## EDITOR'S PREFACE.

This volume of the Catalogue of the Greek Coins in the British Museum describes the Coinage of Mysia.

The size of the coins is given in inches and tenths, and the weight in English grains. Tables for converting grains into grammes and inches into millimètres, as well as into the measures of Mionnet's scale, are placed at the end of the volume. A Map has been prefixed showing the position of the Cities of Mysia that issued coins, and notes, dealing with questions of provenance, attribution, reading and type, have been appended to many of the descriptions.

The whole work has been written by Mr. Warwick Wroth, of the Department of Coins and Medals; and I have revised it by comparing every coin with the corresponding description in the manuscript.

## GREEK COINAGE OF MYSIA.

## INTRODUCTION.

The cities of Mysia of which coinages are extant are twenty-four in number.* (See the Map in this volume). The most important of these places (about half of which were on the northern and western coasts) were the great sea-ports of Cyzicus, Parium, and Lampsacus on the Propontis and Hellespont, Apollonia on the Rhyndacus, and Pergamum. The earliest Mysian coinage took

Periods of Mysian Coinage. place at Cyzicus during the seventh and sixth centuries b.c. During the fifth century, coins were issued at Apollonia, Cyzicus, Lampsacus, Parium and Pergamum. In the majority of the cities, however, the coinage begins in the fourth century, from which time, with occasional cessations during the third, second, and first centuries, it is continued till late in the third century of our Era.

The Mysian currency consisted chiefly of the fine series of electrum coins issued at Cyzicus from circ. b.c. 500 to circ. 350 , and of the important though less extensive series of gold staters

[^0]minted at Lampsacus from circ. b.c. 394 to circ. B.c. 350. The principal money of the period в.c. 284-133 consisted of the Attic tetradrachms of the Kings of Pergamum and-from about B.c. 200 to b.c. 133-of the Cistophori coined by this dynasty at Parium and Pergamum. After the death of Attalus III., the last King of Pergamum, in b.c. 133, and the formation in the same year of the Roman Province of "Asia"-a province of which Mysia and the Pergamene kingdom formed part-the Mysian silver money consists principally of Cistophori issued from B.c. 183 to b.c. 67 at Pergamum and Adranyteum. The coinage of the Imperial Age is of bronze.

The important coin-series of Cyzicus, Lampsacus and Pergamum, and the coinages of Apollonia, Cisthene and Germe, call for special discussion.

The admirable monograph by Mr . Greenwell on the electrum coinage of Cyzicus, published in 1887,* has
cyzicus
Electrum Coinage. furnished numismatists with full descriptive lists of the Cyzicene staters, sixth, and twelfths, and with an interesting commentary on the whole series. Mr. Greenwell has arranged the coins and the plates that illustrate them according to their types, placing first the representations of divinities and heroes, and next those of animals and monsters. This plan offers several advantages in arranging an extensive and varied series like the Cyzicenes, but it sacrifices the chronological order of the coins. In the present Catalogue an arrangement in Periods has been attempted. Within each Period, however, the specimens are not grouped chronologically, but according to types-gods, heroes, animals, monsters, and inanimate objects. For convenience of comparison

[^1]representations of heads are placed together, and these are followed by representations of the figure.

In the introduction to his Cyzicus (pp. 32-34), Mr. Greenwell

## Chronology.

 has briefly set forth a proposed chronological arrangement of the coins, and with this classification $I$, in the main, agree, though differing in some instances as to the period to which certain specimens belong. There is a difficulty, especially, in dating the coins with animal types. Mr. Greenwell has assigned the bulk of these to his period b.c. $440-410$, while he has given a small number to the preceding period. I am inclined to withdraw from the $440-410$ period several pieces that have the squares in the incuse of the reverse irregularly formed. No. 49, p. 24, pl. $\nabla .12$, infra $=$ Greenwell, no. 155, type, Cock, is an instance of this change, and, generally, I am disposed to place the animal types before, rather than after, b.c. $440 . *$In this Catalogue the electrum coins are arranged in the following four periods:-
Period I. Seventh and sixth centuries b.c.
$" \quad$ II. Circ. b.c. $500-450$.
$" \quad$ III. Circ. b.c. $450-400$.
$" \quad$ IV. Circ. B.c. $400-350$.

