Live Safer and Better By Growing Your Own.

Dear Garden and Farm Friends:

Our food picture has definitely changed for the worse during these past few months. Hundreds of millions of people in other countries are on the verge of starvation and must be fed from this country or perish. Each one of us who has a plot of garden ground has a personal responsibility to grow every pound of food possible for family use and to release commercial supplies needed so badly elsewhere.

It will require, at best, two to three years to get food production in the starving countries on a normal basis. That means a continued drain on our food supply; continuing shortages for our own people even with abundant 1946 crops. If unfavorable growing weather hits our large producing states in the middle west it will just be too bad, particularly for those folks who fail to go the limit for home needs.

Our Victory Gardens did a wonderful job through the war years in added food supply, in money saving, in building better health from plenty of fresh vegetables. The present food situation demands the continuation of Victory Gardens; first: that there may be more food for the starving millions elsewhere, second: that we may be better fed ourselves and more independent of food shortages.

We are fortunate here in most of the south with our two planting seasons, spring and fall. In much of it an all-year-round garden is possible. In Florida and near the Gulf Coast more or less planting can go on all winter. It's fall planning and seed ordering time now! Bush snapbeans and early bush lima or butter beans can be planted up to September 1st. September and October plantings can be made of the more hardy sorts, as, Beets, Cabbage, Collards, Carrots, Raps, Kale, Lettuce, Mustard, Tender-greens, Onion sets and seed, Radish, Spinach and Turnips.

With a good fall and winter garden, your food supply will be assured and your health and pocket book safeguarded.

Seed germinates in 3 to 8 days, according to weather. Keep young plants growing steadily from the start. When plants have made the fourth pair of leaves transplant to open ground. 1 Oz. of seed usually makes at least 1,000 good strong plants. Sow 1/2 to 3/4 Lb. for plants to set one acre.

