VETERANS' LIBRARY FUND

Veterans can contribute to a special library fund for Illinois Veterans' Homes through the purchase of six military license plates — Silver Star, Bronze Star, Gold Star, Korean War Veteran, POW/MIA and Universal Veterans. Upon renewal of these plates, a \$2 fee is charged, which goes toward the purchase of books, large-print materials and other items for libraries in Illinois' four veterans' homes.

PARKING PRIVILEGES

There are two forms of identification used for persons with disabilities parking: parking placards and disability license plates.

Parking placards are available free to persons with permanent or temporary disabilities.

Disability license plates are available to persons who have a permanently disability. These plates may be purchased at the cost of standard license plates for one vehicle titled in their name.

Disabled veterans may obtain special Disabled Veteran Plates if their disabilities are 100 percent servicerelated. For a free brochure on the Secretary of State's Parking Program for Persons with Disabilities, contact the Department of Senior & Community Services.

CUT CAR COSTS

Discounts on automobile insurance premiums are available to eligible drivers age 55 and over upon successful completion of an Automobile Insurance Discount Program approved by the Secretary of State's office.

PHOTO ID PROGRAM

An official Illinois photo ID card for both drivers and non-drivers can be obtained through the Secretary of State's office. The non-expiring ID is free to persons age 65 and over and to persons with disabilities. The card may be obtained at any Driver Services facility or mobile photo ID unit throughout the state.

RULES OF THE ROAD

A free Rules of the Road Review Course is offered statewide to people taking the driver's license examination. Veterans' organizations are encouraged to sponsor these classes for members and their families. Contact the Department of Senior & Community Services to find out about a course in your area:
