DETAILED ACTION

Papers Received

Receipt is acknowledged of the applicant's amendment, response, and petition for extension of time, all received on 04 October 2005. Receipt is acknowledged of the applicant's information disclosure statement, received on 06 April 2005.

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 103

The text of those sections of Title 35, U.S. Code not included in this action can be found in a prior Office action.

The rejection of Claims 2 and 3 under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over Lentz et al. is rendered moot with the cancellation of those claims.

The rejection of Claims 1, 4-6, 10, 16-18, and 20-32 under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over Lentz *et al.* is maintained.

Response to Arguments

Applicant's arguments filed 04 October 2005 have been fully considered but they are not persuasive.

The examiner does not interpret the prior art as being solely limited to what has been disclosed in the examples of the Lentz *et al.* reference. The examiner must take the broadest reasonable interpretation of both the claims and the prior art. It is the position of the examiner that one of ordinary skill in the art, giving both the prior art and the claims in their present form

their broadest reasonable interpretation, would find the claimed invention obvious in view of the prior art. See MPEP § 2111 and 2123. The examiner must also consider what has been taught by the prior art apart from what is only disclosed in given examples. Given the overlapping ranges of the process temperatures of the prior art and the instant application, it is the position of the examiner that such same temperatures must lead to the same result of vitrified starch products. The prior art clearly discloses a first and second level of destructurization that remains below the glass transition temperature (See Page 12). Furthermore, preferred embodiments are not a teaching away from a broader disclosure. Thus, it is the position of the examiner that the applicant's response is based on a narrow interpretation of the prior art. One of ordinary skill in the art, giving both the prior art and the claims in their present form their broadest reasonable interpretation, would find the claimed invention obvious in view of the prior art. See MPEP § 2111 and 2123. As such, all pending claims are presently rejected.
