The copper (R-6) and Tin (R-5) pieces are Prooflike with brilliant reflective fields; there are light beginnings of tone on the Copper and a faint contact mark or two on the otherwise flawless surfaces of the Tin piece; the copper is ex Fuld. The Bronze (R-6) has a dark mahogany finish and has acquired varicolored overtones and is choice save for two relatively small and innocuous tarnish spots on obv. 

Surfaces somewhat granular due to light corrosion on either side, scattered small to microscopic handling marks. R-6, perhaps a dozen or so survive of the 350 originally struck in tin.

An attractive uniform reddish brown finish. A couple of minor contact marks on obverse. Excellent high relief bust in uniform by Key, an impressive looking piece. R-5. Ex Fuld.

We suspect this is the same piece which appeared in a sale held by George Massamore (of Baltimore) on June 11, 1884, Lot 453; an iron Washington of just about identical dimensions, specially engraved and struck at St. Petersburg, Russia, by order of Czar Nicholas 1 and presented by him personally to the officers of a U.S. warship visiting the city. The piece in the Massamore sale was mounted in gold as a scarf pin, and had been owned by Col. Foster, passing from him to Ed Pittman of Baltimore and thus to the aution in 1884.

2139 N.D. Washington Association of New Jersey. By Tiffany & Co. Silver; 32 x 29mm. EF. PLATE

An ellipse imposed upon a rectangle with loop, a hangar bar and a white and blue ribbon which is slightly aged and faded yet still intact. Reverse depicts a spacious home inscribed: "MORRISTOWN/1779 1780." Undoubtedly, representing a headquarters for Washington during the Revolution. Hanger bar inscr.: "W.A.-horse head-N.J." obviously it has been worn, as it shows some minor, nicks, hairlines, etc. A lovely piece.

The 1977 Assay Commission included no public members, only officials of the Government; of the 50 medals struck. 19 specimens were remelted. We have never seen a specimen offered at auction before!

MINT & TREASURY MEDALS

1 OF 54 STRUCK

2310 (1871). David Rittenhouse, 1st Mint Director. J.MT-1. Copper, 45mm. by Barber. Choice AU.

Bust left/ inscription in thin wreath. Light reddish-brown, no bronzing applied at the Mint - essentially a "coin finish" piece, probably one of the 5 struck in 1888-9. Total mintage 1874-1904 was only 3 in silver and 54 in copper. Missing from the great Kessler-Spangenberger Sale.

2311 1922. Andrew W. Mellon. Bronze; 76mm. By Morgan. Choice AU.

Bust left/Eagle left and seal of Treasury Dept.; "SECRETARY OF THE TREASURY," around Nearly Unc, with mild hint of rubbing on hair and cheek of portrait, a tiny nick or two.

LIFE SAVING MEDALS

1 OF 2 STRUCK

2312 (1877). Treasury Dept. Life Saving First Class, J.LS-7. White metal, 50mm, by Anthony C. Pacquet. EF. PLATE

Rescue scene/ woman holding wreath and preparing to write name on tablet. Fields prooflike, light friction and scattered nicks. These dies were used from early 1877 until 1882, with the total mintage being 86 awarded specimens in gold. 5 coppers, and two white metal strikes (these last two made in 1882, as were two of the 2nd Class LS-8 in the same metal). The only auction records we know of for the white metal strikes was W.E. Woodward's 9/10/1888 sale, reappearing in his 1/21/1889 sale.

CARNEGIE LIFESAVING AWARD

2313 1913. Carnegie Hero Fund Award Medal. Bronze, 70mm, by J.E. Caldwell Co., Phila. Unc. PLATE

Excellent high-relief bust right of Andrew Carnegie, founder of the Hero Fund Commission in 1904/ map of North America with three coats of arms and a cartouche superimposed, the cartouche reading "Awarded to Arthur E. Cook, who attempted to save Theresa Miller from drowning. Harhor Springs, Mich. August 8, 1913." The surrounding inscription is the Bihlical quotation "Greater love hath no man than this . . . " Deep tan-hrown finish, excellent surfaces. The lirst specimen of this rare medal we have handled.

MASONIC, RELIGIOUS & FRATERNAL MEDALS

NAMED SHIELD FROM MASSACHUSETTS

2314 ND (late 18th Century?) Masonic Shield. Silver, 60 x 70mm, uniface. PLATE

Hand engraved design, "Mason Shaw Castine, Massachusetts, U.S.A." at hottom/ hlank reverse. The piece shows cleaning and polishing lines on obverse, as usual. An important early piece of Massachusetts Masonry.

EARLY MASONIC ARC & COMPASS

2315 ND (late 18th Century?) Masonic Arc & Compass. Silver, 65 x 80mm, uniface EF. PLATE

Uninscribed, but originally acquired by the consignor together with the previous shield and thus probably of Massachusetts origin, perhaps belonging to the same party. Hand engraved, traces of polishing, another attractive and important early specimen.

RARE NAMED MASONIC SHIELD

2316 1801. Masonic Shield. Silver, 46 x 58mm. EF. PLATE

Temple in circle with motto above and the Masonic "HTWSSTKS" around/beneath the Arc and Compass, a smaller shield inscribed "J.F Montamat -les Amis Reunis - 5801". Cleaning lines, as usual; a fancier design than most, very attractive. Though it seems French at first glance, the odds are high that it is of American origin, both stylistically and from the abbreviations - Montamat may have managed to get out of France in 1801 and come here to join other refugees from the French Revolution.

EARLY BADGE WITH RIBBON

2317 ND (late 18th Century?) Masonic Badge. Gilt Silver. 36 x 46mm. EF. PLATE

Hand engraved with Masonic symbols on both sides, raised band on reverse reads "J.McD.C. 72", presumably the Chapter number though we do not know the State. Suspended from a goldish ribbon with top, bottom and center silver bars. A very unusual piece, both because of the gilding and because of the barred ribbon. Cleaning/polishing traces, of course.

NAMED EARLY MASONIC BADGE

2318 ND (ca. 1800?) Masonic Badge. Silver, 41 x 54mm. EF. PLATE

Hand engraved silver showing numerous Masonic symbols on both sides, the bottom reverse inscribed "L. Lamb". One small obverse dent, and cleaning lines on both sides. An interesting early specimen. Some of the prominent early members of the Lamb family were based in N.Y.C., though we do not know for sure whether this was one of that group.

2319 ND (early 19th Cent.) Handmade Mason's Badge. Gilt brass. 46mm w/loop. VF+. PLATE

A cut-out design with many symbols, each engraved on the surfaces on both sides, the gilt worn off in some places.

EARLY BRITISH BADGE

2320 ND (ca. 1834). Hand engraved gilt silver Badge. By George Knight of England. AU. PLATE

In four pieces originally joined by a (missing) ribbon; top har with stickpin, central "endless knot" bar; lower hanger bar; and the Badge itself which is engraved with mottoes and symbols. "G.K." hallmark on each part; "Silver" hallmark on top three parts, three other small hallmarks on Badge. Should not he hard to replace the ribbon.

2321 1950. Royal Sussex Lodge Badge. 37mm gilt silver, light blue enamel. AU.

Light blue rihhon and light blue enameling on center har and the circular Badge itself, the reverse inscribed to "Bro B H.Rapoport from the Brethren of Royal Sussex, 22.6.1950". One chip on enamel at 4:30. In hlue plush fined hlack leatherette case.



























2322 ND (Early 19th C.) Chapter High Priest's Jewel.

Sterfing silver triangle, 79mm across hase, 67mm high plus loop, 7-point star in each corner, imperial crown across central opening. Once gilt, toned mostly deep hlue-violet, c/s Sterling on reverse.

2323 1881. Past Master's Jewel. PLATE

A magnificent piece, with deep blue ribhon bearing three hangers of (apparently) gold, the top one the monogrammed "VL" of the Vaux Lodge #393, the center the Altar, the bottom one the "JSE" monogram of the recipient. The Square below is heavy silver, nicely engraved, while the Eye is a diamond in a gold mount attached to the Square. The reverse is inscribed to Joseph S. Efliott by the Lodge on 12/27/1881. Made by Booz & Thomas, Phila; in leathered hox of issue, fitted, deep purple silk and velvet finer.

2324 1885. Past Master's Jewel, Chandler Lodge #227.

Silver Square, 82mm on a side, with hanging pair of diamonds supporting the Cube, all elaborately engraved with the Working Tools, the Eye at top, "A", "L", "5885" on the hangers/ "Presented to Past Master Abraham Seivard by Chandler Lodge No. 227 F&AM", "Dec.", "27", "1885" on the hangers. The whole suspended from a swiveling ring. Handsome, carefully done engraving work.