It is generally agreed $\dagger$ that the first issue of the long series of

## Period I.

7 th and 6th
Centuries B.c. electrum staters and smaller divisions marked with the tunny, took place not later than b.c. 500 . A few specimens may be even earlier than this, but it

[^2]is convenient to class together all the archaic or quasi-archaic pieces in Period II. (b.c. 500-450). (See plates iv., v.) The exceptional stater, no. 1, pl. iii. 20, with the type of a tunny, filleted, is assigned by Mr. Greenwell to the first half of the sixth century, and is considered by him to be the sole representative of the earliest coinage of the city. It may well be questioned, however, whether, during the seventh, or at any rate during the sixth, century, Cyzicus confined herself to the issue of staters of this solitary type. I would, therefore, assign to Period I. not merely this stater but a number of electrum coins-chiefly sixths and smaller divisions-all of which bear types of a marine character, some of them relating to the tunny-fisheries from which Oyzicus derived so much of her revenue.* (See plate iii.) In this period, I have also included the curious silver stater no. 16, p. 20, pl. iii. 21 , bearing the head and tail of a fish, apparently the tunny. Coins of this type have been found in the island of Melos, and two specimens occurred in the Santorin (Thera) Find of 1821. $\dagger$ The type, which is an unusual one, is not specially appropriate to either Melos or Thera, but would be well-adapted to Cyzicus, as a comparison with the electrum coins (pl. iii.) will show. The coins are of the Phœnician standard, and may be as early as the seventh century в.c.

About b.c. 500, marine types disappear from the Cyzicene elec-

Period II. circ.B.C.500-450. trum coinage, with the exception of the tunny, which henceforth becomes the constant symbol of the city. The coins of this period (pl. iv., v.) are for the most part of archaic or partially archaic style, such as we are accustomed

[^3]to associate with the period before the Persian wars (b.c. 480). Some pieces, however, especially those with auimal types, may be later than b.c. 480, and it is for this reason that I have fixed the lower limit of the period at circ. b.c. 450. In any case, it is impossible to admit a break in the issue of the Cyzicenes between this period and the next.

On the coins assigned to the third period $*$ (pl. vi., vii., viii.), all

Period III. circ.B.C.450-400. traces of archaism have disappeared, and the small squares in the incuse of the reverse are more regularly formed. The treatment of the types is characterized, as a rule, by strength and simplicity.
To the fourth and latest period of electrum coinage at Cyzicus, may be assigned a series (unfortunately but poorly repre-

Period IV. circ.B.C.400-350. sented in the British Museum) of specimens having the incuses more or less dotted or roughly grained (pl. viii.). The types consist almost exclusively of human heads and figures. The work is, for the most part, delicate and beautiful ; but, by contrast with the style of the preceding period, sometimes appears almost effeminate. The coins that can be assigned to the present period are not numerous, and there is no doubt that the gold staters of Philip of Macedon and of his successor Alexander, ultimately superseded the Cyzicenes and Darics as the staple gold currency of the ancient world. Mr. Greenwell supposes (Cyzicus, p.34) that the issue of Cyzicenes completely ceased before B.c. $360 . \dagger$ I have (with Mr. Head, Hist. Nium., p. 451) suggested the year в.c. 350 for the cessation of the coinage, a slightly later date, which would leave more time for the issue of the gold "Philips" to take

[^4]effect. In style, the Cyzicenes of this period bear much resemblance to the gold staters of Lampsacus, which-if rightly dated in this catalogue-were issued within limits of time almost exactly corresponding, namely B.c. 394-350.

In their multiplicity of type and beauty of artistic treatment, the

> Types. Cyzicenes form a striking contrast to other widely-spread Hellenic currencies (such as those of Athens and Corinth), in which fixity of coin-type, with its obvious commercial advantages, was all that was aimed at. Cyzicus combined this fixity with both variety and beauty. The fixed elements in the Cyzicene currency-those without which it could not well have performed its function as a popular medium of exchange *-are the representation on every specimen of the tunnyfish, the incuse square (retained long after the archaic period), and the unusual fabric and colour.

