Hundredo quod in hoc Manorio subtractæ sunt duæ hidæ et una virgata quæ ibi fuerunt T. R. E. sed PRÆPOSITI accommodaverunt eas suis amicis.” See another instance under the lands of the Abbey of Westminster, fol. 32. Among the lands of Robert Fitz Hugh in Cheshire, tom. i. fol. 264 b. under Burwardeslei, we read, “ Ibi iii. hidæ. De hac terra 1. hida fuit ablata ab Ecclesia S. This was Hereward, or Herward, the younger son of Leofric Earl of Mercia, who was chosen, by the prelates and nobility who retired to the Isle of Ely after the Conqueror’s invasion, to be the general of their forces. His heroic character has been already alluded to, vol. i. p. 308.

He was lord of Brune in Lincolnshire, and the marshes adjoining. He left Turfrida, his only daughter and heir, married to Hugh de Evermont lord of Deeping.

Mann, in his History of Reading, p. 121, says, the Church spoken of in this entry “was no doubt St. Mary’s, being the oldest Church in the town.” Leueua seems to have been the last Abbess of the Nunnery here, which was virtually ruined by the Danes in the middle of the ninth century: and the eight hides were probably all the property which remained to the foundation after the Conquest.

In Somersetshire, in the notice of Combe, a manor belonging to Shaftsbury Abbey, the Exon Domesday, p. 176, notices an Abbess of the name of **LEUEUA**, who had held that manor T. R. William the Conqueror occasionally provided for old soldiers in this manner. The Abingdon Register, MS. Cotton. Claudius, C. ix. fol. 134, contains some particulars which are here transcribed, not merely as illustrating the Conqueror's practice, but because they afford at the same

time some little contribution toward a picture of the times. A common soldier, unfit for further service, addresses himself personally to the King to obtain support for the rest of his life from those by whom he had been immediately employed in war.

The chapter is, "De militibus istius Ecclesiæ." Adelelm mentioned in it became abbat of Abingdon in 1071, upon the deposition and imprisonment of his predecessor.

Vlchel, called also Vlchetel and Wulketul, was appointed abbot of St. Guthlac Croyland by King Edward the Confessor in 1052. He was the immediate predecessor of Ingulphus the historian. He gave so great offence to Ivo Tailbois lord of Hoyland or Holand, by publishing the miracles performed at Earl Waltheof's tomb in the Chapter-house of Croyland, that he was summoned in 1075 to a Council at London, accused of idolatry, deprived of his abbey, and committed to prison at Glastonbury "sub cruentissimo tum abbe Thurstano procul a notis et a sua patria :" the treasure of his Abbey being at the same time confiscated to the King.

The circumstance, as in Lavenham, of the brother of the abbat of St. Edmundsbury holding lands in fee, which in the Confessor's time had been a part of the endowment of his brother's Monastery, seems explained by a passage in the Consuetudinarium of that foundation, MS. Harl. 3977, fol. 18, relating to some other manors: "Willelmus primus Rex dedit Sancto Edmundo, prima vice qua ejus requisivit suffragium, Brok et omnia appenditia ejus. Item alia vice totum feodum Brichtulfi fil. Leomari, *unde feodatus est Frodo* frater Abbatis Baldwini. Nam ad opus Ecclesiæ et FRATRIS sui ipse Abbas impetravit omnes terras prædicti viri a Rege, sc. hæc Maneria, Cheuenton, Saxham, Dunham, Tostoke et Sumerleston."

Abbat Baldwin's influence at Court will be explained by a reference to the passages in the former volume, p. 304, and in the present volume, p. 46. He was a royal physician.

port are acknowledged. The manor of Leominster, belonging to the Crown, is expressly said to have been let out to farm for sixty pounds a year, exclusive of provision for the Nuns. "Hoc Manerium est ad firmam de lx. lib. *preter victum MONIALIUM.*" An Abbess, too, without the name of her monastery, but evidently of Leominster, follows in the second column of the same folio holding a hide of land at Fencote in capite.

There is a passage in the Saxon Chronicle, under the year 1046, relating either to this or a former Abbess of Leominster, which adds one to the many pictures of the lawless condition of those times. "This year went Earl Sweyne into Wales, and Griffin King of the northern men with him; and hostages were delivered to him. As he returned homeward, he ordered the Abbess of Leominster to be fetched to him; and he had her as long as he list, after which he let her go home."

They say, “The greatest landholder under the Earl of Moretaine, in this county, was Rainaldus or Reginald, who held thirty (it should be thirty-three) manors, including the manor and castle of Trematon. This was Reginald de Valletort, who is known to have possessed the honor of Trematon at a period not much later. Dugdale mentions Reginald de Valletort as witnessing a deed in the reign of William Rufus, which he speaks of as the first mention he had found of the family: he does not seem to have been aware, that his property is described in the *Domesday Survey*.” *Mag. In the Baieux tapestry, as published by the Society of Antiquaries, Plate III., the name of Turolld stands above the head of a bearded dwarf, who holds two horses.

In Plate X. of the tapestry, over the head of a mounted warrior in armour, without his helmet, but with shield and spear, are the words "Hic est Wadard." He stands between the soldiers who hasten to Hastings and the preparation of refreshments.

In the lower compartment of Plate XII. are the words, "Hic Willelm: Dux interrogat Vital: si vidisset exercitum Haroldi." Vitalis is represented on horseback, in armour, with sword, shield, and spear, his helmet on his head, pointing backward, as if toward Harold's army, with his left hand.

Wadard of the Survey, as the references above will show, held property under the Bishop in no fewer than six counties. In Oxfordshire alone he was the under-tenant for six hides and a half.

His consequence is shewn in an entry in Surrey, fol. 32, where he held the manor of Ditton under the Bishop, consisting of six hides, where it is said, "Ille qui tenet de Wadardo reddit ei L. sol. et servitium unius militis."

Vitalis held lands under Odo in Kent; and the son of Turolld, in Essex.

ABSTRACT OF POPULATION.

A CURSORY perusal of the Abstract here laid before the reader will convince him that it presents but an imperfect view of the total population of England in 1086. For the owners and occupiers of land, and for the agricultural population, it may probably be considered as a fair record.

Amongst its omissions, the state and population of the Cities and Towns cannot fail to be observed. The King's own burgesses, wherever they occurred, were carefully registered, as well as those who belonged to Tenants in capite; but further than these the Survey rarely goes; in fact, the information of the rent which was to be paid from the town, was more important for the receipt of the Exchequer; and we have some towns represented as paying rent, in which neither burgesses nor other residents are noticed.

In Middlesex pannage is returned for 16,535, in Hertfordshire for 30,705, and in Essex for 92,991 hogs, yet not a single swine-herd (a character so well known in the Saxon times) is entered in these Counties.

In the Norman period, as can be proved from records, the whole of Essex was, in a manner, one continued forest; yet once only in that county is a forester mentioned, in the entry concerning Writtle.

Salt-works, Works for the production of lead and iron, Mills, Vineyards, Fisheries, Trade, and the Manual Arts, must have given occupation to thousands who are unrecorded in the Survey; to say nothing of those who tended the flocks and herds, the returns of which so greatly enlarge the pages of the second Volume. In some counties we have no mention of a single priest, even where churches are found; and scarcely any in-

mate of a monastery is recorded beyond the abbat or abbess, who stands as a Tenant in capite.

These remarks might be extended, but they are sufficient for their purpose. They apprise the reader that, in this point of view, the Domesday Survey is but a partial Register. It was not intended to be a record of population further than was required for ascertaining the geld.

In the following Abstract the head of Tenants in Capite comprises the **TAINI**, **MINISTRI**, **ELEMOSINARI**, and all other persons who are entered as holding lands directly from the King.

The Under-tenants and minor Occupiers of land, beside all who are mentioned by name in the Record, include such **MILITES**, **CLERICI**, **PRESBYTERI**, and others, who occur as mesne lords, holding from those who held from the King.

The **PRESBYTERI** who occur in this enumeration under *their own title* are only those who are recorded with the mere church, or who stand alone without the occupation of land; in many instances they are classed in the Survey with the **Villani**, **Servi**, and **Bordarii**.¹ Many **Milites** also are put down in the Survey with the inferior cultivators; such have their own head in the Abstract.

In summing the total of the numbers together, due allowance has been made for the frequent recurrence of the same Tenant in capite in different Counties. Eudo Dapifer held lordships in twelve, Odo bishop of Baieux

in sixteen, the Earl of Moretaine in twenty, and Earl Hugh Lupus in twenty-one counties. The real number of the Tenants in capite will be very far exceeded, should the reader add together all who are set down in the tables for the distinct Counties.

A greater difficulty attends the establishment of the positive number of Under-tenants as mesne lords. There are so many Hughs, Ralphs, Rogers, and Walters entered upon the property of the same Baron, who, being without the distinction of surnames, may or may not be the same persons, and who sometimes likewise held land under a neighbouring lord.

In the present enumeration, where the name was continually repeated upon the property of the same superior lord, it has been counted but once. It is to be remembered, too, that many of the greater Barons were under-tenants to persons of their own rank, and that Corporate Bodies were also under-tenants.

The selection of the under and agricultural tenantry at the time of the Survey, from the second volume of Domesday, was more difficult than from the first. Throughout the entries in Essex, Norfolk, and Suffolk, the words *tenet* and *tenuit* are expressed but by one contraction; and even the word *tenet* is frequently used at length for *tenuit*.

The compiler of the present Abstract, in ascertaining the numbers of the inferior classes, wrote the numerical amount of each at the bottom of every page in his own copy of the Domesday Survey, and he believes that for them the numbers have been ascertained to minuteness.

For advice in the compilation, and for the use of some manuscript Collections on the Burghs, the editor stands much indebted to John Allen Esq.

Of BEDFORD, the county town, no population is recorded. It paid geld, as for a half-hundred, "in expeditione et in navibus." The lands which were held by several of its burgesses individually² form a distinct title. The entry which relates to them has no concern with the town.

In fol. 214, col. 2, it is said, "In MELDONE Johannes de Roches occupavit injuste xxv. acras super HOMINES qui villam tenent."

In the time of King Edward the Confessor, the King had 276 hagæ in the burgh of **WALINGFORD**. These had been reduced at the time of the Survey to 263. Eight out of the thirteen which formed the deficiency had been removed, to make way for the buildings of the castle. Fifty-eight hagæ and ninety-three masuræ are enumerated in Walingford belonging to other persons, making a total of 414 in the folio in which Walingford is described. Forty-three hagæ in Walingford are enumerated in fol. 56 b.; and two priests of the name of *Ælmer*, and eight other persons, are said to have had the gable of their houses; increasing the number to 467. Houses in Walingford, beside these, appertaining to different manors in Oxfordshire, to Newington, Dorchester, Watlington, Ewelme, &c., are enumerated in other folios, to the number of 24; making a final total of 491.¹

From folio 58 it appears that the King had twenty-eight hagæ in the town of **READING**. This town had been burnt by the Danes in 1006.

In **WINDSOR**, at the time of the Survey, there were 100 hagæ. This must have been the town of Old Windsor.

No burgesses of Walingford, Reading, or Windsor are recorded in the Survey.

CAMBRIDGE, in the time of the Conqueror, as well as in that of Edward the Confessor, had 373 masuræ. Of these, 92 paid no customary rent. Some had been wasted, some were privileged, and 27 houses had been taken down to form a site for the Castle. Cambridge was rated at a whole Hundred, divided into ten wards; yet twenty-nine burgesses only are enumerated as belonging to the town, beside a priest, and three Francigenæ. The burgesses T. R. E. gave the sheriff the use of their “carrucæ,” or carts, three times a year. The record says, they are now demanded nine times. The “harieta Lagemannorum” is mentioned in the account of Cambridge, but we have no enumeration of the Lagemanni. The heriot received for one of the Lagemanni (probably the last who died) was twenty shillings: this marks their rank and condition.

CHESTER was rated at fifty hides, probably equivalent to a half-hundred. The houses in the city which paid geld in King Edward's time were in number 431, beside 56 which belonged to the Bishop; making a total of 487. When the city was given to Earl Hugh, as well as at the time of the Survey, the number was less by 205; "valde enim erat vastata," says the Record. The number of houses at the Survey was 282. The Church of St. John had eight houses in the City free from cus-

tomary payment. The Church of St. Werburgh had twelve houses.

In the time of King Edward the Confessor there were seven Moneyers and twelve “*Judices Civitatis*” in Chester. Of the last, it is said, “*hi erant de hominibus Regis, et Episcopi, et Comitis.*” From the penalty which these *Judices* incurred when they neglected to attend the Hundred Court, it should seem that the attendance of these persons was necessary to enable that Court to transact the business brought before it, forming most probably the jury, as it was afterwards called, who heard and decided all complaints made on applications for redress.

DERBY, in the time of King Edward the Confessor, had 243 burgesses: one church with seven clerks, and another church with six. There were fourteen mills in the town.

There are some circumstances mentioned with regard to the burgesses of Derby T. R. E. which seem worthy of notice as marking their condition. Forty-one burgesses held twelve carucates "ad geldum," and employed twelve ploughs in the cultivation of the land, though eight would have sufficed for that purpose. Also the Clerks of one of the two churches held two carucates "libere," and those of the other held four bovates "libere."

At the time of the Survey there were 100 greater and 40 lesser burgesses, 103 "mansiones wastæ," four churches, and ten mills: there were also 16 masuræ possessed of sac and soc, of which ten belonged to the King.

The account of Derby is found in Domesday, in the first page of Nottinghamshire, and follows that of Nottingham. It was probably so placed on account of the commercial connection between the two towns. King John, in his confirmation of the charter of Derby, in the 6th year of his reign, after referring to the privileges of the place in the time of Henry I., says,

From different entries it will be seen that there were at least 411 houses in the city of EXETER at the time of the Survey, and 463 houses T. R. E.¹ Baldwin the

sheriff is said to have 19 houses in Exeter, seven of which had belonged to King Edward the Confessor.¹ From a passage at the close of the short entry which relates to Exeter it would seem that the city was incorporated.² It never paid geld, except when London, York, and Winchester paid it. The geld seems, however, to have been trifling, only half a mark of silver “ad opus militum,” or, as it is expressed in the Exon Domesday, fol. 89, ad *solidarios*. Upon any expedition by land or sea Exeter was rated as for five hides: Barnstaple, Lidford, and Totness were rated jointly at the same. This is confirmed by another passage, fol. 108 b.

At BARNSTAPLE it is said, “Ibi sunt xxiii. domus vastatæ postquam Rex venit in Angliam.”³ Fifteen other wasted houses occur in subsequent columns of the Survey.⁴

In LIDEFORDE forty houses are recorded to have been laid waste before William the Conqueror came to England.⁵ The Messrs. Lysons say, “it is probable that this was in 997, when the town of Lidford was burned by the Danes.” They add, “it is evident, from the Domesday account, (inferring from the words *intra* and *extra* burgum,) that Lidford was then a walled town.”⁶

The greater towns of Dorsetshire at the time of the formation of the Domesday Survey were Dorchester, Bridport, Wareham, and Shaftesbury.

One burgess only in DORCHESTER is mentioned in the Survey, and he was attached to the Bishop of Salisbury's manor of Cerminstre.¹ The number of houses in Dor-

chester in King Edward's time had been a hundred and seventy-two. At the time of the Survey they amounted to eighty-eight only. A hundred houses had been destroyed between the time of Sheriff Hugh and the time of the Survey. This town had two moneyers, each of whom paid to the King a mark of silver, and twenty shillings "quando moneta vertebatur," probably meaning when the type of the coinage was changed.

Dorchester T. R. E. paid geld for ten hides, or double the geld of Exeter, *i. e.* a whole mark of silver *ad opus Huscarlium*. There seems to have been great variety in the rights and obligations of the Anglo-Saxon burghs.

In BRIDPORT a hundred and twenty houses had existed in King Edward's time: a hundred only remained at the time of the Survey. The other twenty were so far destroyed that their inhabitants were unable to pay geld. In King Edward's time Bridport had one moneyer, who made the same payment to the King as the moneyers of Dorchester.

At WAREHAM, in King Edward the Confessor's time, a hundred and forty-three houses had stood upon the King's demesne. At the Survey, seventy of these only remained: seventy-three had been destroyed from the time that Hugh was sheriff. In the division of St. Vandrille forty-five houses were standing, and seventeen ruined. Twenty houses on the portions belonging to different Barons were standing, and sixty destroyed. It is evident that Wareham contained two hundred and eighty-five inhabited houses in the time of the Confessor, which had been reduced, before the year 1086, to a hundred and thirty-five.

There were two moneyers in Wareham T. R. E., who paid the same rent to the King as the moneyers of Dorchester and Bridport.

A hundred and fifty-one burgesses of SHAFTESBURY have already been included in the Abstract for Dorsetshire, who, with twenty empty manses and a garden, belonged to the Abbess of Shaftesbury, at the time of the Survey, in right of her Monastery. The 151 burgesses dwelling in 91 manses shows that the number of burgesses in a town might exceed the number of houses.

In the time of King Edward the Confessor, there were a hundred and four houses in Shaftesbury upon the King's demesne; but sixty-six only remained at the Survey. Thirty-eight had been destroyed since Hugh's time. In the part of the town belonging to the Abbess there had been a hundred and fifty-three houses T.R.E., which were reduced at the Survey to a hundred and eleven. Forty-two had been destroyed. Two hundred and fifty-seven inhabited houses, of which the town consisted in the time of the Confessor, had been reduced before the year 1086 to a hundred and seventy-seven.

The account of COLCHESTER in the Survey is full. One section of the entry relating to it begins, "Isti sunt burgenses Regis qui reddunt consuetudinem." Then follows a list of 294 names, of whom by far the greater number had one house in the borough; some had two houses; a few had four; and one person as many as thirteen. To each of these houses a few acres seem to have been attached, and after some of the names there is no house, but only a small parcel of land. The whole number of houses entered is 401, which has been assumed in the preceding Abstract for the number of the burgesses, or at least inhabitants. Most of the names are of ordinary burgesses, but there are a few of Barons who had estates elsewhere. Hamo Dapifer has a house, a "curia," a whole hide of land, and fifteen burgesses. In another part of the Survey the Bishop of London holds fourteen houses in Colchester, "non reddentes consuetudinem præter scotum," *Essex*, fol. 14. These would increase the number of the burgesses to 415. The King had a demesne in Colchester of a hundred and two acres, on which were ten Bordarii. It was the custom of Colchester for the King's burgesses to

There is no place of the name in Essex; and the second entry, *Essex*, fol. 76 b., makes this matter clear, under Haingeham, "Huic manorio jacent xv. burgenses in Sudberia et appretientur in illo." In fact, the first of these entries, as the context of the passage shows, belongs to the manor of Halsted, which precedes it in the Record. Halsted in Essex is to this day held of the honor of Clare in Suffolk, which lordship belonged at the time of the Survey, together with Halsted, to Richard Fitz Gilbert.

pay two marks of silver “ad firmam regis,” every year, a fortnight after Easter. Beside which every house paid sixpence a year, when the King had soldiers, or made an expedition.

Every thing marking the existence of communities in burghs deserves to be noticed. At Colchester, eighty acres of land, and eight perches round the wall, belonged to the *Commune Burgensium*, and produced sixty solidi a year, which, if not wanted for the King’s service, was divided “in commune.”¹

In MALDON, the Record says, the King had one house, pasture for a hundred sheep, and one socherman; he had also 180 houses, which the burgesses held of him, and 18 wasted houses. Fifteen burgesses held half a hide and twenty-one acres; the others held nothing but their houses in the burgh.

In GLOUCESTER, the rents which were paid to the King, with various mansions held in the city by tenants in capite and others, are enumerated; but the folio which contains them gives no account of the burgesses. Those mentioned in the above Abstract occur as appendant to different manors, scattered through the Survey of the County.³ The passages are referred to in a note in the preceding page. In Worcestershire, folio 172 b,

The abbat of Evesham, according to the statements just quoted, was the superior lord of three burgesses in Gloucester, and of two in Winchcombe. The Domesday Survey itself gives him four in Gloucester, and one in Winchcombe.

There is a short passage in the account of the Evesham property in Gloucestershire, in Domesday, fol. 166, relating to the manors of Stock and Hadecote, which must not be passed here without a comment. The Record says, "Has duo Villas habet Abbas *duobus militibus suis commendatas*." It is the only entry in which the "Milites Abbatis" occur: but the abbat must have had a greater number of "milites" upon his lands ready when called upon for service. The Cottonian Register already referred to, fol. 14 b., preserves what the Editor of the present Work believes to be the OLDEST WRIT of MILITARY SERVICE extant. It is from King William the Conqueror to Abbat Egelwin, and demands the service forthwith of five "milites." It must have been addressed to the Abbat in or before the year 1077, since the Saxon Chronicle places Egelwin's death in that year. The instrument is as follows :

"W. Rex Anglorum Agelwin abbat de Evesham salutem. Precipio tibi quod submoneas omnes illos qui sub ballia et

Although no description of WINCHESTER occurs in the Survey, that City is repeatedly mentioned in the account of Hampshire, as will be seen in the references below,¹ in which, beside the Burgenses and Sub-urbani mentioned in the preceding Abstract, we have seven houses, thirty-nine hagæ, and thirty-two masuræ. The fourteen burgesses belonged to the Abbey of Rumsey; the sub-urbani to the Abbey of Wherwell.

The state of Winchester in the time of King Edward the Confessor, as well as in the reign of Henry the First, is fully detailed in the *LIBER WINTON'*, published by order of His Majesty's Commissioners upon the public records, among the Additamenta to the Domesday Survey, in 1816.

In the time of King Edward the Confessor there were 103 homagers in HEREFORD, within and without the wall.⁶ Six "fabri," or smiths, had each his forge in the city. Earl Harold, it is added, had 27 burgesses,

In the Conqueror's time the burgesses were of two classes; the English, who enjoyed the privileges which they had been accustomed to in the reign of the Confessor; and foreigners, or "Francigenæ," who had some exemptions. No numbers, however, are specified. Roger de Laci had certain burgesses in Hereford¹; Henry de Ferrars had one belonging to his manor of Frome²; and Alured de Merleberge had five appertaining to his manor of Bur-gelle.³ Four belonged to the royal manor of Merchelai.⁴ The burgesses of Hereford upon the three manors last mentioned are those which are counted in the Abstract above.

The payments and privileges of the moneyers of Hereford have been already detailed, vol. i. p. 176. All had *sac* and *soc*, and consequently had all their inmates under their own jurisdiction and frankpledge.

The Burgh of WIGMORE is mentioned as paying a rent of £7 to Ralph de Mortemer; but no burgesses are named in the entry.⁵

The Town of Hertford in Edward the Confessor's time had 146 burgesses under the protection of the King. It was rated at ten hides.

Eighteen burgesses only are noticed at the time of the Survey, who are comprised in the preceding Abstract: they were the King's, and are said previously to have been the homagers of the Earls Harold and Leuin. Thirty-seven houses (including the mansion of Asgar stalre) are enumerated as held chiefly by the great Norman landholders of the County, which had previously belonged to burgesses.

Clutterbuck, in his History of Hertfordshire, states, that Hertford Castle was given by King William the Conqueror to Peter de Valoines; but the Charter to which he refers, Cart. Antiq. K. 22, in Turre Lond., is from William Rufus, and no mention of Hertford Castle occurs in it.

