






















SENIORS

The Pikeville College Academic Team is a member of the Kentucky Collegiate Quick Recall League, whose members host tournaments all across Kentucky. The league provides for two divisions: Division II (community colleges and freshmen and sophomores from 4-year colleges), and Division I (juniors and seniors from 4-year schools). Pikeville College was represented in each division.

During the 1991-2 academic year, Pikeville's academic teams competed in every tournament in the state except one — including a tournament hosted at Pikeville College. Best finish for the Division I team was secondplace at the Alice Lloyd College tournament, while Division II placed first at both Transylvania and Elizabethtown. Though win-loss records are not kept by the league, Pikeville's overall record placed them third among all Kentucky colleges participating.

Captains for the teams this year were Michael Sparks (Division I) and Don Tackett and William Hall (Division II). The teams' faculty coach, Dr. Nancy Cade, was also elected League Coordinator for the 1992-3 academic year.







Coach Scruggs instituted a brandnew offense which resulted in a team average of 90 points per game, and a school record 711 three-point baskets. All this against one of the toughest conferences in the NAIA, which featured two nationally ranked teams. Coach Scruggs feels that Pikeville will soon become the third.

A highpoint of the season came when senior Bart Williams broke the school career points record, with 2,736 total points. Another standout for the Bears was senior Damon Stephenson, whose intense style of play was an example to the rest of the team.

The Pikeville Bears baseball team had a much better season than had been expected. Picked to finish seventh in the conference, the Bears finished third, with an 18-23 record.



Standouts for the Bears were Rob Taylor, who was First Team All-District, and Craig DeLong and Sammy Hamilton, both named to the Second All-District Team


With most of his players returning, Coach Cutright sees a solid nucleus for the coming season, with a number of good role players who can step in and play well.
