REMARKS

In the Office Action, the Examiner requires election between the following three species:

- I. A composition comprising a liquid fatty phase and polymer particles dispersed in the fatty phase (Claims 1-27, 31-44, and 51-64);
- II. A composition comprising a liquid fatty phase and polymer particles dispersed in the fatty phase, where the particles are surface stabilized (Claims 28-30); and
- III. A composition comprising a liquid fatty phase and polymer particles dispersed in the fatty phase, where the composition comprises a gelling agent (Claims 45-50).

See Office Action at 2.

Solely to be fully responsive to the election requirement, Applicants elect, with traverse, **Species I**, "a composition comprising a liquid fatty phase and polymer particles dispersed in the fatty phase." Applicants submit that Claims 1-27, 31-44, and 51-64 read on Species I.

In addition, the Examiner requires election of a "single sub-species from the list of [polymers] that constitutes the polymer particles," as listed in Claim 23 and as set forth in the Office Action at pages 3-4:

Polyureas-polyurethanes
Polyester-polyurethanes

traverse, poly(methyl acrylate/acrylic acid) (disclosed, for example, at paragraphs

[059]-[064] and Example 1 of the as-filed specification) as the polymer which constitutes

the polymer particles. Applicants submit that Claims 1-27, 31-44, and 51-64 read on the

elected species.

Applicants expect the Examiner, if the elected species are found allowable, to

continue to examine the full scope of the subject matter to the extent necessary to

determine the patentability thereof, as is the duty according to 35 U.S.C. § 121 and

M.P.E.P. § 803.2.