2325 1887. Past Commander's Jewel, De Molay Commandery #9, Reading, PA. PLATE

Black & white ribbon, gilt silver with enamel; top hanger with sword, sceptre, cross and crown, inscribed to "E.Sir Abraham Seivard", the main badge a hollow cross moline on a sunburst and bearing another, on which is a red-orange enamel disc with white border, on which again is a curved triangular shield bordered in black with white center bearing a red cross through a crown; the hack is engraved 1886-1887. In black leatherette case of issue with purple silk and velvet liner.

2326 1887. Royal Arch Past High Priest's Jewel. PLATE

A lovely specimen, deep red corduroyed silk ribbon with three hangers on it in heavy gilt silver, the top one the Arch around the "AS" monogram of the recipient; the triangle suspended below, also in heavy gilt silver, beautifully engraved, the Eye a diamond on a gold mount attached to the top, a high relief 7-point Star within, the reverse inscribed to Past High Priest Abram Seivard by Reading (PA) R.A.C. #152 on 12/17/1887. Made hy C.G. Wilson of Reading; in black leathered case of issue with padded red silk liner.

INCREDIBLE MASONIC WATCH

2327 ND (19th Century). Triangular Masonic Watch in Case. G.R.O. AU. PLATE

15-jewel, 3-adjustment Schwab & Loeillet (Swiss) watch mounted in a triangular casing of (apparently) nickel atloy with a front casing of brass, the winder stem at bottom when upright, the face showing Masonic symbols. Complete with sweep second hand on small dial. It runs, though we do not at the moment know how to set the hands (and hesitate to experiment). It rests in a padded triangular fitted bluegreen leather case with Masonic symbols in gilt on the top, the case original and unbroken. Clearly the watch was once intended to hang from a neck ribbon. We have never seen one like it!

2328 ND (ca. 1900). Square on sash.

Nice silver Square, 107mm on a side, Iloral design engraving, suspended from a neck sash of medium blue moire silk on thicker backing, some moth holes in the silk.

2329 1912. Past Master's Jewel. PLATE

Silver with light blue ribbon and deep blue enameling work, three hangers on ribbon, the Square helow with symbols made separately and enameled before being attached, the opened Cuhe in frame beneath with Lodge number at its top, the reverse inscribed to H. Townsend Wilson by Philadelphia Lodge #380 on 1/2/1912. A lovely piece, made by Wm. Lehmherg of Phila., in black leather case of issue with purple sifk finer.

2330 1917-1918. Pair of Masonic Jewels.

Both are from Oriental Lodge #385, hoth inscribed to Oscar R. Willett: 1) the Square, 103mm on a side, reverse inscribed to him as Worthy Master in 1917, apparently silver and once gift; 2) Past Master's jewel, blue ribhon, named on top hanger, "385" on center hanger, lodge name on bottom hanger, Square with the opened Cube in a frame befow suspended from the Square, all engraved, reverse inscribed from the Lodge to Wiffett on 1/3/1918, apparently silver though not hallmarked

THE FAMOUS WILLIAM PENN MEDAL

> Fine bust of Penn right Penn and Indian shaking hands. By Deeds of Peace" around. "Pennsylvania Setled 1681" below (including misspellings) Medium chocolate brown (inish, light marks, the normal die failure at ohverse (im at 1.30). This peice is apparently (be earliest medallic tribute to William Penn in existence. Though it is not dated. a letter is quoted in Betts which dates its existence to 1775, this is logical enough in a way, since Pingo became Assistant Engraver at the Royal Mint in 1776 and would not have taken thereafter what must have been a private die contract. The bust of Penn is believed to be an excellent likeness as it closely resembles the Bevan bust of bim in Philadelphia. The medals exist in both copper and silver, though the latter are almost prohibitively rare (one in well worn condition hrought 600 Pounds in London a few years ago⁴). The coppers are rare, especially above VF, and seldom come up for sale over here since they are collected in England as well and most of the survivors are still there. A major medal on one of the most important figures in 17th Century colonization of America.

RARE WRIGHT TRIAL PIECE

2412 ND (1825-6). Maj. Gen. Charles Coatesworth Pinckney. Plaster, uniface obverse, 44mm, by C.C. Wright. EF-AU, edge chipping. (Photo)

Bust of Pinckney right in uniform, wearing Society of the Cincinnati badge on lapel. Wright signature below shoulder. Edge wrapped in old stiff paper as was done frequently in the 19th Century with plasters of seals or dies to protect them; some light edge chipping anyway Pinckney, one of the numerous prominent Revolutionary War members of that South Carolina family, was born 2/25 1746 and died 8/16. 1825. He was a member of the First Provincial Congress in S.C. and served in the Continental Army as Washington's Aide at Brandywine and Germantown. Captured by the British when Charleston tell to them in 1780, he was exchanged in 1782 and promoted to Brig. Gen in 1783. He served in the Constitutional Convention in 1787 and was appointed Minister to France in 1796 and was later involved in the XYZ Affair**. He was an unsuccessful Federalist candidate for VP in 1800 and for President in 1804 and 1808. C.C. Wright is known to have done his earliest work in Charleston itself, and he probably prepared dies for a medal shortly after Pinckney's death. The only illustration of this piece known to us at the moment was in the 1 1940 Coin Collector's Journal in soft medal, with the comment that the dies were never used (i.e., probably never hardened). The present piece differs from the illustrated one in several details of the portraiture (this one is more delicately done) and even more so in the legend which is reduced on the other piece to "Charles Coalesworth Pinckney" without rank and with a series of stars below the hust, with Wright's name in smaller letters. This may be the only surviving piece from the original obverse design

2413 1847. Washington Allston/American Art Union. J.PE-3, Copper. 64mm, by C.C. Wright. Original Dies, AU.

Finely detailed high relief bust right woman leaning on American shield and crowning artists. Ohverse and reverse designs by P. P. Duggan, engraved by Wright. This piece is part of a short (3-piece) series by Wright for the Art Union, struck in the year they are dated and distributed to members. There are two different reverse dies for the Allston issue, this one is the "large date" with hyphen heliween Art and Union; the "small date" has no hyphen. Combined mintage for the two reverses was only some 250 copies. (The next two in the series, Gilbert Stuari and John Fruinhull, had mintages of about 200 each). Deep brown finish, an attractive specimen showing one of the most influential artists in early 19th Century America.

2414 (1851), Henry Clay, J.PE-7, Coppet, 90mm, by C.C. Wright AU.

Fine hust left in wreath his career from 1806 to the Compromise of 1850 in a wreath of corn, tohacco, etc. Rich deep brown-mahogany finish, slight flattening on hair from being displayed with reverse up, some pinscratching on obverse. In throken, case of issue

Superb portrait hust right/globe on column in foreground, huildings in the background, the column (probably representing the Union) laheled on base "I Still Live", the surrounding legend reading "Liherty and Union. Now and Forever. One and Inseparable". Lovely brown-mahogany finish, minor tics in obverse field and rims, superb reverse from the die with legend extending far down onto ground. The reverse is hightly symbolic of the two great oratorical efforts of Webster during his long and distinguished career; the strong defence of the Union against Sen. Hayne of South Carolina in 1830, and his decisive pro-Union speech in favor of the Compromise of 1850. Henry Clay's greatest work. Wright probably cut the dies shortly after Webster's death in 1852, just about the same time as he did the ones for the Henry Clay medals (both of these statemen died in the same year). Though Julian mentions that "it is said that only two silver medals were struck", the earliest auction record known to us - Bangs 6/6/ 1855, #153 & 160 - claims a total of four in silver. Copper strikes are very scarce indeed, and we would estimate survivors at under 50 pieces in all conditions.

2417 (1852). Daniel Webster, J.PE-37. Gutta Percha, 77mm, by C.C. Wright. Original Dies. EF.

Excellent portrait bust right/globe on column, buildings. The reverse variety with the legend reaching far into the ground line. Some wear and a past cleaning; red-brown obverse, blackish reverse. First we have seen in this material.

2418 (1858). Cyrus W. Field from A Few Friends in New York. White metal, 51mm, by G.H. Lovett. AU.

Bust right in wreath/inscription in and around wreath. Diagonally bisecting die break on reverse (which is the die without the date, probably replaced shortly after this piece was struck by the one with the date 1858). Slight darkening, minor edge dings as usual with this soft metal.

THE RAREST CYRUS FIELD MEDAL

2419 **1867.** The State of Wisconsin to Cyrus W, Field, Copper, 65mm, by Borrel (Paris), struck by Tiffany. Handsome EF+-AU. (Photo)

Bust left, "To Cyrus W. Field The Original Projector Of The Atlantic Telegraph"/arms of Wisconsin, "From the State of Wisconsin/Perseverantia Vincit". Light friction on the highest points, rich deep brown finish elsewhere, minor rim tics. Like the huge U.S. Mint issue J.PE-10 - this issue was prepared after the successful laying of the cable in 1866 by the Great Eastern (following the difficulties of the 1857-8 attempts). Our records show only 3 auction appearances, all in copper: Cogan/Lefferts in 1878; Frossard/Wood in 1884; and Chapman/Ramsden in 1892. The strike run was presumably very small aside from a presentation piece (gold?), and most of them probably wound up in non-Numisnatic hands in Wisconsin A rare opportunity!

