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## DETAILED ACTION

### *Election/Restrictions*

1. This application contains claims directed to the following patentably distinct species of the claimed invention:

Group I drawn to the embodiment illustrated in patent claims and

Group II drawn to the newly presented claims drawn to the embodiment illustrated in patent figure 5.

Applicant is required under 35 U.S.C. 121 to elect a single disclosed species for prosecution on the merits to which the claims shall be restricted if no generic claim is finally held to be allowable. Currently, no claim is generic.

Applicant is advised that a reply to this requirement must include an identification of the species that is elected consonant with this requirement, and a listing of all claims readable thereon, including any claims subsequently added. An argument that a claim is allowable or that all claims are generic is considered nonresponsive unless accompanied by an election.

Upon the allowance of a generic claim, applicant will be entitled to consideration of claims to additional species which are written in dependent form or otherwise include all the limitations of an allowed generic claim as provided by 37 CFR 1.141. If claims are added after the election, applicant must indicate which are readable upon the elected species. MPEP § 809.02(a).

Should applicant traverse on the ground that the species are not patentably distinct, applicant should submit evidence or identify such evidence now of record showing the species to be obvious variants or clearly admit on the record that this is the case. In either instance, if the examiner finds one of the inventions unpatentable over the prior art, the evidence or admission may be used in a rejection under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) of the other invention.

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2. Newly submitted claims 60-81 are directed to an invention that is independent or distinct from the invention originally claimed for the following reasons: the original patent claims are not drawn to an insert having staggered interconnected vent slots.

Since applicant has received an action on the merits for the originally presented invention, this invention has been constructively elected by original presentation for prosecution on the merits. Accordingly, claims 60-81 are withdrawn from consideration as being directed to a non-elected invention. See 37 CFR 1.142(b) and MPEP § 821.03.

***Claim Objections***

3. Claim 48 is objected to because of the following informalities: in line 2, -- a -- should be inserted after "with". Appropriate correction is required.

***Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 102***

4. The text of those sections of Title 35, U.S. Code not included in this action can be found in a prior Office action.

5. Claims 48,49,58,59 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(b) as being anticipated by Costa et al. (US 5,730,306).

Insert 10 is made of plastic, has a first surface opposite a second surface and a groove 11 formed in the first surface and extending beyond two locations of a bottle rim having a smaller diameter than the bottle shown. Since the claims are drawn to the subcombination of the insert, the insert can be used on a bottle smaller than that depicted in the drawings and is not limited to use with the bottle depicted therein.

***Allowable Subject Matter***

6. Claims 1, 3-42, and 57 are allowed over the art of record.

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**Conclusion**

7. In view of the new grounds of rejection to claims 48 and 58, this Office action is made non-final.