The total number of the burgesses of HUNTINGDON at the time of the Survey, entered in the Record, was 296. The 116 burgesses, in the two quarters of the town which are mentioned first, had 100 Bordarii who assisted them in paying geld to the King. These are included, in the above Abstract, in their class. The Borough of Huntingdon paid geld for a fourth part of the hundred of Hyrstingstan, for fifty hides, but it is added, " Modo non geldat ita in illo Hundredo, postquam rex Wil-lielmus geldum monetæ posuit in burgo." Previous to the time of the Survey there had been three Monetarii in Huntingdon, but they were employed there no longer.

The dues from Huntingdon were farmed; two thirds of the " firma burgi" were paid to the King, and one third to the Earl.

Under the title "Terra Archiepiscopi Cantuariensis" it is said, "In Civitate Cantuaria habet Archiepiscopus XII. burgenses et XXXII. mansuras quas tenent clerici de villa." Tom. i. fol. 3. Seven burgesses in Canterbury are recorded, fol. 4, as appertaining to the Archbishop's manor of Aldinton, and ninety-seven as belonging to the manor of Nordevde, fol. 5; seventy burgesses in Canterbury belonged to St. Augustine's manor of Lanport, fol. 12. fessor, and till the Bishop had taken them away; fol. 9 b. col. 1. Thirteen masuræ in Canterbury belonged to the manor of Cilleham; fol. 10, col. 1. One masura to the manor of Ernoltun; fol. 10. Five hagæ to the manor of Dodeham; fol. 10 b. Four hagæ in Canterbury belonged to the manor of Newetune; fol. 14 b.

T. R. E. the burgesses of Canterbury had 45 mansuræ without the city, of which they had the rent and customs, but the King had the sac and soc. They had also 33 acres of land "ad gildam suam;" and held 80 acres of the King "in allodio." In folio 9 b. we read that Haimo the sheriff held four carucates of land under the Bishop of Baieux, which the burgesses of Canterbury had held T. R. E., and of which they were afterwards deprived by the Bishop.

DOVER had been burnt, we have therefore no enumeration of its burgesses or inhabitants. The burgesses, however, must have been a powerful body in the time of King Edward the Confessor, since they fitted out for the King, once a year, twenty ships and four hundred and twenty men for fifteen days. The “Gihalla Burgensium” at Dover has been noticed in the preceding Volume. The King is said to have lost his custom upon twenty-nine masuræ.

SANDWICH had T. R. E. 307 “masuræ hospitatæ,” at the time of the Survey 383. These imply a considerable population, which is not otherwise recorded: as well as that the town had increased.

Sixty-five burgesses of LEICESTER, only, are actually mentioned in the Domesday Survey; but the number of inhabited houses belonging to different persons is 318, exclusive of four which are described as *wastæ*, and of 47 burgesses mentioned as appendant to the manors of Hanstigie, Siglesbie, Pontenei, and Erendesbi.¹ Allowing, therefore, only one burgess to a house, the real number must have been 365. Of the houses, seventy-one paid geld to the King.

In the first column of the folio of Domesday which relates to LINCOLN, the number of houses in that city in the time of King Edward the Confessor is calculated by six score to the hundred. They amounted consequently to 1,150.¹ The Record then gives a list of the twelve Lagemen as they existed in the time of the Confessor,² followed by the names of their successors as they stood at the time of the Survey. In the remainder of the column about 120 houses belonging to different persons are enumerated. Geoffrey Alselin held the hall or mansion which had belonged to Tochi the son of Outi, and Bishop Remigius held 30 mansiones which had belonged to the same person. From the names of Merlesuain, Morcar, Ulf, and Harold, as possessors of mansions here, it should seem that Lincoln had served for a resort to partisans opposed to the Conqueror at the beginning of his reign. Of the “mansiones hospitatae” of the time of the Confessor, 240 lay waste at the time of the Survey; and 900 were inhabited. This last number has been adopted for the burgesses in the preceding Abstract.³ Colsuen, it is said, had lately built 36 houses

and two churches on a piece of waste ground outside the city, given to him by the King. Of the 240 wasted houses within the city, 166 had been demolished in building the Castle, and 74 had fallen to ruin, not from the oppression of Sheriffs and other Officers of the Crown, but from misfortunes, poverty, and fire.

Nine burgesses of STAMFORD only are mentioned in the Survey¹ by title; but it is clear that there must have been a large population there. In five out of the six wards into which it was divided there were 141 inhabited houses in the time of King Edward the Confessor, 136 of which remained at the Survey. Five had been destroyed at the building of the Castle. Stamford also had had 12 Lagemen in the time of the Confessor; but the number at the Survey was nine only. The above number of 136 inhabitants, one for each house, has been adopted in the Abstract.

The lower part of the second column of *Linc.* folio 336 b., proceeds to enumerate 111 houses belonging to different persons, but whether exclusive of those contained in the general enumeration is difficult to say. They all existed T. R. E., but had changed their owners. Seventy of these mansiones, which had belonged to Queen Editha, are said to be in Rutlandshire.

Stamford was rated T. R. E. for landfyrd, shipfyrd, and danegeld, as for Twelve Hundreds and a half. The lagemen and burgesses held two hundred and seventy-two acres T. R. W. "sine consuetudine."

In TORKSEY, in the time of King Edward the Confessor, there were 213 burgesses; at the time of the Survey 102; one hundred and eleven "mansiones" lay waste.

In the time of King Edward the Confessor there were 1,320 burgesses in NORWICH. The King had soc, sac, and customary rent of 1,230; Stigand had the soc, sac, and "commendatio," or patronage, of 50; and Harold of 32. Stigand held the two churches of St. Martin and St. Michael in Norwich, which were together endowed with a hundred and thirty acres of land: fifteen other churches were held by the burgesses, to which there belonged in alms 181 acres of land and meadow: and twelve burgesses, in King Edward's time, held the church of the Holy Trinity. The Abbat of St. Edmunds had one house, and a moiety of the church of

St. Laurence. The church of All Saints in Norwich is also incidentally mentioned, and the church of St. Simon and St. Jude. So great was the consequence of Norwich at this period, that it was rated by itself as for a whole hundred.

