House of Ardkinglass.

(436) COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, third son of Sir Colin Campbell of Lochow (No. 6), married 1396, by Papal License, Christina, daughter of Robert MacLayman or Lamont of Invernye, and had two sons:—

(a) John (No. 437).

(b) Sir Duncan Campbell of Malta, had two sons:—

(1) Colin, ancestor of Ardentenny (No. 470.)

(2) Donald, ancestor of Auchawillan (No. 447).

Arms on Seal 25th August 1355.—*Gyronny of eight within a bordure, impaled with arms of Campbell of Strachur, whom see.* [Plate VI., fig. 12.] (*Argyll Charter Chest*).

(437) JOHN CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, whose nickname was "Riach," or the "Freckled," hence succeeding chieftains were known as "MacTain rioch or riabhaich." He married Marion, daughter of Iain Campbell of Craignish, and had:—

(a) Colin (No. 438.)

(b) Robert, ancestor of Carrick (No. 513).

(c) —, ancestor of Beach, of whom little is known.

He also had two natural sons:—

(d) Ewen, ancestor of Dergachy (No. 531).

(e) Duncan, ancestor of Clachan (No. 554).

(438) SIR COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, married a daughter of the Laird of Houston, and had three sons:—

(a) John (No. 439).

(b) Archibald Campbell.

(c) Duncan Campbell.

(439) SIR JOHN CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, married a daughter of the Laird of Buchanan, and had:—

(a) Colin (No. 440).

(b) Archibald Campbell.

(c) Duncan Campbell.

(d) Dougal Campbell of Ardaitoun, who married and had:—

(1) James (No. 441).

(2) Alexander, Bishop of Brechin.

(e) Patrick Campbell.

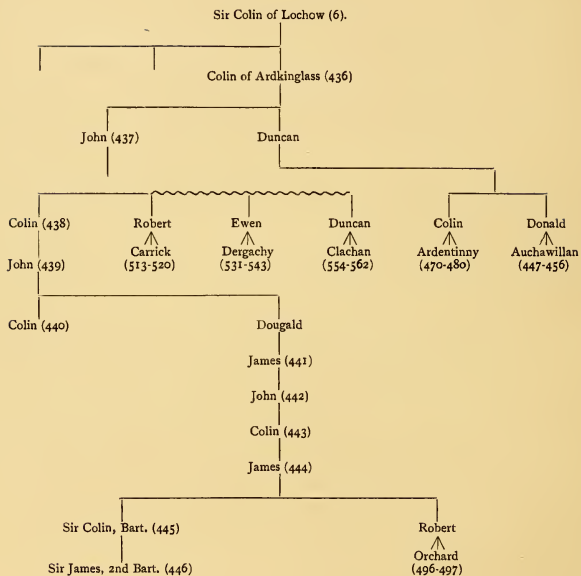
(440) COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, married three times, and died *s.p.m.*, and was succeeded by his nephew, his son having died *v.p.*

Arms on Seal 1545.—*Gyronny of eight.*

On Seal 1550.—*Gyronny of eight, with a star at fess point.* M'Donald's *Scottish Seals.* [Plate V., fig. 2.]

- (441) SIR JAMES CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, died 1591. Will recorded 12th June 1591 at Edinburgh. He married Elizabeth, daughter of the Laird of Lawers, and had issue:—

 (c) Dougall Campbell.
 (d) Duncan Campbell.
- (442) SIR JOHN CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, married, 23rd July 1571, Annas, daughter of Colin Campbell of Glenurchy, and had a son:—
 (a) Colin (No. 443).
 He married a second time, and had two sons:—
 (b) James Campbell.
 (c) Patrick Campbell.
 He was accused of the murder of John, Laird of Calder, September 1591.
- (443) SIR COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, married Mary, grand-daughter of the third Lord Sempill, and had two sons:—
 (a) James (No. 444).
 (b) Archibald.
- (444) SIR JAMES CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, married Isabella, daughter of Sir Robert Campbell of Glenurchy. He was M.P. for Argyllshire 1646-47, 1648-49, and had issue:—
 (a) Colin (No. 445).
 (b) Robert of Orchard (No. 496).
 (c) Alexander Campbell.
 (d) James Campbell.
 (e) William Campbell.
- (445) SIR COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, was created a BARONET OF NOVA SCOTIA 23rd March 1679, with remainder to the heirs male of his body. He died April 1709. Will recorded 2nd June 1709 at Argyll. He was M.P. for Argyllshire 1693-1702. He married Helen, daughter of Sir Patrick Maxwell of Newark, Co. Renfrew, and had a son:—
- (446) SIR JAMES CAMPBELL OF ARDKINGLASS, SECOND BARONET, died 5th July 1752, aged 86, when the title became extinct. Will recorded 31st March 1756 in Stirling. He married first, Margaret, daughter and co-heiress of Mr Adam Campbell and heiress of Gargunnoch, by whom he had three daughters. The eldest daughter, Helen, married Sir James Livingstone of Glentirran, whose eldest son succeeded to the Estate of Ardkinglass. He married second, Anna, daughter of Sir John Callendar, of Graigforth. He was M.P. for Argyllshire 1702-07, as heir of Ardkinglass. He sat in the first Parliament of Great Britain, M.P. for Argyllshire 1708-27, and for Stirlingshire 1734-41.

