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1. The following is a quotation of 35 U.S.C. 103(a) which forms the basis for all obviousness rejections set forth in this Office action:

(a) A patent may not be obtained though the invention is not identically disclosed or described as set forth in section 102 of this title, if the differences between the subject matter sought to be patented and the prior art are such that the subject matter as a whole would have been obvious at the time the invention was made to a person having ordinary skill in the art to which said subject matter pertains. Patentability shall not be negatived by the manner in which the invention was made.

2. Claims 22,28,38 and 43 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over Jacobson (4,378,634) in view of Francis (4,868,983).

Jacobson shows a method of making a razor having most of the recited steps including;

Providing a housing (bottom elements of figure 6),

Providing a plurality of blades (36,36'),

Providing 1st and 2nd plastic blocks (4,6), each having non-contiguous slots (16) for receiving the blades such that the blades can move in the slots during shaving (via springs 18).

No part of the subassembly extends past an outer surface of the plastic blocks. Inserting the integrated subassembly into the housing (figure 6).

Jacobson's housing (bottom elements of figure 6) has just two walls instead of 4, and the guard is on the subassembly instead of on the housing. However, Francis shows that it is old and well known for the housing to have 4 walls and include the guard, as see in figure 7. It would have been obvious to one of ordinary skill in the art to have modified Jacobson by making his housing have 4 walls and include the guard, since Francis shows this to be an art recognized equivalent way of achieving the same purpose.

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3. Claims 22,28,38,39,43 and 44 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 103(a) as being unpatentable over Jacobson (4,378,634), as modified above, and further in view of

Santhagens Van Eibergen et al. (6,671,961).

In regards to at least claims 39 and 44, Jacobson, as modified, lacks a lubricating strip, but this is ubiquitous in the art as seen in Santhagens Van Eibergen (23, lines 18-21, column 6). It would have been obvious to one of ordinary skill in the art to have provided a lubricating strip for Jacobson's housing, as taught by Santhagans Van Eibergen, in order to provide a more pleasant shaving experience.