At the formation of the Domesday Survey there were in Norwich no more than 665 English burgesses, beside 480 bordarii, who from poverty paid no custom.

On the land which Stigand had held T. R. E. there were 39 burgesses and 9 empty houses;¹ and on the land of which Harold had had the soc, 15 burgesses and 17 empty houses, then in the occupation of the Castle; and on the land which was in the soc of the King and Earl there were 190 empty houses; and 81 in the occupation of the Castle. There were besides 50 houses in the borough from which the King had no custom. The names of the owners of these houses follow in the Record.² Forty-three chapels, not mentioned in the Survey as existing in King Edward's time, are entered in the Conqueror's time as belonging to the burgesses.

The Record expressly states, that Norwich had suffered much. It had been deserted by part of its inhabitants, "partim propter forisfacturas Rogerii Comitis, partim propter arsuram, partim propter geltum Regis, partim propter Walerannum."

In spite, however, of this reduced ability, Norwich, which in King Edward's time had paid to the King

20*l.* and 10*l.* to the Earl,¹ at the time of the Survey, paid to the King 70*l.* by weight, and 100*s.* by tale “de gersuma,” as a free gift to the Queen; a palfrey and twenty pounds of blanched silver to the Earl; and twenty shillings by tale to Godric, who is supposed to have been the Sheriff. Many of the inhabitants of Norwich had taken up their residence in other places. Domesday expressly states, that 22 burgesses had gone to Beccles, a town belonging to the Abbat of St. Edmundsbury; six had seated themselves in the hundred of Humbleyard;² one at King’s Thorp; one on the land of Roger Bigot; one under William de Noiers; and one under Richard de Sent Cler.³

YARMOUTH remained in the same condition, nearly, in the Conqueror’s time, as it had been in the time of King Edward the Confessor. “Semper lxx. Burgenses.” The customary rent to the King and Earl was triflingly increased; and the burgesses gave 4*l.* to the sheriff, “gratis et amicitia.”

THETFORD had had 943 burgesses in the time of King Edward. At the time of the Survey there were 720 burgesses only, and 224 empty houses. Twenty-one of these burgesses held of the King six carucates and sixty acres of land. The King had two thirds of the customs and rents of Thetford as belonging to his Crown, and one third in right of the Earldom

of Ralph Guader, which had come into his hands by forfeiture. In the time of King Edward the Confessor, Thetford paid 20*l.* by tale to the King, and 10*l.* to the Earl. At the time of the Survey it paid to the Crown yearly no less than 50*l.* by weight, to the Earldom 20*l.* blanch, and 6*l.* by tale, beside 40*l.* a year to the King in coin, "de moneta," and 16*s.* for two allowances of provender. The exaction here, on the part of the Norman invaders, seems to have been great.

as many mansions. At the Survey, King William had but 47 in demesne, with 40 “in Novo Burgo,” which must mean a fresh extension of the place. In this new Town 221 houses are enumerated as belonging, at the time of the Survey, to the Bishop of Coutance, the Abbes of St. Edmundsbury, Peterborough, Ramsey, Coventry, Evesham, and Selby, the Earl of Moretaine, Earl Hugh, the Countess Judith, and others, of which 21 lay waste; so that there were at least 287 houses inhabited in Northampton when Domesday was formed. The burgesses of Northampton, at the time of the Survey, paid 30*l.* 10*s.* as part of the Sheriff’s farm of the county.

In the time of King Edward the Confessor there were in NOTTINGHAM 173 burgesses, 19 villani, and two monetarii. In the Conqueror's time, when Hugh Fitz Baldric was sheriff, there were 136 resident burgesses, called "homines manentes;" there were 16 less in number, as the Abstract shows, at the time of the Survey.

Two hundred and fourteen houses are enumerated as belonging to different persons at the time of the Survey. Forty-eight of these, held by William Peverell, are called "domus Mercatorum," and twelve, held by the same person, "domus Equitum;" a title which is also given to thirteen houses held by Ralph de Burun. Sheriff Hugh, it is said, had built thirteen houses in the new burgh, on the land of Earl Tosti, and subjected them to the census of the New Burgh.

The burgesses of Nottingham held six carucates of land, twenty bordarii, and fourteen ploughs.

No enumeration of the inhabitants of the city of OXFORD occurs in Domesday.² At the formation of the Survey there were 243 houses within and without the walls which paid geld; and 478 so dilapidated, from different causes, that they could not pay it.

The owners of 186 inhabited and of 126 waste houses are enumerated, most of whom are persons not residing in the town; but some appear to be resident burgesses.

The churches mentioned in the last paragraph of Rutlandshire, fol. 294, had been first given by King William the Conqueror to the church of Westminster. The following is the passage relating to them in his earliest charter to that monastery: “*Preterea quidem in Rotelande ei (sc. In the time of King Edward the Confessor there were 252 houses in SHREWSBURY, inhabited by the same number of burgesses, who paid gable.

At the time of the Survey the English burgesses complained that they paid the whole geld which had been paid in King Edward's time, although Earl Roger's castle occupied fifty-one masures, and fifty more lay

waste. The geld was for a hundred hides. Forty-three foreign burgesses held masures which had paid T. R. E., but did not pay at the Survey; and 39 burgesses who did not pay, were given by the Earl to the Abbey. In the whole, 193 masures did not pay geld. The Bishop of Chester had sixteen masures, and as many burgesses, T. R. E. Of these ten had become waste; the remaining six still paid customary rent.

The penalties which King Edward the Confessor had in demesne in Shrewsbury have been already enlarged upon in vol. i. pp. 200, 201. The custom of the moneyers of Shrewsbury also, will be found vol. i. p. 176.

To the observations in the former pages here referred to, should be added, that from the circumstance of King Edward having penalties for breach of the peace, fore-stel, and heinfare, all over England, *extra firmas*, it is to be inferred that ferms of the revenue were not uncommon T. R. E.; although Mr. Hallam thought he found no instance in Domesday except that of Huntingdon.

