DETAILED ACTION

Receipt is acknowledged of the Applicant's Remarks and Amended Claims filed on 10/13/2005.

As a result of Applicant's amended claims, the 35 USC §102 rejections over EP 0335133 A2 ('133) are hereby **withdrawn**. Additionally, as a result of Applicant's amended claims, the 35 USC §103 rejections over Zelphati et al (Intracellular Delivery of Proteins with a New Lipid-mediated Delivery System) in view of Maa et al (Biopharmaceutical powders: particle formation and formulation considerations) as well as US 2003/0054007 ('007) in view of Maa et al (Biopharmaceutical powders: particle formation and formulation considerations) are hereby **withdrawn**.

NEW REJECTIONS:

The following is a list of new rejections:

Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 112

Claims 1-8, 21-24 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 112, first paragraph, as failing to comply with the written description requirement. The claim(s) contains subject matter which was not described in the specification in such a way as to reasonably convey to one skilled in the relevant art that the inventor(s), at the time the application was filed,

had possession of the claimed invention. The instant claims 1-8, 21-24 have been amended to encompass the limitation of "polypeptide-detergent." This term is not set forth in the instant specification and, as such, is considered to be new matter. Moreover, after electronically searching the instant specification, the only mention of "detergent" is in the definitions portion of the text (See pages 13-14 of the instant specification). Since, the instant application is concerned with polypeptide-surfactant complexes and the amended claims read on a more narrow "polypeptide-detergent" limitation, the newly amended claims fail to comply with the written description requirement.

Applicant's amendment necessitated the new ground(s) of rejection presented in this Office action. Accordingly, **THIS ACTION IS MADE FINAL**. See MPEP § 706.07(a). Applicant is reminded of the extension of time policy as set forth in 37 CFR 1.136(a).


