Receipt is acknowledged of the amendment filed 8/3/01. Claims 1, 3-8, 11-18, 20, 24-25, 27-30, and 32 are pending.

## Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 112

Claims 1, 3-8, 11-18, 20, 24-25, 27-30, and 32 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 112, second paragraph, as being indefinite for failing to particularly point out and distinctly claim the subject matter which applicant regards as the invention.

In claim 1, line 3, "component supporting said wall", line 4, "plate resting on the ... component:", and lines 15-16, "connected to ... component and disposed between ... plate and ... component" are indefinite since the component is not positively recited.

## **Double Patenting**

The nonstatutory double patenting rejection is based on a judicially created doctrine grounded in public policy (a policy reflected in the statute) so as to prevent the unjustified or improper timewise extension of the "right to exclude" granted by a patent and to prevent possible harassment by multiple assignees. See *In re Goodman*, 11 F.3d 1046, 29 USPQ2d 2010 (Fed. Cir. 1993); *In re Longi*, 759 F.2d 887, 225 USPQ 645 (Fed. Cir. 1985); *In re Van Ornum*, 686 F.2d 937, 214 USPQ 761 (CCPA 1982); *In re Vogel*, 422 F.2d 438, 164 USPQ 619 (CCPA 1970);and, *In re Thorington*, 418 F.2d 528, 163 USPQ 644 (CCPA 1969).

A timely filed terminal disclaimer in compliance with 37 CFR 1.321(c) may be used to overcome an actual or provisional rejection based on a nonstatutory double

patenting ground provided the conflicting application or patent is shown to be commonly owned with this application. See 37 CFR 1.130(b).

Effective January 1, 1994, a registered attorney or agent of record may sign a terminal disclaimer. A terminal disclaimer signed by the assignee must fully comply with 37 CFR 3.73(b).

Claims 1, 3-8, 11-18, 20, 24-25, 27-30, and 32 are provisionally rejected under the judicially created doctrine of obviousness-type double patenting as being unpatentable over claims 36-47 of copending Application No. 08/975,940. Although the conflicting claims are not identical, they are not patentably distinct from each other because both applications set forth a wall plates, studs, a shear-resisting assembly, and means for connecting the plate(s) to the assembly.

This is a <u>provisional</u> obviousness-type double patenting rejection because the conflicting claims have not in fact been patented.