King William had 18 burgesses in STAFFORD in demesne, beside 8 “manses,” which are said to have been “wastæ.” He had also 22 manses “de Honore Comitis,” of which 17 only were inhabited. Eighteen more burgesses of Stafford were appendant to the manor of Mertone, held under Earl Roger by the Monastery of St. Evroul in Normandy.

The manses held in Stafford by tenants in capite of the County were 131 in number, of which 38 were “wastæ,” and apparently unoccupied. The rents from the customary payments of the Town had diminished.

In IPSWICH, in King Edward's time, there were 538 burgesses who paid customary rent to the King. At the Survey there were 110 who paid the rent, and 100 poor burgesses who paid a penny per head: 328 mansions which had paid geld, and made the total of 538 for the burgesses at the former period, were wasted. The Church of the Holy Trinity, two Churches dedicated to St. Mary, and the Churches of St. Michael, St. Botulph, St. Laurence, St. Peter, and St. Stephen, in this town, are mentioned in the same entry.¹ Three of these Churches belonged to priests, and others were in lay patronage. One of the Churches of St. Mary belonged to Culling, a burgess. Of the Church of St. Laurence it is said, "Hanc Ecclesiam tenebat Lefflet quædam libera femina T. R. E. quam reclamat Comes Alanus ad feudum Comitis Radulfi, et revocat Ivonem Tailebosc ad liberatorem." Roger de Ramis held a Church in Ipswich dedicated to St. George, with four burgesses and six wasted mansions.² Another Church, St. Julian's, belonging to Aluric the son of Rolf, a burgess of Ipswich, is mentioned among the lands of the Vavassors in Suffolk.³

In King Edward's time Earl Guert had the third penny of Ipswich.⁴

One burgess in Ipswich belonged to Robert Malet's manor of Plegeforda.¹ Five burgesses belonged to the Church of St. Peter in Ipswich.² Richard son of Earl Gilbert had thirteen burgesses.³ Forty-one in King Edward's time had belonged to Robert Fitz Wimarc, the commendatio of twenty-six of whom was still in his son Suein of Essex; the other fifteen were dead at the time of the Survey.⁴ Ralph the brother of Ilger held "i. mansura vacua et altera hospitata" in Ipswich.⁵ Walter the Deacon held five houses and three "mansuræ vacuæ" which had belonged to King Edward the Confessor's queen.⁶ Norman the Sheriff had two burgesses.⁷

Two burgesses of Ipswich appertained to a grange near the burgh which in the Confessor's time had belonged to Queen Editha.⁸ Two others, who had belonged to Stigand, were dead at the time of the Survey.⁹

BECCLES belonged to the Abbey of St. Edmundsbury. Beside the agricultural tenantry upon the manor, the Abbat had twenty-six burgesses and three parts of the market: the King the fourth. Thirty soc-men, with all customary payments, had twenty bordarii under them.¹⁰

SUDBURY, which in the Confessor's time had belonged to the mother of Earl Morcar, at the time of the Survey belonged to the King. Sixty-three burgesses are described as "halle manentes," and fifty-five as in demesne. The Church of St. Gregory then possessed fifty acres of free land, and twenty-five of meadow. This town had a market, and moneymen, though it is not said how many.¹ The customary rent to the King had risen from £18 to £28.

DUNWICH was an improving place at the time of the Survey. Two bordarii and twenty-four foreigners, upon forty acres, paid rent to the manor. In the Confessor's time there had been 120 burgesses. At the Survey, when in Robert Malet's possession, there were 236, beside 178 "pauperes homines." Two churches out of three had been added. The sea had made an encroachment upon Dunwich, which has been alluded to in the former volume. The customary rent in the total was £50 and 60,000 herrings.² Eighty burgesses of Dunwich were attached to the manor of Alneterne, belonging to the Abbey of Ely.³

A market at CARAHALLA is recorded as "*de dono Regis.*"⁴

Odo Bishop of Baieux held a monastery and water-course in SOUTHWARK, both of which had been King Edward's. Of the dues on shipping which lay there, King Edward had received two parts, and Earl Godwin the third. The church and watercourse were claimed for the King, but appear to have been exchanged away by the Bishop of Baieux. The rent from Southwark to the King amounted to 16*l.*

The “homines de Sudwercke” are twice mentioned, but it is not said of what condition they were, nor of what number. They had, however, obtained by legal process a haga and a toll which had been held by Earl Eustace.¹

The Archbishop of Canterbury had four masures in Southwark,² Richard Fitz Gilbert had three hagæ,³ and

Earl Roger four masures.¹ Sixteen masuræ belonged to the King's manor of Merton in Surrey.² St. Peter's, Westminster, had a bordarius in Southwark.³

In GUILDFORD, at the time of the Survey, the King had seventy-five hagæ, on which 175 homagers were resident. Of these, Ralph the clerk had three hagæ, upon which six homagers were resident. Some of the hagæ appear to have been surreptitiously obtained by the persons who possessed them at the Survey. Domesday makes no allusion to any corporate privileges in this place.⁴

Thirteen burgesses of London are recorded to have belonged to the manor of Bermondsey, T. R. E.;⁵ and nineteen at the time of the Survey belonged to the Church of Lambeth.

At CHICHESTER, in King Edward's time, ninety-eight "hagæ" are enumerated. These hagæ were inclosed plats of ground upon which houses stood. How many houses the total number contained cannot be conjectured. From the rent which one haga produced, it may be supposed that more than one house might stand upon a haga:³ as is clearly shown at Guildford in

Surrey, in page 495. At the time of the Survey, it is said, there were more houses than had been there in former time (probably King Edward's) by sixty. But here is no clue to the population of Chichester in 1086. Nine burgesses only, as above, are incidentally enumerated in the Survey. The city of Chichester is said to have been "in manu Roberti Comitis."