2420 ND (ca. 1860), Washington Irving Medal, White metal, 68mm, by A.I. Henning, Prooflike AU. (Photo)

Excellent high relief bust of the famous author left/in a wreath. "Washington Irving Born April 3, 1783. Died November 28, 1859" Irving, born in New York City, was one of the hest known and best loved authors of his day in America; he is remembered most frequently today for his "Rip Van Winkle" and "Legend of Sleepy Hollow" stories, though he wrote a great deal of essays, satires, and travel works as well as a 5-volume biography of George Washington. He served in American legation abroad and was our Minister to Spain in 1842-46 His estate, "Sunnyside", is near Tarrytown on the Hudson River, and the town of Irvington-on-Hudson next door to it is named for him (Ed Froassard, one of the major 19th Century numismatic auction cataloguers, was the first Town Clerk there!) This commemorative medal, done by Henning of New York, was certainly produced shortly after frying's death; the earliest auction record known to us was Woodward's 10/18/1864 Sale. It was struck in silver (apparently only 2 specimens, no public sale known since 1925), copper, and white metal. All are extremely searce. This piece has light indescent toning, a slight scull area on shoulder, and rim nicks.

GROLIER CLUB "WASHINGTON IRVING" PLAQUE

2421 1907. Washington Irving Plaque, Copper, 180mm, by Henry Kirke Bush-Brown, AU. (Photo)

Fine portrait of Irving thinking, arms of New York at left, rooster weathervane to the right, artist's monogram below hand; reverse reads (incuse) "St. Nicolas Soc. Dec. 6, 1907". Handsome deep brown finish, complete with ring on reverse for wall hanging. One of the very limited issues of the Grolier Cluh of New York, and a particularly appropriate one since Irving's home is only a few miles up the Hudson from NYC.

ARTIST'S PORTRAIT

2422 1888. John Sartain/Monument Cemetary 50th Anniv. Copper. 58mm, unsigned. Prooflike Choice AU.

Fine bearded head right/inscription. Sartain, 1808-97, moved from London to America in 1830 and shortly hegan receiving important commissions to engrave prints after lamous paintings. He introduced pictorial illustration as a major feature in American periodicals, and was a pioneer in mezzotint engraving. He worked mostly in Philadelphia. We have seen a similar medal with a blank cartouche below the bust (instead of the date) and an 1893-dated Philadelphia reverse. Handsome red-brown finish, minor nicks.

COMMEMORATIVE MEDALS

2423 (1776). Benjamin Franklin/American Beaver. J.CM-8. Bronzed electro, 41mm, by John Reich. AU.

Deep chocolate brown, nice bust of Frankling/heaver gnawing tree. One of the real rarities, which doubtless explains the existence of an electro. Missing in Kessler-Spangenberger in any form.

Both inscribed around reverse: "PRESENTED BY THE HOLLAND SOCIETY OF NEW YORK JANUARY 1904 (1905)." Both prooflike with reddish brown finish ("Commerce" has more red) and hoth have a moderate amount of tiny rim nicks and minor surface marks. Two very nice looking reproductions

LIBERTAS PATTERN

ERIE CANAL - IN SILVER!

2426 1826. Completion of the Eric Canal, HK-I, Silver, 44mm, by C.C. Wright. In box of issue. Nicely toned Proof. (Photo)

Designed by Robertson and engraved by Charles Cushing Wright, this medal was prepared for the great celebration in New York City in early 1826 to commemorate completion after 8 years of labor of the Eric Canal which linked the Hudson River and Lake Eric and permitted rapid and inexpensive travel and shipping to and from the midwestern states. The obverse shows Pan seated on a cornucopia lifled with the fruits of the land, his arm around Neptune who is seated by the ocean, the reverse shows the New York coat of arms surmounted by an eagle on a half globe, flanked by a view of Castle William with a ship before it on the right, and the western end of the Canal on the left, an inscription above dating the course of the project and another below declaring the piece a presentation by the City of New York. Electric blue and violet toning, well mirrored fields, inscratching on rims where it was removed at times in the past from its close-fitting two-piece wooden box (which was made from wood brought by the "Seneca Chief", the first canal boat to make the passage). The hox itself contains top and bottom paper labels on the occasion, as is often the case, a piece of the thin edge of the box has broken off from the pressure of prying the medal out carelessly, but it has been reglued and is complete. The completion of the Canal was of immense importance in the development of our nation, as well as to the rise to dominance of New York as the major port city on the East Coast. We would estimate the surviving population of silver specimens of this medal in all conditions at 20-25 pieces (perhaps 8-10 of them still in the boxes of issue), and the white metal ones at perhaps 80-100 with about 20-30 in hoxes. One of the original gold strikes (the only survivor of which we have record) was presented to Andrew Jackson and sold in 1925 in the famous W.W.C. Wilson Collection auction.

ERIE CANAL MEDAL IN BOX

2427 **1826.** Completion of the Eric Canal. HK-I. White metal, 44mm, by C.C. Wright. In box of issue. AU.

Designs as fast (same dies), and in an identical type of wooden box with the paper labels, a couple of pieces of the vertical rim of the bottom box broken off. The medal shows some friction on Pan's knee and that of the eagle, though this may be partly due to striking weakness; the rest of the details are clear and sharp. There are a few faint lines on the reverse, probably from a pin used to pry the piece out of the box. Overall a nice specimen of this important meadal,

A FINAL ERIE CANAL MEDAL

2428 **1826.** Completion of the Eric Canal, HK-I. White metal, 44mm, by C.C. Wright, EF/VF,

Designs as last, no box. Obverse in nice shape with light friction, the devices outlined by prooflike field areas; the reverse, which is, as usual, convex, shows more wear since the attractive obverse design is the one usually shown when the piece is resting in a tray (though the wear is essentially confined too the eagle's breast and the upper part of the globe, with all lower details sharp). A quite acceptable specimen, especially with the P/L areas outlining legends and devices.

ARCHITECTURAL MEDAL

The Crystal Palace building, names of the designing architects Carstensen & Gildemeister on ground fine/Liberty seated with shield and cap on pole, Latin inscription around "Science and the Arts will flourish in the inity of nations." POLICE "DOLLAR"

View of the Crystal Palace in NY, "Crystal Palace Police" engraved around, obverse rotated double struck/ten flags of participating countries. US shield in center, names of all participating nations around above flags. Was obviously originally mounted in a ring-mount for wear as an official badge by the police on duty at the great Exhibition. First we have handled.

THE GREAT "NATIONAL MEDALLION"

2432 Ca. 1860. "The National Medallion". Copper shell plaque 315x412mm! EF+. (Photo)

A huge, deep-dished electrotype - as were all of these - leaturing at center the C.C. Wright "Declaration" medal and the "Washington Before Boston", above these the complete text of the Declaration, below them a complete history of the Revolution and the Presidents down to Buchanan (1857-61), the four corners showing a Feuchtwanger-like eagle, the Libertas Americana obverse, a flag, and a Union-type shield. Broad outside rim for attaching to wall or frame. An exceptional piece of work, unsigned, undoubtedly put out in the last phases of the pre-Civil War attempts to keep the Union together. First we have ever had the chance of handling.

Superh Iron rearing up from a prone position, his foot on an arrow, walls of Belfort on cliffs hehind him. A rare and handsome piece by the designer of the Statue of Liberty, his only medallic work listed in Forrer (and even there only in the Supplement).

Belfort is a fortified city in Alsace on eastern France, which commands the "Burgundy Gate" between the Vosges and Jura mountains and dominates the road systems linking France, Germany and Switzerland. During the Franco-Prussian War of 1870-71 it held up the Germans during a siege that lasted 108 days. In recognition of the heroism of the defenders, the Germans left Belfort in French hands when they annexed the rest of Alsace in 1871. The siege was commemorated by the construction of an immense statue - 36 feet high and 72 leet long - of The Lion of Belfort, designed by Bartholdi and itself commemorated on this plaquette.



Bust left of Longstreth." Awarded by the Franklin Institute", wreath below, center blank, Light toning, scattered marks. This is only the second specimen we can recall seeing; the other was also unawarded. In sequence, we should place this medal after Julian's AM-22 (the 1848-dated Elliott Cresson piece of the Institute), but it does not seem to have been struck at the U.S. Mint.

2508 ND (ca. 1900?) American Kennel Club Medal. Silver, 48mm, unsigned. AU.

> Initials of organization at center, name and founding date around/ hranch with herries at left, at right "Awarded to Champion Kis-A-Wa-Wa No. 134830", the number being the dog's AKC registration. Partial gold and blue toning.

INDIAN PEACE MEDALS

2509 (1829). Andrew Jackson. J.1P-15. Copper, 62mm, by Furst & Reich. Original Dies. Choice AU.

