There are some changes to the forthcoming 1987-88 Fiscal Operations Report/1989-90 Application to Participate (FISAP) in the Perkins Loan, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) and College Work-Study (CWS) programs. We are herein advising you of those changes in advance of the form's distribution in late July. Enclosed is a draft copy of the new FISAP form. Most of the changes that have been made to the FISAP are the result of the Higher Education Amendments of 1986, and the final regulations of December 1, 1987, for the Campus-Based programs.

There were no major changes to "Part I - Identifying Information, Certifications, and Warning". Listed below are the major changes that have occurred in the other Parts of the previous FISAP form:

Part II - Application to Participate

Section B - Certain eligible institutions may now request, as with CWS, a waiver of the five percent SEOG institutional share requirement that becomes effective on July 1, 1989. Section 676.21(b) of the SEOG regulations issued December 1, 1987, states that the Secretary may authorize, under special circumstances, a Federal share of 100 percent of the SEOG funds to students for each award year.

Sections C, D, & E - These sections have been rearranged on the application page to reflect a more logical sequence of data reporting. In Section C you must report "Information on Enrollment"; in Section D you must report "Assessments and Expenditures", and in Section E you must report "Information on Eligible Aid Applicants for Award Year 1987-88". No other changes have been made to Part II.

Part III - Perkins Loan Program Report

Section A - Fiscal Report (Cumulative) as of June 30, 1988

Four new lines have been added to report cancellations for volunteer service under the Peace Corps Act and the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973.

Section B - Fund Activity (Annual) during the 1987-88 Award Year

"Calculating the Default Rate", line 6 from the previous 1986-87 report, has been moved to Section C of the new Perkins Loan Fiscal Operations Report.

Section C - Cumulative Repayment Information as of June 30, 1988

Lines 4.3a, 7.1, and 7.7a of the previous 1986-87 report have been eliminated. The data that would have been entered in the previous line 7.1 will now be included in the new line 2. Line 7.1 on the 1987-88 report begins the default categories used in determining the default rate.

Part IV - SEOG Program Report

The final year that SEOG funds were obligated separately as initial year and continuing year was 1986-87. All funds awarded thereafter are being obligated under one document number. Therefore, only one column is needed to report your total SEOG program activity for 1987-88.

Part V - CWS Program Report

Section C - Total Compensation for CWS Under line 11 there are now three categories to report student compensation. You must report earned compensation for a) on-campus expenditures, b) off-campus expenditures at public or private non-profit agencies, and c) off-campus expenditures in the private (for profit) sector.

Section D - Funds Spent From Federal Share of CWS Line 13 provides new lines for total disbursements to students in both the Regular and Community Service Learning Programs. You must report a) compensation at Federal share not to exceed 80 percent; b) off-campus private (for profit) sector compensation at Federal Share not to exceed 60 percent; and c) Community Service Learning Program (CSLP) compensation at Federal Share not to exceed 90 percent.

Also in Section D, under Federal Share of Job Location and Development (JLD) Program Expenditures, line 16, two new lines have been added to report separate regular JLD Program expenditures and JLD Program expenditures for CSLP.

<u>Section G - Information About the Job Location and Development Program Lines 21 and 23, each has two new lines added to report a) regular JLD expenditures and b) CSLP-JLD expenditures.</u>

We suggest that you begin making the necessary changes to your data collection systems now to avoid any last minute problems in meeting the FISAP filing deadline, which will be September 16, 1988, for paper FISAPs, and September 30, 1988, for Electronic FISAPs. If you need clarification on any of these changes, please direct them to your Campus-Based Programs State Representative in Washington.

SPECIAL NOTE:

- 1. Perkins Loan Program Administrative Cost Allowance The regulations of December 1, 1987, Section 674.18(b)(5), require that an institution charge any Perkins Loan administrative costs against its Loan Fund during the same award year in which the expenditures for those costs were made. Previous regulations authorized an institution to claim in a subsequent award period any Perkins Loan administrative cost allowance incurred, but not previously claimed, in a prior award period. The new regulatory requirement is effective July 1, 1988; therefore, the current 1987-88 award period ending June 30, 1988, is the last opportunity for an institution to withdraw from cash-on-hand in its Loan Fund, any Perkins Loan administrative cost allowance incurred, but not claimed, in a prior award period.
- 2. Eligible Aid Applicant Grid Information This information is provided in order to enable your institution to prepare for completing the eligible aid applicant grid in September, 1989.

