# **EDGEWORTH LADIES' SEMINARY,**

Formerly at Braddock's field, but now removed to

## **SEWICKLY, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PA.**

It is now nearly fourteen years since this Seminary was first established, at Braddock's field. It stood for some time, the only institution of the kind, it is believed, in this section of the United States; and may claim the praise accordingly, of having led the way in the great sphere of useful action, to other institutions which have since come into being, and are now sharing with it the solemn and deeply responsible task of educating the female mind of the West.—From the beginning it has been regarded with favor, and still continues happily to command, so far as it can be said to be properly known, the respect and confidence of the community generally.

This Institution has been removed from Braddock's field to its present location, at Sewickly, three years—and we have now the pleasure of announcing that we are fairly settled in our new residence. Encouraged by the kindness of friends, and the number of pupils for the past year consisting of seventy-six, we go forward in our course, trusting we shall be enabled to conduct the institution on the same principles which have characterized it for the past fourteen years.

The location of this institution is much admired. It is situated fourteen miles below Pittsburgh, near the public road leading from that city to Beaver, and a short distance off from the beautiful stream of the Ohio. The buildings are commodious, and convenient in their whole construction; being erected expressly for the purpose, much has been done to render them an agreeable temporary home to their inmates. Omitting other advantages that might be mentioned, we cannot forbear to say a word on the subject of **HEALTH**. We have been favored with this blessing in a most extraordinary manner. There are probably but few families, numbering only five or six members, which have not had in the same time, more cases of sickness than have occurred here in a household counting about one hundred persons.

The studies particularized show, to a certain extent, the kind of education which is aimed at in the institution. The discipline adopted, and acted upon from the beginning, is mild and persuasive, rather than harsh—being guided by affection alone. This system has been found so effective, and has been so generally approved by those best acquainted with

its operation, that we feel ourselves under no temptation to change it for any other.

Subjoined are the terms on which the young ladies are received, together with a statement of studies.

### Primary Studies and Engagements.

Reading, Writing, Orthography, Sacred History, Geography, History of the United States, Good's Book of Nature, Swift's Philosophy, Mental Arithmetic, Questions on Common Things, Elements of Botany, Natural History of Animals, Plain Sewing.

### Studies of the Junior Class.

Written Arithmetic, Geography, Grammar, History of the U. S., Ecclesiastical History, Botany, Phi. of Natural History, Watts on the Mind, Rhetoric, Natural Philosophy.

### Studies of the Senior Class.

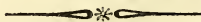

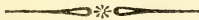



## ALLEGHENY.

We now, for the first time, finish a Directory of this beautiful town—we hoped to be able to say city—a bill having been passed at the last session of the Legislature, to incorporate it as “*the city of Allegheny*,” but it wants the signature of the Governor to become a law.

It is delightfully situated, on the north side of the Allegheny river—just above its confluence with the noble Ohio, and is surrounded with several delightful hills and enclosures, having a vast amount of the most beautiful ground for a large city. It now, with Manchester just below it, contains about 13,000 inhabitants; but we believe will in 20 years be filled with 100,000 happy, industrious, well educated people.—The Western Pennsylvania Canal terminates in it, and the Weigh Master’s and Collecting office are just at the turning point—from where the Canal passes over the Allegheny into Pittsburgh, by an excellent Aqueduct, built by Sylvanus Lothrop, Esq. There is now a good old bridge crossing from Federal street to St. Clair street, Pittsburgh. Another one, finished last summer, passing from the upper part of Allegheny to the 5th Ward; and now there is a fine new bridge erecting, and will be ready to cross early this fall, from Morgan street to Hand, which, when finished, will make three Bridges and an Aqueduct crossing into Pittsburgh, within about half a mile. Allegheny, it will be seen, is surrounded with great advantages—well improved—and her march is onward—onward. Her advance in Moral, Literary and Religious improvements, is very rapid. Some of our best Seminaries, Schools, Churches, and means of Moral and Literary improvement are to be found within her spacious limits—with an intelligent and industrious community. Besides a great many minor Mechanics and Manufactories, there are three very large Steam Cotton Manufactories; one very extensive Iron works; one large steam Paper mill, and a number of steam saw and other mills.

Several of the most beautiful gardens, and delightful country seats are in and about her suburbs—and a large number of our most respectable merchants, manufacturers, mechanics, and clerical and professional gentlemen have their private dwellings in it.

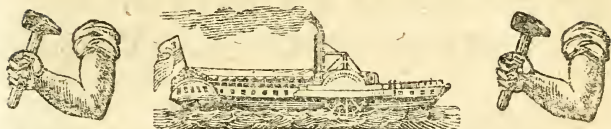
The United States have lately bought a piece of ground, and are about erecting a National Hospital, for the western waters, a short distance below Manchester, which must



add greatly to its facilities, &c. It will be seen that Allegheny is literally "a city of Churches, Sabbath Schools and Seminaries." What a contrast to our early days spent in it, when but 5 or 6 cabins & houses of all kinds, were to be found upon its spacious bosom. For her streets, Lanes and Alleys we refer the reader to our "Pittsburgh Western Business Directory," pages 24, 25 and 26.