Broken "R" in Furstreverse die type of 1809 with pointed "A's". Very deep chocolate hrown, the finish used in the 1860's-1870's, a sharp strike with a tew minor nicks. The Kessler-Spangenherger specimen of IP-15 had the later reverse type of 1846.

2510 (1850). Millard Fillmore. J.1P-31. Copper, 62mm, by Ellis & Willson. Original Dies. Choice AU. (Photo)

Deep red-mahogany finish, obverse die with rust mark behind neck and raised die line in lower right field, reverse with raised die lines ahove and right of Virtue link and a die break across Indian's lelt foot and ankle, very slight toning hreaks on highest points, excellent surfaces. Superior to the Kessler-Spangenherger specimen (Lot 1622).

2511 (1857). James Buchanan/Old Reverse. J.IP-36. Copper, 76mm. by Ellis and Willson. AU.

Reddish-hrown finish of the early 1890's, scattered light marks and a hairline scratch on obverse

Bust right/settler and Indian by cabin (same reverse used on all the oval pieces from Hayes through Harrison). Medium tannish-hrown "coin linish" typical of the 1880's, and quite possibly one of the initial 37 pieces struck in 1883. Total copper mintage was only 69 pieces 1883-1903, and it is helieved that only 6 silvers were struck. Lacking in the great Kessler-Spangenherger offering.

Total copper mintage only 55 pieces, and only 12 were struck in silver. Missing in the Kessler-Spangenberger Sale.

2514 Ca. 1920's. Indian Peace Medals selection, late-date strikes. Bronze; 76mm. 8 Pcs.

(1797.) John Adams (J.IP-1) AU+(2), very light friction on revhigh spots of each, one with minor nick on either rim. (1801.) Thomas Jefferson. (J.IP-3.) Unc., numerous tarnish freckles, hoth sides (1809.) James Madison. (J.IP-5.) AU, widely scattered tiny handling marks. (1845.) James K. Polk. (J.IP-24.) Unc., darkening slightly (1849.) Zachary Taylor. (J.IP-27.) AU, very light triction on rev. (1853.) Franklin Pierce (J.IP-32.) Unc., darkening slightly. (1857.) James Buchanan. (J.IP-34.) AU, some friction on high points of either side.

> Bust left in uniform/view of this classic naval battle. Lovely deep redmahogany finish, fields semi-prooflike, a touch of friction on high points of hair from displaying the piece with the battle scene up. Total copper mintage 1861-1903 was only 126 pieces.

Fine hust right in uniform/the ship combat, with American sailors storming onto the British ship which is lowering its colors. Medium brown finish with a touch of tan, a couple of tiny marks. Copper mintage 92 specimens.


2520 (1813). James Lawrence for the Victory of the "Hornet" over the "Peacock". J.NA-14. Copper, 65mm. by Moritz Furst, Original Dies, Sharp AU.

Bust right in uniform/boat from the American ship approaching the sinking British ship. Light reddish "coin finish", from the original dies with long vertical diehreak down hust and a long horizontal diebreak across reverse; these dies had to be replaced in 1868 due to breakup, only 45 copper specimens having heen struck from them between 1861 and 1866.

LOF 34 STRUCK

2521 (1814). Thomas MacDonough for the Victory on Lake Champlain. J.NA-15. Copper, 65mm, by Furst/Barber. 1878 Dies, Choice AU.

Bust right in uniform/view of the fleet engagement at the mouth of Plattshurgh Bay where the British fleet was decisively defeated and the threat of invasion ended Reddish-mahogany finish, couple of darker spots on reverse. From the replacement dies made by Charles Barher in 1878, only 34 copper specimens were struck from these before the yellow bronze strikes again.

Bust right in uniform wreath for inscription. Eight brownish "coin finish" with light overlay of blue-violet, fields semi-prooflike. Only 23 pieces were struck from this die pair in copper.

2523 (1815). Charles Stewart for the Victory of the Constitution over the "Levant" and the "Cyane". J.NA-23. Copper. 65mm, by Moritz Furst. Original Dies, Unc.

Bust half right in uniform:Constitution opening fire on the Levant while the Cyane tries to get hack into the fight. Nice medium red-mahogany finish, semi-prooflike fields, some small marks in lower reverse. Copper mintage only 80 pieces 1861-1903.

2524 (1846). Loss of the Brig Somers off Vera Cruz. J.NA-24. Copper. 56mm. by C.C. Wright. Original Dies. AU. (Photo)

Excellent close-up view of the Somers lying over on her heam ends in a stormy seardistance view of the same with lifehoats bearing English. French and Spanish flags hastening to the rescue. Though Boh Julian provides excellent data on the problems of die preparation and striking of this issue, and Capt. Failor gives a very short description of the event itself, the full story seems worthy of recording. We were able to consult the copy of "Service Afloat and Ashore During the Mexican War" at the Library of Congress; this volume, published in 1851, is the autobiography of Lt. Raphael Semmes, Commander of the Somers at the time of the sinking, aide to Gen. Worth during the later march on Mexico City, and Captain of the famous CSA raider "Alahama" during the Civil War.

-From the earliest period of the Mexican War, the U.S. Navy set up a blockade at the harbor of Vera Cruz. In October of that year, Lt. Semmes replaced Commander Duncan Ingraham (for whose later activities see J NA-26 in this sale) as commander of the Somers on blockade duty. In November, Commodore Conner, head of the blockading force, left the Somers and a few other ships to cover Vera Cruz while he and the rest went north to seize Tampico Bay as a staging area for the forthcoming campaign against Mexico City under Scott. On 8 December, the Somers spotted a sail and proceeded north along Green Island in anticipation of intercepting a blockade runner: it turned out, however, to he another American hrig which was just arriving and which was to relieve the Somers on blockade duty the next morning. As the Somers proceeded south again, another sail was spotted and they turned to pursue it. Just as they were changing course with all sail set, a violent "norther" - a sudden heavy gale from the north - struck the ship without warning and heeled it flat over amongst the high waves. Semmes' report on the accident was written on Dec. 10 Irom the Frigate Raritan at Anton Lizardo (harbor south of Vera Cruz and the main squadron base) to Commodore M.C. Perry (cf. J.PE-26 this sale) who had replaced Conner in overall command. He reported that the crew managed to launch only a single lifehoat which was sent to Green Island with Midshipman Clark, the Purser, the Surgeon, and 17 men. The rest leaped or were knocked into the water as the ship sank in only 10 minutes (we suspect all the gun ports may have heen open); these included Semmes and Lt Parker, both clinging to pieces of the upper batch gratings, which floated Clark managed to land the men on Green Island, then took the boat out again against heavy waves and rescued Semmes. Parker, and one other man, landed them, then went out once more hut could find no other survivors. Lt. Claihorne was able to cling to a small hatch cover and was washed ashore violently over the rocks. Meanwhile the "observing" British, French and Spanish crews off the islands of Los Sacrificios launched lifeboats in the heavy storm and managed to rescue another 14 members of the Somers' crew Losses were half of the 76-man crew. The gold medals struck were presumably for Officers involved in the rescue; the silvers for the crew members of the lifehoats. Semines listed the Captains and the foreign ships involved. Capt. Lambert of the English frigate Endymion; Capt. Frankland of the English corvette Alarm: Commander Maison of the Linglish brig Daring, Capt. Duhut of the French brig Mercure, Capt. Labredoyaire of the French Brig Pylade, and Capi. Puente of the Spanish corvette Luisa Fernandez. Not only was Semmes exonerated of all blame in the loss of the Somers, but was soon promoted to Flag Lt of the Home Squadron (which was running the blockade); oddly enough his roomate on the Raritan after the Somers sank was later to he the commander of the Kearsage which sank Semmes' "Alabama' off France in 1864"

—Total copper mintage of the Somers medal was only 90 pieces 1861-1903. The present specimen has a deep brown-mahogany finish with some light scratches in the upper reverse field and a few rim scratches hut with the close-up obverse in excellent condition

2525 (1854), To Commodore Matthew C. Perry for Opening Trade with Japan, J.PE-26. Copper, 65mm, by F.N. Mitchell. Original Dies. AU,

Magnificent high-relief head left/wreath around inscription with a crown of ship sails at the hottoin. Perry, who had taken over the naval forces operating against Vera Cruz in 1846, during the Mexican War, and had heen in naval command at the amphibious landings against the city, was in command of the famous expedition in 1854 which opened up trade relations with the Japanese. This piece has deep brown finish with no trace of red, though there is a darker coating on parts of it. Copper mintage only 146.

2526 (1854). Commander Duncan Ingraham for the Rescue of Martin Koszta, J.NA-26. Copper, 105mm, by Eastman & Cross/Eastman & Longacre. Original Dies. Choice AU.