At Cyzicus, the magistrates' symbols are not represented, as at Athens and Corinth, by small devices in the field of the coin, but are, by a happy inspiration, exalted to the position of "types," while the type proper (the tunny) is placed in the position of the symbol. Hence the varied array of Cyzicene coin-types. It seems strange, at first sight, that such facile engravers as those of Cyzicus should never have attempted the adornment of the reverse of the coins. The reverse of the gold staters of Lampsacus, a series which in several respects resembles the Cyzicenes, is invariably occupied by the city-arms (the winged horse), and the tunny of Cyzicus might easily have been placed in the same position. It was probably felt, however, that such a reverse-type would be monotonous. Moreover, the incuse square and the lumpy fabric of the statersthough ugly in themselves-serve as a foil to set off the fine work of the obverse; just as the portion of a pebble that the lapidary

[^5]purposely leaves unpolished enhances the beauty of its polished side.

The greater number of the types relate, as Mr. Greenwell has remarked, to the cults and myths of Hellas, and have been derived from many sources. "Some are of original design, some are simply copies of other coins, and some are modifications of the types on the coins of other States. There are also others which have been taken from single figures or groups in marble," and which have been either reproduced or modified by the taste of the artist " to fit them to the requirements of the space on the coin." In connection with the last-mentioned point we may notice the frequent occurrence of stooping or kneeling figures. Figures in similar attitudes are constantly found in the circular medallions that ornament the inside of the Greek kylix. (See e.g. the illustrations in Kleiu's Euphronios.)*

The silver coinage of Cyzicus consists principally of staters of

## Silver and bronze coins of Cyzicus.

 Rhodian weight issued from circ. B.c. 400-280. $\dagger$ Brandis, and others, have attributed to Cyzicus a still earlier coinage, B.c. 480-400, consisting of the small silver pieces described below on pages 34,35 (pl. ix. 1-7). M. J. P. Six has argued that this series belongs to Caunus in Caria, but, for reasons explained in a note on p. 34, infra, I have been unable to accept his attribution. The autonomous bronze coinage extends[^6]from circ. b.c. 400 to b.c. 100 or later. The Imperial series of bronze is varied and extensive, but the types chiefly relate to the myths and cultus of Kore Soteira (pl. x. 10 ; xi. 1, 3, 8 ; xiii. 6, \&c.) who was specially honoured at Cyzicus (see Lenormant in Saglio, Dict. des ant., art. "Ceres," p. 1030, and references there).

The earlier coins of Lampsacus in the British Museum are arranged (pp. 78-85) in the following periods :-

The attribution to Lampsacus of the coins in Period II. may be regarded as certain. $\dagger$ The stater placed in Period I. may have been issued about 500 b.c., or a little earlier, and may well be attributed to this city on account of its type. Its weight, however,

[^7]is Phœenician or Asiatic, while the staters of Period II. are struck on the Lampsacene standard.* The coin belongs to a class of staters bearing animal types which are evidently either issued from a single mint-according to M. Six, the mint of Chios $\dagger$-or (as Mr. Head has suggested $\ddagger$ ) from several mints regulated by a monetary convention. The attribation of this stater must therefore, for the present, be considered doubtful. The series of gold staters in Period III. (pl. xix. 1-9) is of especial interest on account of the variety and beauty of the obverse types. Considerable additions to this series have been made of late from Finds, and not less than thirty-one distinct types are now known. The following is a list of types, § with references to representative specimens of each :-

