DETAILED ACTION

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 102

The following is a quotation of the appropriate paragraphs of 35 U.S.C. 102 that form the basis for the rejections under this section made in this Office action:

A person shall be entitled to a patent unless –

(b) the invention was patented or described in a printed publication in this or a foreign country or in public use or on sale in this country, more than one year prior to the date of application for patent in the United States.

Claims 1-2, 5-14 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(b) as being anticipated by Saccardo et al. (U.S. Patent No.: 6,471,649).

Regarding claims 1-2, 5-11, Saccardo teaches an inspection apparatus for diagnosis, comprising: a micro processing unit (CPU 101) for actuating units and modules of the inspection apparatus via an instruction of a user or a program; an input unit (touch sensitive pointing device 66) for allowing the user to input the instruction or data; a conversion module comprising at least a receive unit (audio compressor/decompressor 116) for receiving sound and a transceiver unit (transducer 22) for emitting and receiving ultrasonic wave energy signals; a signal processing module (analog-to-digital converter component 114) for converting analog signals received by the conversion module into digital signals; a memory unit (storage device 121) for allowing high-speed data access for the units and modules of the inspection apparatus; a storage unit (compact flash card 125) for storing data processed by the micro processing unit according to the instruction inputted via the input unit; and a communicate module

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(infrared link 74) controlled by the micro processing unit, for allowing data communication between the inspection apparatus and at least one data processing device connected to the inspection apparatus.

Regarding claims 12-14, Saccardo further teaches wherein the data processing device comprises a control module (control panel 33) connected with the communicate module of the inspection apparatus via a wired or wireless transmitting interface to control operation of the inspection apparatus, and being incorporated by software (see abstract).

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 103

The following is a quotation of 35 U.S.C. 103(a) which forms the basis for all obviousness rejections set forth in this Office action:

(a) A patent may not be obtained though the invention is not identically disclosed or described as set forth in section 102 of this title, if the differences between the subject matter sought to be patented and the prior art are such that the subject matter as a whole would have been obvious at the time the invention was made to a person having ordinary skill in the art to which said subject matter pertains. Patentability shall not be negated by the manner in which the invention was made.

Claims 3-4 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over Saccardo et al. (U.S. Patent No.: 6,471,649) in view of Besson et al. (U.S. Patent No.: 5,957,854).

Saccardo et al. teaches all the limitations of claim 1 as described above but does not teach a conversion module to further comprise an infrared body temperature inspection unit nor a pulse inspection unit. Besson et al. teaches a contactless temperature measurement using infrared (fig. 5) and also a pulse inspection unit (fig. 4b). It would have been obvious to one of ordinary skill in the art at the time of the invention to have modified the apparatus as taught by Saccardo et al. and to have further included

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an infrared body temperature inspection unit and pulse inspection unit as taught by Besson et al. in order to provide for eliminating the need for multiple equipment for patient diagnosis.
