Information Disclosure Statement

Copies of the requested references (EP 0,815,841 A1, JP 61,028,078, and WO 98/03147) have been submitted in a Supplemental IDS on October 9, 2001.

Claim Rejections - 35 USC §103

Claims 21-33 and 35-40 are rejected by the Examiner under 35 USC §103 as being anticipated by Roe (US 5,607,760) in view of Kasahara et al. (JP 04-182,423). Specifically, the Examiner states that they consider the IC₅₀ values to be an <u>inherent property</u> of the protease inhibitor itself, and because Kasahara et al. teaches multiple protease inhibitors, that Kasahara et al. has disclosed all the claimed IC₅₀ values. The Examiner further states that Kasahara et al. teaches protease inhibitors in the form of a lotion or emulsion and it would be obvious to a skilled artisan to
