DEPARTMENT OF MINES.

EXAMINATION FOR ASSAYERS FOR LICENCE TO PRACTISE IN BRITISH COLUMBIA.

IN ACCORDANCE with section 12 of the "Bureau of Mines Act," examinations for efficiency in the practice of assaying will be held at Victoria, B.C., on the 15th day of December, 1913, and on such following days as may be found necessary.

Examinations will cover the following subjects, and candidates must be prepared to be examined in all of these subjects:—

(a.) A knowledge of the principles of inorganic chemistry.

(b.) SAMPLING:

Sampling of ores or furnace products and the reduction and preparation of samples for assay, including also the melting of gold-dust and sampling of bar for assay.

(c.) QUALITATIVE DETERMINATION:

The qualitative determination of the common elements in ores and furnace products.

(d.) QUALITATIVE DETERMINATION—ASSAYING:

- Bullion—Gold bullion, for gold and silver;
- Copper bullion, for copper, gold, and silver;
- Lead-copper bullion, for lead, copper, gold, and silver.

Coal:

Determination of moisture, volatile combustible matter, fixed carbon, ash, and sulphur.

Ores and furnace products:

Fire assays—

Gold, silver, and lead.

Wet, and combined wet and fire assays—

Gold and silver, by combined method.

Copper, by electrolytic, colorimetric, and volumetric (cyanide or other approved) methods.

Nickel, by electrolytic method.

Iron, lead, lime, zinc, sulphur, and silica, by any approved wet methods.

The mineralogical determination of a number of simple mineral substances.

ENTRANCE FOR EXAMINATION.

Entrance for any examination must be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, at least ten days before the date set for beginning of examination, and must be accompanied by the prescribed fee (\$15).

CERTIFICATE.

A certificate of efficiency in assaying will, upon payment of the prescribed fee (\$15), be issued to each successful candidate, which certificate shall be considered as a licence to practise assaying in British Columbia; and notice is hereby given that only those holding such certificate of proficiency or licence will be allowed to act as assayers in this Province, under penalty, as provided by the Act.

EXEMPTION FROM EXAMINATION.

In accordance with subsection (2) of section 12 of the Act, graduates of certain Schools of Mines and Colleges may be exempt from examinations, and may, upon satisfying the examiners, as provided in the Act, receive such certificate of competency or licence, upon payment of the fee therefor (\$15).

The examination will consist chiefly of the practical assaying of samples, and while the Department of Mines will provide all the apparatus and chemicals usually necessary, it will not undertake to provide any special or unusual appliances or chemicals which might be called for, and if a candidate should require such he will have to provide them at his own expense.

Candidates must provide themselves with such platinum-ware and sets of weights as they may require, as these will not be furnished at the examination.

The Department of Mines will make no charge for the use of chemicals or apparatus, but a candidate will be charged for all breakages or unnecessary loss caused by him.

The retiring Mayor and Aldermen shall continue in office after the annual election until the first day of January next following, and on said date the newly elected Mayor and Aldermen shall take office. The Council shall meet on the first Monday in January (not being New Year's Day), or if the same be New Year's Day, then on the first Tuesday in each year, and thereafter as the Mayor may appoint.

7. In the event of the election of an Alderman to fill a vacancy in office, the term of his office shall be the unexpired term of the Alderman whose office has become vacant.

8. The election for Mayor and Aldermen for the said municipality shall hereafter be held in the month of December (commencing in December, 1914, and the nomination for Mayor and Aldermen shall be held on the second Monday in December in each year (commencing December, 1914) from twelve o'clock to two o'clock p.m., and the polling (if any) shall be held the following Monday from nine o'clock a.m. to seven o'clock p.m.

9. The "Municipal Elections Act," in so far as it affects the Municipality of the City of Victoria, but not otherwise, is hereby amended in manner following, viz. :—

As to section 8 and all amendments thereto, by striking out the word "October," and substituting instead thereof the word "September":

As to section 15 thereof, by striking out the words "thirtieth day of November" wherever they occur therein, and substituting instead thereof the words "thirty-first day of October"; and also wherever the word "December" occurs therein by striking out the same, and substituting instead thereof the word "November":

As to section 21 thereof, by striking out the word "January" therein, and substituting instead thereof the word "December":

As to section 23 thereof, by striking out the word "December" therein, and substituting instead thereof the word "November."

10. The "Public Schools Act Amendment Act, 1913," in so far as it affects the Municipality of the City of Victoria, but not otherwise, is hereby amended in manner following, namely: By inserting at the end of section 50, subsection (1), enacted as section 8 thereof, the words following: "Provided, however, that the said estimates shall be prepared and laid before the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of Victoria by the Board of School Trustees of Victoria on or before the first day of December in the year next preceding the year for which the sums set out in said estimate are required. The nomination and election of the Board of School Trustees of Victoria shall be held at the same time as the municipal nomination and election of Mayor for the said City of Victoria as hereinbefore in this Act provided."

No by-laws for raising upon the credit of the said municipality any money not required for its ordinary expenditure and not payable within the same municipal year, shall be submitted for the assent of the electors of the said municipality except at the date of the annual elections: Provided, however, that it shall be lawful to submit a by-law at any other time if the Council shall pass a resolution that in view of an emergency it is necessary to submit said by-law.

THE Minister of the Interior submits, under date 13th November, 1913, that an inspection by an officer of the Department of the Interior has been made of the timber on the coal reserve, controlled by the Dominion Government, situated near

Morrissey, in the Province of British Columbia, containing an area of 5,000 acres, and a report received to the effect that as the probability is that this timber may, sooner or later, be destroyed by fire, owing to there being several railways in the vicinity and a number of camps which keep a continual stream of foreign labour on the move, the said officer recommends that it be disposed of.

As this reserve is not included in those portions of the Province of British Columbia covered by the regulations governing the disposition of timber on Dominion Lands, established by Order in Council of the 1st July, 1898, and subsequent amending orders, the Minister recommends that he be authorized to dispose of the timber thereon, under licence, at public auction, under the provisions of the regulations above referred to, with the additional provision that the Government of Canada reserves the right to enter upon the coal reserve at any time and conduct mining operations thereon and to remove any timber necessary in such operation and in constructing roads in that connection, on the condition that the Government will pay the licensee of the berth the value of any timber necessarily cut, of a diameter of ten inches and upwards at the stump.

A road is hereby gazetted commencing at a point near the north-east corner of the Huntingdon School Lot; thence in a north-westerly direction to approximately the north boundary of the 7.6-acre portion of S.E. ¼ Sec., Tp. 16; thence westerly following the north boundary of the said 7.6-acre portion to the west boundary of said portion; thence southerly following the west boundary of the said 7.6-acre portion, to Fourth Street Extension West, as shown in plan attached.

To be known as Gordon Avenue.

LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

PRIVATE BILLS.

EXCERPT FROM RULES AND ORDERS RELATING TO PRIVATE BILLS.

RULE 76.

ALL APPLICATIONS for Private Bills, properly the subject of legislation by the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia, within the purview of the "British North America Act, 1867,"—whether for the erection of a Bridge, the making of a Railway, Tramway, Turnpike Road, or Telegraph or Telephone Line; the construction or improvement of a Harbour, Canal, Lock, Dam, Slide, or other like work; the granting of a right of Ferry; the incorporation of any particular trade or calling, or of any Joint-stock Company; or otherwise for granting to any individual or individuals any exclusive or peculiar rights or privileges whatever, or for doing any matter or thing which in its operation would affect the rights or property of other parties, or relate to any particular class of the community, or for making any amendment of a like nature to any former Act,—shall require a Notice, clearly and distinctly specifying the nature and object of the application and, where the application refers to any proposed work, indicating generally the location of the work, and signed by or on behalf of the applicant; such notice to be published as follows:—

In the BRITISH COLUMBIA GAZETTE, and in one newspaper published in each Electoral District affected, or if there be no newspaper published therein, then in a newspaper in the next nearest Electoral Districts in which a newspaper is published.