Koszta, a refugee Hungarian Revolutionary who had applied for American citizenship, was captured by Austrian authorities in 1853 and placed on the Austrian brig "Hussar" at Smyrna preparatory to being shipped hack to Austria for trial. Commander Ingraham demanded his release, which was eventually obtained without a naval battle through tactful negotiations. The obverse of the piece shows the ships at Smyrna, with Ingraham's party in a gig appraching the Austrian ship to make their demand; the reverse contains the Congressional inscription in a wreath with an eagle on anchor at hottom surrounded by 31 stars (proper for a date in the 1853-4 period). Deep red-mahogany finish, a couple of minor nicks and some rim dings, excellent condition for a specimen of one of the 5 largest medals ever struck at the Mint in the 19th Century! Copper mintage was only 149 pieces, and the piece currently produced by the Mint is a 3-inch (76mm) reduction.

Sweden & Norway to U.S. Admiral

2527 1882. Rear Admiral J.W.A. Nicholson from Oscar II of Sweden & Norway. Copper, 55mm, by Lea Ahlborn. Prooflike Choice AU. Plate.

Head of Oscar II right/presentation inscription on the Admiral's services to Swedish and Norwegian subjects during the bombardment of Alexandrai (Egypt) in July. James William Augustus Nicholson (1821-87) was an Officer on the Powhatan during the effort to relieve Fort Sumter in 1861, and served at the successful naval attacks on Port Royal (SC), Jacksonville (FL), Mobile Bay (AL), and other actions during the Civil War; he retired in 1883 as Rear Admiral. He was the grandson of Samuel Nicholson, first Commander of the U.S.S. Constitution and senior officer in the Navy hefore his death in 1811; likewise, he was the great-nephew of James Nicholson, sentor officer of the U.S. Navy from 1778 until his retirement. The events in Alexandria, Egypt, which led to this medal's award to him stemmed from the British involvement in Egypt after Ismail Pasha's 1875 sale to them of Egypt's share of the Suez Canal and their subsequent acquisition of control over Egypt's shaky finances. In 1881, a nationalist cabinet took power in Egypt following an anti-foreign rehellion: the British and French forced the ouster of this cabinet in early 1882 and held naval demonstrations off Alexandria in May and June. During the latter month, rioting swept the city, and, on July 11, the British homharded the city, landed, and occupied it. We suspect Admiral Nicholson provided protection for civilians (and perhaps Emhassy personnel) from Sweden. Norway, and other neutral countries during the lighting. The piece is prooflike, red with some light hlue and violet toning, and shows slight friction above the ear from constant display with the important legend side up. The only specimen we have ever seen or heard of!

Named Dewey Medal

2528 1898, Medal to Sailors at Manila Under Dewey, Copper, 45mm, by D.C. French, With hanger and ribbon, VF-EF,

Large bust of Dewey right in uniform, legend and symbols in field/sailor with flag seated on a naval gim, legend around, plaque at his feet engraved "U.S.S. Concord". Edge engraved "John A. Plumber Boatswam's Mate 2nd Class". Top hanger has eagle between sword hift and olive branch; dark green and yellow tibbon hangs down behind. Edge dent at bottom where dropped. These medals were engraved with the name of ship and recipient, a time-consuming process. We have seen a few, and pictures of others, but this is the first one we have actually handled at auction.

2529 1898-9. Group of 3 Dewey Mcdals.

All bronzed copper. 1) ¼ facing bust/angel w/2 cherubs. 32mm, by Aliesky, EF. 2) Bust rt. in uniform/the Olympica. 35mm, unsigned, Unc. 3) Similar but larger view of the ship, 36mm, unsigned, "Olympia" uniface hanger. Unc.

2530 1899. Group of 4 Dewey Medals.

All brass, one in copper frame, 2 enameled, 2 with ribbons, one for the National Peace Jubilee in Washington, two with "Olympia" on reverse, 1 uniface. AU-Unc.

2531 1936. Medal on Launching of U.S.S. Brooklyn. Bronze, oval 74 x 80mm. AU.

View of the ship in rope border, anchor behind. Uniface.

2532 1917-1919. Pair of original National Geographic issues.

1) October, 1917; the "Flag Number" with 1197 flags in color and 300 more in B&W, as well as articles on the subject and an illustrated article on Insignia of the Uniformed Forces. Cover frayed, contents in good shape. 2) December, 1919; The Romance of Military Insignia, and American Decorations and Insignia of Honor and Service (119 color illustrations). Very nice condition.

2532A "1756". Col. Armstrong/Kittanning Destroyed. J.M1-33. Copper, 45mm, by Edward Duffield. Original Dies. Choice AU.

Scene of the destruction of the Indian village of Kittanning/arms of Philadelphia. One of 50 coppers struck from the very heavily broken original dies in 1861-1864, with the die scratch down through the right side of the 6 in the date: dies greatly bulged, heavy die crack vertically down to center obverse, massively branched reverse break. Rich red-mahogany finish, doubtless Paquet's bronzing formula.

2533 (1777). Horation Gates For Defeat of Burgoyne. J.M1-2. Copper, 56mm, by M. Gutteaaux. Original Obverse, New Reverse. Choice AU.

Bust left/scene of Burgoyne's surrender at Saratoga. Handsome red mahogany finish used in the early 1890's, probably one of the 10 pieces struck in 1893-4, the first year of use of the new reverse die (the original broke). Only 32 pieces in copper struck from this die pair before the yellow bronze mintages began, less than half the mintage (76 pieces) made with the old reverse die.

Early Comitia Americana

2534 (1781). Congress to John Egar Howard for Victory at Cowpens. J.MI-9. Copper, 46mm, by DuVtvter Original Dies, EF, (Plate)

A strike made about 1800: die rust marks only slightly more advanced than on the 1790-struck silver specimen in Mass. Hist. Soc. (George Washington's own set), and no edge marking. Light wear on the figures, mostly a break in the medium brown finish. Howard from Maryland, led the main bayonet charge at the Battle of Cowpens in 1781 which broke Tarleton's line and sent the British fleeing in deteat, seriously damaging Conrwallis's plans for capturing the South

Lafayette Medal

2535 1824. Lafayette the Defender of American and French Liberty. Copper, 46mm, by Caunois. Prooflike Unc.

Excellent bust of Lafayette to right/inscription in oak wreath "Coin finish, light golden-brown with deeper bust, overtones of blue-violet prooflike fields. A lovely piece, struck in France with English legends at the time of Lafayette's last visit to the United States in 1824. One of the finest portrait issues of the famous friend of American Independence. In blue and gift cardboard box, probably original.

2536 (1814). Gen. Alexander Macomh for Battle of Plattshurgh. J.M1-16. Copper, 65mm, by Moritz Furst. Original Dies. Sharp AU.

Bust right in uniform/fantastic scene of the land and sea battle with cavalry and infrantry fighting by the bridge, the town burning, ships dueling, etc. One of Furst's best efforts! Handsome medium brown finish, fields fairly prooflike, a scuff below epaulette, superb reverse Copper mintage only 133 pieces 1861-1903.

2537 (1814). Gen. Peter B. Porter for Battles of Chippewa, Niagara, and Erie. J.M1-18. Copper, 65mm, by Moritz Furst. Original Dies, Prooflike Unc.

Superb strike, excellent surfaces, handsome light reddish-brown finish, highly reflective fields. Copper mintage only 100 pieces 1861-1903.

2538 (1813). Governor Isaac Shelby for Battle of Thames. J.MI-21. Copper, 65mm, by Moritz Furst. Original Dies. Prooflike Unc.

Fine bust right in uniform/magnificent scene of the Battle with the death of Tecumseh at the hands of Richard N. Johnson at the right center. Beautiful medium brown-mahogany finish, excellent surfaces, light blue overtoning. Copper mintage only 94 pieces 1861-1904

2539 (1846). Zachery Taylor for Monterey. J.MI-23. Copper. 64mm, by John T. Battin (Obv.) Original Dies. Unc.

Bust right in uniform/legend in wreath. Deep red-mahogany finish, excellent surfaces, a very pleasing specimen.

2540 (1848). Zachery Taylor for Buena Vista. J.M1-24. Copper, 90mm, by C.C. Wright. Original Dies. Sharp AU.

Bust right above crossed branches/panoramic view of battle within a wreath formed by Iwo snakes. Medium brownish-tan finish, mitnor nicks, friction on car and point of shoulder from display with the scenic side up. A magnificently detailed view of the battle with light artillary, cavalry, staff officers, etc., all clearly defined.

2541 (1848). Maj. Gen. Winfield Scott - Six Battles. J.MI-26. Copper, 90mm, by C.C. Wright, Original Dies. AU.

Bust left beneath ribbon views of six major battles in the march on Mexico City, with the City itself in the center. Deep brown-mahogany finish, scattered smalll nicks and a spot at 1 00 reverse; the usual light friction spot above earl from resting on that side most of the time, museum acquisition number "483" in left obverse field. One of the most elaborate reverses in the entire Mint Medal series!

