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DETAILED ACTION

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 112

1. The following is a quotation of the first paragraph of 35 U.S.C. 112:

The specification shall contain a written description of the invention, and of the manner and process of making and using it, in such full, clear, concise, and exact terms as to enable any person skilled in the art to which it pertains, or with which it is most nearly connected, to make and use the same and shall set forth the best mode contemplated by the inventor of carrying out his invention.

2. Claims 1-8 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 112, first paragraph, as containing subject matter which was not described in the specification in such a way as to enable one skilled in the art to which it pertains, or with which it is most nearly connected, to make and/or use the invention.
3. Claims 1-8 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 112, first paragraph, as containing subject matter which was not described in the specification in such a way as to reasonably convey to one skilled in the relevant art that the inventor(s), at the time the application was filed, had possession of the claimed invention.

The specification description is such that the invention limitations can not be ascertained. For example, it not known what constitutes a "pocket" and "pebbles" and "poppers". Such terms are not recognized in the art.

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Further, as noted in the specification Page 3 Lines 7-8, the wording seems to imply that while embodiments are envisioned such embodiments have not been put to practice and thus the inventor did not have possession of the invention.

Further, the description fails to adequately describe how to construct a "conductive bedsheet" or a "conductive duvet cover" so that control of images may be performed or how a "clock" can project dots or images of notes.

In general, the description recites general possible functions without adequate physical limitations to carry out the functions.

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 102

4. The following is a quotation of the appropriate paragraphs of 35 U.S.C. 102 that form the basis for the rejections under this section made in this Office action:

A person shall be entitled to a patent unless -

(b) the invention was patented or described in a printed publication in this or a foreign country or in public use or on sale in this country, more than one year prior to the date of application for patent in the United States.

5. Claims 1 and 8 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(b) as being clearly anticipated by DE 20004679.

De 20004679 discloses a projection arrangement wherein a projector (3) connected to a computer (1) is used to project images upon a ceiling and interface at (4).

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Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 103

6. The following is a quotation of 35 U.S.C. 103(a) which forms the basis for all obviousness rejections set forth in this Office action:

(a) A patent may not be obtained though the invention is not identically disclosed or described as set forth in section 102 of this title, if the differences between the subject matter sought to be patented and the prior art are such that the subject matter as a whole would have been obvious at the time the invention was made to a person having ordinary skill in the art to which said subject matter pertains. Patentability shall not be negated by the manner in which the invention was made.

7. Claims 2, 4, 5 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over DE 20004679.

DE 20004679 discloses the invention substantially as claimed but does not teach the particulars of the projector or the computer system.

It is well known in the art to connect PC means to the internet, scanners, and the like. It is further old and known to form LCD projectors with fresnel lens such as in overhead projectors. Official notice is given of such facts.

It would have been obvious to one skilled in the art at the time of the invention to modify the device of DE 20004679 by the use of such known features in order to increase the functionality of said device.


