The Pikeville College Academic Team is a member of the Kentucky Collegiate Quick Recall League, whose members host tournaments all across Kentucky. The league provides for two divisions: Division II (community colleges and freshmen and sophomores from
 seniors from 4 -year schools). Pikeville College was represented in each division.
During the 1991-2 academic year, Pikeville's academic teams competed in every tournament in the state except one - including a tournament hosted at Pikeville College. Best finish for the Division I team was secondplace at the Alice Lloyd College tournament, while Division II placed first at both Transylvania and Elizabethtown. Though win-loss records are not kept by the league, Pikeville's overall record placed them third among all Kentucky colleges participating.

Captains for the teams this year were Michael Sparks (Division I) and Don Tackett and William Hall (Division II). The teams' faculty coach, Dr. Nancy Cade, was also elected League Coordinator for the 1992-3 academic year.
