HEAD OF UNITED FRUIT FIRM DIES

Andrew W. Preston Gained Fortune By Bringing Bananas To U. S.

Boston, Sept. 27 —Andrew W. Preston, head of the United Fruit company, who died at his summer home at Swampscott last night,

gained a fortune for himself and others by bringing bananas to this country on a big scale.

Although others had imported the fruit in a small way previously, Preston popularized the banana and then brought it here in bunches that filled ships. The result was the organization of the United Fruit company, which comprises the bulk of the tropical fruit trade of the country, and of the United Steamship company, which operates one of the country's largest steam-