Mr. Head (Num. Chron., 1876, pp. 288, 291; Hist. Num., p. 456)
Date of gold has placed the first issue of these staters in b.c. Staters. $\quad 412$, partly because he supposes the head on no. 24 to be that of the Persian Pharnabazus, who succeeded to the satrapy of the Hellespont about b.c. 413. As will be shown, however, this coin is not one of the earliest of the staters, and the head bears so little resemblance to that on the well-known silver coin inscribed ФAPNABA (Imhoof, Portrüthöpfe, p. 23, pl. iii. 2), that it cannot be assumed to represent Pharnabazus. M. Six thinks that the head is of the Satrap Orontas (Num. Chron., 1888, p. 113). The earliest staters in the series are nos. 1 and 2. They are distinguished from all other specimens of their class by being struck on an oval, instead of a more or less circular, flan, and by having the winged horse turned to the left instead of to the right. The oval flan and "type to the left," after being in use for a shor't time, were evidently abandoned in favour of the circular flan and " type to the right," characteristics which-when the coins became well known and popular-remained stereotyped. Now, the stater no. 1 is almost certainly copied from the Herakles on the alliance-coins of Samos, Ephesus, Cnidus and Rhodes, struck after the battle of Cnidus, b.c. 394 (Waddington, Mél. de Num. ii., p. 18); and as this stater is one of the earliest Lampsacenes, we may place the earliest issue of the whole class about b.c. 394-a date already suggested by M. Six (Num. Chron., 1888, p. 112). The gold coinage of Lampsacus must ultimately have been superseded by the gold money of Philip II. and Alexander the Great, and its
issue may have ceased-as Mr. Head supposes *-about the year B.c. 350. M. Six $\dagger$ considers that the coinage continued as late as the time of Alexander, b.c. 330. Nos. $\ddagger 25$ (pl. xix. 7), 6 and 17 "carry us down" (says M. Six) "to the year 331, when Alexander visited the oracle of Ammon . . . and to the year 334, when Lampsacus was spared by Alexander." The town (continues M. Six) would therefore have had a special reason for placing on its coins the head of Alexander's mother (divinized as a Maenad; no. 25) ; that of his father Ammon (no. 6) ; and his own head, idealized as Achilles (no. 17). Though M. Six's reference of these three types to Alexander is highly interesting and ingenious, I feel some hesitation in accepting it. Unless I am mistaken, M. Six, misled by the engraving in Mionnet, pl. lxxr. 3, has not nuted that the young head called by him Achilles has a stag's horn attached to it (see Z. $f . N$. ., xvii., p. 8, no. 2, pl. i. 12), and that it is therefore not Achilles but Aktaeon. The head on no. 25 may be simply that of a Maenad, and not Olympias in that character; and the head of Zeus Ammon-if the "Achilles" and "Olympias" interpretations are set asideneed not necessarily be connected with Alexander.§

The Lampsacenes (struck according to the standard of the Darics,
Types of gold. Staters. have been discovered in Egypt and Syria, || in Sicily $\|_{\|}$and in Asia

[^10]Minor.* In variety of device and beauty of execution this stater-series-of which the full extent is probably not yet known-recalls the electrum coinage of Cyzicus. The obverse type is usually a head. Figure-subjects only occur seven times. The head was no doubt preferred to the figure because a figure-subject (the winged horse) had, of necessity, to form the type of the reverse. The heads are chiefly those of well-known divinities-Zeus, Zeus Ammon, Apollo, Helios, Demeter, Athena, Hermes, Dionysos, Pan, Herakles, Hecate. We find also a head of Aktaeon, Odysseus (?), a satyr, a Maenad. The head on no. 24 has been described as that of the Satrap Orontas. These subjects, though comparatively commonplace, are by the engravers of Lampsacus nearly always treated with marked distinction of style. The Demeter or Persephone (pl. xix. 1) bears a remarkable resemblance to the corn-wreathed head of Demeter on the well-known coins of Messene struck about b.c. 370 (Gardner, Types, pl. viii. 28), and, in style, recalls some of the fine hectae of Phocaea (cp. B. V. Head, Guide to the Coins of the Ancients, iii. A. 9; pl. xviii. 9). The head of the female satyr (pl. xix. 2) shows something of the feeling that inspired the famous youthful Satyr of Praxiteles (see Baumeister, Denkmäler, art. "Praxiteles," fig. 1548). The head, pl. xix. 3, is almost identical with one on a Cyzicene stater (Greenwell, Oyzicus, p. 86, no. 70, pl. iii. 21). It has been called a Cabirus and also Hephaistos, but I agree with Mr. Greenwell (loc. cit.) in thinking it more suitable to " the crafty, restless and bold Odysseus ... a storm-tossed, but not weary or disheartened warrior." The figure-subjects relate to Herakles, Apollo, Nike, Gaia, and Helle. The last-named was specially appropriate to a town situated on the Hellespont. An imperial coin of Lampsacus (Z.f. N., vii., p. 25, pl. i. 15) represents Helle's brother Phrixos riding on the

