A RESOLUTION TO ENABLE FACULTIES TO BE REPRESENTED IN THE UNIVERSITY BY MEMBERS WHO SERVE PRIMARILY IN A TEACHING CAPACITY (66/21)

- Whereas (a) the Faculty of the School of Government and Business Administration on March 29, 1967, passed unanimously a resolution declaring its deisre to have any member of its faculty whose duties are not primarily administrative eligible, if elected to serve as its representative in the University Senate, and
- Whereas (b) an earlier resolution of the Senate that would negate this desire of the Faculty of the School of Government and Business Administration is scheduled to be presented to the next meeting of the Faculty Assembly, and
- Whereas (c) the Faculty of the School of Government and Business Administration desires that its duly elected representative whose status in the Senate would be adversely affected by the provisions of Senate Resolution 66/8, if such were implemented, should continue to be eligible in his present assignment to serve in the Senate: and
- Whereas (d) the representative so involved serves as a member of the Faculty primarily in a teaching capacity:

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the University Senate of The George Washington University:

1. Senate Resolution 66/8 shall be amended by changing the period after the word"election" in line 9 of paragraph 3 to a comma and adding the following:

"provided that any member of the faculty serving primarily in a teaching capacity and meeting the aforestated service, rank and tenure requirements shall be eligible for election."

Note: If so amended, the Faculty Organization Plan provision (Title III, Section 2 (a) (4)) relating to eligibility for Senate membership would read:

"All members elected to the Senate shall be members of the University Faculty in full-time service, hold the rank of Associate Professor or above, and have tenure as of the academic year next succeeding the date of their election. Vice Presidents, assistant vice presidents, deans, vice deans, associate deans, and assistant deans and other faculty members whose duties are primarily administrative in nature, shall be ineligible for election, provided that any member of the faculty serving primarily in a teaching capacity and meeting the aforestated service, rank and tenure requirements shall be eligible for election. Questions of eligibility for election to the Senate shall be determined by the Senate.

RESOLUTION ON LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT (66/22)

- Whereas, the library holds a central place in the life of the University, and
- Whereas, this University's growth is necessarily dependent on the improvement and continuing increase of library holdings, and
- Whereas, a severely limited and limiting budget has led in the past to virtual stagnation of the general collections, and
- Whereas, the current budget is inadequate to allow for necessary growth,
- Be it then Resolved that the University Senate endorse the establishment of a faculty library acquisitions committee whose purpose shall be to survey and make known to the Librarian and to the administration areas where great and immediate additions to the collection are most needed, and
- Be it further Resolved that the Senate urge and request that the Administration adopt a policy of fiscal support to the Library such that within-a-minimum-of-three-to-five-years in the shortest possible time the Library budget will reach and thereafter remain at five per cent of the University educational budget.

A RESOLUTION TO ALTER THE UNIVERSITY CALENDAR 66/25

Be It Resolved by the University Senate of The George Washington University:

- 1. The University Senate recommends the adoption of a University calendar constructed upon the following principles:
 - (a) The Fall semester shall lie between Labor Day and Christmas Day.
 - (b) Thanksgiving shall normally be observed as a holiday weekend.
 - (c) The Spring semester shall commence early in January and end early in May.
 - (d) A one-week Spring recess shall be located in the first week of March, and Easter shall normally be observed as a holiday weekend.
 - (e) Commencement shall take place near the middle of May.
 - (f) Each semester shall contain approximately 75 class days, including examinations, and each day of the week should receive approximately the same number of class days.
- 2. The Senate regards as an administrative function the assignment of dates to the University calendar, within the principles set forth, including the observance of national holidays and the placement of University holidays.
