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DETAILED ACTION

Double Patenting

The nonstatutory double patenting rejection is based on a judicially created doctrine grounded in public policy (a policy reflected in the statute) so as to prevent the unjustified or improper timewise extension of the "right to exclude" granted by a patent and to prevent possible harassment by multiple assignees. See In re Goodman, 11 F.3d 1046, 29 USPQ2d 2010 (Fed. Cir. 1993); In re Longi, 759 F.2d 887, 225 USPQ 645 (Fed. Cir. 1985); In re Van Ornum, 686 F.2d 937, 214 USPQ 761 (CCPA 1982); In re Vogel, 422 F.2d 438, 164 USPQ 619 (CCPA 1970); and, In re Thorington, 418 F.2d 528, 163 USPQ 644 (CCPA 1969).

A timely filed terminal disclaimer in compliance with 37 CFR 1.321(c) may be used to overcome an actual or provisional rejection based on a nonstatutory double patenting ground provided the conflicting application or patent is shown to be commonly owned with this application. See 37 CFR 1.130(b).

Effective January 1, 1994, a registered attorney or agent of record may sign a terminal disclaimer. A terminal disclaimer signed by the assignee must fully comply with 37 CFR 3.73(b).

Claims 9-18 and 21-24 are provisionally rejected under the judicially created doctrine of obviousness-type double patenting as being unpatentable over claims 1-5, 7, 8 and 19-31 of copending Application No. 09/739,531, now allowed. Although the conflicting claims are not identical, they are not patentably distinct from each other because the claims of the instant application have been fully disclosed in the claims of application No. 09/739,531, except for the optical element being utilized in an optical module such as an optical receiver, an optical transmitter or an optical transceiver.

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However, the prior art teaches utilizing optical elements (i.e., transfer lenses) for coupling laser light in modules into fibers.

It would have been obvious, at the time the invention was made to a person having ordinary skill in the art, to adapt the optical element in an optical module such as an optical receiver, an optical transmitter or an optical transceiver in order to improve signal to noise ratio in the optical module.

This is a <u>provisional</u> obviousness-type double patenting rejection because the conflicting claims have not in fact been patented.

Response to Arguments

Applicant's arguments have been considered but are moot in view of the new ground(s) of rejection.

The examiner notes that the newly presented claims are subject to a new obviousness-type double patenting rejection (see Office Action).