Arms recorded 1672-77.—*Gyronny of eight, gold and black, within a gold bordure.* CREST: *A black lymphad with oars in action.* MOTTO: "*Set on.*" SUPPORTERS: *Dexter, a merman with trident in his right hand; Sinister, a mermaid holding in her left hand a mirror, all proper.* [Plate V., fig. 3.]

Auchawillan.

- (447) DONALD CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, son of Sir Duncan Campbell, Knight of Malta (No. 436, *b*), had a son:—
- (448) ROBERT CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, who was dead before 30th March 1540, had two sons:—
 (*a*) Donald (No. 449).
 (*b*) Archibald of Dunoon (No. 457).
- (449) DONALD CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, had six sons:—
 (*a*) John (No. 450).
 (*b*) Duncan Campbell, living 1596.
 (*c*) Robert Campbell
 (*d*) Patrick Campbell. Either he or his brother Robert married Helen Stuart, and had a son:—
 (*i*) Robert (No. 451).
 (*e*) Colin Campbell, living 1589.
 (*f*) Iain Campbell, living 1612.
- (450) JOHN CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, died before 7th February 1604, and was succeeded by his nephew. He had a natural son:—
 (*a*) Duncan Campbell, living 1604.
- (451) ROBERT CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, whose father was probably Patrick Campbell (No. 449, *d*), and whose mother is known to have been Helen Stuart. He married Isobel Campbell (who was alive in 1667), and had:—
 (*a*) Donald (No. 452).
 (*b*) Iain Campbell, living 1696.
 (*c*) Duncan Campbell, married Katherine, daughter of Cornet Alexander Hepburn (Contract dated 3rd January 1678), and had a son:—
 (*i*) Robert, living 1693.
 (*d*) — Campbell of Claonary.
- (452) DONALD CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, married, at Inverary, 26th March 1667, Muriel, daughter of George Campbell of Airds, Tutor of Calder, and had two sons:—
 (*a*) Iain (No. 453).
 (*b*) Robert Campbell of "Auchynmyllyne," living 1711.
- (453) IAIN CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, living 1729. Married Margaret Campbell and had issue:—
 (*a*) Niall (No. 454).
 (*b*) Archibald Campbell of Springfield.
 (*c*) George Campbell, living 1696.
- (454) NIALL OR NEILL CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, served heir to his father 25th October 1734. Married Margaret Campbell of Otter, and had two sons:—
 (*a*) Niall (No. 455).
 (*b*) Archibald Campbell of Springfield, born 1720; died 30th

January 1808. Married Mary, daughter of Iain Campbell of Otter.

- (455) NIALL CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, served heir to his father 25th October 1734, and died at Auchawillan 22nd March 1779. He married Margaret, daughter of John Campbell, fourth of Otter, by his second wife, Jane Stenhouse (Contract dated 21st May 1752), and had two sons:—

(a) Iain (No. 456).

(b) James Campbell, living 19th December, 1774.

- (456) IAIN CAMPBELL OF AUCHAWILLAN, who died 11th October 1820. He married a daughter of Archibald Campbell of Springfield. He sold the estate.

Arms recorded 1672-77.—*Gyronny of eight, black and gold, within a gold bordure charged with eight black crescents.* CREST: *Two oars of a galley disposed in saltire proper.* MOTTO: "*Armis et fide.*" [Plate V., fig. 4.]

Inellan and Dunoon.

- (457) ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, FIRST OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, whose father was Robert Campbell of Auchawillan (No. 448), was dead before 26th April 1589. He married Isobell, probably daughter of Colin Leche or M'Lachlan of Craiginterve, and had two sons:—

(a) John (No. 458.)

