The applicant's arguments have been considered but do not place the application in condition for allowance. The applicant is arguing two main points. The first point is that the needle is not the same size as the claimed invention. According to paragraph [0053] Paques discloses the same size of the needle. This is what is claimed, and therefore the prior art reads on
this limitation. The applicant also argues, that Paques fails to teach the piercing being advanced into the eye. The examiner disagrees with the applicant's interpretation of the prior art, because the prior art discloses the needle being used to pierce the
eye, it must advance into the eye. If the membrane of the eye is pierced, the needle must travel into the eye, and thus fulfill the limitation of the claimed invention. Therefore, the examiner is keeping his rejections.
