DETAILED ACTION

1. The amendment filed on January 27, 2005 has been entered.

Information Disclosure Statement

2. The information disclosure statement filed on January 5, 2005 as been received and the references listed thereon have been considered. It is noted that JP 5-65433 was considered in the previous IDS, paper no. 2).

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 102

3. The following is a quotation of the appropriate paragraphs of 35 U.S.C. 102 that form the basis for the rejections under this section made in this Office action:

A person shall be entitled to a patent unless -

- (b) the invention was patented or described in a printed publication in this or a foreign country or in public use or on sale in this country, more than one year prior to the date of application for patent in the United States.
- 4. Claims 1 and 2 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(b) as being anticipated by Daniels, pn 3,839,935.

Daniels '935 discloses a turret punch press with every structural limitation of the claimed invention including an upper turret (e.g., 12); a lower turret (e.g., 14) having a worksheet outlet (e.g., 40) positioned inside the lower turret; a punch driving mechanism (e.g., 24); and a chute (e.g., 46).

5. Claims 1, 2, 4 and 5 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(b) as being anticipated by Daniels, pn 3,685,380.

Daniels '380 discloses a turret punch press with every structural limitation of the claimed invention including an upper turret (e.g., 20) having a plurality of punch tools (e.g., each of the outermost tools 23 about the periphery of the upper turret); a lower turret (e.g., 22) supporting a plurality of die tools (e.g., each of the outermost tools 25 about the periphery of the lower turret) having a worksheet outlet (e.g., either or both of the openings corresponding to die tools 25) positioned inside the lower turret between the plurality of die tools (e.g., the outermost tools described above) and the center of the lower turret; a punch driving mechanism (e.g., 44); and a chute (e.g., the wide opening under die tools 25).

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 103

- 6. The following is a quotation of 35 U.S.C. 103(a) which forms the basis for all obviousness rejections set forth in this Office action:
 - (a) A patent may not be obtained though the invention is not identically disclosed or described as set forth in section 102 of this title, if the differences between the subject matter sought to be patented and the prior art are such that the subject matter as a whole would have been obvious at the time the invention was made to a person having ordinary skill in the art to which said subject matter pertains. Patentability shall not be negatived by the manner in which the invention was made.
- 7. Claims 5 and 6 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over Daniels, pn 3,685,380 in view of Daniels, pn 3,839,935.

Daniels '380 discloses a turret punch press with almost every structural limitation of the claimed invention but lacks a plate as claimed. However, the Examiner takes

Official notice that such plates are old and well known in the art and provide various well

known benefits. As one example, Daniels '935 provides such a plate and teaches that the plate is used as part of a blank collection and side ejection mechanism, along with a chute, to segregate blanks from the slugs. Therefore, it would have been obvious to one having ordinary skill in the art to provide such a blank collection and side ejection mechanism on the press of Daniels '380 for the well known benefits including those taught by Daniels '380 as described above.

Allowable Subject Matter

8. Claims 3 and 7 are objected to as being dependent upon a rejected base claim, but would be allowable if rewritten in independent form including all of the limitations of the base claim and any intervening claims.
