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DETAILED ACTION

Summary

In response to the Appeal Brief filed on January 29, 2002, the Examiner is

hereby withdrawing the final rejection.

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 112

The following is a quotation of the second paragraph of 35 U.S.C. 112:

The specification shall conclude with one or more claims particularly pointing out and distinctly claiming the subject matter which the applicant regards as his invention.

Claims 2-3, 14, 31, and 33 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 112, second paragraph,

as being indefinite for failing to particularly point out and distinctly claim the subject

matter which applicant regards as the invention. In claims 2-3 and 14, the eyeglass

frames and the bridge were not positively recited in claim 1. In claims 31 and 33, the

eyeglass frames were not positively recited in claim 30.

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 102

The following is a quotation of the appropriate paragraphs of 35 U.S.C. 102 that

form the basis for the rejections under this section made in this Office action:

A person shall be entitled to a patent unless -

(b) the invention was patented or described in a printed publication in this or a foreign country or in public use or on sale in this country, more than one year prior to the date of application for patent in the United States.

Claims 1-11, 13-25, 27-41, and 43-45 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(b) as

being anticipated by Heaford ('077).

Heaford discloses a flexible body formed of a pliable material and adapted to

partially extend over the lens and along side the side arm (col.1, lines 45-55) and (7),

first and second fasteners (12), eyeglass frames, a lens socket, (col.2, lines 70-95), a

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first fastener comprising a loop having first and second ends (12) (second end may be

interpreted as being a pronged tab), a releasable connector (17), and a body having at

least one slot (10). The method of intended use is not given patentable weight in the

article claims.

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 103

The following is a quotation of 35 U.S.C. 103(a) which forms the basis for all

obviousness rejections set forth in this Office action:

(a) A patent may not be obtained though the invention is not identically disclosed or described as set forth in section 102 of this title, if the differences between the subject matter sought to be patented and the prior art are such that the subject matter as a whole would have been obvious at the time the invention was made to a person having ordinary skill in the art to which said subject matter pertains. Patentability shall not be negatived by the manner in which the invention was made.

Claims 12, 26, and 42 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over Heaford in view of Grindle ('401).

Heaford discloses the invention substantially as claimed; however, Heaford does not disclose a fabric material or a fastener comprising a tab that is separate from the body. Grindle teaches a lens occluder comprising a fabric material and attaching means (col.3, lines 35-40). It would have been obvious to one having ordinary skill in the art at the time the invention was made to incorporate the fabric material taught by Grindle as an alternative material for the occluder. It would have been obvious to one having ordinary skill in the art at the time the invention was made to form the tab separate from the body and incorporate that in place of the attachment means disclosed Heaford, since it has been held that constructing a formerly integral structure in various elements involves only routine skill in the art. *Nerwin v. Erlichman, 168* USPQ 177,

179.

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Conclusion

The prior art made of record and not relied upon is considered pertinent to applicant's disclosure. Mosher ('524), Hamilton ('372), Kobashikawa ('952), Blumenthal ('573), Gilkerson ('548), and Shindel ('195) teach eye glass covers.
