Pursuant to the provisions of 37 C.F.R. § 1.182, applicants hereby petition the Commissioner to convert this application from a regular U.S. Application under 35 U.S.C. § 111, to a PCT National Phase application under 35 U.S.C. § 371.

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1, 2000 (number PCT/JPOO/01190) and relied on a Japanese priority of March 5, 1999. A check for a filing fee as a regular U.S. National Application was included, but there was also included an authorization to charge our deposit account for any additional fees. Thus, in fact, all the requirements of 35 U.S.C. § 371 were met on that date. The error was made by inadvertence and without deceptive intent.

The error was only just discovered when a first action on the merits was received and the file was reviewed.

Under the circumstances, it is respectfully requested that the application be treated as a PCT National Phase application under 35 U.S.C. § 371 and the respective files be combined. A check for a petition fee of \$130 is enclosed. Any additional petition fees or filing fees may be charged to Deposit Account No. 05-1323 (Docket No. 1830/50325).