[^11]ram, and Helle herself thrown from the ram into the sea. The Herakles subject (no. 1) is, as already pointed out, a pleasing reproduction of the type on the well-known series of Alliance Coins of Cnidus, Ephesus, \&c. (Waddington, Mél. de Num., ii. p. 18, pl. ii.). Pl. xix., no. 4, Gaia rising from the ground, holding ears of corn and grapes, may have been suggested by the Cyzicene stater described by Mr. Greenwell in the Numismatic Chronicle, 1890, p. 24, pl. iii. 7, to which, however, it is inferior in delicacy of execution.* No. 3 in the list, Nike killing a ram, is a beautiful variety of the well-known subject of Nike sacrificing an animal, usually a bull. $\dagger$ A similar type occurs on a contemporary gold stater of Abydus (Head, Guide, iii., A. 14, pl. xviii. 14), but there Nike is completely draped. The Nereid on a dolphin (no. 4 in list) occurs also on a Cyzicene stater (Greenwell, Oyzicus, p. 72, no. 48, pl. ii. 26).

The most frequent type on the latest autonomons and on the Imperial coins of Lampsacus is Priapus. Lampsacus was the legendary birth-place of this divinity and the principal seat of his worship. Priapus first occurs on the coins about b.c. 190, and the representation of him bears out the statement of Athenaeus (i. 54) that at Lampsacus he was identified with Dionysos. The Lampsacene territory was noted for its wine.

- The earliest coins of Pergamum (pl. xxiii. 1, 2) belong, to judge


## pergamum.

 Earliest Coinage. from their style, to the closing years of the fifth century-circ. B.c. 420-400, and were doubtless those issued by the widow, or the descendants, of Gongylos the Eretrian, to whom the King of Persia had given[^12]Pergamum as a reward for espousing his cause.* From about b.c. $354, \dagger$ the city remained in the hands of the Persian King, until the arrival of Alexander the Great, who there established Barsine and his son by her, named Herakles. Herakles lived at Pergamum till the year 310, when he was persuaded by Polysperchon to set out for Greece as a claimant to his father's throne. He died in 309 , but it is highly probable-as M. Six has pointed out $\ddagger$-that before starting for this expedition he issued at Pergamum a series of gold, silver and bronze coins (pl. xxiii. 3-5), which bear types chiefly relating to Herakles, and to Athena, the great divinity of Pergamum.
From circa b.c. 284 till 133 the city is the chief mint place of the Pergamene kings.§ This regal currency con-

## Pergamenekings, B.C. 284-133.

 sists chiefly of tetradrachms of Attic weight, of Cistophori and of small bronze pieces. The tetradrachms and the bronze bear no inscription except the name of Philetaerus, the founder of the dynasty. The reverse type of the tetradrachms is, throughout, a figure of Athena, seated and, usually, crowning the name of Philetaerus. The obverse type-from the time of Eumenes I., b.c. 263, onwards-is the head of the divinized Philetaerus || (pl. xxiii. 13, \&c.). On the obverse of the coins of Philetaerus himself is the head of his suzerain or supporter Seleucus I., Nicator (pl. xxiii. 12).T Philetaerus and Seleucus are[^13]the only portrait-heads that occur. An exceptional tetradrachm of Eumenes II. (pl. xxiv. 5) presents a head, not of Philetaerus, but (presumably) of Eumenes himself.
The arrangement of the tetradrachms adopted in this Catalogue is that proposed by Dr. Imhoof-Blumer in his admirable monograph Die Münzen der Dynastie von Pergamon. The data for this classification are afforded chiefly by variations in the head-dress of the king, the border of dots, the attitude of Athena, the position of Athena's spear and shield, the position of the inscription, and by changes in the fabric.

The obverse type of the bronze coins of the kings (pl. xxv.) is usually a head of Athena. On the reverses there occur as types several devices (e.g. bow, ivy-leaf, bee) that figure on the tetradrachms as symbols; a circumstance which renders possible the assignment of the specimens to individual kings.*

From about b.c. 200 to 133 the coinage of regal tetradrachms is supplemented by an issue at Pergamum (pl. xxvi. 1), and also at Parium (pl. xxi. 16) of cistophori. $\dagger$ Some coins with Alexandrine types are also attributable to Pergamum, probably in the time of Eumenes II. $\ddagger$

From the establishment of the Roman Province of Asia, till near

Pergamum. Roman Period. the beginning of the Empire, the coinage of the Pergamene mint consists chiefly of a new issue of cistophori (pl. xxvi. 3-6), of which the latest specimens bear the names of C. Fabius § and C. Claudius Pulcher, \|

[^14]Proconsuls of Asia, and of Q. Caecilius Metellus, Imperator (p. 126 infra; pl. xxvi. 6). An extensive bronze coinage also falls within the period b.c. 133-Augustus. The types generally relate to Athena and Asklepios (pl. xxvi. 7-9; pl. xxvii. 1-15).