Allegheny has been built up so rapidly, and her bounds are so very great, and there being no numbers or names on her streets or houses, it is extremely difficult to describe the location of the inhabitants—especially those living in back streets and suburbs. We hope, ere long, many of these difficulties will be abated.

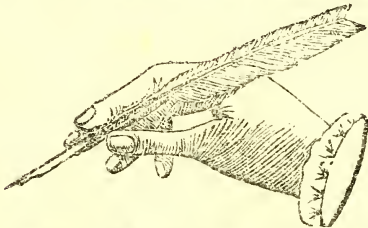

## THE BOARD OF TRADE.

This association was organized in January 1836, under the control and supervision of a President, two Vice Presidents, Treasurer, Secretary, and twenty one Directors, to be elected annually by the members.

Having for its object the amicable adjustment of all controversy of a business character, arising among Merchants, Shippers, and others; a committee of three members from the Board is monthly appointed, to whom reference or application may be made by all those disposed to avoid litigation, and avail themselves of the arbitrament of this Committee—the officers being selected for their general commercial knowledge, no appeal has yet been made from their decision.

Many important and valuable suggestions connected with the prosperity of the city, and calculated to extend its trade and commerce, have already, during its brief existence, originated; and, emanating from the combined intelligence of mercantile community, have been productive of that influence which such unity of action obtains.

Connected with the institution is a *Reading Room*, in which all of the most valuable mercantile and political papers, shipping lists, and public documents are received and on file. It is supported by the yearly subscription of Five Dollars, of the members of the association.

The association holds its meetings on the first Thursdays of January, April, July and October.

The Board of Directors meets on the last Thursday of every month.

The Rooms of the Association and the Reading Rooms, appropriated also for the purposes of a Public Exchange, for the convenience of the members, are in the second story of W. W. Irwin's new building, opposite the Merchants' and Manufacturers' Bank, on Fourth street, between Wood and Market streets.

Strangers can be admitted to the Reading Rooms, and their names recorded on its roll by being introduced by any of its members.

THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY OF THE ASSOCIATE REFORMED CHURCH.

The Theological Seminary of the Western Synod of the Associate Reformed Church, established in the year 1825, and at present under the care of Rev. John T Pressly, D D, is located in Allegheny. The Library belonging to the Institution is a valuable one; and after a legacy of two thousand dollars left by Mr. Andrew Walker, for its enlargement shall have been appropriated to that object it will be amply sufficient for the purpose for which it is designed. No building has yet been erected for the accommodation of the Seminary. To the generosity of the Associate Reformed congregation in this place, which is under the pastoral care of the Professor, the Seminary is indebted for the use of a spacious and comfortable room in the basement of their church, which answers the two-fold purpose of a Lecture room and

a Depository for the Library. There is but one session in the year, commencing with the first of December and ending with the first of April. The term of study, comprehends four sessions. The number of students connected with the Seminary has regularly increased, and during last session amounted to thirty-four.

## PHILOLOGICAL INSTITUTE.

The Philological Institute is the oldest Literary Society in the city, except, perhaps, those attached to the Western University. It was formed on the 7th December, 1827, by some 12 or 15 young men, principally clerks, and students in the University. JAMES JUNIUS MARKS, at present a professor in Marion College, Missouri, was the first *President*. There have been eighty-four members attached to the Institute since its organization; eight of whom have died, thirty-two have removed from the city, and twenty-six still continue in full membership. Of the members 28 were merchants, 11 manufacturers, 20 lawyers, 6 doctors, 14 editors.

This Institute has a hall handsomely furnished, all within the Bar being carpetted and the walls ornamented with several paintings and busts, the gallery outside of the Bar is provided with settees for the accommodation of ladies, and gentlemen who attend the discourses. Each member has a separate chair and desk arranged in semi-circular rows facing the President.

The objects of the Society are the investigation and discussion of subjects of practical utility, no topic being excluded except those of a *strictly sectarian* character; hence the debates cover a wide range and are frequently extended through several months. The mode of conducting business is altogether different from the old forms of debating societies, and free from most of the objections which have been urged against them.

The Philological Institute is entitled to much credit for having furnished a model for younger Societies, and excited a spirit of inquiry and enterprise amongst the young men of the city, truly laudable and which ought to be encouraged.

### FRANKFORT,

A flourishing village of Beaver county, 26 miles west of Pittsburgh, 20 from Beaver, and 13 from Georgetown. There are in this village two large brick churches; one Seceder. Rev. William McElwee, pastor; one Presbyterian, Rev. James Sloan, pastor. One Public School. A Classical and Mathematical Academy has just commenced here, Rev. James Sloan, principal; Thomas Nicholson, Assistant. Near the village are the celebrated "Frankfort Mineral Springs," owned by Mr. Edward McGinnis. These springs are much resorted to by the invalid, the gay and fashionable in quest of health or pleasure—and also, many gentlemen of Pittsburgh and elsewhere seek here, in this delightful retreat, during the months of July and August, an exemption from the cares and drudgeries of an active business life.

