ELECTION/RESTRICTION

1. Restriction to one of the following inventions is required under 35 U.S.C. 121:

I. Claims 1-11, drawn to a method of organizing a plurality of connections in an optical network into one or more spectral groups. This is classified in class 398, subclass 79.

II. Claims 12-20, drawn to an optical system that is comprised of a router to route a plurality of optical signal channels from one node within a subnetwork to another node within that subnetwork. This is classified in class 398, subclass 57.

The inventions are distinct, each from the other because of the following reasons:

Inventions I and II are unrelated. Inventions are unrelated if it can be shown that they are not disclosed as capable of use together and they have different modes of operation, different functions, or different effects (MPEP § 806.04, MPEP § 808.01). In the instant case the different inventions are unrelated because invention I is related to a method of organizing a plurality of connections in an optical network into one or more spectral groups, wherein the spectral groups have a maximum capacity of connections and subconnections that can be carried in a single spectral group, and wherein one connection is partitioned into a plurality of subconnections, and spectral groups are formed for connections and subconnections that are routed on identical paths. Invention II is related to an optical system comprised of a subnetwork having a group router to route a plurality of optical signal channels of a spectral group when contained within the subnetwork, and terminate optical signal channels when bounding the subnetwork, wherein each optical signal channel is being transmitted from one node within the subnetwork to another node of the subnetwork. Inventions I and II are different because invention II does not require organizing a plurality of connections into one or more spectral groups, wherein spectral groups

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have a maximum capacity of connections and subconnections, and wherein one connection is partitioned into a plurality of subconnections, and forming spectral groups for connections and subconnections that are routed on identical paths.

2. Because these inventions are distinct for the reasons given above and have acquired a separate status in the art as shown by their different classification, restriction for examination purposes as indicated is proper.


3. Because these inventions are distinct for the reasons given above and the search required for Group I is not required for Group II, restriction for examination purposes as indicated is proper.