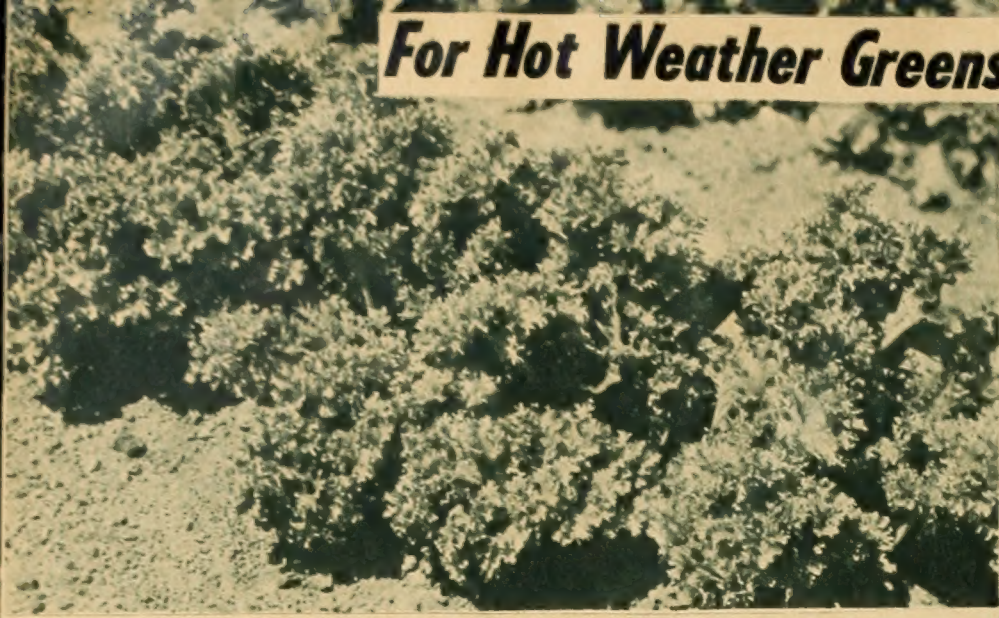

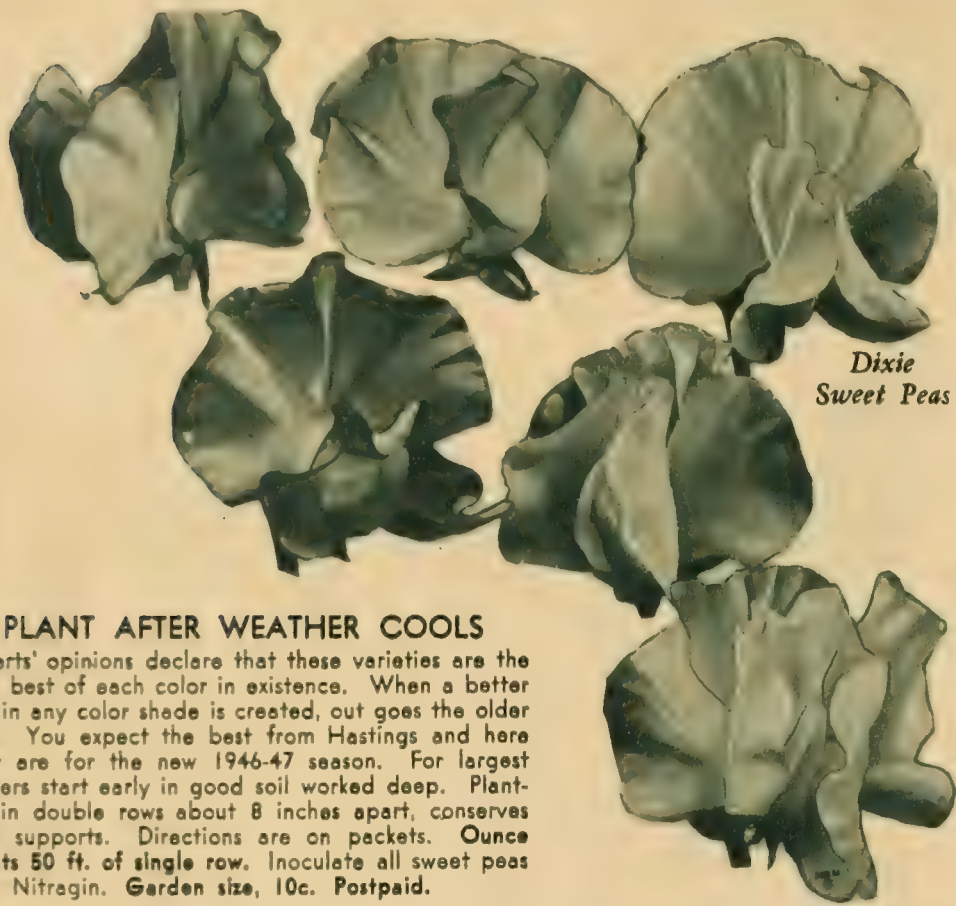

CULTURE—Set these fine new Chinese Chestnuts in any well drained location with full sun all day long preferred. Space the trees 40-50 feet each way for commercial grove or at greater distance if desired for lawn shade. Trim off lower branches to develop shapely tree and work lightly in around roots, well rotted cow lot or stable manure until they bear when high potash commercial fertilizer is recommended.

It is a very happy privilege to be able to offer to our good friends and customers these blight-resistant Chestnuts so that once again we may have the deliciously sweet meats of the nuts.

The dreaded Chestnut blight has just about killed all the American Chestnuts in the South and East where great forests were so common in past generations. And it was feared that Chestnuts were a thing of the past until our U. S. plant explorers found the Chinese Chestnuts and that they were blight-resistant.

Production is yet very small and the demand is tremendous as everyone with any space wants to get into production of nuts for home use or for market.

The trees are medium large, inclined to a spreading habit of growth unlike the tall, heavy American type.

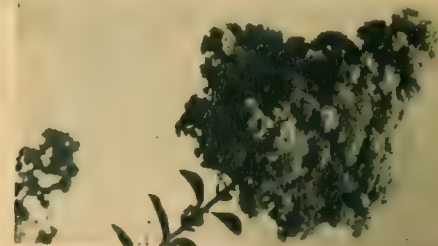
The leaves are large, heavily serrated and are very beautiful adornments of a superb dual purpose (shade and nuts) tree. The mature height of the Chinese Chestnut is about 40 feet. Before the blight came there was natural Chestnut growth as far South as middle Georgia and there is every reason to believe that this Chinese type which came from conditions on the opposite side of the world quite similar to our own, will continue to thrive as has been observed for the past several years. Heavy crops of nuts are now being produced in several small Southern commercial groves, but most seed is being planted for propagating purposes.

Quality tests of the meats of the nuts show them ranking very high and comparable to the finest American nuts.

We do have a few hundred trees to offer again this winter and spring but would suggest an early order, as we sold out last year. Plant two or more trees to insure proper pollenization.

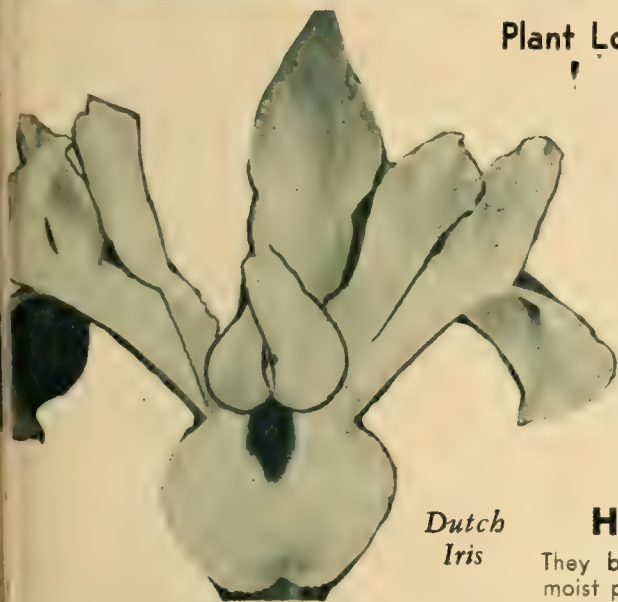

CULTURE: Plant in rather rich, exceptionally well drained beds during fall. Set small bulbs 3 to 4 inches and large bulbs 6 to 8 inches deep after mixing bone meal or high potash fertilizer (8 Lbs. for each 100 sq. ft. bed area) deeply and completely in soil. In Florida and along coastal sub-tropical locations plant Daffodils in December and particularly set deeply for best blooms.