Both these are large and splendid establishments, where every accommodation can be had on moderate terms.

### ECONOMY,

A settlement of Germans, on the Ohio river, eighteen miles below Pittsburgh, Beaver county. Their town of the same name, containing about one hundred brick and frame dwelling houses, is laid out at right angles on a beautiful plain, about eighty feet above low water mark. Their tract of land, between three and four thousand acres, about one-half under cultivation is partly in Allegheny county, and part in Beaver. Population, between four and five hundred, part of which attend to the cultivation of the soil, while others are engaged in manufacturing.

The property is held in common as general and indivisible stock, and the models of their religious and private regulations, are taken from the precepts of the first church, as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles. They say, without the practical exercise of this Religion in its strictest sense, they could not prosper as a society.

George Rapp, near eighty-two years of age, is in fine health and vigor, retaining all his faculties. He is the head of the Society, and has been, since the formation of it in 1805, which took place soon after their arrival in the U. States. Their first location was in Butler county, Pa., but being desirous of a milder climate, they sold out their possessions, and settled on the Wabash river, in the state of Indiana, where they made great improvements, and after remaining there ten years, they resolved unanimously to return to Pennsylvania, which they effected in the year 1824 & 25, and selected their present location, which is said to be the best of the three, in many respects.

Their woollen manufactory, propelled by steam, consumes annually from seventy to eighty thousand pounds of wool, which is made into broad cloth, satinet, flannel, and blankets of superior quality. Their cotton manufactory and grist

mill are propelled by one steam engine, the former consumes about three hundred bales of cotton a year, a part is used for satin warp, a part is made into cotton goods, and the balance is sold in the yarn. They pay a great attention to raising and manufacturing of silk, using both the white Italian and *morus multicaulus* mulberry with good success. In 1838 the product of silk was 1440 pounds cocoons, yielding 151 pounds of reeled silk, and plain and figured satin ribbons, of the very first quality. A loom of the latest and best improved English plan, producing seven pieces ribbon at one time, has lately been erected here, and is now in full operation. We are informed that this is the first and only loom of the kind in the United States.

All the product of these manufactories, after the society is supplied, are deposited in a warehouse or store, where sales are made either by wholesale or retail.

They carry on all the branches of ordinary mechanism, as well for their own use and comfort, as also for the accommodation of their country neighbors, with whom a considerable business is carried on in the purchase and exchange of country produce, &c. &c.

In the lower story of a brick building 120 by 60 feet, is to be found a large and extensive museum of natural curiosities, with one of the finest collections of minerals in the United States and a large number of paintings.

The upper story of the same building consists of one room called the Social Hall, in which the whole society on certain occasions dine altogether, in celebration of their yearly Harvest home; the anniversary of their society, as well as other days of importance to them.

They have also erected a large brick church, finished in a neat, but plain manner. They meet twice on Sunday and once on an evening during the week. Visitors all agree that nowhere so much good order, silence and attention can be found during service as among these people. Mr. Rapp delivers the discourse in the German language, which is generally spoken among them, although many of the members are well acquainted with the English language. The tower or steeple is furnished with two bells, and a town clock which strikes each quarter of an hour, the latter is said to be of their own make.

They have a large and commodious school house for the education of their children.



A fine and numerous band of music occasionally entertain the society with a concert.

They have a physician of their own, and an apothecary shop.

A large and well arranged Hotel for the accommodation of travellers is kept by the society, as well as a post office.

Their large flocks of sheep, horn cattle, horses, hogs, &c. all of good stock, and regularly taken care of, and stabled in winter, are the best we have seen in the western country.

In agriculture they are not surpassed by any, their fields, meadows, orchards, vineyards, nurseries of mulberry and fruit trees, are the best the country affords, and many travellers from all parts take pleasure in stopping to see this interesting place.

Some peculiarities in their internal arrangements, seem to us strange and singular, but having chosen the United States for their residence, and complying with all civil duties required by law, no one will pretend to question their free and undeniable privilege to select such a mode of living as in their opinion will best promote happiness here and hereafter.

Each department or branch of business is headed by a foreman, who is responsible to uphold the standing rules and regulations, and to do justice to, and act impartially to all members, in the distribution of all the necessaries of life.

Their habits of industry, morality and strict adherence to sound religious principles, leading to unanimity and peace, speak volumes in their favor. They clearly demonstrate to the world, how much vice and misery can be eradicated in the human family, and what degree of human happiness may be attained, by combined action of heart and hand.

We say, it cannot be a bad tree that bears good fruit.

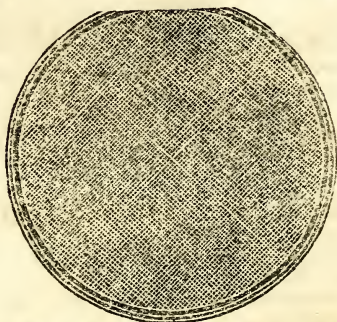
