Continuation of 3. NOTE:

All independent claims (1, 5, and 10) as well as dependent claim 14 have been amended to include new limitations requiring further consideration and/or search.

Continuation of 11. does NOT place the application in condition for allowance because:

Applicant essentially argues on pages 11-14 that there is no motivation to combine the references. The motivation to combine was previously addressed on pages 3 and 4 of the 2/28/06 Office action. In that action it was pointed out that the references are concerned with software development including the control of external machines in a object-oriented control system (See Wright column 6 lines 12-19). As such, Applicant's arguments are not convincing.

Applicant essentially argues on pages 14-15 that the references do not disclose newly amended limitations. These new limitations require further consideration and/or search.

Applicant essentially argues on pages 15-16 that the Almond reference does not share an object name between development tools. These arguments were addressed on page 4 of the previous Office action. In that action it was pointed out that names must be shared as evidenced by the display of a version number in Almond FIG. 7C. As such, Applicant's arguments are not convincing.


Applicant essentially suggests on page 17 that Wright does not teach generating objects for each device of the control system. However, this limitation appears to be addressed in Wright column 6 lines 29-40 as addressed on page 7 of the previous Office action. Thus, this argument is not convincing.

Further arguments presented on pages 18 and 19 are based on prior arguments, addressed above.

Applicant essentially argues on pages 19-20 that there is no motivation to combine the Atkins reference with the Almond reference. Applicant suggests that Almond does not disclose multiple copies of an object and would not need the "used-by" table taught by Atkins. However, Almond teaches multiple instances of objects (see column 3 lines 19-20). Therefore, a single object may be used in the form of multiple instances and might therefore benefit from Atkins' teaching of concurrency (Atkins column 3 lines 11-13). Therefore, Applicant's argument is not convincing.

It is noted that Applicant has not filed new drawings which comply with 37 CFR 1.121(d) as addressed on page 3 of the prior Office action. New drawings with the proper label are required.

Applicant's arguments/amendments appear to otherwise resolve the objections to claims 6, 11, and 16.



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