Dig bulbs in early summer when tops die naturally, but only when they become crowded. Otherwise do not disturb them except to use one-half plant food recommended above worked lightly into bulb beds in early fall.

CULTURE: Hyacinths do best in a rich, light loam but do well in any good soil. For outdoor planting, set bedding bulbs 6 to 8 inches apart each way and cover each bulb about one and a half times its own depth.

Potted bulbs may be entrenched or heeled in the garden and covered with six inches of ashes or gravel for moisture and to prevent frost damage. Keep them dark for 12 weeks and then keep in low temperature (about 50 degrees) for 2 weeks until top growth is well developed. Then you may force them as rapidly as you wish. You will have strong, compact spikes by keeping close to the glass or window and giving plenty of air. Plant September to December.

PREPARING BULB BEDS. You want increasingly beautiful flowers, so it is necessary to prepare the soil deep and well. Dig out the beds at least 18-24 inches. Replace with good topsoil or mix in fibrous material, such as Peat Moss, until your soil is loose and porous. This provides easy root penetration and drainage beneath bulbs. Add 8 Lbs. bone meal or bulb fertilizer to each 100 sq. ft. bed area for ample feeding.

CULTURE: A Tulip is usually planted about 6 inches deep in average soil. In planting among perennials, in good deep soil, set bulbs deep enough to allow free cultivation, even 8 inches or more deep. Smaller bulbs, such as Grape Hyacinths, Scillas, Crocus, Snowdrops are planted about 3 inches deep in ordinary soils or 5 inches in well-prepared soil. An old thumb-rule for ordinary soil is to cover most bulbs 3-4 times their greatest thickness.

Depth of Lily planting varies. Candidum or Madonna Lily is only covered 2 to 3 inches, Regal Lily 6 to 8 inches.

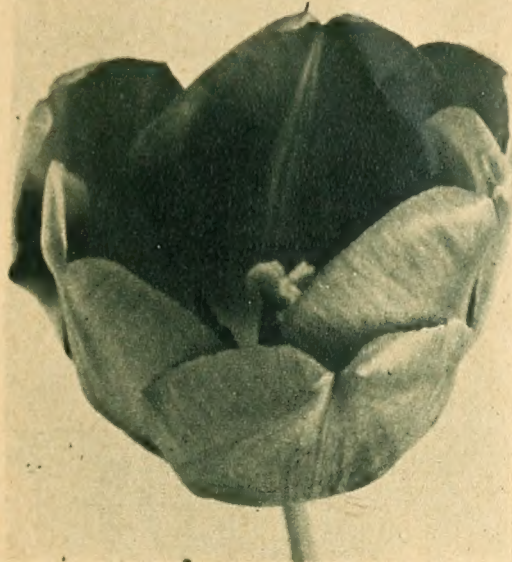

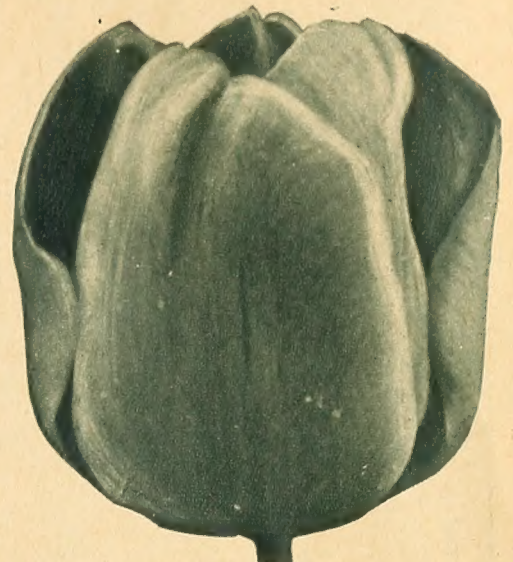

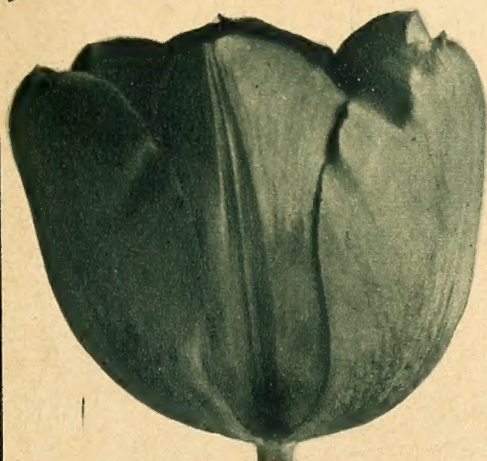