(b) Donald Campbell of Glenmassen, who married Margaret Stewart.

- (458) JOHN CAMPBELL, SECOND OF INELLAN, CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, was dead before 19th January 1606. He married, 1573, Margaret, daughter of Robert Stewart of Largobroughton and Ritcattan, and had:—

(a) Archibald (No. 459).

(b) Robert (No. 460).

(c) Colin Campbell of Ballyherrin, Co. Donegal, living 1618. He married, and had a son:—

(1) James (No. 463).

(d) Ian Campbell of Orrobus in Islay, living 1674, and had a son:—

(1) John (No. 464).

(e) Major William Campbell, who was dead before 18th January 1781. He married Margaret Campbell, and had:—

(1) John (No. 465).

(2) Archibald, living 1710.

(3) George.

(4) William, dead before 25th February 1737, had two sons:—

(a) Iain, dead in 1737.

(b) Patrick, living 1737.

(f) Evire Campbell, living 1617.

- (459) ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, THIRD OF INELLAN, CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, died *s.p.* before 19th January 1606. He married Margaret, daughter of Dugald Campbell, Dean of Brechin, and was succeeded by his brother:—

- (460) ROBERT CAMPBELL, FOURTH OF INELLAN, CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, died before 2nd May 1617. He married Isabell, daughter of Duncan Campbell, Captain of Carrick, and had :—
 (a) Archibald (No. 461).
 (b) Elvin Campbell, living 1618.
 (c) Duncan (No. 462).
 (d) Donald Campbell of Glenmassen, living 1643.
- (461) ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, FIFTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, born 1613; died *s.p.* before 30th June 1644. He married (Contract dated at Rothesay 1st February 1633), Jean, daughter of Ninian Stewart, fourth of Kilchattan, and was succeeded by his brother :—
- (462) DUNCAN CAMPBELL, SIXTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON. Married (Contract dated 24th July 1649), Elspeth, eldest daughter of Duncan Campbell of Ellengreig. He died *s.p.* and was succeeded by his cousin :—
- (463) JAMES CAMPBELL, SEVENTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON. He succeeded as a boy, but was never actually infefted by Charter. He appointed his cousin, who succeeded him, as his tutor, and died under age before 13th September 1676.
- (464) JOHN CAMPBELL, EIGHTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, son of No. 458 *d.*, died *s.p.* before 17th April 1714. He married first (Contract dated 26th July 1654), Agnes Stewart, daughter of John Stewart of Ballilan, Ireland, and second (Contract dated at Rothesay, 2nd January 1696), Elizabeth Bannatyne, daughter of Ninian Bannatyne of Kames. He was succeeded by his cousin :—
- (465) JOHN CAMPBELL, NINTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, Minister of Carne Castle, Co. Antrim. He married first (Contract dated at Irvine 1st December 1680), Agnes, daughter of Hew Cunningham, Provost of Irvine, and had :—
 (a) Archibald (No. 466.)
 (b) Iain Campbell.
 He married second (Contract dated at Rothesay and Inellan 30th September 1700), Anna, daughter of Ninian Bannatyne of Kames, and had :—
 (c) William Campbell.
 (d) James Campbell, living 1755.
- (466) ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, TENTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, died about 1759. He married first, 8th January 1735, Liliis, daughter of Walter Campbell, Minister of Dunoon. She died before 10th July 1740, leaving issue :—
 (a) John (No. 467).
 (b) Walter Campbell, Lieutenant in the Royals, 24th March 1747.
 He married second, Helen, daughter of Dr George Thomson, Physician in Glasgow, and by her had a son :—
 (c) George Campbell, merchant in Glasgow.
- (467) COLONEL JOHN CAMPBELL, ELEVENTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON AND OF BLUNHAM, died 25th April 1773. He was Governor

of Chelsea Hospital, and married, 12th April 1761, Susanna, daughter and co-heiress of John Lewis, and had two sons:—

(a) John (No. 468).

(b) George Campbell, married Elizabeth Snow, who died 25th February 1813. He died *s.p.* 25th June 1812.

(468) LIEUTENANT-COLONEL JOHN CAMPBELL, TWELFTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, born 30th October 1771; died 12th February 1846. Married, 28th September 1797, Caroline Francis Wyndham. They assumed by Royal Licence, 3rd April 1844, the surname of Campbell-Wyndham, and had:—

(a) John Henry (No. 469).

(b) Wyndham Campbell, born 1805; died 24th February 1829; buried 26th February 1829 at Blunham, Beds. Unmarried.