The Imperial bronze coins of Pergamum, like those of Cyzicus, form an extensive and varied series. Besides the specimens with Emperors' heads, there is a smaller contemporaneous class bearing the heads of divinities, \&c. (pp. 134-137), which may be assigned to various reigns from Augustus to Gallienus. The types of the greatest interest and of the most frequent occurrence relate to the worship of Asklepios, the principal divinity of Pergamum under the Empire.* This god was already worshipped in the time of the Pergamene kings, and a few types relating to him-including one (pl. xxv. 9) which perhaps reproduces the Asklepios of the sculptor Phryromachus $\dagger$-are found on the bronze regal coinage (pl. xxv. 10, 11, 12). Asklepian types are also found on the coinage of B.c. 133-Augustus (pl. xxvi. 7; xxvii. 1-9). On the Imperial money these types begin to appear in the reign of Domitian, and last till the time of Gallienus. They are most abundant under the Antonines, and under Caracalla, of whose visit to the Pergamene temple of Asklepios in A.D. 214 they form an interesting record. (See especially pl. xxxi. 1, the Emperor entering Pergamum ; pl. xxxi. 3, 4, 5, sacrifice to Asklepios; pl. xxxi. 6, adoration of Asklepian serpent and Telesphoros.) Caracalla conferred upon the Pergamenes certain privileges (Dio Cass. lxxviii. § 20), and on the reverse of one of his enormous coins (no. 318), which is entirely covered by the inscription, we read a boastful record of the city's titles.

[^15]Among other noteworthy types in the British Museum may be mentioned: (i) pl. xxviii. 5, The Demos of Pergamum crowning the Proconsul, M. Plautius Silvanus (Augustus) ; (ii) pl. xxviii. 10, Trajan and Zeus Philios (Trajan); (iii) pl. xxviii. 16, Koronis, mother of Asklepios (Hadrian) ; (iv) pl. xxix. 1, Apollo Smintheus and Asklepios (Antoninus Pius) ; (v) pl. xxix. 7, Asklepios and a small naked figure ; between them, a rat: cf. Wroth, Asklepios, \&c., p. 38 ff. (M. Aurelius) ; (vi) pl. xxx. 4, Youthful Zeus with Gaia and Thalassa (Commodus); (vii) pl. xxx. 7, Vaulted shrine with statues of two bulls-a type not yet explained (Sept. Severus); (viii) pl. xxx. 8, Ariadne discovered by Dionysos (Sept. Severus).

The imperial types of Apollonia relate to Apollo. Of especial

APOLLONIA AD RHYNDACUM. interest are the coins representing the statue of an undraped Apollo, standing in an easy pose, with one arm resting on a pillar (pl. ii. 13, 16).
The attitude of the figure recalls the Apollo Sauroktonos of Praxiteles (L. Mitchell, Anc. Sculpt. pp. 444, 445; Baumeister, Denkm. art. "Praxiteles," fig. 1550; Overbeck, Iunstmythologie cited infra, p. 11, note).

## CISTHENE.

The earliest coin of Cisthene is of the fourth century B.c.
Obv. Bearded head r. in Persian mitra.
Rev. KI<〇A Horseman galloping r. . size " 12." Munich. (See Imhoof, Griech. Münzen, p. 613, no. 166, pl. vi. 27).*

The obverses of nos. 1 and 2 in the British Museum, infra, p. 17, pl. iii. 7, resemble the Demeter-head on silver coins of Paros, assigned in the British Museum Cat. Crete and Aegean Islands (p. 114, no. 13, pl. xxvi. 7) to the third century B.c. On the other hand,

[^16]the obverse of no. 3 is of somewhat rude style, and the reverse type of all three specimens occurs also at Adramyteum on coins that seem to be of the second century b.c. These coins of Cisthene are therefore best assigned to the second century. In or before the time of Strabo (xiii. 1, 51) the place was deserted.

