## **DETAILED ACTION**

## Election/Restrictions

1. Restriction is required under 35 U.S.C. 121 and 372.

This application contains the following inventions or groups of inventions which are not so linked as to form a single general inventive concept under PCT Rule 13.1.

In accordance with 37 CFR 1.499, applicant is required, in reply to this action, to elect a single invention to which the claims must be restricted.

Group I, claim(s) 1-8, drawn to a method for gait rehabilitation by identifying one deficient gait element and exercise the deficient gait element using a rehab apparatus.

Group II, claim(s) 9-17, drawn to a method for gait rehabilitation by detecting the positions of at least one gait element during movement; recording and displaying said position recordings of the at least one gait element; and exercise the gait element based on the display of recordings.

Group III, claim(s) 18, drawn to an apparatus for rehabilitation with a motorized pedal and a track.

Group IV, claim(s) 19-38, drawn to an apparatus for rehabilitation with a motorized pedal having two motors: the first motor providing movement along x-axis and the second motor providing movement along y-axis.

Group V, claim(s) 39, drawn to an apparatus for gait training with a foot moving element, an armpit support and a motor for moving the armpit support from a sitting to a standing posture.

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Group VI, claim(s) 40, drawn to an apparatus for gait training with a foot moving element, at least one chair and a motor for tilting the sitting surface of the chair.

Group VII, claim(s) 46-55, drawn to a method for gait rehabilitation by attaching a multiple axis rotatable pedal to a patient's foot and automatically controlling the rotating of the pedal.

The groups of inventions listed above do not relate to a single general inventive concept under PCT Rule 13.1 because, under PCT Rule 13.2, they lack the same or corresponding special technical features for the following reasons: The special technical feature of group I, identifying one deficient gait element, is not shared in groups II- VII The special technical feature of group II, detecting the positions of at least one gait element during movement; recording and displaying said position recordings of the at least one gait element, is not shared by groups I and III-VII. The special technical feature of group III, a track, is not shared by groups I-II and IV-VII. The special technical feature of group IV, a motorized pedal having two motors: the first motor providing movement along x-axis and the second motor providing movement along y-axis, is not shared by groups I-III and V-VII. The special technical feature of group V, an armpit support and a motor for moving the armpit support from a sitting to a standing posture, is not shared by groups I-IV and VI-VII. The special technical feature of group VI, at least one chair and a motor for tilting the sitting surface of the chair, is not shared by groups I-V and VII. The special technical feature of group VII, attaching a multiple axis rotatable pedal to a patient's foot and automatically controlling the rotating of the pedal, is not shared by groups I-VI.

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Lack of unity of invention may be directly evident "a priori," that is, before considering the claims in relation to any prior art, or may only become apparent "a posteriori," that is, after taking the prior art into consideration. For example, independent claims to A + X, A + Y, X + Y can be said to lack unity a priori as there is no subject matter common to all claims. In the case of independent claims to A + X and A + Y, unity of invention is present a priori as A is common to both claims. However, if it can be established that A is known, there is lack of unity a posteriori, since A (be it a single feature or a group of features) is not a technical feature that defines a contribution over the prior art.

- 2. Applicant is advised that the reply to this requirement to be complete must include (i) an election of a species or invention to be examined even though the requirement may be traversed (37 CFR 1.143) and (ii) identification of the claims encompassing the elected invention.
- 3. The election of an invention or species may be made with or without traverse. To preserve a right to petition, the election must be made with traverse. If the reply does not distinctly and specifically point out supposed errors in the restriction requirement, the election shall be treated as an election without traverse. Traversal must be presented at the time of election in order to be considered timely. Failure to timely traverse the requirement will result in the loss of right to petition under 37 CFR 1.144. If claims are added after the election, applicant must indicate which of these claims are readable on the elected invention or species.

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4. Should applicant traverse on the ground that the inventions have unity of invention (37 CFR 1.475(a)), applicant must provide reasons in support thereof.

Applicant may submit evidence or identify such evidence now of record showing the inventions to be obvious variants or clearly admit on the record that this is the case.

Where such evidence or admission is provided by applicant, if the examiner finds one of the inventions unpatentable over the prior art, the evidence or admission may be used in a rejection under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) of the other invention.
