I. The following Circular is published for the information of all concerned.

CONFEDERATE STATES OF AMERICA,

BUREAU OF CONSCRIPTION,

MONTGOMERY, VA. APRIL 5th, 1864.

I. Circular No. 13, current series, is hereby revoked.

II. Commandants will retain out of the reserve Classes a sufficient number to compose their Camp Guard and supporting force, and proceed as rapidly as possible to organize into companies, persons of the said reserve Classes already enrolled.

III. Commandants will instantly designate proper rendezvous, and order all persons of the reserve Classes to report at such rendezvous on the sixteenth day of April inst., for the purpose of electing Company Officers, and being organized into Companies.

IV. The instant organization of these Classes is deemed of the highest importance, and all such persons as do not appear at the rendezvous on the day appointed must be enrolled and assigned at the discretion of the Commandant.

Unless otherwise instructed Commandants will forward the Muster Roll direct to this Bureau.

II. Pursuant to the above Circular the following Camps of Instruction, viz :

For the 1st, 2d, 3d, 4th and 5th Cong: Districts—Camp Buckner, Talladega, Ala.;

For the 7th and 8th Cong: Districts—Camp Watts, Notasulga, Ala.;

For the 6th and 9th Cong: Districts—Camp Preston, Montgomery, Ala.;

are designated as points to which all parties enrolled under General Order No. 12, from this office, except such as join some Company for local defense, will be ordered by Enrolling Officers as soon as enrolled.

III. Commandants of Camps of Instruction will retain out of the reserve classes a sufficient number to compose their camp guard, and one Company of sixty-four men for each Congressional District under their control, organize them into Companies and forward their Muster Rolls to this office. In organizing these Companies, Commandants will be guided by Par: XIX, Circular No. 8, Bureau of Conscription, and will allow all, except those organized as camp guards, to elect their officers.

IV. District Enrolling Officers will require and forward to this office the Muster Rolls of all Companies for local defense in their respective districts, giving their descriptive rolls in full.