For an award period or period of enrollment that begins on or after July 1, 1988, an institution must use the Congressional Methodology (CM) to determine an expected family contribution for the campus-based programs. This methodology is detailed in Part F - Need Analysis of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended. Although the methodology may collect different data from that which is currently collected under an "approved system of need analysis," e.g., uniform methodology, the method by which you will place applicants on the grid in the Fall of 1989 (considering taxable and nontaxable income, dependency status and educational classification) will not change. Likewise, the format of the eligible aid applicant grid will not change.

As always, you must ensure that the taxable and nontaxable income used in computing the expected family contribution for an eligible aid applicant is reflected. However, when you place eligible aid applicants on the grid in the Fall of 1989 you must consider all taxable and nontaxable income used in the methodology. This is a change from previous practice where a dependent student's taxable and nontaxable income was not used in determining grid placement. In completing the grid in September 1989 where the CM provides for consideration of base year income, as in the case of dependent and independent students, that total family taxable and nontaxable income must be used in placing the student on the grid. Likewise, where the CM provides for consideration of projected year income as in the case of a dislocated worker, that income must be used in determining grid placement.

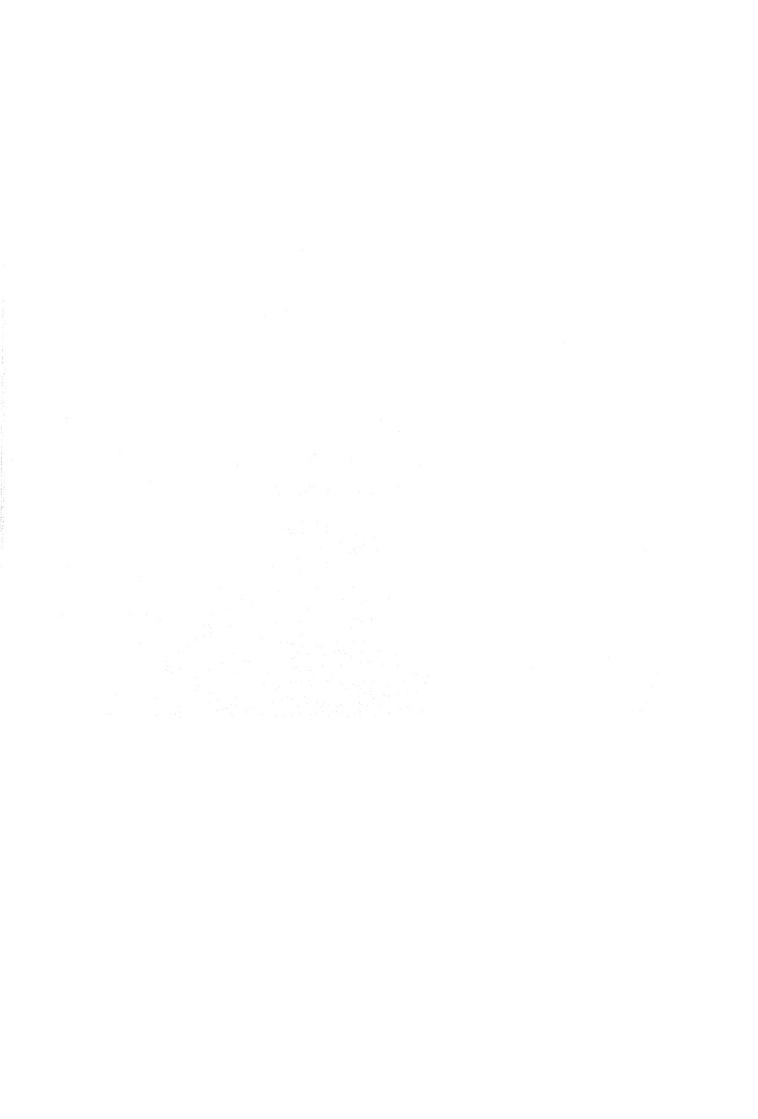
