Continuation of 3. NOTE: The amendment to claim 29 would raise the need for a new objection because the resulting claim has a grammatical error- the claim would state "isolating 10 or more mRNA or cDNA species which according to the method of claim 18." If applicant further amended this claim to delete "which" then the amendment could be entered and would overcome the 112 2nd rejection of record.

Continuation of 5. Applicant's reply has overcome the following rejection(s): The written description rejection of claims 27-29 is withdrawn. Applicant's arguments set forth in the response are persuasive, particularly when applicant points out that there should be no need to describe the intermediate products which are obtained during performance of the method. .

Continuation of 11. does NOT place the application in condition for allowance because: Applicant summarizes the rejection (p. 11-12) then reiterates previously addressed arguments (p. 12-13). Applicant presents further arguments beginning on page 13. Applicant states that the method of Ralph is concerned with a comparison of gene expression levels from patients with metastatic cancer. This has been previously addressed- namely Ralph expressly teaches that their invention is intended to include organ defined cancers. The reference must be considered for all that it teaches, including non-preferred embodiments. Applicants present further arguments regarding a declaration which was not filed (page 15 and following). These arguments are not considered since the declaration was not filed. Even if it were, however, it is noted that it would not have been timely filed as this rejection was first presented in the non-final office action. The arguments are not persuasive.