At LEWES, King Edward the Confessor had a hundred and thirty-seven burgesses in demesne; but the number of them at the time of the Survey, royal or other, is not mentioned. Fifty-three, like the nine burgesses of Chichester, occur incidentally in different pages. The inhabitants of Lewes had probably increased, as the annual value of the burgh, which in the Confessor's time had been rated at $26l.$, had risen under the Conqueror to $34l.$ In subsequent entries to that which describes the town, it appears that William de Warene, at the time of the Survey, was the superior lord of a hundred and forty-seven "hagæ" and eleven "masuræ;" these are entered as part and parcel of distinct manors, held either by him or his under-tenants.

At CASTLE ARUNDEL, as it is called, we have the produce of the town, port, and dues from vessels, rated at $12l.$ a year; but the whole entry affords no materials whatever for estimating the number of inhabitants.

At PEVENSEY, in King Edward's time, there were twenty-four burgesses belonging to the King's demesne. The Bishop of Chichester had five; Edmer the priest two; Ormer the priest five; Doda the priest three. At the Survey, the Earl of Moretaine had sixty bur-

gesses,¹ the monks of Moretaine eight, and forty-two appertained to other individuals.

In the burgh of STEYNINGES, a hundred and twenty-four “masuræ” occur. It is added, “ad curiam operantur sicut villani T. R. E.”

Beside these, 19 burgesses had as many masures, with sac and soc. MALMESBURY, like Wallingford in Berkshire, furnished soldiers for the army. Sixty-five masures, seven halves, and a quarter of a masure, are enumerated in that town, with nine coscez “*foris burgum*,” who paid geld with the burgesses. Walter Hosed, from two divisions of the burgh of Malmesbury, paid 8*l.* to the King. The whole town paid the same sum in the time of King Edward the Confessor.¹ The military service of the town consisted in either paying twenty shillings to the King “*ad pascendos suos buzecarl*,” or in furnishing him with one man “*pro honore v. hidarum*;” which shows that twenty shillings was the commutation for the service of one man.

Only 17 burgesses of **WILTON** are mentioned; but as the revenue to the Crown was 50*l.* the number of burgesses must have been far greater.

We have no mention whatever of burgesses, or of the borough of **SALISBURY**; but, fol. 64 b, col. 1, we have “*De tertio denario Sarisberie habet Rex vi. lib.*” and fol. 66, col. 1, “*Episcopus tenet Sarisberie. Ibi xxv. villani et l. bord.*” Neither is **MARLBOROUGH** mentioned as a borough.

In different folios, as the references show, 33 burgesses of **CREEKLADE** are mentioned: exclusive of whom, those which belonged to the Abbey of Westminster are to be reckoned. Under title **IX.** of this county, “**QUOD HABET SANCTUS PETRUS WESTMONASTERIENSIS**,” it is said, “*Ecclesia S. Petri Westmonast. tenet aecclesiam de Crichelade, et habet ibi plures burgenses, et tertium denarium ejusdem villæ. Totum simul reddit ix. lib.*”

The account of the city of WORCESTER, in the first column of Worcestershire, refers to the rents, customs, and services of the place only: there is no enumeration of the burgesses; seven of whom, however, occur in other folios,² and one is mentioned in the Survey of Herefordshire as attached to the manor of Suchelei.³

Houses in Worcester are enumerated in various entries. Ninety are mentioned as appendant to the Bishop of Worcester's manor of Norwiche. Of these, the Bishop himself held forty-five in demesne; Urso held twenty-four; Osbern Fitz Richard, eight; Walter

Ponther, eleven; and Robert Dispenser, one. Vrso also held twenty-five houses of the Bishop in the market-place of Worcester, which paid 100*s.* per annum.¹ The Abbey of Evesham held twenty-eight masures in Worcester, five of which were wasted.² One house was appendant to Earl Roger's manor of Hala, and one to Urso d'Abetot's manor of Osmerlie.³ One house belonged to the manor of Chideminstre.⁴ Houses in Worcester were also attached to several manors in Herefordshire. Three belonged to the royal manor of Merlie in that county,⁵ one to Halsede, two to Fechham,⁶ one to Buselie;⁷ and three masures in Worcester, paying thirty pence yearly, belonged to the Church of Hereford, as appendant to its manor of Cotingtune.⁸

When Worcestershire paid geld, the City of Worcester was rated at fifteen hides.

Houses and Salinæ in WICH are numerously mentioned.

In the time of King Edward the Confessor there were six shires in YORK, beside the shire of the Archbishop. One of these shires, at the time of the Survey, had been demolished to make room for the castles. In the other five shires there were 1,418 “mansiones hospitatae.” In the shire of the Archbishop there were, T. R. E., 189 “mansiones hospitatae;” so that the full number of those “mansiones” was 1,597, beside the shire which was afterwards sacrificed to the castles. The whole number may be presumed to have been 1,800 or thereabout. The Curia of the Archbishop and the houses of the Canons not included in this estimate.

Of the houses within the King’s shire, T. R. W., there were 391 which paid rent; 400 inhabited occasionally, which did not pay the ancient rents; 540 which were empty and paid nothing; and 145 held by Francigenæ. One hundred and fifty-four “mansiones” and an “hospitium” are next enumerated, possessed by different persons, which are probably included in the preceding enumeration. At the time of the Survey, 100 houses, great and small, were inhabited in the Archbishop’s shire, exclusive of the Curia and houses of the Canons.

The whole number of “Domus hospitatae” at the time of the Survey may be therefore reckoned at 1,036.

In one of the “mansiones” T. R. E. Gamel lived with four *dingis*.

There were four “Judices” in York T. R. E., but the privilege which they enjoyed by the King’s writ is not clearly expressed.

Eighty-four carucates of land gelded with the city of York T. R. E., being probably the quantity of land within the bounds and jurisdiction of the city. The amount of the geld is not stated.

The ravage of the Conqueror’s arms in YORKSHIRE in 1069 has already been detailed. It will account for the paucity of cultivators which marks this part of the Domesday Survey.¹ Upon four hundred and eleven manors, in folios 300, 300 b, 301, 301 b, and the first column of fol. 302, the only inhabitants enumerated are thirty-five villani and eight bordarii.