Named Mexican Veterans Medal

2542 1876. Mexican Veterans Association Shield Medal. J.CM-31. Copper, 53 x 57mm, unsigned. Original Die. AU, (Plate)

The shield border contains the names of 8 major battles (2 of them misspelled: Cherubusco & Chepultepec) while the main devices include symbols of Infantry, Artillary and Navy over symbols of Mexico, the ribbon at the bottom of the wreath bearing the names of Scott, Perry, and Taylor (Perry being Matthew C. Perry, Commander of naval forces at the Vera Cruz landings). The top hanger has the name of the organization and the label "Patented March 7th, 1876"; the two parts are connected by a red, white and blue ribbon. The reverse of the shieldkl is engraved to "Joseph Rouse, 5th Louisiana Infantry". Though some 4500 pieces were made by the Mint, few seem to have survived; this is the first one we have seen offered in several years. Our earliest record of an auction appearance was in W. Elliott Woodward's 11/1878 Holland Collection Sale, engraved to "Caspar Beckman, 4th Inf." The pieces themselves, as far as is known to us, were struck from melted down Mexican cannon brought back from the War years helfore as trophies; it took until 1876 to get Presidential authority to get the guns from the various military posts where they were displayed!

Another Named Mexican Veterans Medal

2543 1874? Mexican Veterans Associations Shield Medal, Silver, 31 x 33mm, unsigned. Holed as issued. F-VF,

This was the first shield medal type, adopted at the first meetingk of the Association and bearing the same design as the later large copper ones, including the 29 stars representing the number of states in the Union during the Mexican War. It was abandoned a year or so later in favor of the striking of a much larger piece made from Mexican cannon. They were suspended from a ribbon and hanger for wear, though this specimen lacks those. The reverse is engraved to "Ben. F. Egan. Lieut., 4th Kentucky Infantry". A rare issue, of which we have no 20th Century auction records at hand; most were probably melted for their silver value after the larger copper ones were struck.

Awarded New York Mexican Veterans Medal

2544 ND (1848). New York City to the N.Y. Regiment of Volunteers, Silver, 51mm, by C.C. Wright. Prooflike AU. (Plate)

Arms of New York City supported by sailor and Indian, engraved to "Joseph Fly, Company I"/Columbia about to hurl stylized thunderbolt at city of Vera Cruz, Mexico City faint in the distance among mountains. Electric blue, violet, and rose-gold toning, slight striking weakness at very centers as usual, some light marks. The New York Regiment fought throughout the campaign from the Vera Cruz amphibious landing to the final conquest of Mexico City. It formed part of Gen. Shields' Brigade, as did the Palmetto Regiment from South Carolina Those two regiments led the final assault against Chapultepec, and they quarreled for more than a decade about which one's men had been the first over the wall. Of all the volunteer regiments in the Mexican War, these two alone had major medals prepared for them: the present issue for the NY men and the "Palmetto Regiment Medal" for their southern rivals. A few hundred pieces were awarded in each case, all in silver; unawarded silver and copper Proofs are also known of each medal. The NY pieces included the name of the Company to which the recipient belonged; these range from "A" to "K", though as yet we have no record of a "B" (No "J" Company was included). This is the first specimen your cataloguer has had the pleasure of auctioning since 1978. Our researches to date have located 28 different named pieces in numismatic channels at auction or in FPL's dating from 1862 to 12/1983; 5 of those have appeared kmore than once during the past 120 years. We suspect that the majority of these are currently in "military collector" channels and are not passing through normal numismatic sales, though some may have been destroyed with the passing of the years. An important medallic record from a tumultuous period in American history!

The Greatest Mexican War Artillerist

2545 **1848.** Citizens of New York to Brevet Col. James Duncan. Copper, 53mm, by C.C. Wright. AU. (Plate)

Bust of Duncan right within circle of the names of his Mexican War hattles. long die break (as always) down the bust/inscription from New York to him on Dec. 28, 1848, within a circle of his further hattles. Light friction on hair, "coin" (niish with light, slightly irregular brownish toning. A rare and interesting medal, for which we have only 13 anction records since 1859 (8 in copper, 4 in white metal, 1 in silver—which was last seen in 1883).

Rare Fort Sumter Connected Medal

2546 1860. Washington Light Infantry, South Carolina. White metal, 38mm, by Robert Lovett. Prooflike Unc. (Plate)

S.C. arms over "W.L.1/Capt. Simonton/144 men/4th July/1806" within a ribbon headed "22d Feb'y 1807" and bearing the names of previous commanders; the reverse, modeled after the 1803 Washington "Fame" medal, shows Fame flying left with trumpet and inscribing "Washington" on a cloud, "Virtue and Valor" above, "W.L.1" below. Prooflike fields with light sculling, frosty devices, some reverse rim spots.

—The Washington Light Infantry was one of the militia units which were formed on the eastern seaboard following the attack of the British ship "Leopard" on the U.S. ship "Chesapeake" on 22 June 1807, one of the great "impressment of American seamen" incidents which fed to the War of 1812; many of these units took Washington's birthday as their "fictitious" founding date. The names on the ribbon on this piece are those of. William Lowndes, first Captain. Speaker of the House in 1820: Cross; William Crafts; S. Lewis Simons; W.H. Miller; Gilchrist; Henry Ravenel of the old Carolina family of that name; B.M. Lee; William Jervey; W.D. Porter; Joseph Walker who led the Company as part of the Palmetto Regiment during the Mexican War; and L.M. Hatch, Simonton's predecessor. The unit is the ancestor of today's 118th Infantry Regiment.

—Capt. Simonton and his Company were guarding the Arsenal in Charleston, S.C., during the tense Fall of 1860 to prevent Union removal of the weapons stored there. On Christmas Eve, 1860, Governor Pickens detailed them to board small steamers and patrol Charleston Harbor in order to prevent Major Anderson of the Union forces from transferring his men to Fort Sumter from the less defensible Fort Moultrie. His failure to intercept Anderson led to the siege and eventual firing upon Fort Sumter.

—The medal is important in another way: it has been asserted in the past that the "Confederate Cent" was made by Lovett entirely on his own as a speculative design since he was not known to have had any formal contact with any of the southern groups. This medal, engraved and struck in the summer of 1860 when secession was already in the wind, provides evidence of a direct link into official groups in South Carolina.

—A rare piece, for which we have only about a dozen auction records since 1873, alamost all of them for copper strikes (which are usually looped for wearing).

The Great Fort Sumter Medal

2547 ND (early 1864?) Citizens of New York City to Major Robert Anderson. Silvered white metal, 70mm, by G.H. Lovett. AU. (Plate)

View of Fort Sumter under bombardment, flag flying amidst the clouds of powder smoke, etc., dates of the bombardment below/in a wreath with shield at bottom "Prudens. Fidelis et Audax. Invictae Fidelitatis Praemium" over an arc of 35 stars enclosing "To Maj. Robert Anderson, U.S.A. from the Citizens of New York City as a Slight Tribute to his Patriotism". Somewhat prooflike fields with a darker patch in obverse upper field where the silver plating has worn off; various light rim tics.

—Anderson was born in 1805 and graduated West Point in 1825. He fought in the Seminole and Mexican Wars (being wounded in the latter). Following the siege of Fort Sumter he was made a Brigadier General in May, 1861, and served during the next 2½ years of the Civil War, resigning in October 1863; in February, 1865, he was brevetted a Major General for his gallant defense of the Fort, and was brought by the Army to Fort Sumter when it was again in Union hanads to raise the Union flag over it once more. The circle of 35 stars on the medal indicates that it was made in late 1863 or early 1864 (after the admission of West Virginia but before that of Nevada), which fits in well with a visit by Anderson to NYC after his retirement from active duty in Ociober of 1863.

—This medal is rare in white metal (we have only some 18 auction records since 1864), extremely rare in copper (only 5 records for the same period), and prohibitively rare in silver (only 2 or 3 struck, four auction records 1864-1882, at least 3 of them the same piece!) It is by far the largest and most impressive of the medals on this first comhat of the Civil War.

Confederate Seal

2548 Post War Electrotype copy in gilt copper of the CSA Scal. In black Gutta-percha plush-lined fancy case. (Plate)

The original seal was authorized by a Join Resolution approved April 30, 1863. James M. Mason, Confederate Commissioner to London, approached Joseph S. Wyon, the Queen's Seal Maker and the seal and its supporting paraphenalia were completed and paid for on July 6, 1864. Unfortunately the equipment for using the seal was lost or went astray (the press is still a prized possession of a Bermuda family) and passed by Secretary of State Benjamin to the Bromwells who gave it to Colonel John T. Pickett (the Southern diplomatic agent who sold all the CSA diplomatic correspondence to the U.S. for \$75,000 in 1872.) As a gift, Pickett gave the seal to his negotiating partner, Captain, later Admiral Selfridge, but did borrow the seal hack and made a limited number of silver and a more numerous group of bronze seals (electrotypes of these last are considerable). The originat seal was ultimately hought for the Confederate Museum, where it reposes with the State Department, Treasury and Post Office seals.

