Continuation of 11. does NOT place the application in condition for allowance because: Applicant argues that the filtration fraction value or FF of Brugger does not depend on the blood flow rate, as shown by equation (1) on page 6 of Applicant's response filed December 28, 2006. However, equation (1) is not taught by Brugger, and it is not clear to the examiner that equation (1) must be true in the system taught by Brugger. Brugger clearly states in col. 21, lines 34-42 and col. 24, lines 23-26 that FF does depend on the blood flow rate. Applicant's claims do not require any particular measure of blood concentration, nor any particular point of measurement other than before and after the blood purifier. Applicant's specification teaches that the blood purifying rate is the water removal rate of the ultrafiltration pump or the filtration rate by the plasma separator, and does not otherwise define the blood purifying rate (specification page 12, lines 8-9, page 33, lines 8-9). In both the blood circuit of Applicant and the blood circuit of Brugger, the various rate parameters appear to depend on the blood flow rate from the blood pump, the amount of fluid removed by the blood purifier, and the amount of replacement fluid added. Applicant argues that Brugger's definition of post-treatment hematocrit requires that the sensor of Brugger must be upstream of the the intersection of the replacement fluid line with the venous blood return path. However, Applicant's claims do not require that the second measuring unit must be located downstream of the intersection of the replacement fluid line and the venous blood return path.