There were two towns in Mysia of this name*:-(i) Germe on
GERME. the Caicus near Pergamum, at or near the modern Soma.t (ii) Germe (called by Ptolemy "Hiera (Germe ') on the Rhyndacus, S.W. of the lake of Apollonia, near the modern Kirmasli Kassaba. $\ddagger$ Are the coins reading $\Gamma$ EPMHN $\Omega N$ (described infra, pp. 64-71) to be distributed between these two towns, or, if not, to which town should they be assigned?

The coins in question are Imperial, both with and without Emperor's heads. The inscription is always $\Gamma \in P M H N \Omega N$, though one coin (no. 10) has (besides the $\Gamma \in P M H N \Omega N$ on the reverse) the legend IEPA TEPMH accompanying the turreted bust of the city on the obverse. On many of the specimens the name of the local magistrate occurs. The types chiefly relate to Apollo and Artemis.

On grounds of style, I am inclined to believe that all the coins belong to a single town. With regard to the inscriptions, it might at first be thought that the presence or absence of the name of the magistrate indicates that the coins were issued by two distinct towns. This does not, however, appear to have been the case, for

[^17]the coin of Gordian III., no. 28, which bears the name of a magistrate is from the same obverse die as no. 24, which is without a magistrate's name.

It is more difficul's to decide to which of the two towns the whole series should be attributed. M. Waddington appears to be in favour of the attribution to Germe near Pergamum. The finding of inscriptions at or near this place, and its situation on the important road between Pergamum and Ihyatira, raise the presumption that it was sufficiently important to have issued coins. A further argument for this attribution may be found in the circumstance that a large coin inscribed $\Gamma \in P M H N \Omega N *$ (Caracalla) has the type of Herakles and Telephos, a type that is almost identical with one on a large coin of Pergamum $\dagger$ (Commodus). On the other hand, it may be urged that Germe on the Rhyndacus, though not so near a neighbour to Pergamum as Germe on the Caicus, was nevertheless not so remote from it that it might not have borrowed a coin-type from Pergamum. It may also be pointed out that one of the $\Gamma \in P M H N \Omega N$ coins, no. 19, has a type (Dionysos in chariot) which resembles the reverse of a coin of Cyzicus (Imhoof, Griech. Miinzen, pl. vii. 4; cp. ib. pl. vii. 3), the neighbour of the Germe on the Rhyndacus.

Most numismatists (see Borrell in Num. Chron., vi. 154, 155), including the author of the Historia Numorum (p. 455), have selected Germe on the Rhyndacus as the mint-place of the coins. The chief reason for this choice appears to be the existence of the coin inscribed IEPA $\Gamma \in P M H$ (no. 10). It has not umnaturally been supposed that this specimen belongs to the Germe that is styled by Ptolemy 'I $\epsilon \grave{\infty} \Gamma^{\prime} \Gamma^{\prime} \rho \mu \eta$. I may observe, however, that strictly speaking the name of the town is given on the reverse of the coin

[^18]in the inscription $r \in P M H N \Omega N$. Although the town-name "Hiera Germe" may be implied in the obverse legend, the word IEPA is there not exactly part of the town-name, but an epithet descriptive of the type-the personification of the town Germe.* The legend should be compared with the IEPA CVNKAHTOC and $I \in P O C \triangle H M O C$ on other coins of the place (nos. 1-5).

On the whole, the data seem to me to be insufficient at present for determining positively to which of the two towns these coins belong. For the solution of the problem we must trust to future finds, and more especially to the identification of the monetary magistrates by means of lapidary inscriptions.

In concluding this Introduction, I am anxious to express my obligations to several living scholars, whose works have been of much assistance to me in the preparation of this volume. I may mention especially the writings of Greenwell, Head, Imhoof-Blumer, W. M. Ramsay, J. P. Six and Waddington. Professor Percy Gardner has kindly placed at my disposal his manuscript description of the British Museum coins of Cyzicus, and of several other Mysian towns, and I have thus had the advantage of comparing it with my own work. I am also indebted for valuable suggestions to Mr. Barclay Head, who has read and collated the proof-sheets with the coins.