The Only Congressional Medal of the Civil War

2549 (1863). U.S. Grant for Victories at Fort Donelson, Vicksburg, & Chattanooga. J.MI-29. Bronzed with white metal, 105mm, by Pacquet. Original Dies. AU.

Fine bust left in uniform surrounded at rim by wreaths and flags/superb scene of Commerce seated on a rainbow with eagle, shield, and cornucopia above view of Vicksburg and Chattanooga. Deep redmahogany finish, light spotting and a touch of friction on bust (indicating that the scenic side was usually displayed uppermost); a couple of light edge dings. The strike is extremely sharp, as one would expect of this softer metal. Today, only the 76mm reduction is available from the Mint.

2550 (1864). Gen. Ben Butler to Colored Troops Before Richmond in 1864. J.MI-30; Belden 5. Copper, 40mm, by A.C. Paquet. Original Dies. Prooflike Unc. (Plate)

> Two colored soldiers with rifles advancing against fortifications/inscription around and in oak wreath. This medal was specifically designed by Maj. Gen. Benjamin F, "Beast" Butler for presentation to colored soldiers in his Army of the James who had distinguished themselves in the attack on Newmarket Heights on 28 September 1864. Dies were engraved by Paquet and the medals were struck at the U.S. Mint during 1865: 197 in silver, 11 in copper. The silver pieces were intended for presentation and were mounted by an elaborate eagle claw on globe hanger suspended from a red, white and blue ribbon with a leaf-shaped top bar reading "Army of the James"; the mounting and ribbon were put on by a Boston jewelery firm of Bigelow and Kennard Butler himself presented most of the awarded pieces to the soldiers who had earned them. Auction records of the medal are very scanty indeed; in silver we know of only three appearances (1 with ribbon in an 1888 Woodward sale; 1 with ribbon awarded to Sgt. W.H. Thomas, Co. 1, 5th Reg't USCT in Stack's 3/73 "Massachusetts Historical Society Sale Lot 151"; one without ribbon, unholed, same sale, Lot 152; these last two are presumably from Appleton's collection); In copper the record is similar: 1 in the 1870 Longacre sale, then in the 10/4/1870 Mason auction whence it passed to Appleton, reappearing in Lot 152 of the Stack's 1973 "Mass, Ilist, sale together with the unawarded silver one; I appeared in the 1873 Isaac Wood Collection sale, reappearing in Frossard's 1884 Isaac Wood Collection sale, this quite possibly being the specimen which appeared as Lot 901 of the 1925 W W.C. Wilson Collection sale. It is quite possible that the awarded silver in the Appleton/Mass. Hist Soc. offering is the same piece as the 1888 Woodward specimen. As of 1912, the Mint Cabinet did not contain a specimen in either metal, nor was the medal ever restruck for sale to collectors. The present specimen is believed to be distinct from the Longacre/ Appleton piece and the Wilson piece. It is in "coin finish", i.e., not bronzed, has prooflike fields with a few minute nicks, and is developing a pale iridescent toning. In addition to being an extremely rare military medal, it is also, to the best of our knowledge, the only medal from the 19th Century struck by the U.S. Mint for award to colored troops. It is almost certainly the only medal ever designed by Ben Butler (whose name appears on the groundline as designer), one of the most colorful characters in the Civit War and a major political figure alterwards, a Radical Republican in Congress and one of the House managers of the Johnson impeachment trial, Governor of Massachusetts 1882-4, Presidential candidate of the Greenhack Party in 1884 Robert W. Julian reports that he is currently preparing an article for The Numismatist on this medal. A rare opportunity for a collector in any of the several numismatic fields!

General Meade Medal

2551 (1866). Maj. Gen. George G. Meade for Gettysburg Victory. J.PE-20. Bronzed white metal, 79mm, by Pacquet. Original Dies. AU.

Bare bust right in inscription on presentation by the Union League of Philadelphia and above the two stars of his rank/Columbia seated right with flag and Liberty Cap, placing a victor's wreath on the hill of the sword of Meade who stands facing her. Excellent strike, light friction on the high points, deep red-mahogany finish, some spotting on obverse. In many ways this medal may be considered a counterpart to the Congressional one given Grant for Vicksburg and Chattanoogadoubtless the Union League felt that the "savior of Pennsylvania" deserved a medal as well, and if Congress would not provide one, they would.

Fenian Movement - Irish Solidarity

2552 ND (ca. 1869). Fenian Medal on Boycott of English Goods. White metal, 38mm, unsigned. Prooflike EF+.

Eagle flying left, holding harp and ribbon labeted "Solidarity - American Manufactures and Irish Independence" /37 stars (19 above, 18 below) around "We purpose for high Heaven/Till Erin's chains are riven/For works by Britain made/No more with her we'fl trade". Prooflike fields, lightly toned, scattered marks and some spots. The 37 stars date the piece between 1867 (admission of Nebraska) and 1876 (admission of Colorado), and as it is clearly connected with the Fenian Movement in this country it was probably struck around 1869-1870 before the end of the Fenian raids into Canada. The earliest auction record known to us is the Cogan/Jenks Sale 4/12/1877; the piece in Woodward's 11/11/1878 Holland Sale included the information from Henry Holland that the dies were then lost in shipment to the U.S. We have records of one specimen in silver (from England in 7/1981), 5 in copper, and 4 in white metal (including this piece) in 105 years!

2553 ND (1876?) First Defenders of Washington. White metal, 38mm, by George Morgan. With ribbon and hanger, AU.

Infantryman before Capitol, flanked by Lincoln and a Union shield in circles, "First Defenders Washington Apr. 18, 1861"/on interlocking circles, "Logan Guards", "National Light Infantry", "Allen Infantry", "Washington Artillerists", "Ringgold Light Artillary". There were the first units available to throw a defensive screen around Washington when the Civil War began. Brass hangers with red-white-blue ribbon. Made, we presume, for wear by the survivors during the Centennial; one of Morgan's 1st medals in the U.S.

> Most of Jefferson's face is on the planchet, and the bottom halves of all four digits of the date (far enough up to reach the crossbar of the "4"), the fragment thinner than a Dime and appears to he made of nickel. These "howtie" fragments are the result of a planchet cutter alignment error which resulted in the punching out of a division section of the strip hetween the holes from several proper planchet punchings. As they vary in size and are randomly positioned in the dies when struck, it is pure luck if the entire date happens to be on one. We do not know of any other Jeff bowtie with complete date

2625 1964-D. Roosevelt Dime with remarkable end-of-strip clip. Unc. (Photo)


> The resulting coin has the appearance of a dime which was cut down the middle showing almost none of the details on the front of FDR's face but it does show his hair-part, cheekhone, ear, throat line, etc., and date. The reverse includes a plain "D" mintmark. The planchet was cut out of the strip at the point where it was almost used up. Details of the strike are as sharp as those of a normal coin except along the irregular rim; there is only a small amount of reeding where the edge could come in contact with the collar.




































2626 1964 Quarter, End of Strip Clip. (Plate)

A full half-planchet tragment from the edge of the planchet strip, positioned when strick so that complete date is present - a rare error, and the largest end-of-strip specimen we know of

2627 (1776-1976) Kennedy Bicentennial Half Dollar Fragment. Copper-Nickel Clad. Unc. (Photo)

The undated fragment is about ten percent of the size of the actual com, struck in the center of the dies, the shape of a dog's head and approx. 14 x 9mm in its widest and narrowest dimensions. Obv. bears eye, ear, hair and neck of Kennedy portrait; rev. displays part of tower and more than half of lower part of Independence Half.

OFF METALS

2628 N.D. No mint mark. Roosevelt Dime on Foreign Aluminum Planchet, Unc. (Photo)

Full sharp head of Roosevelt but details of bottom obv. ("IN GOD WE TRUST" and date) are all or partially missing and the flan is thinnest at this point. Almost all of the reverse got on the flan, but "STATES OF AMERICA" is enlarged and drawn out towards the edge. Mostly lustrous with light handling marks. A rare error.

2629 1970-D Quarter Struck On A Foreign Clad Planchet. (Plate)

Weighs 4.2 grams, too heavy by far for a Dime planchet, much too light for a Quarter planchet.

2630 1970-D Quarter Struck On A Foreign Clad Planchet. (Plate)

Weighs almost the same as the last piece, doubtless intended for the same foreign denomination.

2631 1976-S Kennedy Half on Already Struck Mexican 20 Centavos. (Plate)

Obverse over reverse, traces of the underlying designs and legends can be read when the planchet is carefully tilted in the light but they are faint since this was struck as a Proof with very high pressure. The "94" central digits of the Mexican piece's date are clear, and the final digit seems to be a "4".

Extremely Rare W.W. II Nickel on W.W. 11 Cent Planchet

2632 1943-S. Jefferson Nickel on Zinc-coated-steel Cent planchet. Unc. (Photo)

Large "S" mintmark above the Monticello edifice, all of Jefferson portrait and most of the obv, lettering on flan but "Liberty 1943" is cut off lengthwise through center. Bottom half of "States of America" missing from reverse. It has developed some of the characteristic gray color and spotting seen on 1943 cents.

