RESPONSE TO RESTRICTION REQUIREMENT

Dear Sir:

This paper is responsive to the Office Action for the above-identified patent application mailed from the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office on June 9, 2006. Applicants believe that no extension of time (because July 9, 2006, was a Sunday) or fees are required. However, please charge any fees necessary for entry of this paper to Deposit Account No. 07-1700.

According to the Office Action, the Office has required Applicants, pursuant to 35 U.S.C. §121, to elect an alleged single invention for prosecution on the merits. The alleged inventions include:

Group I, claims 1-14, drawn to a cartridge, classified in class 435, subclass 287.4;

Group II, claims 15 and 18, drawn to a method of detecting microbes, classified in class 435, subclass 31;

Group III, claim 44, drawn to a method of drying a hemocyte lysate onto a solid support, unclassifiable;

Response to Restriction Requirement U.S. Serial No. 10/803,177

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Group IV, claim 59, drawn to a method of preparing an amebocyte lysate, unclassifiable;

and

Group V, claim 77, drawn to a solid support, classified in class 435, subclass 395.

Applicants provisionally elect the claims of *Group I*, namely the subject matter defined by claims 1-14, for further examination. Notwithstanding, Applicants respectfully request that the restriction between *Groups I* and *Group II* be reconsidered and that the claims in both groups be rejoined for purposes of further examination. Applicants submit that the method claims in *Group II* require the use of the cartridge defined by the claims of *Group I* and, therefore, a search for art relating to the *Group I* claims would also reveal publications relating to the *Group II* claims. Furthermore, Applicants would like the Office to clarify whether independent claim 21 belongs to *Group II*.

Applicants reserve the right to pursue any non-elected claims in one or more related applications.

Applicants believe that pending claims 1-14 read on the subject matter of Group I.
