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DETAILED ACTION

Response to Arguments

Applicant's arguments filed 9/07/04 have been fully considered. Applicant has made modification to claim 1 to overcome the 112 rejection. The original claims are now in condition for allowance. Applicant has added claim 13 as an independent claim. Due to the broadness of the claim, a Second Office Action rejection is presented for applicant's response.

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 103

The following is a quotation of 35 U.S.C. 103(a) which forms the basis for all obviousness rejections set forth in this Office action:

(a) A patent may not be obtained though the invention is not identically disclosed or described as set forth in section 102 of this title, if the differences between the subject matter sought to be patented and the prior art are such that the subject matter as a whole would have been obvious at the time the invention was made to a person having ordinary skill in the art to which said subject matter pertains. Patentability shall not be negatived by the manner in which the invention was made.

Claim 13 is rejected under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over IEEE 1394.1

Bridge Standards Meeting /Talk Title: Wireless Bridge with Virtual Bus/ Sato, in view of Iijima.

Regarding claim 13, Sato in his talk Wireless Bridge with Virtual Bus discloses the possibilities of wirelessly connecting n 1394.1 buses with two portal bridges. Thus, Sato meets the preamble

A method for managing isochronous resources in a communication network comprising more than two communication buses linked by way of a wireless transmission bridge, the bridge comprising for each bus a portal connected to this bus, each portal being provided with wireless communication means (see abstract of the talk on page 3 of 6).

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However Sato is silent regarding the registers of the limitations.

Iijima discloses a communication control method and system that makes use of isochronous resource manager that includes bandwidth available registers (global passband register equivalent) in which the number of bandwidths of transmission line may be written which seems to be the equivalent of the reserved passband for each wireless link between the two portals. Thus, Iijima meets the following limitation:

providing a global register of passband availability for the set of wireless links of the wireless bridge; (col. 13, lines 50-63)

reserving passband with the global register for each wireless link participating in a communication between two portals. (col. 13, lines 50-63)

Sato and Iijima are combinable because they share a common endeavor, namely isochronous resource management. At the time of the applicant's invention it would have been obvious to modify the discussion of Sato to include the discussion of global and reserved passband as done by Iijima as a means of keeping necessary organization of the system.

Allowable Subject Matter

Claims 1-12 are allowed.

The following is a statement of reasons for the indication of allowable subject matter:

Regarding claim 1, the method and modeling techniques for managing isochronous resources in a communication network were neither found, suggested, nor made evident by the prior art.