2633 1956-D Nickel On Cent Planchet. (Plate)

Parallel scratches on head.

2634 1962 Nickel on Cent Planchet. (Plate)

Almost Full Steps!

2635 (1943)-D Quarter on Steel Cent Planchet, Off Center. (Plate)

About 40% O.C. to K5 so no date on it but the odds are extremely high that it is a 1943 strike. It is unusual for us to have two 1943 steel cent pieces in one sale with wrong denomination strikes! AN-ACS F2726A.

Copper Franklin

2636 1963. Franklin Half on a Cent Planchet. With partial indent! AU. (Photo)

Ex lot 488 of 7.17.1981 Providence Collection sale where described as follows: Quite well centered, with full date and full face of Franklin, most of legend on bell visible, still part red with just a touch of friction. At 12:00 obverse, a partial indent from another struck planchet lying over this one when it was in the press, the letters ATES visible backwards and incuse on the projecting part; from the curvature and reeded signs there, it must have been an already struck Dime that was caught! A real wild combination. Weight 3.14 grains.

2637 1970-D Quarter Struck On Nickel Planchet. (Plate)

Weighs 5 grams, no edge reeding 10 00 to 2 00 since the planchet was not large enough to expand to the full width of the Quarter dies

2638 1961-D. Franklin Half Dollar on Nickel Five-Cent Planchet. Unc. (Photo)

The flan has spread out to a diameter of approximately 21mm (although now no longer perfectly round), the Franklin portrait and hell of reverse are almost completely on the flan, date and minimark are visible but virtually none of the lettering is on obv. and on the revoilty part of "HALL DOLLAR" can be seen. Very rare, and a welcome addition to your error collection.

Eleven-Cent Piece!

2639 1958-D/1958-D. Lincoln Cent struck over Roosevelt Dime. Unc. (Photo)

"Wheat-ears" reverse of the cent is struck upside-down upon the Roosevelt portrait. Lincoln's portrait (also upside-down) is boldly struck atop flame and torch of dime's reverse. The resulting coin has a date on either side and two "D" mint-marks on the Lincoln-overtorch side. Details of the two denominations are unmistakable on each side.

One or two microscopic scratches and the faintest hint of friction on cheek of Kennedy portrait.

2646 1978. Eisenhower Dollar on Half Dollar Planchet. AU. (Photo)

Almost all of Eisenhower's head hut for a little off the top and all of the egale, globe and "E PLURIBUS UNUM" on reverse. Just enough of the date is there to read it, and less than 10% of the lettering of the legends are on the flan. No marks to speak of and only very light friction. Very rare, said to be one of only two such pieces known



Uniform looking surfaces, a nick atop reverse rim and a small bump and lint mark on upper field of reverse. Initial year of the Liberty Head series.

3589 1893-C. Fine-15.

Evenly worn, no rim nicks to speak of and a good strike for a Charlotte coin. The only date in this seris with the mint mark on the obverse (placed above date.)



3590 1842-C. Large Date. AU-50. (Photo)

Greenish-gold toning, lustre at rims, date, outlining devices, sharp strike, scattered small nicks across both sides. Very seldom available in any of the upper grades.



3591 1842-D. Small Date, Small Letters. VF-30. (Photo)

Greenish-gold toning, many small contact marks, traces of lustre in protected areas. A nice Dahlonega type coin.

3592 1842-D. Large Date, Large Letters. EF-40+. (Photo)

One of the major rarities in the Coronet Half Eagle series as well as a major contender for rarest D-Mint issue of any denomination, the 42-D Large Date has shown up at auction only 38 times since 1944 in all grades; the only Unc. ever offered was the 1944 Roach piece, which is described as Uncirculated, light friction on the high points (i.e., an AU, and probably identical with the Eliasberg specimen which is the only true AU ever offered). Probably because of failure to recognize the full rarity of the issue, specimens appearing at auction have seldom been photogrpahed: the AU Eliasberg was, as were the EF pieces in Superior/Auction '81 and the 1969 ANA; a couple of VF's were also photo'd in the mid-1970's, but otherwise the coins have been relegated to one or two line descriptions with no illustrations. The present specimen is a nice greenish-gold with lustre at rims and outlining the devices, well struck, light nicks and some cleaning traces on lower obverse. The obverse is a match for the Akers plate coin, the reverse is noticeably sharper.

3593 1843. VF-30.

Orangy toning, long cut on upper rim and through denticulated border



3594 **1843-D**. EF-40+.

Greenish-yellow toning, partially prooflike fields, otherwise quite lustrous, struck from rusty dies (as seems to be the case with almost all, most noticeable at stars 1-2 and 12-13, ct. Akers plate), light marks including a nick line above the eagle. Looks like a 45-50 coin without a glass, and the color is very pleasing. Well above average grade for the issue

3595 1846, VF-20,

A small nick on either rim. obv. bag marks.





3596 1846-C. VF-20. (Photo)

Greenish-gold fields with reddish devices, well circulated with marks consistent with the grade. A very tough date with only 22 auction records 1972-1982; probably does not exist in technical Unc.

3597 1847, EF-45,

Even wear, with partial original lustre.

3598 1847-O. AU-50. (Photo)

Deep yellow-gold with touches of green, substantial lustre, a few light marks, a somewhat soft strike up center obverse from before ear to coronet tip and matching reverse center from shield tip down over arrow feathers, branch, and lower part of mitmark (this seems to be standard on this issue, cf. Akers plate coin and others). Neither Akers nor Breen had ever seen an Unc. specimen, nor even a full AU; only one "Unc." has appeared at auction, included in a complete set of "Unc." O-Mint Half Eagles in 1967 which barely reached estimate, the only "AU" offered was in a 7/79 auction and was a reappearance of the same piece offered as "EF" by the same company a few months earlier. The Akers plate coin, not as sharp as this specimen on the hair, the claws and the wingtips, appeared as an EF in Paramount's 5/76 auction and then again in their session of Auction '79. The two (apparently different) pieces offered as EF in 1978 are both somewhat weaker in the same areas as the Akers plate coin; no photo is available of the EF-40 Eliasberg coin, nor of the EF Stack's piece. Akers found 32 auction appearances in all grades from 1944 to early 1979; we can add 4 more, all mentioned above. This specimen may be the finest known, but we feel safer in counting it among the top two or three in existence for this rare date.





3599 1848-C. EF-40. (Photo)

Somewhat dark greenish-gold toning, traces of lustre, a multitude of small circulation marks on both sides though the only large one is a nick line by arrowheads. Another very difficult date: of the meager 17 specimen at auction since 1978 only 6 have graded EF or better.

3603 1854-C. EF-40. (Photo)

Medium yellow-gold with touches of green, slightly soft strike, lustre at rim and date, has been cleaned and has a large planchet defect (due to a poor mix in the alloy) from star 9 down through bun and shoulder to the 4 of the date. In the upper half of the survivors in terms of grade.





3604 1857-C. EF-40. (Photo)

Deep yellow-gold with splashes of rose at borders, many small contact marks across both sides but none serious, some lustre at date and rims. Well struck, a generally pleasing overall appearance.





3605 1859-C. AU-50. (Photo)

Greenish-gold toning, very sharp obverse, the usual extremely worn reverse die, various small marks, just a touch of actual friction. Extremely rare in this high a grade; substantially sharper on both sides than the Akers' plate coin (which, from the photo, appears to be Paramount's 5/76 Elrod piece, AU-50).





3606 1859-C. EF-45. (Photo)

Medium yellow-gold, some lustre, many small nicks and marks and has been polished.





3607 1859-D. Fine-12+. (Photo)

Evenly well worn with light marks suitable to a higher grade, but has been cleaned. 2nd lowest mintage Dahlonega Half Eagle; Akers found an unusually large number of auction appearances (88) for the period from 1922 to Early 1979, and although we can add some 8 auctions from 79-82, our total for the period 1972 through 1982 is only 40, more in line with the mintage and suggesting mutiple reappearances of the same pieces in the earlier records.





3608 1860-C. Unc.-60. (Photo)

Rich deep yellow-green toning, nicely lustrous, somewhat haggy with a pair of denticle marks on jaw and thin scratches on obverse field, struck from the same wornout reverse die as the 1859-C pieces. Only 40 auction appearance 1972-82, and only 3 pieces offered as Unc. in that period⁴





3609 1860-C. VF-35. (Photo)

Orange-gold toning, deepest at rims, light contact marks across both sides, one large edge ding at 9:00 obverse. Just above the VF-32 average found by Akers.

3610 1861. VF-20.

Heavy obv. bag marks, small dig on rev





3611 1861-C. EF-45. (Photo)

Green-gold with traces of lustre at rims, slightly soft strike, many tiny contact marks and a thin cheek scratch. Well above average for this final year of Charlotte Mint gold


