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DETAILED ACTION

1. This Office Action is the answer to the communication sent on 1/26/05, which paper has been placed of record in the file.

2. Claims 1-10 are pending in this application.

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 112

3. Claim 1 is rejected under 35 U.S.C. 112, second paragraph, as being incomplete for omitting essential structural cooperative relationships of elements, such omission amounting to a gap between the necessary structural connections. See MPEP § 2172.01.

A. As to claim 1 the omitted structural cooperative relationships are: the implementation from prior art of disclosed switch in Fig. 1 (a specific type of N-channel power FET and its drive circuits), that switcher needs to be specified to fit with its desired function, e.g., IRFL210, IRF540, IRF740, or IRF3415 .etc., claiming "N-channel power FET and its drive circuits" <u>are not sufficient for controlling a particular</u> <u>path/connection for an airbag restraint system</u>. This claims is rejected as not enabling one of ordinary skill in the art to make and use the invention. These rejections are based on the fact the applicant did not specify a particular series or model of N-channel power FET and its drive circuits in this invention; as best interpretation, this claimed circuit is unclear and vague; one with ordinary skill in the art can not duplicate that circuit without trial and error.

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B. Dependent claims 2-10 are rejected because they inherit that same defective from claim 1.

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Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 103

The following is a quotation of 35 U.S.C. 103(a) which forms the basis for all

obviousness rejections set forth in this Office action:

(a) A patent may not be obtained though the invention is not identically disclosed or described as set forth in section 102 of this title, if the differences between the subject matter sought to be patented and the prior art are such that the subject matter as a whole would have been obvious at the time the invention was made to a person having ordinary skill in the art to which said subject matter pertains. Patentability shall not be negatived by the manner in which the invention was made.

4. Claim 1 is rejected under 35 U.S.C.103(a) as being <u>obvious</u> over Applicant Admitted Prior Art (AAPA) in view of well-known HEXFET Power MOSFET from International Rectifier.

AAPA discloses that prior art discloses a firing circuit for vehicle restraint system. comprises everything except a power switching element having a controlled path connected in series with said control path of said high side switch and of said low side switch (comparing between Fig.3 (prior art) and Fig.1 (pending invention))

However, a HEXFET Power MOSFET from International Rectifier (a very well

known provider) is a fundamental component to electronic designers to perform a switching task under controls.

It would have been obvious to one having ordinary skill in the art at the time the invention was made to modify AAPA's design to include IRFL210 of International Rectifier so that a designer can switch ON/OFF a path/connection in an electronic circuit; this gives more control-abilities to a designer for circuits that need reliability.

Conclusions

5. Claims 1-10 are not patentable.