Such notice shall be continued in each case for a period of at least six weeks, during the interval Session and the consideration of the Petition, and copies of such notice shall be sent by the parties inserting such notice to the Clerk of the House, to be filed amongst the records of the Committee on Standing Orders.

72. No Petition for any Private Bill shall be received by the House after the first ten days of each Session, nor may any Private Bill be presented to the House after the first three weeks of each Session, nor may any Report of any Standing or Select Committee upon a Private Bill be received after the first four weeks of each Session, and no Motion for the suspension or modification of this Rule shall be entertained by the House until the same has been reported on by the Committee on Standing Orders, or after reference made thereof at a previous sitting of the House to the Standing Committee charged with consideration of Private

Bills, who shall report thereon to the House. And if this Rule shall be suspended or modified as aforesaid the promoters of any Private Bill which is presented after the time hereinbefore limited, or for which the Petition has been received after the time hereinbefore limited, shall in either case pay double the fees required as herein mentioned, unless the House shall order to the contrary. Any person seeking to obtain any Private Bill shall deposit with the Clerk of the House, eight clear days before the opening of the Session, a printed copy of such Bill, a copy of the Petition to be presented to the House, *together with copies of the notices published.* Such publication to be proved by affidavit or declaration to the satisfaction of the Clerk of the House. At the time of depositing the Bill, the applicant shall also pay to the Clerk of the House the sum of three hundred dollars. If a copy of the Bill, Petition, and notices shall not have been so deposited in the hands of the Clerk of the House at least eight clear days before the opening of the Session, and if the Petition has not been presented within the first ten days of the Session, the amount to be paid to the Clerk shall be six hundred dollars. If the Bill shall not pass second reading one-half of the fees paid shall be returned.

77. Before any Petition, praying for leave to bring in a Private Bill for the erection of a Toll Bridge, is received by the House, the person or persons intending to petition for such Bill shall, upon giving the notice prescribed by Rule 76, also at the same time and in the same manner give notice of the rates which they intend to ask, the extent of the privilege, the height of the arches, the interval between the abutments or piers for the passage of rafts and vessels, and mentioning also whether they intend to erect a drawbridge or not, and the dimensions of the same.

78. All Private Bills for Acts of Incorporation shall be so framed as to incorporate by reference the clauses of the General Acts relating to the details to be provided for by such Bills. Special grounds shall be established for any proposed departure from this principle, or for the introduction of other provisions as to such details, and a note shall be appended to the Bill indicating the provisions thereof in which the General Act is proposed to be departed from. Bills which are recast by the promoters and reprinted at their expense before any Committee passes upon the clauses.

82. All Private Bills shall be prepared by the parties applying for the same, and printed in Small Pica type, twenty-six ems by fifty ems, on good paper, in imperial octavo form, each page when folded measuring 10¾ inches by 7½ inches. There shall be a marginal number every fifth line of each page; the numbering of the lines is not to run on through the Bill, but the lines of each page are to be numbered separately. Three hundred copies of each Bill shall be deposited with the Clerk of the House immediately before the first reading. If amendments are made to any Bill during its progress before the Committee on Private Bills, or through the House, such Bill shall be reprinted by the promoters thereof.

By Rule 83, a model form of Railway Bill is adopted. A copy of same can be obtained upon application to the Clerk.

All Bills to incorporate or amend Bills incorporating railway companies are to be drawn in accordance with the Model Bill.

The provisions contained in any Bill which are not in accord with the Model Bill shall be inserted between brackets.

Any exceptional provisions that it may be proposed to insert in any such Bill shall be clearly specified in the notice of application for the same.

In the case of Bills to Incorporate Companies, in addition to the fee of \$300 mentioned in Rule 72, fees calculated on the capital of the company are payable at the same time. Further particulars can be had on application to the undersigned.

Every Petition for a Bill to incorporate a company shall state the name of the proposed company.

Petition signed by agents or attorneys must be accompanied by the authority of such agent, etc.