(c) Stephen Thomas Campbell, died young.

(469) JOHN HENRY CAMPBELL-WYNDHAM, THIRTEENTH OF INELLAN AND CAPTAIN OF DUNOON, D.L., M.P., assumed the additional name of Wyndham, born 26th July 1798. Married, 7th February 1839, Urania May Ann, daughter and heir of Colonel Peter Kinghorn. He died *s.p.* 16th November 1868, and was succeeded by his niece.

Arms of Campbell of Inellan, recorded 1672-77.—*Gyronny of eight, gold and black within a gold engrailed bordure charged with eight black crescents.* CREST: *Two oars of a galley disposed in saltire.* MOTTO: "*Armis et fides.*" [Plate V., fig. 5.]

Ardentinny.

(470) COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, son of No. 436, *b*, died in 1510, had probably two sons:—

(a) Donald (No. 471).

(b) Colin (No. 472).

(471) DONALD CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, was succeeded by his brother:—

(472) COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, had three sons:—

(a) Donald (No. 473).

(b) Walter Campbell, married about 1533, Janet Carlyle, and also probably he married the heiress of Skipnish.

(c) Colin Campbell, married before 1566, Margaret Lyonn, probably daughter of the Hon. Archibald Lyonn, son of the Earl of Strathmore.

(473) DONALD CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, died before 20th April 1558, is frequently mentioned as Provost of Inveraray. He left issue:—

(a) Archibald (No. 474).

(b) Walter of Skipnish (No. 481).

(c) Duncan Campbell, living 1558.

(474) ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, whose son was probably:—

(475) DUNCAN CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY. He married, and had a son:—

(a) John Campbell, Fiar of Ardentinny, was dead before March 1629.

He married second, 11th May 1591, Margaret, sister of Awlay M'Awley of Ardencaple. She died 23rd March 1629, leaving a son:—

(b) Donald (No. 476).

(476) DONALD CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, dead before 1678, married (Contract dated at Glasgow 15th August 1633), Barbara Montgomery. He was succeeded by:—

(477) COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, who called himself nephew and apparent heir to Donald Campbell. He married Anna Lindsay, daughter of Mr George Lindsay of Blakholme, and had three sons:—

(a) John (No. 478).

(b) George Campbell.

(c) Duncan Campbell.

(478) JOHN CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, died in or before 1702. He married, 1660, Anne M'Auley, daughter of Walter M'Auley, seventh of Ardencaple, and had issue:—

(a) Colin (No. 479).

(b) Walter Campbell, living 1692.

(c) Alaisdar Campbell, living 1692.

(479) COLIN CAMPBELL OF ARDENTINNY, married a daughter of Walter Campbell of Skipnish, and had a son:—

Skipnish and Shawfield.

The first family of "Skippinche" sprang from Archibald, a younger son of Archibald, second Earl of Argyll, who, in 1511, granted him a Charter. In the reign of Queen Mary the heiress of this branch "married one of the family of the Ardkinglass Campbells."

In the MS. Pedigree of the Campbells of Ardkinglass, after the third Laird of Ardentinny, whose christian name is omitted, occurs a son of his, simply called "Skipnish." This may mean that the eldest son married the said heiress of Skipnish, or, as is more likely (as it is well known that the Ardentinny family combined in the male line) it was a younger son of the third Laird of Ardentinny who married the Skipnish heiress.

- (722) SIR DUNCAN CAMPBELL, second son of Sir Donald Campbell, second son of Sir Colin (Mor) Cambel of Lochow (No. 2). He had a charter from King Robert Bruce to him and Susanna, his wife, daughter of Sir Reginald Crawford of Loudoun, of the lands of Loudoun and Stevenstoun. He had a son:—

- (727) SIR GEORGE CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN, had a charter as son and heir of his father in the lands of Duchray in King's Kyle, Beuquhol and Dalnarton in Ayrshire, Kittomure in the Barony of Stanehouse, from Alexander Livingston of Duchray. He was alive 1489-90, but was dead 9th March 1490-91. He married about 1466 Elizabeth Stewart, and had issue:—

 - (b) John Campbell, who had a charter from his father of the lands of Duchray, called Corshill, Ruchil, and Lewlands, dated 17th August 1476.

