DETAILED ACTION

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 102

1. The following is a quotation of the appropriate paragraphs of 35 U.S.C. 102 that form the basis for the rejections under this section made in this Office action:

A person shall be entitled to a patent unless -

(e) the invention was described in (1) an application for patent, published under section 122(b), by another filed in the United States before the invention by the applicant for patent or (2) a patent granted on an application for patent by another filed in the United States before the invention by the applicant for patent, except that an international application filed under the treaty defined in section 351(a) shall have the effects for purposes of this subsection of an application filed in the United States only if the international application designated the United States and was published under Article 21(2) of such treaty in the English language.

Claims 1-8,10-18, 20-23, 24-28 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(e) as being anticipated by Gentalen et al (US6,306,643 Oct 23, 2001)

Gentalen et al teach an array with three discrete regions of probes in which different sets of probes bind to wild type or allelic variants of target samples (see whole document esp. abstract). They teach one region would bind to sequences in determining different polymorphic regions (see col. 3). They teach detecting overall fluorescence from the overall regions to determine sequence. They teach histograms and overall patterns (see Figure 5A and 6). They teach fluorescein labels (see col.11 line 3).

The response filed 8/29/03 has been fully considered and deemed not persuasive. The response states that Gentalen do not determine a histogram of total signal resulting from hybridization of target sequence compared with another histogram of total signal obtained using a wild type sample and the claimed invention does not contains pools as taught by Gentalen.

First the claims do not recite a negative limitation of using pools. The claims recite regions with groups of pools which would read on Gentalen's pools. The Gentalen's histogram then measure of total signal from the pool regions would read on the claims. Moreover, they also teach regions of probes which do not contain probes from other regions (see claim 1). The rejection are maintained.
