Pacon's Patent Come Cymnusium.



The apparatus is supported by two strong screw hooks in the ceiling, about eighteen inches apart, and screwed five inches into the joist. It can also be used out of doors by erecting a frame-work, such as is used for swings. The straps are of the strongest linen, handsomely colored. The rings are of the patent bent wood, about nine inches in diameter. By an ingenious device the rings and stirrups can be instantly raised or lowered to any desired height, or the stirrup straps removed, or the rings removed for the insertion of the Trapeze bar. The apparatus can be put up in any room, and removed in a moment, leaving only the two small eyes in the ceiling visible. It can be used in different rooms at pleasure, by having extra sets of hooks for the ceiling. A space six or eight feet wide is ample

for any of the exercises. Four large sheets containing over one hundred cuts of the exercises, and a pamphlet explaining how each

is performed, is supplied with each apparatus.