- (729) SIR HUGH CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN. He sat in Parliament in 1504, and was dead in 4th August 1508. He married Isobel, daughter of Sir Thomas Wallace of Craigie, and had issue:—

- (732) SIR HUGH CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN, Sheriff of Ayr as Hugh Campbell, younger of Loudoun and Terrinzeane. He had a charter of the lands of Sorne from William Dunbar of Blantyre 1588, was Provost and M.P. for Irvine 1579-87, sat in Parliament as a minor Baron 1597 and 1599, was admitted to the Privy Council 8th July 1601, and created BARON CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN with destination apparently to heirs whomsoever 30th June 1691.  (b) Elizabeth Campbell, married Sir Hugh Campbell of Cessnock.

- (734) MARGARET CAMPBELL, BARONESS LOUDOUN, born about 1605, was served heir portioner, along with her sister, Elizabeth, to Sir Duncan Campbell, Knight, great grandfather of Sir Hugh Campbell, Knight, great grandfather of Sir Matthew Campbell of Loudoun, their great grandfather, in the lands of Benderloch in Argyllshire, on 22nd November 1626. Cessnock.

- (735) GEORGE CAMPBELL OF CESSNOCK was probably fourth son of George Campbell of Loudoun (No. 728), who died 1492. He apparently married Janet, daughter of Hugh, Earl of Eglinton. He was killed at Flodden, 9th September 1513, and was succeeded by his son:—
- (736) JOHN CAMPBELL OF CESSNOCK, living 1527. In 1553 he married Janet, daughter of Sir Hugh Campbell of Loudoun, and was succeeded by his son:—
- (737) SIR GEORGE CAMPBELL OF CESSNOCK, married Agnes Cunningham, whose Will is recorded 24th April 1611 (Edinburgh). He was buried in Greyfriars Churchyard 25th May 1666. When altering Cessnock Castle in 1890 a portion of a coat-of-arms was found, which appears to be Sir George's, as his initials are G. C., and (his wife being a Cunningham) a shake-fork appears as part of the Arms impaled with those of Campbell (MacGibbon and Ross's *Castellated Architecture*). He was succeeded by his son:—

Authority—Paterson's *County of Ayr.*

- (740) CAPTAIN HUGH CAMPBELL OF BARQUHARRIE was the third son or grandson of Sir Hugh Campbell of Cessnock and Elizabeth, daughter of George, Master of Loudoun. He married, 5th June 1702, Margaret, daughter of David Boswell of Auchinleck, and had issue:—
- (741) HUGH CAMPBELL OF BARQUHARRIE, afterwards of Mayfield, Comptroller of the Customs at Ayr. He married, 10th January 1727, Margaret, daughter of David Henderson of Tinochside, by whom he had three sons:—

 - (b) Claud Campbell, died *s.p.*
 - (c) Bruce (No. 742).
- He had, however, another son, whose name occurs as follows in the Parochial Registers:—

Skerrington.

Authority—Paterson's *County of Ayr*.

Note.—This family claims to be descended from the same stock as the Campbells of Argyll and Loudoun. The early part of the genealogy of the family is somewhat imperfect, and the first who is distinctly ascertained by Writs in their possession is:—

- (745) DAVID CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON OR SKELLINGTON, who, in 1348, surrendered his lands for a new infeftment. He was succeeded by his son:—
- (746) ANDREW CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, who in a Deed in his favour, dated 1360, is styled son to umquhile David Campbell. To Andrew succeeded (says Nisbet) David Campbell of Skerrington, second of that name, but as this includes a period of one hundred years, it may be supposed that Andrew, father of David, was the successor of the preceding Andrew. The descent would run thus:—
- (747) ANDREW CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, who granted a Charter to his son in 1460:—
- (748) DAVID CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, is said to have married a sister of Stewart of Haining. He was succeeded by his son:—
- (749) ANDREW CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, as appears from a Charter granted him by Hogison of Barshare of the lands of Craigens in 1490. He is said to have married a daughter of the family of Kilmarnock. He was succeeded by:—
- (750) ALEXANDER CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, who had a Charter of the estate granted to him in 1509. He married a sister of John Campbell of Cessnock and daughter of the first Baron of Cessnock, and was father of:—
- (751) ANDREW CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, who had several Charters of lands after 1534, and possessed the Barony of Bargour. Died without issue, and was succeeded by his nephew:—

- (752) CHARLES CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, cousin to Sir George Campbell of Loudoun. He was probably succeeded by his son :—
- (753) CHARLES CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, who probably changed his designation to Horsecleuch, and was living in 1609. He had issue :—
 (a) George (No. 754).
 (b) William Campbell, whose grandson acquired Little Cessnock. He died 18th December 1623. In his Testament he is designed Mr William Campbell, Cumnok.
 (c) Hugh Campbell.
- (754) GEORGE CAMPBELL OF HORSECLEUCH, was retoured heir to his father in 1629, seven years after his death. The property included the lands of Skillington and two Merk land of Horsecleuch. He married Mary Gordon of the family of Lord Kenmure. He died in 1640, and was succeeded by :—
- (755) JOHN CAMPBELL OF HORSECLEUCH, living 1643. He was twice married ; first to a daughter of Gordon of Skirmers, and second to Jean, daughter of Thomas Nicholson, merchant in Ayr, and was succeeded before 1705 by his son :—
- (756) JOHN CAMPBELL OF HORSECLEUCH, married first, Jean, daughter of David Boswell of Auchinleck, and second, to Abigail, daughter and heiress of William Rankin of Bankhead. He had, according to Burke, two sons by the latter :—
 (a) John (No. 757).
 (b) James Campbell.
 The Parish Registers of Cumnock, however, show that he had another son :—
 (c) William Campbell, baptised 2nd February 1705, who probably died in infancy.
- (757) JOHN CAMPBELL, advocate, succeeded his father in 1725, and resumed the designation of Skerrington. He was admitted a Burgess of Ayr in 1739. He married Wilhelmina, daughter of Lieutenant-General Sir Andrew Agnew, Bart. of Lochnaw, Governor of Timmouth Castle, by whom he had one son. In 1763 he went to Little Cessnock to reside, and changed its name to Skerrington, the original seat of the family. He was succeeded by his son :—
- (758) JOHN CAMPBELL OF SKERRINGTON, died *s.p.*, and was succeeded by his sister Eleanora, who married Charles Maxwell of Cowhill, Dumfriesshire, from whom the present family of Skerrington is descended.

Glasnock.

On the authority of an old manuscript at Gilmilns Croft, Robertson stated the Campbells of Glasnock were the last in the entail of Lord Loudoun, 1613, but how descended from that family cannot be discovered.

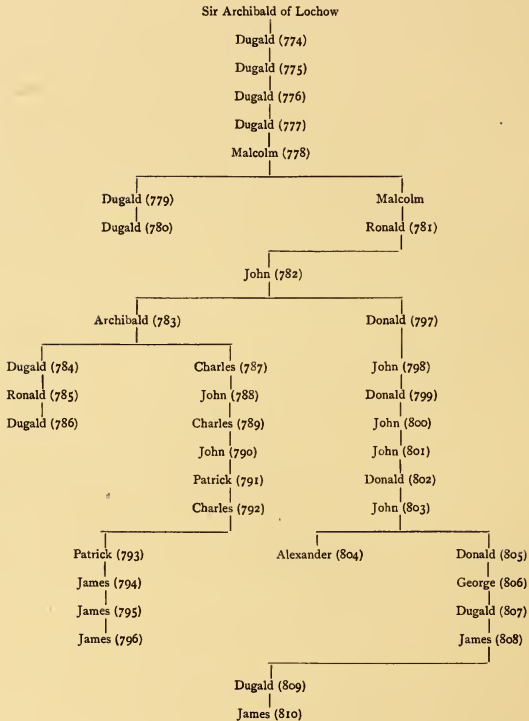

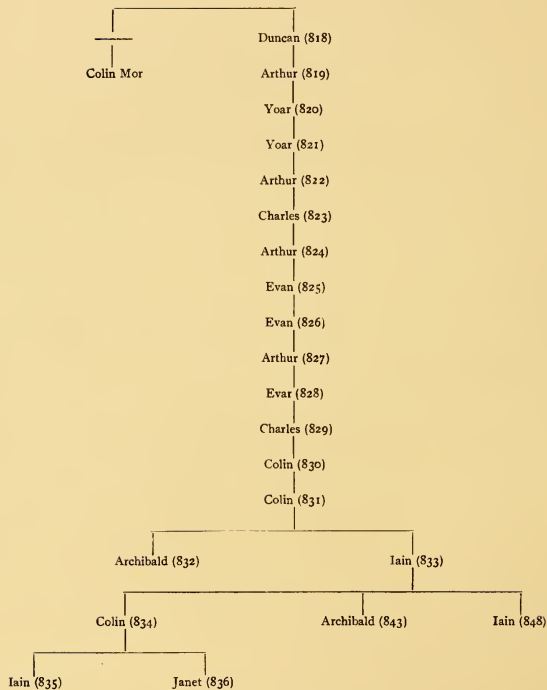
